

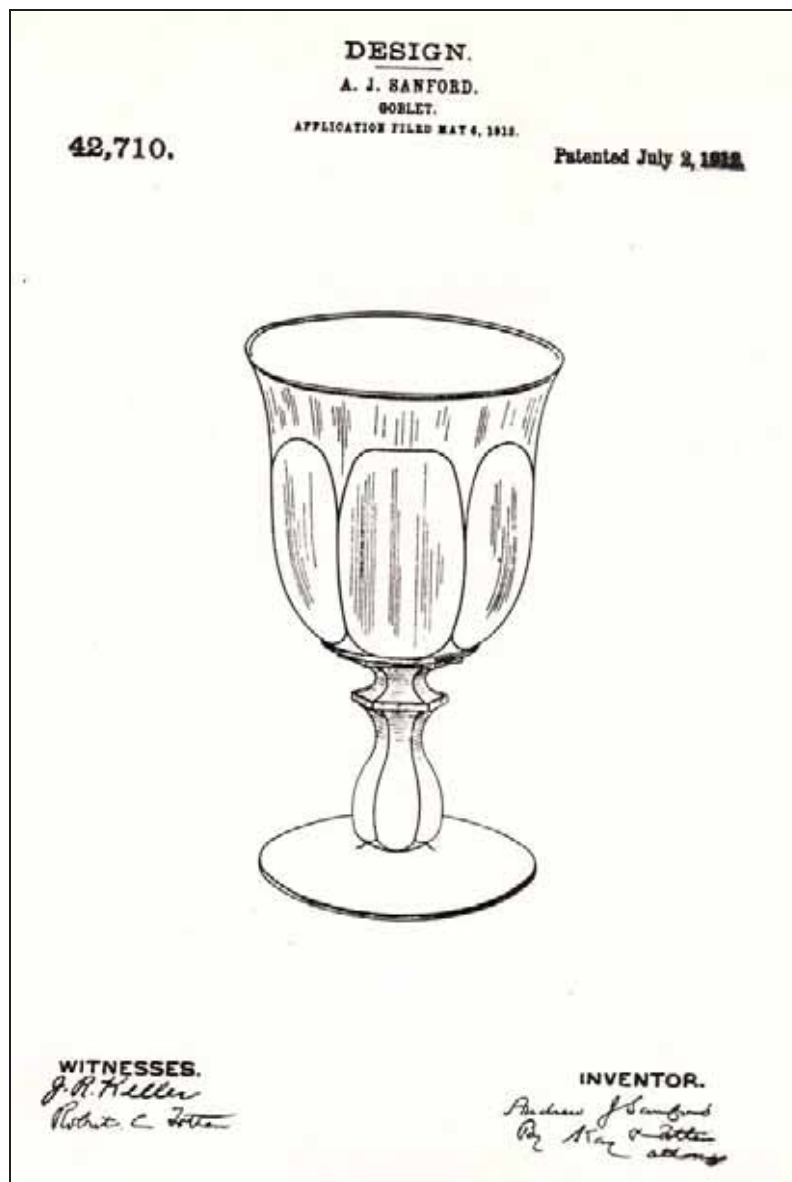

Not only did we have our usual Benefit Auction, but the Museum saw some major upgrades including our new roof (see picture on page 13) and the Archives have a new humidity control unit. It was great seeing so many of you at the auction, but we did miss those of you who could not make it. I hope you will be able to get here for Convention this year because it is going to be another great one.

I am please to announce that we have another pattern named by one of our members. Isabelle Gibbs has named the 1155 punch cup the Gibbs. Do drop by the Museum and see the Bill and Isabelle Gibbs Punch Cup Collection which is on display in a special cabinet in Room 1 of the King House. Look especially for the 1155 Gibbs in both Opal and Custard that are part of this collection.

On a sad note, we have gotten word that the Old Morgantown Glass Collector's Guild Glass Museum has been forced to close. The club just was not able to raise the necessary funds to continue to maintain the museum. Given that Morgantown was the last of the glass clubs to get its museum up and running, it is a bit disheartening to see its demise after such a short run. The club will have continuing displays at the Seneca Center and some other venues, but the museum itself is now history.

PROPOSED BYLAWS CHANGE INFORMATION

Karen Taylo, Chair - Constitution and Bylaws Committee

As many of you know, we hire Wells and Priest to handle our accounting. We have asked for their help in reviewing our financial practices to assure compliance with our non-profit status. One of the areas discussed was related to financial accounting of the "affiliate chapters" or study clubs. At one point, we thought we might need to have each study club submit an annual financial report much as they submit an annual membership roster. Wells and Priest informed us that our responsibility extends to assuring that the affiliate chapter's bylaws are consistent with HCA's bylaws. To that end, the Board of Directors is recommending a change to the HCA Bylaws:

The current language of Article VIII (Initiation Fees and Dues), Section 3 Study group (charter club) reads:

The requirements to establish and maintain a study group (charter club) are:

- a) All members must be voting or associate members of HCA
- b) Payment of a one-time \$25.00 fee
- c) Annually submit a membership list to the Secretary of HCA by May first
- d) Have at least eight (8) members. (approved 3/12/83)

The following proposed change was read into the record at the April Membership Meeting.

Discussion will be held at the June Membership Meeting with voting to commence after the discussion period.

The proposed language of Article VIII, Section 3 reads:

The requirements to establish and maintain a study group (charter club) are:

- a) All members must be voting or associate members of HCA
- b) Payment of a one-time \$25.00 fee
- c) Annually submit a membership list to the Secretary of HCA by May first
- d) Have at least eight (8) members (approved 3/12/83)
- e) Written bylaws approved by HCA Board of Directors. ♦

373/341 OLD WILLIAMSBURG STEMWARE

Stemware set 373 was one of A.H Heisey and Company's most prominent sets. The 373 pattern began around 1911. A design patent for the goblet was filed on May 6, 1912 by Heisey designer Andrew J. Sanford and patent #42,710 was granted on July 2, 1912. An advertisement came out in May 1913 featuring pieces of the 373 line. The 373 stemware design stayed in production until the plant closed in 1957 although it did go through a change in its pattern designation.

In 1937, the 341 Old Williamsburg pattern was introduced by A.H. Heisey and Company. At about the same time, the stock number 373 was dropped and the 373 stemware was adopted into the Old Williamsburg pattern. The stemware now had stock number 341. From 1911 to 1937, some items were dropped from the line while other items were added to the line. Some capacities were modified to better describe the item. Similarly, some changes in the 341 line were made going from 1937 to

1956. I have listed what was available in the Heisey Price Lists near these dates. See the production tables with this article for items offered for these times.

When the Heisey plant closed, Imperial purchased the 373 (341) molds. Later, Lancaster Colony purchased the molds from Imperial when they closed. Besides crystal, Imperial produced the 373 (341) stemware in about 12 colors. Lancaster Colony also produced several colors.

Heisey produced 373 mainly in crystal. However, the goblet is known in Alexandrite, Amber, Limelight, and Dawn. I think these colors were more experimental than actual production.

The 373 bowl design is vertical panels with a scallop top. There is a plain band around the top between the top of the panel scallops and the top rim. The stem has vertical panels that curve to a knob effect near its top. The base is round and clear. Some pieces are signed with the Diamond H but this is not true for all sizes. Heisey would have added paper labels when they marketed this line in its later years.

BENEFIT AUCTION WRAP-UP

We who attended the 37th Annual Benefit Auction had a great time! Our two-day auction was held again at the GMP Local #244 Union Hall on 350 Hudson Ave in Newark on Friday-Saturday, April 9-10. This is the third year using this great site. The auction was well attended - approximately 100 guests and members each day and we had 18 absentee bidders. We had 1086 lots of glass available from 39 consignors. We again heard many great comments about the glass we had this year - our consignors sent in nice clean glass and we only had to reject a few unsuitable pieces. We had the preview on Friday, April 9 from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. with the auction starting at 4 by auctioneer Craig Connelly. On Saturday, we opened the doors at 8:30 a.m., had our HCA Membership Meeting chaired by President Sue Kilgore at 9, and started our auction at 9:30.

How did we do financially? At press time, we have only preliminary numbers. We grossed over \$52,190 and after consignors and expenses are paid, we estimate after expenses we will clear around \$12,850. We had a budget estimate of \$13,500. With the economy the way it is affecting us all, I feel we did well. FYI, last year we grossed \$63,677 and netted \$15,248 with our budget being \$13,800.

I want to publicly thank, on behalf of the HCA Board of Directors and staff, the thirty-eight volunteers who worked with us starting in January unpacking, identifying, cataloging, and repacking the glass and then working for three straight days until the auction was concluded. You make this event a success and HCA's largest fund-raiser. I have listed those who helped in a separate block. If you helped and are not listed, I apologize.

I would like to give special thanks: to Joe Harner, president of the Dayton Study Club and Dick Marsh, Buckeye Club member, who working together did all the little things which need done with little fanfare; to Board member Karen Taylo who single-handedly ran the clerk's office and auction software program, and who as HCA's webmaster, put all our auction information on the HCA website; and lastly to the Dayton Study Club who worked from start to finish in all parts of this auction.

A "THANK YOU" must also go to Craig Connelly, Auctioneer, and his three cohorts, Jeff Baird, Tim Hughes, and Gary Babcock. They sold our glass and kept us in stitches! Concessionaire extraordinaire Gerry Dush and his gang again served the world's best pies and other food, and GMP Local #244's own Jerry West did everything he could to provide us great facilities and went the "extra mile" to make our auction a success.
