

Second Annual Heisey Easter Egg Hunt

The Heisey Glass Museum and Veterans Park was "hopping" with activity for the Second Annual Heisey Easter Egg Hunt, sponsored by the Buckeye Heisey Collectors Club of Newark, Ohio. The hunt took place on Saturday, March 30 at 10:00 a.m. in Veterans Park in the grassy area between the Buckingham and Sherwood Davidson Homes.

The area was roped off to reserve it for hidden Easter eggs. Peering over the ropes, over 40 children, ranging in age from 3—12 years scoped out their strategy to find the most Easter eggs. There were over 850 eggs filled with candy, small favors, free entry to the museum tickets and three special eggs. The special eggs had \$10 gift certificates to the Museum gift shop. When the clock struck 10:00 a.m., the ropes were dropped and the basket filling began. What took so long for the Easter Bunny to hide was collected in the record breaking time of less than two minutes!

After the rush was over and all eggs were gathered, the children and their parents were welcomed into the museum for an Open House. Homemade cookies and punch were served in the lower level, as the Heisey Punch Cup Bunny Craft and a Heisey Easter Basket Coloring Contest took place. The craft raised \$130.00 at \$5.00 a cup. The Coloring Contest winner's artwork is showcased on the front cover of this issue of Heisey News.

While the children made their bunny crafts, the parents were able to view the new Spring Theme Home Collection display of all Flamingo colored glass which filled the four large cases in the lower level. The Home Collection display is maintained and showcased by the Buckeye Club's personal collections. Many families toured the museum after their craft, coloring and refreshments. Buckeye Club members were scattered throughout the museum to show off the glass and answer questions.

Special thanks goes to Debbie Polling for donating all of the pre-made Easter baskets and many candy items that were prizes for the Coloring Contest. We would not have had the quality of prizes had it not been for her generous gift.

The Second Annual Heisey Easter Egg Hunt was a beautiful success. Many families were reached and educated about Heisey Glass and our museum. It was great to see young children and their parents active in our museum and enjoying it as much as we do.

2013 All Heisey Spring Benefit Auction Wrap-up

Those who attended the 40th Annual Spring All Heisey Benefit Auction had a great time! Our two-day auction was held again at the GMP Local #244 Union Hall on 350 Hudson Ave in Newark on Friday-Saturday, April 5-6, 2013. The auction was well attended with over 104 guests and members each day and we had 16 absentee bidders. We had 1,118 lots of glass available from 50 consignors. We heard many great comments about the glass we had this year. Our consignors sent in nice clean glass and we only had to reject a few unsuitable pieces during our cataloging sessions. This year moved the preview and auction starting time to earlier on Friday. Folks seemed to like the earlier start! We had the preview on Friday from 12:30 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. with the auction starting after preview. On Saturday, we opened the doors at 8:30 a.m., had our HCA Membership Meeting chaired by President Jay Barker at 9:00 a.m., and started our auction at 9:30 a.m.

How did we do financially? One never knows what to predict! At press time we have only preliminary numbers. We grossed \$57,982.50 and after consigners and expenses are paid, we estimate we will net around \$14,520. We had a budget estimate of \$14,000. Last year we grossed \$60,316, netted \$14,217 with our 2012 budget estimate of \$16,350. The main difference between this year and last year was that we had less "high end" glass for auction but our net increased because we think the lower end glass did very well this year. We all hope this trend continues.

I want to publicly thank, on behalf of the HCA Board of Directors and Staff, the nearly fifty volunteers who worked with us starting in January unpacking, identifying, cataloging, and repacking the glass and then working for three straight days until the auction was concluded. You make this event a success and HCA's largest fundraiser. Those who helped are listed on page 14. If you helped and are not listed, I apologize. I must also share with you that every board member (all but one was there) and their friends and spouses stepped up and worked as volunteers the entire time!

I would like to give special thanks to Joe Harner, president of the Dayton Study Club and Dick Marsh, president of the Buckeye Study Club, who working together did all the little things which need to be done to help make the auction successful; to Board member Karen Taylo and Roy Eggert who ran the clerk's office and auction software program; to Dan Kilgore who stepped up and helped me whenever asked, particularly when I under the weather; and lastly to the Dayton and Buckeye Study Club members who worked from start to finish in all parts of this auction.



A big "Thank You" must also go to Craig Connelly, Auctioneer and his cohorts. They sold our glass and kept us in stitches! Concessionaire extraordinaire Gerry Dush and his gang again served the world's best pies and other food. GMP Local #244's own Jerry West did everything he could to provide us great facilities and went the "extra mile" to make our auction a success.

Finally, I would like to thank all the consignors who consigned and donated glass to HCA and to all the auction attendees and absentee bidders who purchased that wonderful Heisey Glass. Hope to see all of you at the Convention in June. Happy Heisey Hunting!!

Please note the blank list contains space for twenty lots. However, each member is allowed to submit forty lots for the committee to select from. Remember, this auction benefits your Association. We hope, like last year, that Study Clubs will consider donating glass for this auction. a great project for them! Even if you do not belong to a study club this is a great opportunity for you to support YOUR museum by donating a piece of Heisey. And you don't have to consign glass to make a donation! To continue our tradition for this event, we are maintaining our low consignment fee of 20% with a minimum consignment fee of \$5. This means that for anything that sells for \$25 or less, the consignment fee will still be \$5.

As you prepare your lists, please make them as descriptive as possible since the committee will be using them to select glass for the auction. In particular please check for damage. 




