## **HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2014 SPRING AUCTION**

We have finished cataloging the items for the 2014 Spring HCA Auction. Boy, what a job that was. We ended up with 1,452 lots of glass representing the full range of production of the Heisey Glass Company from their beginnings until the doors closed in 1957. There is something for everyone in this auction from the standard production to true rarities that you never are given a chance to buy.

This is the auction to come to if you would like to start a collection, find the ideal wedding gift, or if you are a long time collector needing to add a special piece to your collection. The auction abounds in those old standbys of 1469 Ridgeleigh, 1503 and 5003 Crystolite, 1540 and 5004 Lariat, 1567 Plantation, 507 Orchid etch, and 515 Heisey Rose etch. But even among some of the more common patterns are pieces that you do not see often. Lot 25 is a perfect 1503 Crystolite cologne while lot 29 contains both of the footed baskets in 1540 Lariat. Two very special pieces in 1567 Plantation are the coupe plate (lot 861) and the flat candy box (862). In 507 Orchid etch, we have 2351 Newton 12 ounce sodas one without optic (1270) and one with optic (1271). Additionally, there is a 2401 Oakwood 12 ounce soda/optic (1272) and a 4182 Thin 6" plate (1273).

This is an auction in which candlesticks and candelabrum seem plentiful. There are plenty of pairs and singles to please any collector (they make great gifts, too). There are almost every 300 Old Williamsburg candelabra represented including a single two light with Alexandrite bobeches (874). Other harder to find candlesticks include pairs in 107 Wellington in Moongleam (540), 21 Aristocrat 11" (602), 1540 Lariat three light candleblocks (883), 341 Old Williamsburg footed epergne candleholder (885), 112 Mercury 9" in Flamingo (895), 28 Elizabeth 9"(937), 68 Hepplewhite 9" with cutting (939), and 8 Jacobean 9" (941).

If cuttings are what turn you on, we have a magnificent set of 926 George VI cutting including many pieces of 5013 Shasta stemware, two 4036 ½ Marshall decanters, and a 4404 Universal hollow stem champagne (lots 918-924). Lots 476 through 485 offers a variety of very elaborately cut pieces which must have been special order or presentation pieces (lots 484 and 485 grace the cover of our auction catalog). Also special in this auction are two pieces with cuttings done by the Tuthill Cut Glass Company on Heisey blanks: 429 Plain Panel Recess 9" nappy (1329) and 2401 Oakwood decanter (1338).

There are some very nice deep plate etchings and carvings including a 4056 Caesar salad bowl with 5003 Nimrod (639), 4163 Whaley mug with 465 Golf Scene (1199), and a 2401 Oakwood 10 ounce soda with 3 Motor Boat (1394). Circus etch items include a 4027 Bethel Decanter with 493 Camel (854) and 2052 bar glasses with 471 Rube (855), 475 Elephant (856), and 476 Western Scene (857). Lots 1194-1197 includes a range of 4052 National pieces with 467 Tally Ho while lot 1198 is two 5048 Rooster Head cocktails with the same etch.

We have the full range of colors that Heisey produced represented in this auction. Some of the more unusual lots include a set of three 2323 Navy 6" plates (655), 4085 Saturn 9" ball vase in Zircon (850), and a 4225 Cobel 1 quart cocktail shaker in Sahara with unusual cutting (908). In earlier colors we have a 56 Sweet Scroll Opal match holder and a 1280 Winged Scroll Emerald pin tray. There are many pieces of 1280 Winged Scroll for the tobacco sets also in the auction. In addition, there are 4" nappies in Vaseline in 1280 Winged Scroll (1377) and 160 Locket on Chain (1378), as well as an Opalescent one in 1220 Punty Band (1392).

Interesting pieces in other early Heisey patterns include all three footed rose bowls in 325 Pillows (864 and 1110), 335 Prince of Wales Plumes (901), and 343 Sunburst (902). There is a great 337 Touraine half gallon jug (654). In colonial patterns, there is a lot consisting of 4" and 5" 341 Puritan mushroom covers (653), a five piece 150 Banded Flute bedroom set (903), all four sizes of 341Puritan footed candy jars (904-907), and all three sizes of 8025 Banded Diamond Foot bowls - 9" fruit, 5" mint, and individual nut (912-914).

If you want a punch set there are several in the auction but the two outstanding ones are a 365 Old Queen Anne set with nine cups (947) and a Flamingo set in 433 Greek Key with 12 cups (948).

You will find plenty of condiment pieces, lavender jars, perfumes, and cruets for the item collector. Two of the rarer cruets are a 461 Convex Circle (1413) and 356 Little Prince (1415).

Other unusual lots include 101 Tropical Fish (851), 5064 Hydrangea claret with no decoration (1318), and a 7103 "Hood" sterilizer jar – complete (1396). A curiosity lot contains two pieces of cullet, one Cobalt and one Sahara (1149). Space limitations prevent me from going on, but as you can see there is plenty for offer in the auction. I hope you will be able to join me and all of your other Heisey friends for this great event. I look forward to seeing you.

## 41st ANNUAL 2014 ALL HEISEY SPRING BENEFIT AUCTION Dave Spahr


Our 41th Annual Spring Benefit Auction will be held April 4 & 5, 2014 at last year's location, the GMP Local #244 Union Hall at 350 Hudson Ave. in Newark, Ohio. We finished cataloging the glass after the last month's newsletter deadline and have 1452 lots from 49 consigners. This is our largest auction in quite some time! Craig Connelly and his crew will again call our auction and hopefully the "Pie Man" will be there too!

We have received some wonderful glass for the auction. Walter Ludwig will give you a full preview in an article elsewhere in this newsletter. You can now visit the museum and see some of the best pieces in the auction on display in the case just inside the Museum entrance.

The auction catalog, preview hours, auction hours, absentee bid instructions, absentee bid form, bidding information, and most importantly the list of sale items will be on our websitewww.HeiseyMuseum.org/, on or about March 5th and hopefully sooner. This will give you a full month of looking and evaluating items and preparing for this great auction! Names, addresses, and telephone numbers of area hotels/motels is being published in this newsletter to assist you in making reservations. You will want to arrive in time to attend the one and one half hour preview on Friday April 4, 2013, 11:30 AM to 1:00 PM with the auction beginning at 1:00 PM. On Saturday April 5, 2013, the doors will open at 8:30 AM, the annual membership meeting will be held at 9:00 AM with the auction beginning at 9:30 AM.

We have again not having a full mailing of the auction catalog. We will mail copies on or about March 5th (sooner if possible) to members who consigned glass, purchased glass, or put in absentee bids in 2012 and/or 2013. We will also provide a copy to any member who wishes one- you need to call the museum after March 12th to get your copy. If you were a consignor, buyer, or absentee bidder wait a few days before you call- give time for your copy to arrive in the mail.

As you know, the Spring Benefit Auction is HCA's largest fundraiser and 2014 will be another challenging year financially for the organization. If you can't make it to Newark for the auction this year I encourage you to look on line at the list of great glass and put in an absentee bid. This is a way for every member to support your association. Forms and instructions are available on the website as well.



Absentee bidders listen up! We have included the absentee bid instructions and form in this newsletter for you to look over and use including shipping information. Please note they need to be submitted by Tuesday, April 1, 2014, by 4:00 PM local time. We are continuing a successful change in that we are having absentee bidders make their own arrangements to have their glass shipped. The absentee glass will be available for pickup at the Museum on Tuesday, April 8, 2014, after 10:00AM. Absentee bidders will have to pay their shippers directly. We will cooperate with your shipper and assist where we can. HCA simply does not have the volunteers, materials on hand, and staffing capability to do this task. We have listed those shippers in the past and have heard no complaints however HCA does not endorse them nor is HCA responsible for their performance.

As you read this newsletter I will be looking for help at the auction - for "Vannas" to hold up the glass, for folks to help move glass during the auction, and to help clean up after the auction. If you would like to help, please contact me. It is a great way to learn about the glass and meet some great volunteers.

## 2014 Heisey Spring Benefit Auction Absentee Bid Instructions

As absentee bidders, we will bid competitively for you at the HCA Spring Benefit Auction, April 4-5, 2014. In case of duplicate bids, the earliest postmark wins. Bids must reflect the listing in the catalog as to lot number, pattern, description, and condition. The minimum absentee bid per lot is \$15.

You set the maximum amount you are willing to pay on each lot. If successful, the remainder will be refunded. Please use good judgment in arriving at your maximum bid figure. Remember, there are minimum limits to raises that the auctioneer will accept (smaller items \$2.50, larger items \$5, \$10 or as much as \$25). Lots containing multiple items will be as one lot to the successful bidder. Normally, these are not split up, however, there may be some exceptions to this.

Please indicate on your bid the desired condition of the item on which you are bidding. We have endeavored to describe all items to the best of our ability and a bid on an item reflects your acceptance of the condition as listed. (As you know, if no flaws are noted, that means the glass is in generally good condition.) If you mark your bid "near mint only," we will use no discretion in your bid. If there is a variance on a lot not called in the catalog (such as unlisted damage or a difference in the number of items in a lot), we will not bid on that lot for you. Please use the form (or a copy) available in the Heisey News, or from this catalog, or from our website www.HeiseyMuseum.org to submit your bid. Absentee bids can be submitted by e-mail, fax, or postal service.

**PAYMENT** Cash, check, cashier's check, or money order payable to HCA Auction, and Visa/MasterCard/ DiscoverCard accepted. A 5% buyer's premium will be added. Buyer's premium is deleted for cash, cashier's check, money order, or approved check payments. You may send a separate check for each lot or you may send one check covering the maximum amount of all bids. Absentee Bidders must make their own shipping arrangements. See Shipping section below for further information.

In addition, if you would like to pay by check, Please consider leaving the amount blank. Designate in the memo blank of your check an amount not to exceed the total amount of your bids. The Auction Manager or HCA Treasurer will fill in the exact amount of your purchase, thus greatly cutting back on refunds. Surplus bid money will be refunded. Send in a self-addressed, stamped envelope to return your checks. HCA reserves the right to reject any bid.

**SHIPPING** Buyers must make their own shipping arrangements including payments for shipping directly to the shipper. 




