The fun of Convention was made possible by your generosity and support and all of you are greatly appreciated ! Here's to the FUN of the rest of the year!

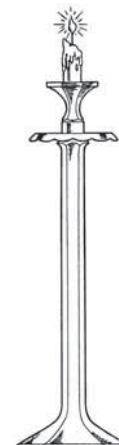

## Looking for “Table Talks”

### News from the Archives

Throughout the life of the *Heisey News*, a handy, yet educational, filler editors used to save their day was the inclusion of a *Table Talk* in the center fold of the newsletter. These four to eight page missives were to aid Heisey company salesmen in building awareness for their glass product and were sent throughout the country to stores everywhere which carried Heisey glassware. They were started in the 1920’s by the Lytle Advertising Agency in Dayton, Ohio, longtime partners with the Heisey company to generate effective ad campaigns not only for the trade, but for the buying public. The topics covered new design trends, patterns, colors, new pictorial ads, and news of the Heisey company. I was always delighted to find a copy in the *Heisey News* because they opened a new area of collecting knowledge in understanding how the company developed and promoted Heisey glass.

In the Heisey Museum archives are a number of these publications. Our “Great Sort” project has unearthed some editions misfiled, but as we come to an end of the sort, we find we have far fewer than we would wish. In reporting to the board of directors progress in the archives, they have developed a desire to try to capture as many of the missing *Table Talks* from the archival collection as possible and publish the collection in a soft-bound book for sale through the museum shop. They are asking for your help by either a donation of editions or allowing us to use your copy. Copies would best be sent in digital format - suggest jpg.

We have included a list of the issues we do not have. They are identified by year, publication number, and month. One thing we found is that publication in later years was sporadic and in some cases a few years passed before they resumed. Salesmen were unhappy about that and correspondence indicates they frequently urged the company to bring them back. We want to bring the *Table Talks* back too – only this time as an educational tool for collectors and lovers of Heisey glass everywhere.

Goblets, plates, vases, candlesticks, flower bowls and a multitude of other items in fine glass by Heisey meet the situation exactly. Among these other items are mayonnaise bowls of various patterns. Decanters are often pleasantly received tokens. There are splendid beverage glasses to go with them. Ice tubs with silver handles and tongs are highly acceptable.

There is also delight in awarding and winning the large, handled sandwich plates, and relish and hors d'oeuvre dishes. Mini, jelly and bon bon dishes many times prove charming.

Bring out the idea to your customer that prizes such as these win for her a reputation as a smart hostess and the recipients of such prizes are always wonderfully delighted.

A good plan is to display Heisey items from time to time as bridge prize suggestions. It will be a successful feature if you make it big and prominent enough.

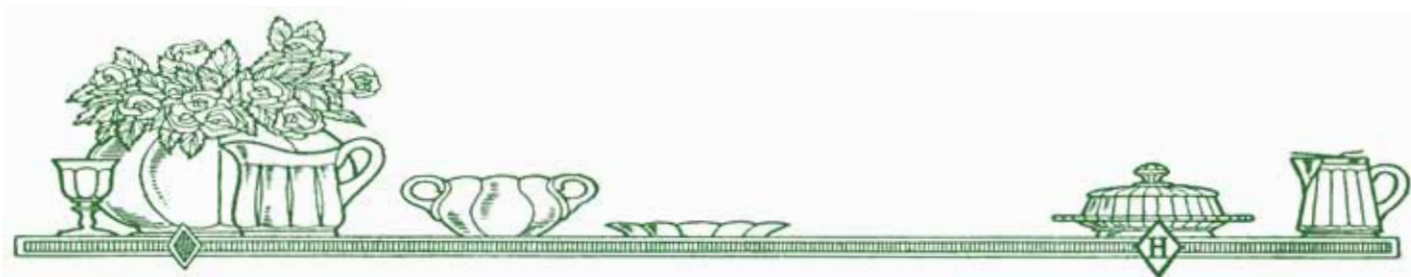

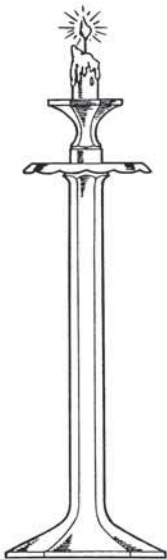
