## Highlights of the 2014 Fall Auction

The gnomes have been working diligently here in Newark in preparation for the upcoming Fall Auction which will be held on October 11. With 306 lots this year it will be the largest Fall Auction that HCA has staged. The items run the gamut from the fairly common to the super rare. The aim was to have something to appeal to every level of collector from the neophyte to the advanced collector. I assure you we have something in this auction that will pique the interest of even the most jaded of collectors who thinks he has seen it all.

The auction starts out with a good assortment of creams and sugars with the most unusual being the table set cream/sugar/lid in the 357 Prison Stripe pattern (Lot 17). Among other early pattern pieces is a 325 Pillows salt and pepper (34), 335 Prince of Wales Plumes ½ gallon pitcher (46), 357 Prison Stripe cruet (51), 1776 Kalonyal 4 oz. cruet (55), 1776 Kalonyal spooner (81), and a 8" round nappy in 462 ½ Nail (82).

The candlestick collector will want to consider the 104 Crocus two light (104), 117 Bamboo with Moongleam stem and foot (114), and the 123 Mercury insert and frog (115). In addition we have a pair of 5 Patrician two light candelabra (244). For the smoking item collector we have a set of 1401 Empress ash trays just missing the Flamingo one (Lots 91-95) and a 411 Tudor cigarette jar with the ash tray cover enhanced with a non-Heisey cutting (99). # Words From Your Curator

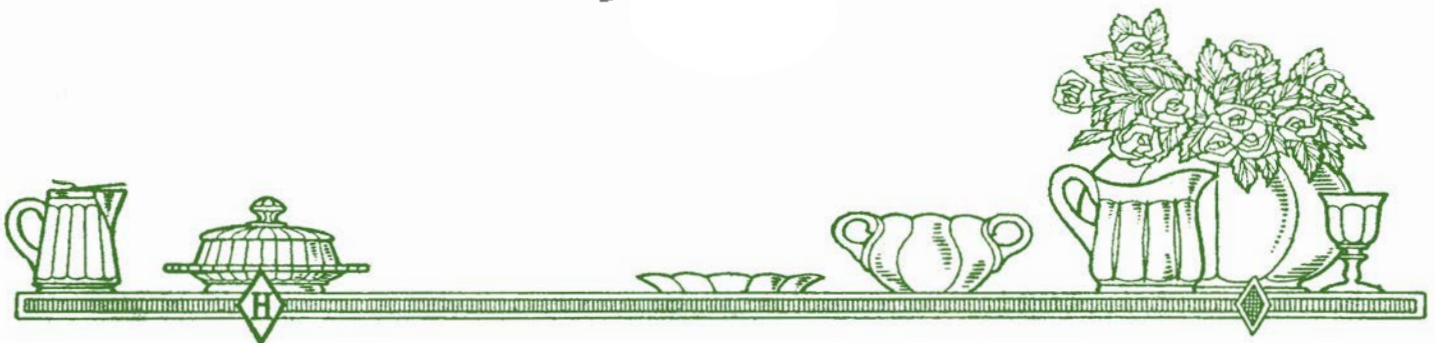

## Highlights of the 2014 Fall Auction cont'd from front page

If 507 Orchid etch is your thing, rarer items include 4121 Glenn marmalade (202), 3311 Velvedere sherry (206), a 1519 Waverly 7" salad bowl (207), and a 4198 Cynthia 12" vase (209).

The cutting collector will like the 2930 Plain and Fancy tumbler with 926 George VI (235), a set of 4054 Coronation 8 ounce sodas with 888 Madeira (239), a 5072 Rose Stem goblet with 980 Moonglo (240), and a 4044 New Era 5 ½" plate with 828 Stardust (242).

We have an unusual number of animals in the auction, several of which are seen infrequently: 1 Mother Rabbit (167) accompanied by a 3 Bunny Heads Up (168); the full Wood Duck family – 20 Mother (170), 21 Floating Duckling (172), and 22 Standing Duckling (171); 3 Small Elephant in Amber (179), and a 101 Tropical Fish Piece (184).

The barware collector will be interested in the 1460 Flame tumbler (216), a 2355 Cloverleaf 3 ounce bar (218), 3407 Overdorf beer mug in Cobalt with crystal handle (277). Additional mugs available are a 1434 Tom and Jerry (38) and a 1591 Elephant handled child's fairy tale (191).

This auction has an unusual number of Cobalt lots with at least 18 available. Among them is a 3397 Gascony floral bowl (278), a 1440 Arch floral bowl (279), and 4045 Heron 4" (281) and 7" (282) ball vases. In Alexandrite we have cordials in both 3390 Carcassonne (230) and 3381 Creole (231).

Other rarely seen color lots include a 3480 Koors water lamp in Flamingo (116), 8047 Cane and Bar ½ pint tankard in Custard (132), 4059 water bottle with cut neck in Flamingo (163), 243 Visible Cookware 9" deep casserole with lid in Vaseline (214). Crystal unusual lots include 341 Puritan shallow punch bowl (301) – no base but it would make a magnificent bird bath, an unusual goblet with 8026 Knob and Navel stem and 5077 Legionnaire bowl (137), and a 1408 Panel and Diamond Point goblet with the non-serrated stem (144).





Finally if you are looking for Favor Vases this is the auction for you with nine of them available (Lots 256 – 264). There is a crystal 4230; Cobalt 4227, 4231, and 4232; Sahara 4228, 4230, and 4231; Moongleam 4228; and a Flamingo 4231.

Space prevents me from listing more but the full auction catalog is available to you in this issue of the Heisey News. Please consider coming to this outstanding auction, or, if you cannot make it, send in an absentee bid on any of the great lots available. I will be there and I hope to see you, too.

# 2014 HCA Heisey Fall Auction

## General Auction Terms and Conditions:

- 1) All lots sold in numerical cataloged order.
- 2) Payment: Cash, traveler's check, certified check or personal check or money order with proper ID. Visa, MasterCard and Discover cards are accepted. 5% buyers premium. Buyers premium deleted for cash or check payment. Cash only payment may be specified for individual bidders at HCA's request.
- 3) HCA has endeavored to describe all items to the best of their ability; however this is not a warranty.
- 4) All items are sold as is and where is. The auctioneer has the right to make any verbal corrections at the time of sale and to provide additional information. Inspection is welcomed during preview and before the item is sold.
- 5) In the case of a disputed bid the auctioneers have the authority to settle disputes to the best of their ability and their decision(s) is/are final. Resale of items will be handled at the auctioneer's discretion.
- 6) The auctioneer has the right to set opening bids and reject any bid raise not in line with established bid increments. Items are sold without reserve, unless advertised otherwise.
- 7) All sales are final and all items must be paid for each day of sale. A moving and storage fee may be assessed for items not picked up within seven (7) calendar days after the last day of sale of the auction.
- 8) Buyers assume full responsibility for items once they are sold unless otherwise specified by HCA or the auctioneer. Buyer must have receipt in hand to pick up items.
- 9) HCA (an auction firm) and all auctioneers used by HCA are licensed by the Ohio Department of Agriculture and bonded in favor of the state.
- 10) Bidding on any item indicates acceptance of these Terms and Conditions of Auction.

- 1) The minimum starting bid per lot is \$15.

# 2014 HCA Heisey Fall Auction

## Absentee Bid Instructions

As absentee bidders, we will bid competitively for you at the HCA Heisey Fall Auction, October 11, 2014. In case of duplicate bids, the earliest postmark wins. Bids must reflect the listing in the catalog as to lot number, pattern, description, and condition. The minimum absentee bid per lot is \$15. Absentee Bid form in page 18 of this publication.

You set the maximum amount you are willing to pay on each lot. If successful, the remainder will be refunded. Please use good judgment in arriving at your maximum bid figure. Remember, there are minimum limits to raises that the auctioneer will accept (smaller items \$2.50, larger items \$5, \$10 or as much as \$25). Lots containing multiple items will be as one lot to the successful bidder. Normally, these are not split up, however, there may be some exceptions to this.

Please indicate on your bid the desired condition of the item on which you are bidding. We have endeavored to describe all items to the best of our ability and a bid on an item reflects your acceptance of the condition as listed. (As you know, if no flaws are noted, that means the glass is in generally good condition.) If you mark your bid "near mint only," we will use no discretion in your bid. If there is a variance on a lot not called in the catalog (such as unlisted damage or a difference in the number of items in a lot), we will not bid on that lot for you. Please use the form (or a copy) available in the *Heisey News*, or from this catalog, or from our website [www.HeiseyMuseum.org](http://www.HeiseyMuseum.org) to submit your bid. Absentee bids can be submitted by e-mail, fax, or postal service.

**PAYMENT** Cash, check, cashier's check, or money order payable to HCA Auction, and Visa/MasterCard/Discover Card accepted. A 5% buyer's premium will be added. Buyer's premium is deleted for cash, cashier's check, money order, or approved check payments. You may send a separate check for each lot or you may send one check covering the maximum amount of all bids. Absentee Bidders must make their own shipping arrangements. See Shipping section below for further information.

In addition, if you would like to pay by check, **Please** consider leaving the amount blank. Designate in the memo blank of your check an amount not to exceed the total amount of your bids. The Auction Manager or HCA Treasurer will fill in the exact amount of your purchase, thus greatly cutting back on refunds. Surplus bid money will be refunded. Send in a self-addressed, stamped envelope to return your checks. HCA reserves the right to reject any bid.

**SHIPPING** Buyers must make their own shipping arrangements including payments for shipping directly to the shipper. Glass is available to be picked up by your shipper on Tuesday, October 14, 2014, after 10:00 AM at the National Heisey Glass Museum, 169 W. Church St., Newark, OH 43055. HCA is aware of the following area shippers: Express Pack and Ship: 740-366-1325, Pakmail: 740-522-2564, and UPS Store 3910: 614-939-5195. HCA is not responsible for any services provided by these vendors. HCA will work with these vendors to make sure your glass is available.

**BID SUBMISSION** Absentee bids must be received no later than **Tuesday October 7, 2014, at 4:00 p.m. Eastern Standard Time.** When using a credit card number, bids must be faxed to (740) 345-9638 using the absentee bidding form. When your Fax is complete, please contact the Museum to ensure it has arrived and is removed from the Museum Fax machine as soon as it arrives. The Absentee Forms with personal checks, et. al., must be mailed to Absentee Bids, National Glass Heisey Museum, 169 W. Church St., Newark, OH 43055. HCA, Inc. must have credit card information or cash, a personal check, money order, or travelers check in its possession prior to executing a bid.

In 1969, a group of nine Heisey collectors from in and around Newark, Ohio, met and formed the Newark Heisey Collectors Club in order to share their finds and their knowledge.

A short-lived national club for Heisey collectors, operating out of California, announced its intention to dissolve in July, 1971. There was so much interest in a new national club to be based in Newark, that the Newark group, by then having 20 members, voted to organize such a club. On October 14, 1971, the Heisey Collectors of America, Inc., a non-profit corporation dedicated to the collection and preservation of the products of A. H. Heisey & Co. was founded. Membership was opened to collectors nationwide on January 1, 1972.

One of the goals of the organization was to found a Museum in Newark, Ohio, for preserving Heisey glass. In July of 1973, the club was offered as a gift, one of Newark's oldest and finest homes to use as a Museum. The house, built in 1851 for Samuel Dennis King, a prominent attorney, had been lived in by members of the King family for all the intervening years. It was now to be torn down to make way for a hotel. The house was accepted by the club and was moved to its new site in the Veterans' Park at 26th and West 24th Street in September, 1973. After extensive renovation and repair, the Museum was opened in September, 1974, and was dedicated in June, 1975, during the HCA's annual convention.

In 1984 the HCA accepted the rights to the Diamond H trademark and in January, 1985, purchased all of the original Heisey molds except those for the Old Willoughby pattern.

By 1991, membership in HCA reached the four thousand mark. With increasing interest in Heisey glassware, the museum's collections began to outgrow the King House. The Board of Directors initiated an expansion project and by June, 1992, ground was broken for a 6,000 square-foot addition. In June, 1993, the new wing was opened, featuring two large galleries, a media room, a multi-purpose room and a climate-controlled archival facility. The King House remains a vital part of the museum complex and was rehabilitated during the expansion.

The National Heisey Glass Museum with its collection of more than 5000 pieces of glassware, tools and other memorabilia remains a Mecca for Heisey collectors and glass collectors in general. Thousands of visitors come from all over the United States and the world to enjoy the legacy of American craftsmanship created by A. H. Heisey and preserved by Heisey Collectors of America, Inc.

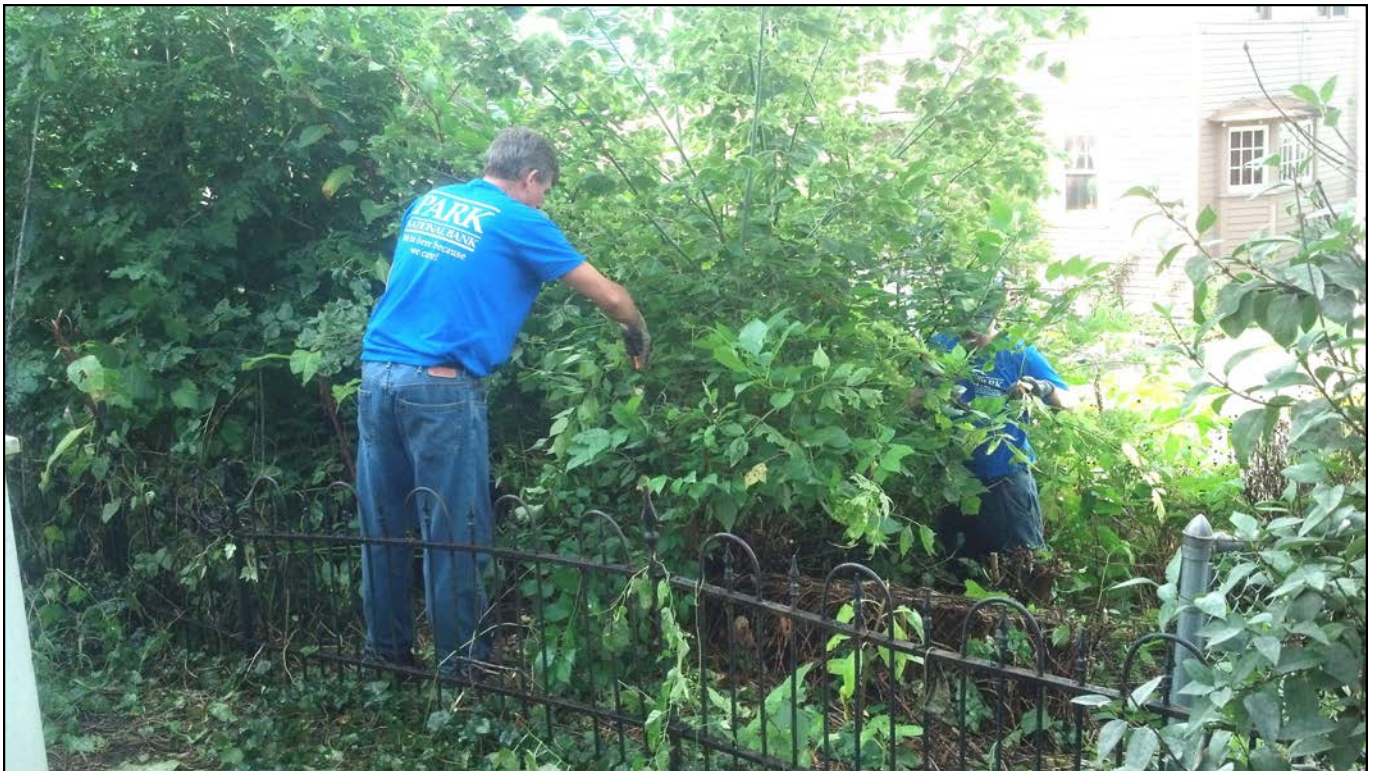


## Thank You Park National Bank!

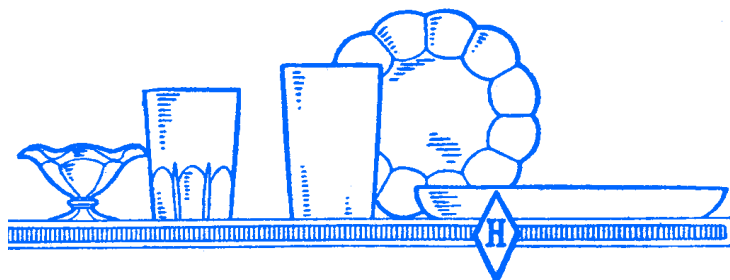
