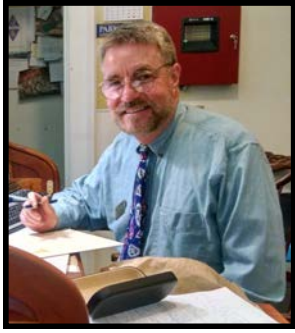

2015 ELEVENTH ANNUAL HEISEY FALL AUCTION

Dave Spahr

Our annual All Heisey Fall Auction is scheduled for **Saturday, October 3, 2015** and will be held at the GMP Union Hall, 350 Hudson Avenue, in Newark. This is the same location where we held our Spring Benefit Auction. Thanks for all the past support you have given for this fund-raiser for the National Heisey Glass Museum. Please place this date on your calendar - **October 3, 2015**.

As you read this, you will have approximately one week left to get your glass list to us for consideration by the committee. The deadline for submitting your glass list is **May 12, 2015**. A blank list for your use is on page 7 of this newsletter. It can also be downloaded from the Museum website. The list contains space for twenty lots. Each member is allowed to submit **forty lots** for the committee to select from. Remember, this auction benefits your association. Please consider selecting a special piece of Heisey for a donation to be auctioned off - 100% of the sale price goes to support HCA and the museum. Donations don't count towards your 40 lot limit. We hope like last year, that Study Clubs will consider donating glass for this auction - a great project for them! If you do not belong to a study club this is a great opportunity for you to support YOUR museum by donating a piece of Heisey. And you don't have to consign glass to make a donation! To continue our tradition for this event, we are maintaining our low consignment fee of 20% with a minimum consignment fee of \$5. This means anything that sells for \$25 or less the consignment fee will still be \$5.

As you prepare your lists, please make them as descriptive as possible since the committee will be using them to select glass for the auction. In particular please check for damage - **we are selecting only undamaged glass** for this special Fall auction. The committees' goal this year is to have a larger auction than in past years which had been targeted at two hundred (200) lots-perhaps three hundred lots or better!. How can you get your glass selected? Here are some clues. Consideration will be given to include diversity in color, etchings, cuttings, and patterns. We want no duplicates and we want glass for both the novice and experienced collector. Please make sure you size each lot so it is worth at least \$25 - and I know it is a guess! The minimum opening bid will be \$15.00. As mentioned earlier, **we will not select damaged glass**.

The selection committee will be busy after May 12th and will contact you on or about June 1 to let you know which lots of glass from your list have been selected. Hopefully, you will be able to bring your glass to Newark and drop it off at the museum when you come to the Convention on June 17-20, 2015. Your deadline for getting glass to the museum is July 7, 2015.

This event has been a successful Fall moneymaker for HCA and beneficial to those who consign and those who buy Heisey glass. Plan on attending and participating in the Auction. 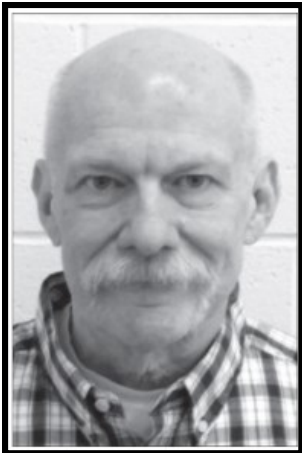

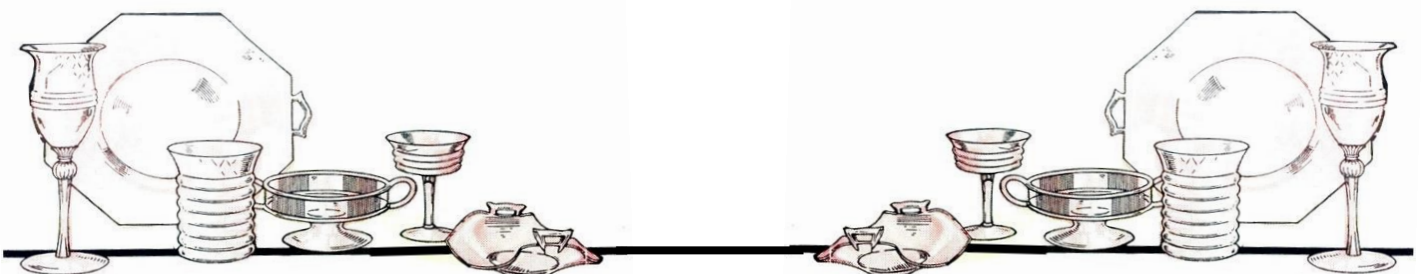
Glass ID Session and Show and Tell at Convention By Walter Ludwig

2015 SPRING ALL HEISEY BENEFIT AUCTION WRAP-UP

Dave Spahr, Auction Chair

Those who didn't attend the 42nd annual Spring All Heisey Benefit Auction missed a really good event! Our two-day auction was held again at the GMP Union Hall at 350 Hudson Ave in Newark on Friday and Saturday, April 17&18, 2015. Attendance was high with over 100 guests and members each day - plus 18 absentee bidders. There were 1,462 lots of glass available from 50 consignors. The preview was on Friday from 10:30am—12:00pm with the auction starting at noon. Saturday began with the preview at 8:30am, the HCA Membership Meeting at 9:00am, followed by the auction at 9:30am.

How did we do financially? One never knows what to predict- it is nice to meet or exceed the budget! We grossed \$65,959.00 and after consignors and expenses are paid, we will net \$18,210. We had a 2015 budget estimate of \$14,250. Last year we grossed \$69,492.50, netted \$16,240 with our 2014 budget estimate of \$14,000. Even though we had less "high end" glass this year, our net profit increased because we had more donated glass, increased buyers' premiums and a reduction in auctioneer fees due to a lower gross sales. Our price per lot this year was \$45.12 compared to last year's average of \$47.84.

I want to publicly thank, on behalf of the HCA Board of Directors and Staff, the fifty one volunteers who worked with us starting in January unpacking, identifying, cataloging, and repacking the glass and then working for three straight days until the auction was concluded. You make this event a success and HCA's largest fundraiser. I have listed those who helped in a separate block. If you helped and are not listed, I apologize.

I would like to give special thanks: to Walter Ludwig who helped from start to finish lending his time and Heisey expertise whenever asked, to Joe Harner, president of the Dayton Study Club who did all the little things (and some big things) which needed to be done, to help make the auction successful,. To my wife Mary Ann Spahr who worked tirelessly in preparing the catalog listing of glass and other tasks too numerous to mention, to long time clerk Karen Taylo and Board Member Roy Eggert who ran the office and auction software program; to Dan & Sue Kilgore & Tom & Kathy Files who ran the hold back and check out area for us again, and lastly to the Dayton and Buckeye Study Club members who worked from start to finish in all parts of this auction.

A "THANK YOU" must also go to Craig Connelly, Auctioneer and his cohorts. They sold our glass and kept us in stitches! Concessionaire extraordinaire Gerry Dush and his gang again served the world's best pies and other food. GMP Local #244's own Jimmy Gill did everything he could to provide us great facilities.

Finally, I would like to thank all the consignors who consigned and donated glass to HCA and to all the auction attendees and absentee bidders who purchased that wonderful Heisey Glass. Hope to see all of you at the Convention in June. Happy Heisey Hunting!!

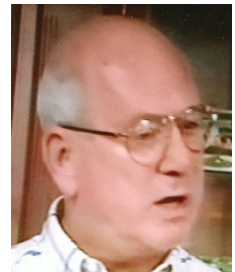

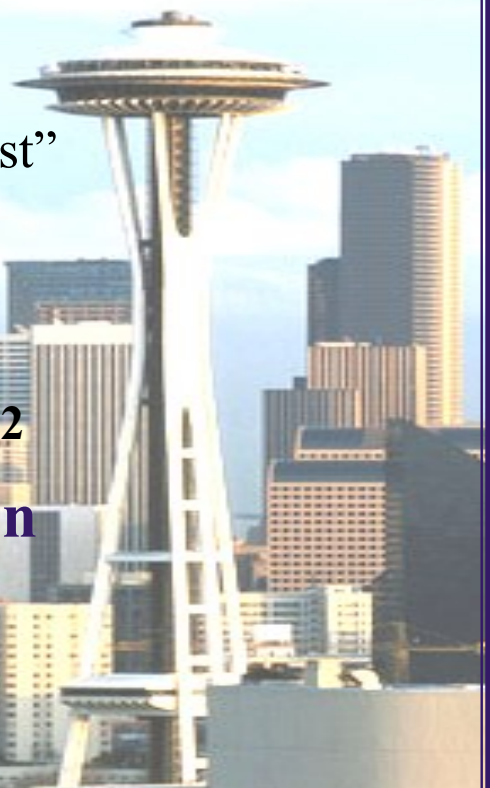
