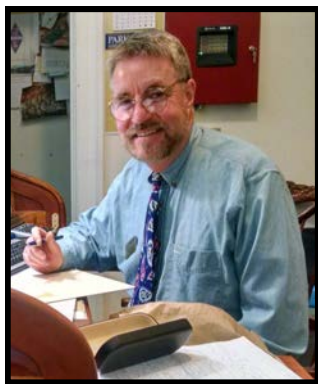
Words From Your Curator – Director

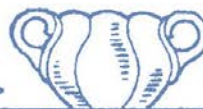

Heisey Down Under

David G. Malick

I caught the glass collecting bug over twenty years ago now. I did not inherit glass from any family members, nor do I even recall growing up with any special glassware that would have caused my interest in collecting. I am an historian by training and I do collect books and I do recall being in several antique stores over the years but I don't really ever remember paying any attention to glassware until I started collecting Carnival glass. The parents of a friend were antique dealers who specialized in high-end art glass like Tiffany and Stuben. The friend's suggestion was that we could collect Carnival glass since it was more affordable. We looked into it, bought a reference book and were soon hooked. We joined several clubs and started to learn about the companies that produced the glass and the other wares they made. From there we gained an appreciation for other types of glass and built small collections of stretch, opalescent, and crystal to complement our Carnival. We were always aware of Heisey and about six years ago we started to learn more about it since we have a dealer that specializes in Heisey in our main mall in Saginaw. A trip to Newark to visit the Heisey museum and attend the Spring auction was enough to start a new obsession.

Among the many lessons I have learned about collecting glass over the years, (e.g. buy what you like, avoid damage, buy quality), perhaps the most important was taught to me a wonderful couple of glass collectors and researchers from England, Glen and Stephen Thistlewood (www.carnivalglassworldwide.com). I first "met" Glen online via the daily mail list for the Woodland World Wide Carnival Glass Association. As passionate as Glen and Steve are about collecting and research, they are even more passionate about sharing information. I learned a lot about Carnival Glass from their answers to questions on the mail list and from their published research which includes a journal and several well researched and beautifully illustrated books. But the most important lesson I learned from them was to always appreciate the historical and cultural background of the glass I was so addicted to collecting. Without some understanding of the time and place in which the glass was produced and the artistry that went into the design of the glass all that would remain would simply be pretty glass.

Perhaps that is why I have always been fascinated by Heisey advertising and printed promotional materials. I have been fortunate to obtain several brochures which I have reprinted and have completed two volumes of a three volume set on Heisey Advertising (all available from www.lulu.com/oldcolonypub). Heisey was one of



the first glass companies to advertise to the public. They also advertised heavily in different trade publications. Heisey advertising is an enjoyable feature of collecting Heisey glassware. The advertisements are collectible in their own right, but their true value is found in the fact that they illustrate to later generations how the glass was used or was intended to be used and the features that its creators and sellers thought would be most appealing to the public. They provide the historical context of what the glass meant to both the buyers and the sellers in a time and place that is now quickly passing from living memory.

Recently Glen and Steve revived their *Network* journal for online distribution and in the first issue they show an illustration of Australian Carnival glass in a mail order catalog from Foy & Gibson, one of Australia's earliest department store chains. In the same catalog is a full page of Heisey glassware! The following examples are the first I have seen of Heisey advertising in mail order publications. I do not think anything similar exists in Sears or other catalogs with the exception of Athena in Montgomery Ward catalogs. These ads are even more unique because they clearly document that for a short period of time between 1919 and 1924, Heisey glassware was sold in Australia. I thank Glen and Steve for the lead on this important information. Full versions of these fascinating catalogs are available online from the University of Melbourne.

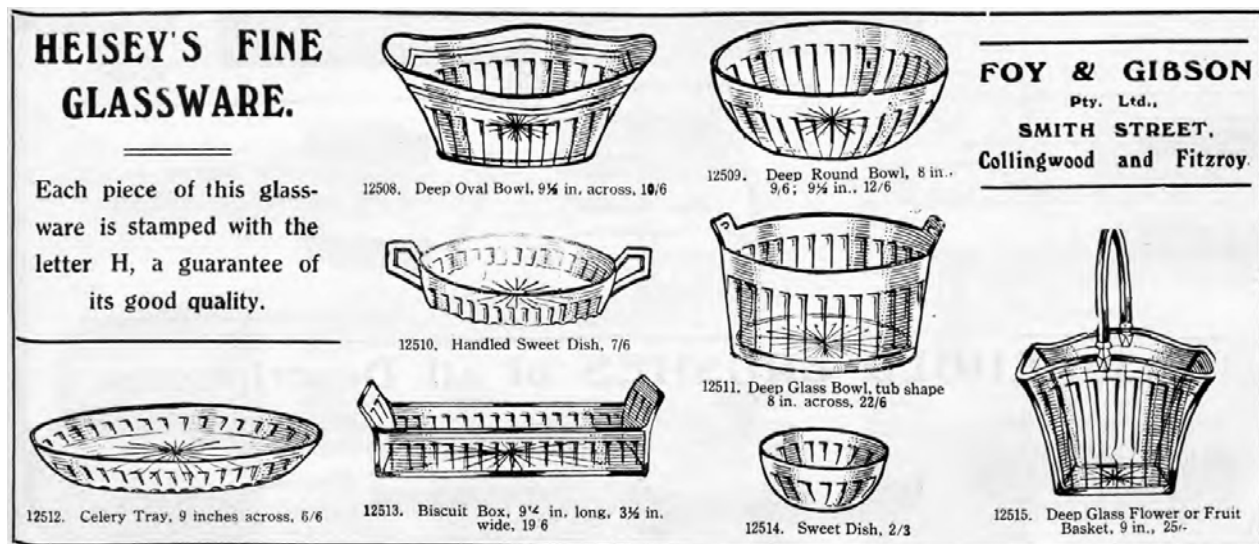


The first known Heisey ad appeared in catalog 57 for Summer 1919-1920 and featured a selection of ten pieces of 393 and 393 1/2 Narrow Flute. The same pieces appear in a slightly different layout in catalog number 58 for Winter 1920.



Summer Catalogue No. 57 (1919-1920)

Catalog 62 for Winter 1922 featured eight pieces of 393, 393 1/2 and 394 Narrow Flute along with a 465 Recessed Panel basket.



Winter Catalogue No. 62 (1922)

Catalog 66 for Autumn & Winter 1923 added 473 Narrow Flute with Rim and 451 Cross Lined Flute bowls to Narrow Flute pieces that appeared before. In addition, a 458 Colonial basket with 351 Mums etching is illustrated in a grouping of glass from other companies. Interestingly, the prices for items that appeared in the 1922 ad were lowered for the same items in 1923.

Heisey's Fine Glassware.

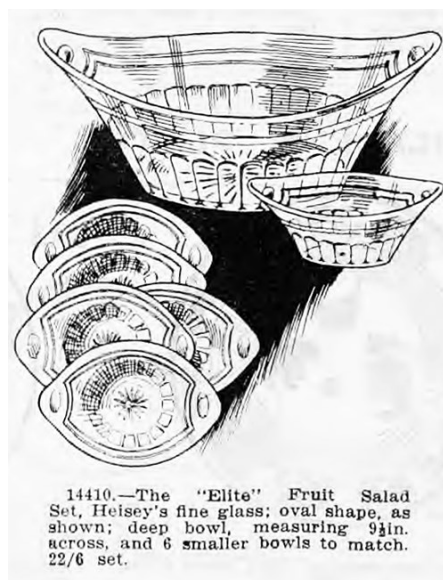
Autumn & Winter Catalogue No. 66 (1923)



Catalog 67 for Spring & Summer 1923-1924 repeated the main ad from catalog 66 but replaced the Colonial basket with a 394 Narrow Flute berry set.

Note on Prices

The pound was the currency of Australia until 1966. Prices are quoted in the catalogs in shillings and pence. Each shilling consisted of 12 pence. In 1924 an Australian shilling was worth roughly 25 cents in US currency. So the price for the seven piece berry set illustrated on the right would have been about \$5.63 in the United States. From pricing I have seen in a US newspaper ad from 1924 for a Heisey berry set, it seems like the price is almost twice as much as what it would have cost in the United States. Perhaps the high cost of imports is the reason why Australian glassware gradually replaces imports in later catalogs.



Spring & Summer Catalogue No. 67 (1923-1924)

The final and most impressive Foy & Gibson Heisey ad appeared in catalogs 68 (1924) and 69 (Autumn & Winter 1924). It featured several 411 Tudor pieces along with 473 Narrow Flute with Rim pieces and a 393 Narrow Flute biscuit tray. The 458 Colonial basket with 351 Mums etching also appears in a grouping of glass from other companies.
