Distinctive & - one of a kind - New Entry Doors with Heisey Glass to Welcome All to The Heisey Museum

In the fall of 2014, Jack Burriss wrote in his Curator's column about several possible new projects for the museum. One of those was to replace the old blank front doors, adding Heisey glass panels. I am an HCA member, avid collector, and a stained glass artist for over 40 years, and therefore very interested. This past May I met with Jack and Michael Maher at the museum. Our first decision was to have a large Diamond H featured in each of the two upper panels surrounded by Heisey glass pieces.

Over the summer and fall the master plan for the doors, two 25" by 34" panels above the break bar containing the Diamond H centerpieces, and two panels below the bar measuring 25" by 20" containing the Heisey dates and dedication was formulated with much input. As many Heisey patterns, etching, and features as can be found/donated and will fit, will be incorporated into these distinctive doors.

During the December 5th Holiday Open House, I presented the final layouts of the panels and showed how this will all come together for the June 2017 annual meeting. Already members of HCA are adding their parts to the work. President Roy Eggert is also working with the glass. If you have bits



and pieces of Heisey glass that you have not sent in for the Museum's projects, you may mail the glass to me directly. All glass that is not used will be upcycled by the Museum. There will be more details and pictures about this very exciting project included in the February newsletter.

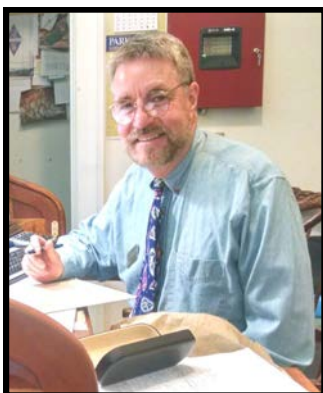
Words From Your Curator – Director

Grapevine, Dallas, & Ft. Worth, things to see
and do at the 2016 PVM Dinner.

Grapevine, Texas is the host city for the 2016 Percy & Vivian Moore Dinner. Located near the DFW airport and approximately 20 miles east of Ft. Worth. Grapevine is in the center of activity in the Dallas-Ft. Worth area. Known as the Christmas Capital of Texas, Grapevine is also known for wine. September 15-18, 2016 is GrapeFest, the largest wine festival in the Southwest and the largest consumer judged wine competition in the nation.

Ft. Worth, also known as Cowtown, is home to the Ft. Worth Stockyards National Historic District, Kimball Art Museum, Amon Carter Museum of American Art, Ft. On the Air With Heisey...Part II

In the August Heisey News page 17, I had written a brief article on the Heisey Radio broadcasts and Radio Show feature "The Crystal Gazer." This is the original Audio which was on a vinyl record, (I believe they were called "78's"), where we can hear the tale of the Crystal Gazer by Cecil Fleming renowned baritone artist from the time, and then the A.H. Heisey and Company advertisement for sponsoring the program. It was really a very cool original story that we had never "heard" before. The Baritone Crystal Gazer and the story of Heisey's radio sponsorship is very interesting and draws a lot of attention as it plays from the console radio in the hallway that connects Gallery 1 and the King House. It feels and sounds as it would have originally in 1928 when it debuted on the air. This true restoration and preservation of the sound had me inspired and my creative mind started thinking what else we could do to tell the story of the A. H. Heisey and Company of Newark Ohio.



Amongst the vinyl records were other paper radio scripts of later (1930s-40s) radio advertisements submissions to be read on the air, stories including the history of the A.H. Heisey and Company; How to choose fine glassware; a Tour of the Heisey Glass House; the History of Glass; as well as many advertisement commercials to choose Heisey Crystal the finest in Glassware for your table. The ads include Rose etching, Dolly Madison Rose, Whirlpool, Moonglo cutting and many others as well as non specific ads such as gifts for men, gifts for the hostess, and of course, the new bride. The stories are so informative and I was delighted to learn these things I had not heard/known before about our premier glass company. For instance, they explained in the factory tour that the Heisey workers use the term "Glory Hold" to describe the secondary furnace used for fire polishing. It must have been quite "glorious" when working because it was not as hot as the main furnace where the liquid glass was stored. So again we learned things from these radio commercials and scripts.

We found the stories and unheard history so intriguing and so different than any project or book could ever tell. This was audio sound from the Heisey company waiting to be heard. I contacted Earthworks recording studio in Newark to see their interest in recreating these as they would have been heard on the radio, so that the story could be told, not read! They were thrilled and very excited about the project and wanted to get their hands on it. Brandon Bankes, the chief Audio Engineer at Earthworks, was the main person working on our project and he said he thoroughly enjoyed it because he loves vintage radio and it is what got him involved in the recording industry to begin with. Earthworks brought in many different voice overs that they felt would represent each story and ad, to have a genuine vintage feel and represent them correctly and truly sell it the way it was supposed to originally when it debuted on the air.

We also asked them to add music from the era (1930s-40s) so that it would really sound like radio. Well the project turned out so fantastic that we wanted all to hear what was preserved and now can be shared by all.

I wanted to be able to play our NEW Vintage Heisey radio overhead while touring the Museum, especially in Galleries 1 and 2. I brought in several IT Project Specialists to get quotes on installing overhead speakers to play our restored sound and to educate and inspire those touring the Museum Galleries. In talking to one specialist who apparently saw my enthusiasm to complete this for the Museum agreed to install the speakers and system on his own time and do it as a volunteer donation to the Museum (we had to buy the equipment, but he would install it for us for free). He also installed surround sound in the lower level for visitors who watch the introductory video before taking a tour of the Museum. We owe a great thanks to Earthworks Recording Studio and our IT installer Tim Ballard who saw the importance of preserving a piece of history and helping us to complete our project.

If you have been to the Museum this fall you have probably heard the "draft" version of the radio program which plays overhead. The draft version was about 65 minutes long, and the final version is about an hour and 40 minutes, and will now play on a loop throughout the Museum. I am very excited to share this with you. When you come back for the Spring Auction or Convention, be sure to reserve time to tour, listen and learn something new at your Museum. If you cannot make it to the Museum in person to hear the stories and Heisey radio, we are very glad to have parts of them available on our website! Please check them out and enjoy!

HCA's 2016 Operating Budget

On December 4th 2015, the HCA Board of Directors approved the 2016 budget. A copy of the budget, along with 2015 information, is shown here.

What a difference a year can make. For most of the people involved, the experience gained last year by the Financial Committee, directly led to a much smoother and faster budget process. The experience also provided a better understanding of our numbers which, in turn, resulted in a greater confidence in the 2016 expectations.

It will be hard for us as an organization to match the tremendous results of 2015. The successes of the auctions, Convention and Percy and Vivian Moore Weekend have set the bar quite high. Sales of real Heisey through the gift shop (our highest margin product!) will hopefully continue robustly. While the sales of beads have been a success beyond anyone's dreams, they are not expected to produce the same results in 2016.

The process followed to prepare the budget started with reaching out to the various individuals or groups that were in the best position to provide guidance on specific line items. This input was then taken into consideration by members of the Board of Directors, members of the Finance Committee and the HCA paid staff. As the numbers came together towards a balanced budget, we were able to challenge some of the lines with sensitivity testing in order to gain greater confidence in our expectations. Finally, we were able to look at some second level considerations and budget for a few nice to have items that were not included in the first go-around.

As you can see many HCA'ers were involved to varying degrees in this effort. One individual stands out above all the others and that is Tom Files. His breadth and depth of HCA knowledge is immense and when this is coupled with his finance and spreadsheet skills we are left with a financial masterpiece that is to be envied by all the other elegant glassware collector clubs.
