

Next Heisey Museum Special Display – Blown Vases

Walter Ludwig

I hope you have had a chance to view our display of Heisey Etchings which has been in Gallery 3 since last fall. Once the Spring Auction is over we will be dismantling that display and installing the next display. This will kick off a series of three displays that will focus on the wide varieties of vases that A. H. Heisey & Company produced. Our first display will feature only the blown vases. The summer 2017 display will feature pressed vases made before 1920 while the 2018 display will feature the pressed vases made after 1920.

I have finished the preliminary work on the blown vase display and already have 270 vases located for the display, but there are a few that I would like to include. We are well represented with Moongleam and Hawthorne but are short on Flamingo examples.

Vases that we do not have any examples of are in patterns 4193, 4195, and 4198 (these are pictured on pages 26 and 34 of "Encyclopedia of Heisey Glassware: Etchings and Carvings") as well as a 4004 Impromptu ball vase. Flamingo vases I would like to have for the display include 516/1, 516/2, 2517 Teardrop, 4160/1 Ellen, 4162/3, 4162/4, 4207 Moderne, 4211 Lilac, 4215 Dorothy, 4217 Frances (both sizes), 4218 Marilyn, 4220 Janice (7" only), and 4222 Horseshoe. In Moongleam I am looking for 3485 Irene, 4196 Rhoda, and 4219 Lucille. In Hawthorne we do not have a 4162/4. The one Sahara vase we are looking for is a 3485 Irene.

If you can provide any of these vases for our display please contact the Museum. If you have an unusual blown vase that is uncommonly seen also feel free to contact us. The full display will be viewable from the beginning of June through mid-August. If you can only provide the example during the Convention that would also be acceptable. Thank you for considering this project.







2016 SPRING ALL HEISEY BENEFIT AUCTION WRAP-UP

The 43rd Annual Spring All Heisey Benefit Auction was really a great HCA Event! Our two-day auction was held again at the GMP Local #244 Union Hall on 350 Hudson Ave in Newark on Friday-Saturday, April 15-16, 2016. Our auction was well attended with well over 100 guests and members each day and we had 16 absentee bidders. We had 1,315 lots of glass available from 54 consignors. The last two years our auction has been larger-around 1,450 lots. We made it smaller this

year and attendees and volunteers seemed to like it-we finished late in the afternoon each day. We had the preview on Friday from 10: 30 PM to12: 00 PM with the auction starting at 12: 00 PM. On Saturday, doors opened at 8: 30 AM, had our HCA Membership Meeting chaired by President Roy Eggert at 9: 00 AM, and we started our auction at 9: 30 AM.

How did we do financially? One never knows what to expect- it is always nice to meet or exceed the budget! We grossed \$75,905 and after consigners and expenses are paid, we will net \$20,445. We had a 2016 budget estimated amount of \$14,500. Last year we grossed \$65,959, netted \$18,210 with our 2015 budget estimate of \$14,250. Main difference between this year and last year was this year that while we had less lots, we had more "high end" glass for auction. Our average price per lot was \$57.39 while last year it was \$45.12. We also had 46 lots of donated glass which brought in \$3,425 while last year we had 21 lots generating \$1,147. So although we had a smaller auction, we had better glass and more donations.

I want to publicly thank, on behalf of the HCA Board of Directors and Staff, the fifty volunteers who worked with us starting in January unpacking, identifying, cataloging, and repacking the glass and then working for three straight days until the auction was concluded. You make this event a success and HCA's largest fundraiser. I have listed those who helped in a separate block. If you helped and are not listed, I apologize.

I would like to give special thanks: to Walter Ludwig who helped from start to finish lending his time and Heisey expertise whenever asked: to long time clerk Karen Taylo who ran the office and auction software program with helper Roy Eggert; and lastly to the Dayton and Buckeye Study Club members who worked tirelessly from January to April to make this a success. We would not have an auction without their help.

A "THANK YOU" must also go to Craig Connelly, Auctioneer and his cohorts. They sold our glass and kept us in stitches! Concessionaire extraordinaire Gerry Dush and his gang again served the world's best pies and other food. GMP Local #244's own Jimmy Gill did everything he could to provide us great facilities.

Finally, I would like to thank all the consignors who consigned and donated glass to HCA and to all the auction attendees and absentee bidders who purchased that wonderful Heisey Glass. Hope to see all of you at the Convention in June. Happy Heisey Hunting!!



SO, HOW ARE THE FRONT DOOR PANELS COMING ALONG?

The first upper panel is assembled and soldered. It now needs lots of cleaning. The Heisey Rose pattern is included as well as two beads. Both can be seen in the detail photos. There are also open spaces in the work to allow for a certain amount of "air" movement within the panels. The second upper panel is well underway with both the layout and the assembly progressing nicely. The lower panels, containing the dates and dedication information, have much of the pieces organized and set aside. The basic layout is also drawn. These two panels will have the official data sandblasted into cobalt blue (to match the upper panels' cobalt blue) pieces of non-Heisey glass.



The main concept for these panels continues to be to include as much variety of Heisey glass as possible, including the colors and etchings as well as patterns. Most of the glass is coming from broken and damaged pieces. However, members have been very generous in also donating undamaged glass, which are being used as whole pieces as much as possible. All the scrap glass not useable in the panels will be returned to the museum to be melted down for further use in museum projects. A full photographic and written record of this project is also being created for possible use as a booklet/fund raiser.

Donations don't count towards your 40 lot limit and you don't have to consign glass to make a donation! To continue our tradition for this event, we are maintaining our low consignment fee of 20% with a minimum consignment fee of \$5. This means anything that sells for \$25 or less the consignment fee will still be \$5.

As you prepare your lists, please make them as descriptive as possible since the committee will be using them to select glass for the auction. In particular, please check for damage-we are **selecting only undamaged glass** for this special Fall auction. The committee's goal this year is to have a larger auction than in past years which had been targeted at two hundred (200) lots-perhaps between 250-300 lots or more! How can you get your glass selected? Here are some clues. Consideration will be given to include diversity in color, etchings, cuttings, and patterns. We want no duplicates and glass for both the novice and experienced collector. Please make sure you size each lot so it is worth at least \$25-and I know it is a guess! The minimum opening bid will be \$15.00. As mentioned earlier, we will not select damaged glass.

The selection committee will be busy after May 10th and will contact you on or about June 1st to let you know which lots of glass from your list have been selected. Hopefully, you will be able to bring your glass to Newark and drop it off at the museum when you come to the Convention on June 15-18, 2016. Your deadline for getting glass to the museum is July 9, 2016.



Show 'n' Tell was wonderful as usual: #3481 Glenford d/o, Moongleam ftd, bar glass, # 1541 Athena candy dish, #1250 Groove & Slash pitcher, #8025 Diamond Footed comport, #1201 Fandango salver (cake Stand), #325 Pillows 9" rose bowl, #1540 Lariat 9" basket, #305 Punty & Diamond Point celery, #1401 Empress footed pitcher, #393 Narrow Flute jug, and a #1404 Old Sandwich Moongleam salt shaker.
