A Good Way to Help HCA.....and Yourself




If you are over age 70 $\frac{1}{2}$ and have an individual retirement account (IRA), the rules say you must start withdrawing required minimum distributions (RMDs). These distributions add to your taxable income thereby increasing your taxes.

However, IRS regulations permit you to donate all or part of your RMD to the Heisey Endowment Fund and prevent the donation amount from being counted as taxable income. This type of charitable gift is called a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). This is possible because HCA is an accredited 501(c)(3) tax exempt organization. Furthermore, giving a QCD directly from your IRA can allow you to benefit from charitable giving even if you don't itemize deductions. Giving directly from your IRA allows you to leave out your QCD amount when calculating your taxable income and also take the standard deduction.

Tax laws are quirky and action must occur before year-end. There are specific factors that must be satisfied to qualify for this treatment. Check first with your tax advisor for details to make sure you qualify for this benefit and how it must be reported on your Form 1040 tax return. If conditions fit your circumstances, contact HCA's Endowment Fund administrator John Uible at Park National Bank for instructions -740-349-3702.

This could be a win-win for HCA and you.

Words From Your Curator — Dírector





HCA ABSENTEE VOTING INSTRUCTIONS for Electing HCA Board of Directors

All HCA Voting Members in good standing are eligible to cast votes at the Annual Meeting in June. We will be electing three people to serve on the HCA Board of Directors. Candidate information will be published in the May 2017 issue of the Heisey News. As your HCA Secretary, one of my duties is to oversee this election.

As a Voting Member, you may vote in person at the June Annual Meeting or by Absentee Ballot. The current HCA Voting Members list is published on pages 22 - 23, of the March 2017 issue of the Heisey News. Check your status on the list to be sure we have it correct. If you have any questions, please contact the Membership Clerk at the Museum.

You may request an Absentee Ballot any time after the beginning of the calendar year, however the Absentee Ballots will be not be prepared until after the slate of candidates has been adopted at the quarterly membership meeting held at the Benefit Auction in April. Absentee Ballots will be available after May 1, 2017. You may pick up a ballot at the Museum or mail your request to:

Along with your written request, be sure to include a self-addressed envelope. If you affix a stamp too, it would help to defray expenses. As your request arrives at the Museum, it will be assigned a voting number. When the Absentee Ballots are available, a blank corresponding-numbered Absentee Ballot will be placed in a new envelope, with your name and voting number written on the outside. This new envelope will be put into the self-addressed envelope you provided and mailed back to you.

When you receive your Absentee Ballot, remove it from the envelope, cast your vote, place the Absentee Ballot back into the envelope, and seal it. Put this envelope into a new envelope, addressing it back to the address above. *Note: To be* included in the election, your Absentee Ballot must be received by the Membership Clerk by 4:00 pm (EST) on Friday, June 9, 2017.

After the polls are closed, the absentee votes are combined with votes cast by the voting members present at the Annual Meeting and the ballot tallying begins.

Please note that according to HCA By-Laws, Article VII, Section f, as approved in June 2011: "If the number of nominees equals the number of Director vacancies, the ballot voting shall be deemed unnecessary if approved by the majority of voting members present."






In preparation for our Gallery 3 vase display, we wanted to share with you an article originally printed in the 1980, May edition of The Heisey News. We hope you enjoy.

FLORAL BLOCKS

Floral blocks 19. 20 and 21 are a family of three sizes of blocks of similar design. Pic-tures of the three blocks taken from Heisey catalog 211, page 84, are shown with this article. Vogel book III, page 94 is a copy of Heisey catalog 211, page 84. Blocks 19, 20 and 21 replaced floral blocks 9, 10, and 11 for about a 3 year period, 1931 to 1933. Blocks 9, 10 and 11 are described in my article that appeared in the October 1979 issue of Heisey News, page 11. Let us look at the general design of this floral block family. The top of blocks 19, 20 and 21 are dome or mushroom shaped and are perforated with holes that go all the way through the blocks. The bottoms of the blocks are plain and relatively flat. In other words, there are no legs of any kind on the bottom. In comparison, blocks 9, 10 and 11 have six small legs on the bottom that are about an eighth of an inch long. Also, you can note in the pictures, for some reason, floral blocks 19 and 20 do not have a perforated hole in the center of the block while floral blocks 9 and 10 did. Per the catalog picture, block 21, like block 11, appears to have a hole in the center. The cross-section sketch I made of block 19 accompanying this article illustrates the holes all the way through, the absence of a hole in the center and the small ledge around the edge of the block at its maximum diameter. The dome shape, the holes all the way through, the absence of a hole in the center (19 and 20 only), the plain bottom with no legs, and the small ledge are all points of identification for Heisey floral blocks 19, 20 & 21. The dimensions of the three blocks are as follows. The #19 block has a diameter (largest) of 3 inches, is 2 inches high and has 6 perforations. The #20 block has a diameter of 412", is 2 3/4" high and has 18 perforations. The #21 block has a diameter of 55", is 3" high and has 19 perforations. Heisey catalog and price list entries refer to the #19 block as 4", the #20 block as 5" and the #21 block as 6". The catalog/price list dimensions relate, on the high side, to the actual block dimensions. Production of this family of 3 floral blocks started in about 1930 and ended in about 1936. All three block sizes were made in crystal, flamingo, moongleam and sahara. I found no evidence that blocks 19, 20 and 21 were made in alexandrite. The price lists I looked at added support to the point that the blocks were not made in alexandrite. For example, price list #210 (circa 1933) lists prices for blocks 19, 20 and 21 in the color columns for crystal, flamingo, moongleam and sahara. There are no prices indicated in the color columns alexandrite, tangerine or blue. Yet, we know that the blocks were used in the #1401 Empress floral bowl and that the Empress floral bowl was made in alexandrite. Therefore, why not alexandrite colored blocks? Since alexandrite colored pieces tend to cost about twice as much as the same pieces in crystal, it is my opinion that crystal blocks were furnished with or suggested for use with the alexan-drite colored floral bowl. There are many types of floral blocks made by other companies. So, now armed with the design information in this article and the article in the October 1979 Heisey News, you should be able to pick out the Heisey floral blocks 9, 10, 11, 19, 20 and 21 at flea markets or elsewhere The stock numbers 19, 20 and 21 were also used for salt & peppers and for candlesticks. Later, #20 was used for the Wood Duck adn #21 for the Wood Duckling, resting. The #17 flower block is a unique, one-of-a-kind block. It was especially designed to fit the #133 14" Swan handled floral bowl. The #133 floral bowl is sort of an elongated oval shape with swan handles at the long ends. Floral block #17 is long and narrow to match the bowl. The block itself is not oval shaped, but has its own special shape as you will note in the picture with this article. This block is not the easiest to describe, so bear with me and refer to the picture as we go along. The center of the block is a bowl-like structure about 21/2" tall. The bottom of the bowl is flat and the bowl walls are vertical with a contour that follows the general overall shape of the block. The block is signed with a small diamond H on the inside bottom of this bowl at the center. Horizontal flange-like structures come out from the top and bottom of the peculiar shaped bowl. The edge or perimeter of the flanges establish the final overall shape of the #17 floral block. The top flange has 14 evenly spaced holes through it for the flower stems. The bottom flange also has 14 holes through it in line with the holes in the top flange. There are 16 evenly spaced small legs on the bottom flange that hold the block slightly above the bottom of the floral bowl. The overall dimensions of the #17 floral block are 5" wide by 95" long by 2 3/4" tall. Production of the #133 Swan handled floral bowl and matching swan candlesticks and the #17 floral block started in about 1931. First mention of the bowl, candlesticks and block occured in a supplement to Heisey price list #209. Production of the #133 floral bowl and candlesticks stopped in about 1934. It must not have been a good seller. Production of the #17 floral block continued as the #1469 floral bowl in the new Ridgeleigh pattern line was especially designed to use that floral block. The #1469 floral bowl that used the #17 block was produced in two forms, with and without swan handles. Production of the Ridgeleigh floral bowls associated with floral block #17 was only for about 3 years, about 1934 to about 1936. The production of the floral block also stopped. Thus, floral block #17 was produced for about 6 years, 1931 to 1936.

It is very important that you carefully check for damage-**we are selecting only undamaged glass** for this special auction. The **deadline** for submitting your completed lists to us is **May 16, 2017.** Remember- send just the list- no glass!

The Committee's target is to have an auction with three hundred (300) lots. How can you get your glass selected? Here are some clues. Consideration will be given to include diversity in color, etchings, cuttings, and patterns. A main goal in the selection will be not to have any duplication of lots. While this auction is mainly for the experienced collector who wants that exotic piece of Heisey we also would like clean problem free glass for the fledgling collector just starting out and building his collection. Please note our minimum bid will be \$15 so think about that putting your lists and lots together. As mentioned earlier, we will not select damaged glass.

The Select Committee will be busy after May 16th and contact you on or about June 1 to let you know the glass it has selected. Hopefully, you will be able to bring your glass to Newark and drop it off at the museum when you come to the Convention (June 14-17). Please look over your glass and begin your lists soon. May 16th will be here before you know it!

This event has been a success for consignors and those purchasing the wonderful Heisey glass. Please plan on attending Percy Moore Weekend and Festivities and participating in this auction for the benefit of your Museum.

As the local guy who is always running around the Museum, I see many opportunities that everyone could help with, but you may not know that we need the assistance. Every June members flock back to Newark and apologize for not being closer and more involved and ask what they can do to help! This is very appreciated and well needed, but, there are items and needs that extend well past Convention duties. We all have talents, skills and even connections that as a team of HCA members could really benefit our Museum! Unless you know we are in need, or are asked, you may not know that we are looking for your contribution and assistance.

I have talked to the Staff and several Board members to ask what OUR Museum needs, either a physical item or skill-set for a certain facet of our Museum. These are the items that made the "wish list" look over the items and please ask your self if you could help with any of these needs?

- We are always in need of foam core/poster board and mounting spray for mounting posters and display items for Gallery 3, it seems we are always running out to get more.
- Totes—are another item that we need for easier storage of the Holiday Open House decorations and others seasonal items used around the Museum.

• Round 5' (60") plastic folding tables for use in the Lower Level/Multi-purpose room. (we have the plastic rectangular tables but would like to be able to offer round tables for rentals and for our own use throughout the Museum. These would be a large expense to the Museum, but if members purchased or donated money to make the purchase, again with many members contributing it would be a smaller amount per person. These are about \$100.00 each and we would like 8, there also is a dolly holder to store them that would be very beneficial for when not in use.

• Tools - It is amazing sometimes if you need a simple screwdriver to repair something or the simplest tool, and we only have one, and are not sure which side of the building it is on. It is a small problem that takes a lot of time and adds frustration regularly. If you are able to give simple tools like screw drivers, hammers, drill bit, and tape measures etc. they can always be utilized.
