

2018 ANNUAL HEISEY FALL SELECT AUCTION



Last month we announced our Thirteenth Annual All Heisey Fall Select Auction. . It is scheduled for **Saturday, October 20, 2018**, and will be held at the BMP Union Hall, 350 Hudson Ave. in Newark OH. Thanks for all the past support you all have given for this Fall fundraiser for the National Heisey Glass Museum. Please place this date on your calendar - **October 20, 2018**.

This article is a reminder to get your list of the glass ready to submit for consideration by the committee. As you read this, you will have approximately one week left to get your list to us! The deadline for submitting your glass list is **May 15, 2018**. A blank list for you to use is on this website. It can also be downloaded from the Museum website. Please note the blank list contains space for forty lots. Each member is allowed to submit **forty lots** for the committee to select from. Remember, this auction benefits your association. Please consider selecting a special piece of Heisey for a donation to be auctioned off- 100% of the sale price goes to support HCA and the Museum. Donations don't count towards your 40 lot limit and you don't have to consign glass to make a donation! To continue our tradition for this event, we are maintaining our low consignment fee of 20% with a minimum consignment fee of \$5. This means anything that sells for \$25 or less the consignment fee will still be \$5.

As you prepare your lists, please make them as descriptive as possible since the committee will be using them to select glass for the Auction. In particular **please check for damage**-we are **selecting only undamaged glass** for this special Fall Auction. The committees' goal this year is to have a 300 lot Auction. This of course depends on you-we need sufficient lists of good clean damage free glass!!

How can you get your glass selected? Here are some clues. Consideration will be given to include diversity in color, etchings, cuttings, and patterns. We want no duplicates and glass for both the novice and experienced collector. Please make sure you size each lot so it is worth at least \$25-and I know it is a guess! The minimum opening bid will be \$15.00. As mentioned earlier, we will not select damaged glass.

The selection committee will be busy after May 15th and will contact you on or about June 1 to let you know which lots of glass from your list have been selected. Hopefully, you will be able to bring your glass to Newark and drop it off at the Museum when you come to the Convention on June 13-16, 2018. Your deadline for getting glass to the Museum is **July 22, 2018**.

This event has been a successful Fall moneymaker for HCA and a benefit to those who consign and those who buy Heisey glass. Plan on attending the Auction. You will see old and make new Heisey friends and get some wonderful Heisey! 

Come for the weekend, stay for a week

Here's another popular Minneapolis/St. Paul attraction to consider for your itinerary when you come for the Percy and Vivian Moore Weekend.

Bev Heise suggests visiting the **Walker Art Center** and the adjacent **Minneapolis Sculpture Garden**. One of the most celebrated art museums in the country, the Walker is known for its innovative presentations and acclaimed collections of contemporary art — visual, performing, and media arts. The adjacent 11-acre Minneapolis Sculpture Garden, home to 40 contemporary sculptures, is a collaboration between the Walker and the Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board. Its iconic *Spoon Bridge and Cherry* sculpture by Claes Oldenburg and Coosje van Bruggen has come synonymous with Minneapolis.

The museum and sculpture garden are located at 725 Vineland Place, Minneapolis, which is just about 12 miles/16 minutes from the official PVMD hotel.

Ripples in Time (and in Optics)

Time is a funny thing. Just ask Doctor Who. (See endnote if that leaves you mystified.) We may not be able to go back and forth in it the way the Doctor can, but as we splash around in time, we sometimes pick up a glittering piece of information from the streambed in which it flows. Every now and then, the glitter proves that a researcher's speculations were right. That gratification makes up for all the times when they were, to put it charitably, off the mark. But the less said about that, the better.

I was rifling through some old Heisey News issues recently, off on a mission for something entirely different. Of course, you can't help but stop and read other things as you search for what you really want. Some years ago, long before I ever wrote for the Heisev News, I set myself the task of reading all the Heisey News, all the way from the first issue of January, 1972. Enthusiasm carried the day and I made it all the way through in one winter's reading, ready for more. There are at least a couple of problems with that kind of approach, though. First, so much information is coming at you that you don't absorb it all the first time around. Second, as time goes on, if there's any justice in the world, you learn more, those glittering bits I mentioned earlier. And that means that you let things slip by the first time that were significant, but you just didn't recognize them at the time.

Both those problems caused me to overlook something of importance to the optics discussion. In the optics series, part 8 (July, 2017), I concluded (or so I thought) the discussion of optics with a look at some of the last ones, some so rare that they might have been called experimental. In particular, I discussed the **Screen Optic.**

I speculated that while Screen Optic is frequently called experimental, that it was probably offered for sale as limited production, due to the comparatively large number of items on which it appeared. In the earlier article, I noted how Screen Optic was found on #4054 Coronation and #6060 Country Club items, mainly in Dawn but occasionally in Limelight, and that there was even a #2351 Newton soda known in crystal with this optic.

It turns out that in February, 1984, the Heisey News gave the contents of a price sheet for a number of items in Dawn. This particular price sheet, dated January, 1954, was probably only one sheet, typed and sent out to salesmen, but never part of a catalog. This seems to have been a standard way that Heisey used when adding and deleting items for sale, announcing new patterns, and the like.

The important part for this article is that the price sheet gives prices for several #6060 Country Club items, in Dawn, with a **Ripple Optic.** Items listed were the 2-oz. bar, sodas in 10-oz., 14-oz., and 18-oz. capacities, and old fashions in 9-oz. and 13-oz. sizes. Several of these very pieces are known in collections today, including the museum's. The Ripple Optic can only mean Screen Optic, a fact that Louise Ream noted at the time. Now we can use the actual factory name for it.

Even though we have proof that Ripple Optic was for production and not just experimental, it was likely only made for a short time in early 1954. (Fortunately, I had earlier speculated a date of 1953 or later, so another guess proved to be about right, and sometimes "about right" is what you have to settle for.) For the record keepers among us, if you are lucky enough to have a Ripple Optic piece in your collection, you may want

to go back to your database, spreadsheet, or notes and change those references from Screen Optic to Ripple Optic.

At the end of Part 8, I also speculated that we hadn't heard the end of optics. Little did I know that here I'd be back in such a short time, through the glass looking, looking at ripples. Now if I could just get the Doctor to take me back to about 1917 so I could pick up a copy of Heisey's Catalogue 77. That wouldn't be tampering with the timeline too much, would it?

For those not into television science fiction, the BBC gave us Doctor Who beginning in 1963, and ever since he has been traveling the galaxies, past, present, and future, in his blue police box, cleverly regenerating into a new form, but the same Doctor, when actors leave the show. He (soon to be she, since the newest regeneration is a woman) is a Time Lord, and is notable for saving Earth and countless other planets, using his wits, the help of his companions, and his trusty sonic screwdriver, not fists or weapons. I'm sure he could help us solve many Heisey mysteries. I'll look for a message from the Doctor (or from you) at heiseyglass@gmail.com.



All HCA Voting Members in good standing are eligible to cast votes at the Annual Meeting in June. We will be electing three people to serve on the HCA Board of Directors. Candidate information will be published in the May 2018 issue of the Heisey News. As your HCA Secretary, one of my duties is to oversee this election.

You, as a Voting Member, may vote in person at the June Annual Meeting or by Absentee Ballot. The current HCA Voting Members list is published on pages 10 & 11, of the March 2018 issue of the Heisey News. Check your status on the list to be sure we have it correct. If you have any questions, please contact the Membership Clerk at the Museum.

You may request an Absentee Ballot any time after the beginning of the calendar year, however the Absentee Ballots will be not be prepared until after the slate of candidates has been adopted at the quarterly membership meeting held at the Benefit Auction in April. 
