Walter was recently given several Heisey promotional leaflets from the late 1940s or early 1950s. They were supplied by the Heisey Company to retailers so they could put them with their displays and customers could pick up the leaflets so they could study them at their leisure. Most of these leaflets are just a single 6" x 3 1/2" sheet but the one for Plantation was a single fold and the one for Heisey Rose was a double fold. All of the leaflets were printed front and back with all but one using a single extra color for design effect. We will be reprinting the other leaflets in coming months, but I did want to present the Plantation one first because of one item that is listed in that handout. We have used the cover of the leaflet as the cover of this issue of the *Heisey News*. It shows the pressed 1567 Plantation goblet. Yellow is the highlighting color for this leaflet. The graphic is of a plantation worker carrying a large tray of pineapples on his or her head. **See page 9 for the rest of this story**

# CURATOR'S REPORT

There is hope in the air. The little pond in my backyard has melted and we have had a day that got into the 60s. I know that winter has not given up yet and is sure to return with another cold blast or two but the All Heisey Show in Gaithersburg, MD put on by the National Capital Heisey group is on March 12 and 13, and that to me is the beginning of Spring. I am looking forward to seeing many of you there. This will be followed by the All Heisey Benefit Auction here in Newark on April 1 and 2. You will find a preview of the auction written by me on pages six and seven. I have highlighted many of the rarer pieces but there are many pieces for the beginning and intermediate collector, also. The auction catalog will soon be in your hands as well as on our web site. Take the time to pick out a goodie or two for yourself. The web site has a nifty search capability that will allow you to put in a pattern, color, or item description (e.g. decanter, Orchid, Sahara, Fancy Loop) and get back a listing of items that match the criteria entered.

The end is in sight for the cleaning and inventorying of the Heisey on display in the Museum. I only have the center section left to do upstairs in Gallery 2 – Cobalt, Hawthorne, Amber, Tangerine, and Zircon/Limelight. The glass and cabinets looks great and I now have a better idea of what we have in the collection. There is still the Imperial and HCA made glass cases to do in the lower level of the King House as well as the many items we have in storage – there will always be plenty to do here at the Museum.

In last month's Newsletter, I heralded two wonderful items. Another set of the nested ashtrays appeared on E-bay almost simultaneously with the mailing of the Newsletter. This set was not decorated. I know it made one ashtray collector very happy when he got it. I got an E-mail from the purchaser of the "Sultana" candlesticks. He informed me that the 134 Tridents were not Amber after all --- instead they were Tangerine in a very dark shade. I looked at our pair here in the Museum and they also are a very dark Tangerine. The photograph with the E-bay listing just did not pick up any of the red tones. Well, should I be disappointed that they were not Amber, or elated that another pair of the extremely rare Tangerine Tridents has appeared? I will have to think about that.

I have been enjoying answering many e-mail questions that the members have sent in. This has sent me to the many resources we have available here at the Museum to come up with the answers – catalogues, price lists, ads, original correspondence, etc. Unfortunately, there is not always a definitive answer to be found – not everything was documented to answer the questions we have today. The research has let me get more familiar with what we do have and results in me finding many bits of information that I was not aware of. Price List 155 from May of 1910 contained three brainteasers that I will pose as a quiz to you to think about until next month when I will provide the answers:

- 1) What pieces comprise the Croton Set that Heisey included in this price list?
- 2) Which pattern contained an assortment of American Beauty Vases?
- 3) Which pattern included a Fern Dish and what was the accessory that was added to the glass piece to convert it into the Fern Dish?

The weather is getting better – time to get out and find the next Heisey piece for your collection. Let me know what you find. ♥

# BENEFIT AUCTION UPDATE

Hope you have made your reservations for the April 1 and 2 All Heisey Benefit Auction at the Apple Tree Auction Center in Newark, OH. It will be a great event as it has been in the past! A list of area hotels/motels with telephone numbers is included in this newsletter if you need to make reservations.

We finished our cataloging of all the glass on a cold and dreary Saturday in January. While the weather was dreary, the glass was sparking and wonderful as it always is! We will have 1000 lots and are really outstanding! Please look for Walter Ludwig's article describing some of the glass. It will give you a heads up before the catalog comes out.

The auction catalog will be coming out around the first of March, which will be around 30 days before the auction. The catalog will contain the two-day schedule of events, glass condition codes, mail in bid forms and instructions, telephone bid instructions and requirements, and a place for you to make notes about those special lots you want to check out further. We will also again put the auction catalog on line on the Museum web site ([www.heiseymuseum.org](http://www.heiseymuseum.org)). It is a wonderful tool to help you find those special items you are looking for since you can sort by pattern number, by pattern name, and by type of item. By using the catalog and the web site, you should easily be able to look over the lists and pick out your favorites. And you will have plenty of time to get your absentee bids prepared and submitted if you will not be able to come to the auction.

As always, your organization is in need of volunteers to help us make the auction a success. We will need people to help unpack and line up the glass at Apple Tree Auction Center. We will need help manning the display cases to show those special pieces to potential bidders. We will need people to carry glass to the tables where the glass is presented for sale. We will need "Vannas" to show off the glass for sale. People are needed to move the glass to the holdback area and to help get the glass to you when you pick up the glass you purchased. We need help in policing and cleaning up the area after the auction- stacking chairs, tables, gathering trash, etc. We will need help at the Museum packing glass for mailing out to successful absentee bidders.

Volunteers do all of these tasks and your help is requested. This is how you can help your association. If any of this appeals to you or if you just want to help, please call the Museum.

In case you just missed getting that special something at the auction, you might have another chance! We will again be having another "After Auction Madness" flea market immediately following the auction on Saturday. The event, sponsored by the Buckeye Heisey Club and organized by member Michael Maher, should be bigger and better than ever. ## BENEFIT AUCTION PREVIEW

I know you are all anticipating the arrival of the catalog for the annual All Heisey Benefit Auction which will take place April 1 and 2 at Apple Tree Auction Center here in Newark. As one of the major fund-raisers each year for HCA, it looks to be another stellar event. As one of the volunteers who helped in the cataloging process, I got to see all the wonderful glass that our consignors sent in, and there are some real gems to be found in this auction.

To whet your appetite let me go over a few of the highlights. Lots of animals and animal related items – topped by two animals in amber – the Baby

Elephant and a Standing Pony, as well as a 1489 Puritan cigarette box with the sitting pony finial, a 5063 Bantam Rooster cocktail, and both sizes of Horse Head stoppers. Speaking of amber there is a 1170 Pleat and Panel cruet as well as two items in 337 Touraine, a parfait and a juice. Lots of cruets in this auction including a 356 Little Prince, a 1485 early Saturn, and a 461 Convex Circle.

From the early patterns there is a 160 Locket on Chain toothpick, a 325 Pillows open salt, a 335 Prince of Wales Plumes water bottle, four egg cups in 343 Sunburst, molasses cans in both 325 Pillows and 343 Sunburst, and several lots of 1205 Fancy Loop stemware.

Candlesticks are well represented, including pairs of 8 Jacobean 9", 117 Bamboo with Moongleam tops, and 137 Concave Circle in Moongleam. Either a full console set in 116 Oakleaf in Flamingo or a 55 Aristocrat stand lamp would make a nice addition to any collection.

1503 Crystolite collectors will be tempted by the cake salver, cocktail shaker, shell torte plate and a swan handled pitcher. There is a 1540 Lariat round deviled egg plate as well as the rarely seen 1504 Regency 2 part candy with lid. A 507 Orchid dinner bell would be lovely in any collection. Plantation collectors will find many lots including a lot of eight tumblers and a lot of seven oyster cocktails. The 1521 Quilt smoking set should be able to find a good home, as will an original Heisey Mailbox.

Among the unusual stemware are a 1423 Sweet Ad-o-line goblet and a set of six 5078 Park Avenue sherries cut with one signed by Max Seidel. In barware there is a 9042 The Sea Wolf etched bar glass as well as two lots containing 507 Orchid etch bars. A 2323 Navy tumbler with #1 Tall Sailboat etch is sure to generate a lot of interest, as will a 3390 Carcassonne flagon in Alexandrite. A set of eight old fashions with 5017 Sailboat carving makes another interesting lot.

There is a possibility of starting or adding to a collection in several categories because there are multiple lots of 1170 Pleat and Panel in Flamingo, 1401 Empress in Moongleam, 1401 Empress Sahara with 448 Old Colony etch, 462 Fox Chase deep plate etch, celery vases in many old patterns, bitters bottles (all 12 that Heisey made are represented), individual cream and sugar sets including three

different stack sets, 1540 Lariat stems, and 454 Antarctic etch (four different pieces).

This is an auction that has something for everyone whether you are just starting out or an advanced collector. Make your plans now to join us April 1 and 2. ♥

All current voting members are eligible to cast votes in this election either in person or by absentee vote. As secretary of HCA, it is one of my duties to oversee this election. I want to let you know how you go about obtaining an absentee ballot and how we process them at the time of the election.

If you would like to vote by absentee ballot in the June Board of Director's election you may either pick

up a ballot at the Museum or send in a request for an absentee ballot to the Museum by mail. The address to use is:

A self-addressed envelope should be included. It would help if you affix a stamp to defray Museum expenses. Requests for multiple family members can be included in the same correspondence. You may request an absentee ballot at any time after the beginning of the year.

Once the slate of candidates has been closed at the quarterly meeting held in conjunction with the April Benefit Auction, ballots will be prepared. We will then put a blank ballot in a new envelope writing the absentee voter's name on the outside of the envelope. This envelope will be put into the self-addressed envelope you sent and then mailed back to you.

Upon receipt of your absentee ballot you remove it from the envelope with your name on it and cast your vote. Put the ballot back into the envelope with your name on it and seal it. This envelope then should be put in a new envelope and addressed to the same address as above. The deadline for receipt of absentee ballots is noon on the day before the election (this year, June 16).

Processing the ballots will be handled to ensure total confidentiality of all ballots. Museum staff will open the outer envelopes of all returned ballots and hold the sealed inner envelopes until the day before election. They will then be turned over to the club secretary. The names on the outer envelopes will then be checked against the eligible voting membership list checking off all names. After the polls are closed, these envelopes, as well as the ballot box, are turned over to the Sergeant at Arms, who is in charge of the vote counting. Once all the vote talliers are sequestered, the envelopes are opened and all outer envelopes are discarded and absentee votes are mixed with collected vote before any vote tallying is done.

Get your request for an absentee ballot in as early as possible. Candidate statements will appear in the May Heisey News. ♥

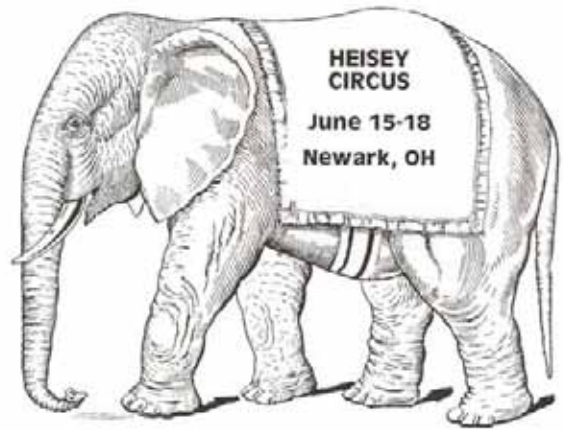
## DOWN ON THE FARM

## TREASURER'S REPORT

Dave Spahr, Treasurer

I reported to you last month with preliminary data on ending the year 2004 since final data wasn't available at press time last month. The final numbers are in for the end of the year and the 2004 Budget vs. Actual Report thru December 31, 2004 is published elsewhere in this Newsletter. Please refer to it when reading this article.

### REVENUES:

We budgeted revenues of \$190,450 and received \$169,477, which was a shortfall of 11% or \$20,973. While Gift Shop sales nearly met budget by finishing well in 2004, we failed to meet budget in nearly every other category.

### RESERVE/ENDOWMENT TRANSFER:

We had \$50,500 allocated to balance the 2004 budget. We actually withdrew and used \$55,000, which included using \$29,600 in earned income from the endowment fund. Our year-end cash reserves (net of endowment funds to be transferred) fell from \$39,328 in 2003 to \$7,276 at the end of 2004.

### EXPENSES:

We had budgeted \$240,950 in expenses and spent \$226,942 netting out our cost of goods sold and



inventory purchases. This is 5.8% or \$14,008 less than budgeted. Most of our savings were in our salary accounts since we did not have a curator for the first six months.

OVERALL CASH POSITION (Net of monies not yet transferred to the endowment fund):

We started 2004 with \$39,247.51 in our checking and money market accounts. We drew down the 2003 endowment fund earned income of \$29,600. We have a 2004 year end balance of \$7,276.12 in our checking and money market accounts. Our available carryover funds have dropped by \$31,971.39.

#### HCA ENDOWMENT FUND:

The HCA Endowment Fund increased in value from \$1,496,873.76 to \$1,587,066.34 in 2004. Contributions into the fund totaled \$30,835.05 and we withdrew \$29,600 of the prior year's (2003) earned income to support Museum operations.

#### GENERAL COMMENT:

Our financial decline began in 1999 when Gift Shop revenues began to annually fall from a \$105,000 level to the current \$65,000 level. The financial picture further worsened since we had no high dollar special projects with Longaberger (or others) last year nor are any planned for this year (2005). We are like many other organizations with our membership slowly but steadily declining. We started to use endowment fund earned income in 2003 to help balance the budget. We have had to use this source earlier and earlier each year. As mentioned earlier, we used endowment income in 2004. We will be doing the same in 2005. We had all hoped the financial picture would improve and things would turn around, but they haven't.

All available cash will be used in 2005 along with 2004 earned income from the Endowment Fund for operations and leaving no funds for inventory purchases for the Gift Shop. Clearly our organization is in financial trouble.

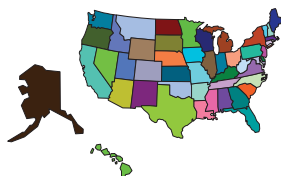

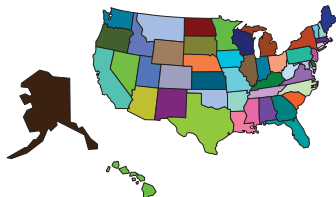
