The Yachting Center lured many famous artists over the years, and continues to do so. A hundred years ago N. A. Lindsey, while walking along the beach, found Childe Hassam contemplating the seascape and persuaded him to design the masthead of his newspaper, "The Marblehead Messenger". That masthead for which the now famous artist received five dollars - is still in use. It was recoppered once, but what a collector's item it is, for art authorities quote that the least of Childe Hassam's works in today's market brings many thousnads of dollars.

Even though it is almost December, today is warm. The sun streaming in my window makes the prisms on my Grape Cluster candlesticks seem to dance and glimmer, putting yours truly in good humor! Being New England cold and snow is only a matter of time, but Fall brings all the indoor Antique Shows and hopefully a "steal" or something to brag about.

Bragging is just exactly what "the Old Viking" is doing when he recounts his recent finds at a Mall Show, the Baby Elephant lumbered into his life at less than lunch in the fast food lane!; the #1567 Plantation cream and sugar with #518 Ivy Etch was picked up at about the same cost and his next find was an ll½" square floral bowl - the #1510 Square on Round! (I have only held one in my hand once and it is a heavy beautiful hunk of glass.)

"Mountain Grandma" (CA) boasts a #32 Skirted Panel/handled candlestick (now she has a pair) plus a #433 Greek Key 5" low footed jelly and six (6) individual nuts.

Staying in the California area where it is warm, "Cal Kid" reports three pieces of #140. Empress in Sahara, the cream and sugar plus a pitcher.

It is sort of difficult leaving the warmth so let's see what "My Good English Buddy" from the Sunshine State (FL) has to say for himself, two toothpicks - #331 Colonial Panel and a lovely #357 Prison Stripe.

Leaving for Mass. the "Midnight Riders" donned their riding clothes and threw their pack over their backs, or was it in their car? Oh well, whatever - their pack was full when they came riding home, #1220 Punty Band 9" crystal comport, and nineteen (count them 19) pieces of Pied Piper etch - 8 plates, 4 wines and 7 juice glasses. Umm Umm good!!

"The Hanging Judge" (MA) must have his jail pretty full by this time for he shows no mercy: a #493 Cologne with a #65 stopper was caputred and sentenced because it was flashed lavender. Now is that a sufficient reason? He also seized the #393 Narrow Flute combination relish with cover. Now, his good wife took compassion on the #1205 Fancy Loop three cornered nappy in Emerald/gold trim, this she added to her ever growing collection.

"The Pilgrims" (NH) are always out there on the horizon gathering up many morsels: #367 Prism Band decanter in moongleam, #310 Ring Band custard cup in Ivorina Verde, pair of #112 candlesticks in Hawthorne, #1205 Fancy Loop Emerald tumbler, #1295 Beaded Swag toothpick, ruby stain - souvenir Old Orchard 1902, #1401 Empress d/f cream and sugar in sahara plus the d/f Floral Bowl, #341 Puritan ½ gallon tankard/silver overlay, #1386 Ash tray in flamingo/dog, and a #429 Plain Panel Recess 1 quart Crushed Fruit jar, patd 1913.

The "Mr" has also been scouting around a little -the #433 Greek Key oval individual cream and sugar, #1252 Twist 13" three compartment relish in crystal, #354 Wide Flat Panel Domino sugar for less than a movie ticket, plus the #367 Prism Band decanter, crystal and etched. A lovely piece. This decanter was sitting in a dark place next to the bottom shelf just covered with dust, in fact so dusty that you could hardly see that it was etched. Cleaned up beautifully.

Now let's see what my "Sharp Eyed Friends" came up with this past few weeks: #406 Coarse Rib 4" nappy; #365 Queen Ann punch cup; #29 9" candlestick,

and the #1469½ Ridgeleigh 8" Vase.
"Shy Gal" (MA) has two (2) #1454 Diamond Point individual jellies\* or as I would rather call them

"honey dishes".

"The Keystone Cops" (PA) decided one Sunday to go looking and came up with the #4037 1 Pint Sherry bottle with Orchid etch. It was missing it's stopper but maybe sometime one will show up somewhere. They also found #5025 Tyrolean 12 oz Ice-teas footed (three of them) and four (4) 10 oz low water goblets, all plain. The plain are very beautiful and much preferred by the "Keystone Cops" than if they had been etched. The optic shows nicely and the clarity of the glass can be appreciated.

"Two Guys" from the Constitution State (CT) found a 4" #1503 Crystolite covered cigarette box. "Cruet Man" (CA) is always out there scouting

around to add more to his beautiful collection.
Those of us who were privileged to see his collection at the Convention this past summer can attest to their beauty. The #411 Tudor 6 oz cruet was added. Mr. Cruet measured some at the show and found that both 4 oz and 6 oz were made; he also added a very rare #1405 Ipswich 3 oz cruet in Flamingo. Yours truly saw that one and it is real pretty!

Now to continue with our Saga regarding "Eagle Eye" (OH) and I must say it has been exciting up to now. Are you prepared for number three? O.K.!
"Eagle Eye" picked up, at convention time, one of the three 359 Colonial creme-de-menthes which were there. Oh, shame on me, I almost forgot to tell you what the color was. Alexandrite!!\*\* Mmmmmmmmm. Eagle Eye, it has been great fun, let's do it again. I'll be awaiting my mailman.

"A Friend in Deed" has a #3404 Spanish Stem, the  $51_2$  oz Champagne, with Pairpoint Cut and also a #361 Criss-Cross nappy.

"Mr. Crystolite" (MA) reports a #1170 Pleat and Panel covered Candy in moongleam and a #11 Flower Block in Flamingo. Two very nice color pieces.

"The Wiz" says, Presto! Here is a #1201 Fandango Crimped 9" bowl, while "the Felicitous Flamingo Hunter" gave me a list of Flamingo pieces that she has acquired over the past couple of months: #1404 Old Sandwich water jug, #1252 Twist oval Cream and Sugar, the #358 Ash Tray, a pair of #51 salt and peppers with #808 top (the one used for salt is quite cloudy), plus in crystal she has a #1460 Flame tumbler, #341 Puritan toothpick, #1184 Yeoman Cologne (enamel top) and the #356 Ash tray (that is quite a heavy piece and crystal clear).

Well readers, Christmas is almost here and I need some presents to make me happy. My best presents would be letters from each and every one of you filled with lots of input for "your column". Have the pleasure of seeing your finds during the

Metal racks on three sides, with two more rows in the center, are filled from the floor to the 20 ft. ceiling of this 70' X 40' room. Moulds are on wooden pallets and every one is tagged with the number and name, if know. This tagging and placing on pallets was done in 1985 by volunteers and was a monumental task. A master list locates any mould which is wanted.

Everyone enjoyed looking at the moulds peeking inside some of them and also looking at some etching plates which were on display. Before we left everyone expressed surprise at the huge quantity of moulds and how pleased they were that "our" moulds are right back here in Newark where they

started.

This was a fun and interesting meeting to attend and we suggest that any club close enough to Newark should try to do this.

Afterward we went to the Best Western Newark Inn (formerly the Sheraton) and had a delicious din-

ner (very reasonably priced).

## 3390 Carcassonne Is There a Cordial?

For some unknown reason original Heisey information does not list a one ounce cordial for this pattern. What then <u>is</u> the loz. footed item? It certainly <u>looks</u> <u>like</u> a cordial to the collectors of these little jewels. There is no listing in the catalog or price lists for any other one ounce item either.

The 3394 Saxony stem line, a close relative of Carcassonne which shares the same base is listed as having a one ounce cordial. There is one of these in the museum and the only difference is the shape of the bowl. The stem does vary on larger items.

The two ounce footed bar is a very nice item but it is too large to fit in a cordial collection. and I know of no cordial collectors who display it as such. We all have the little one ounce ones - in flamingo, sahara, cobalt, alexandrite and crystal and it may exist in moongleam though I haven't seen it.

This is not the only time that something existed in a line yet was never catalogued.

#### HEISEY COLLECTORS OF THE ROCHESTER AREA

Our October meeting was held at the home of Marge and Jerry Gillette. All of us, including guests Lucille and Harlan Harvey and Marlene Johnston, enjoyed seeing Marge and Jerry's Heisey collection and eating more than we should have of the cake decorated with halloween trimmings.

The topic for the meeting was ice buckets. Thirteen people filled the display table with an impressive collection of twenty four buckets with only two duplicates, and they were different shades of moongleam! There were crystal, moongleam and alexandrite Twist ice buckets, Octagon in the colors sahara, moongleam and flamingo, as well as sahara, crystal, moongleam, fisherman cut and arctic etch in Empress. There was a cut Queen Ann bucket and this piece provided a good demonstration of the difference between Queen Ann and Empress -Queen Ann is the one with internal ribs which you can feel and which correspond with the rows of diminishing sized dots on the outside. We also had ice buckets in the Stanhope, Coleport, Course Rib, Fancy Loop, Narrow Flute patterns and an individual sized ice bucket in Greek Key.

The raffle to provide funds for our club had the usual things plus a HCA lapel pin and a small bag of B & O marbles. These, in case you didn't know, were light green glass marbles about an inch in diameter which were used as ball bearings on luggage transport conveyors on the railroad.

Our show and tell provided even more interesting conversation. George and Arlene Reynolds brought a Crystolite floral tray which can be used for salad or fruit and a set of 8 inch square Ridgeleigh plates. Marge Gillette found a Victorian Girl bell and a Bar and Cane custard & pt tankard with a large diamond H. Sharon Orienter found "the other" Crystolite cruet. She displayed the common oil bottle which is cone shaped to a large base and also brought the cruet which is barrel shaped on the bottom, and topped by a neck with the handle attached. Both Crystolite cruets have the identical stopper. Donna Schwendy brought a five inch emerald fancy loop plate. Jerry Gillette provided the show and tell which fit the Halloween season, a 4048 pumpkin punch bowl with a pumpkin handle cover. The bowl measured 11 inches in diameter and 84 inches high. The height of the top of the handle with the cover in place is 12 % in. This bowl can be used with or without an underplate. Anyone seen one? Jerry is looking.

We set up the topic for our January meeting. It is patterns introduced between the years 1917 and 1941. Now we can all go and do our homework.

#### "HEISEY ADVERTISEMENTS"

At last June's Convention, a new Heisey publication was made available to members. It was done with so little fanfare that I doubt that most of you even know of its existence. I am sure that some of you would be interested in purchasing it, especially if you are interested in Heisey's advertising.

As many of you know, Sandra Stout recently published a rather large book on Heisey as pictured through the company's ads. It is quite a good reference and gives the collector a good idea of what Heisey made and when and also just what the company was pushing through advertis-

As an adjunct to this book, two Heisey members from the Rochester, NY, area who have long been interested in glass advertising and Heisey specifically, produced a small book listing all of the Heisey ads they knew about and crossreferenced it to the Stout book. In addition to her ads, they have several pages of ads which she did not include in her book.

This book lists all known magazines and periodicals in which Heisey ads appeared and the issue in which they appeared. If known, page numbers are included. Also ads which are the same but appeared in different issues are coded so that the user knows the ads are the same. Also included is a list of known ads showing Heisey glass, but which are not Heisey advertisements.

All in all, it is a great little book which will help the collectors of Heisey ads keep their collection organized and will tell them where to look for more and different information. As one who knows how difficult it is to organize and work with information, I take my hat off to Jerry Gillette and Marvin Jacob for the great job they did for the HCA in compiling this book. 

It is also interesting that there are no pictures of colognes in Heisey catalogs and no mention of them in Heisey Price Lists. Therefore we must assume that all of them were made at George Duncan Sons since we have no proof at all that they were ever made at Heisey. Thanks to George Fogg and Frank Maloney for the use of their catalog.

Since one of the colognes appeared recently we thought we should again remind you <u>not</u> to buy these for Heisey. They should have collector's value as Duncan.




#### CROOKS IN THE KING HOUSE?

KOVELS' ANTIQUE & COLLECTIBLES PRICE LIST Nineteenth Edition, Ralph & Terry Kovel, Crown Publishers \$10.95

One of the standard price guides on antiques has been the Kovels' guide. The new issue is now on the market and is a very handy easy-to-carry, easy-to-use book. It is soft bound and has over 750 pages with over 45,000 entries.

By using a computer system to record actual selling prices throughout the country, a very accurate index has been made in the back of the book listing where various categories can be found throughout the regular listings.

Just to review the Heisey section, which is over 5 pages, indicates the completeness of the book. However, several Heisey collectors might quibble with some of the entries made under the Heisey section. For instance, it is a surprise that Heisey has become the listing for Cupid and Psyche pattern glass (this mistake probably arises from the Cupid and Psyche ash tray which Heisey did make). Heisey has also been credited with a "figurine, woodchuck, blue" - no indication this is Imperial and never was Heisey. There are a few other difficult-to-interpret entries, but on the whole, the guide for Heisey glass seems remarkably accurate.
