

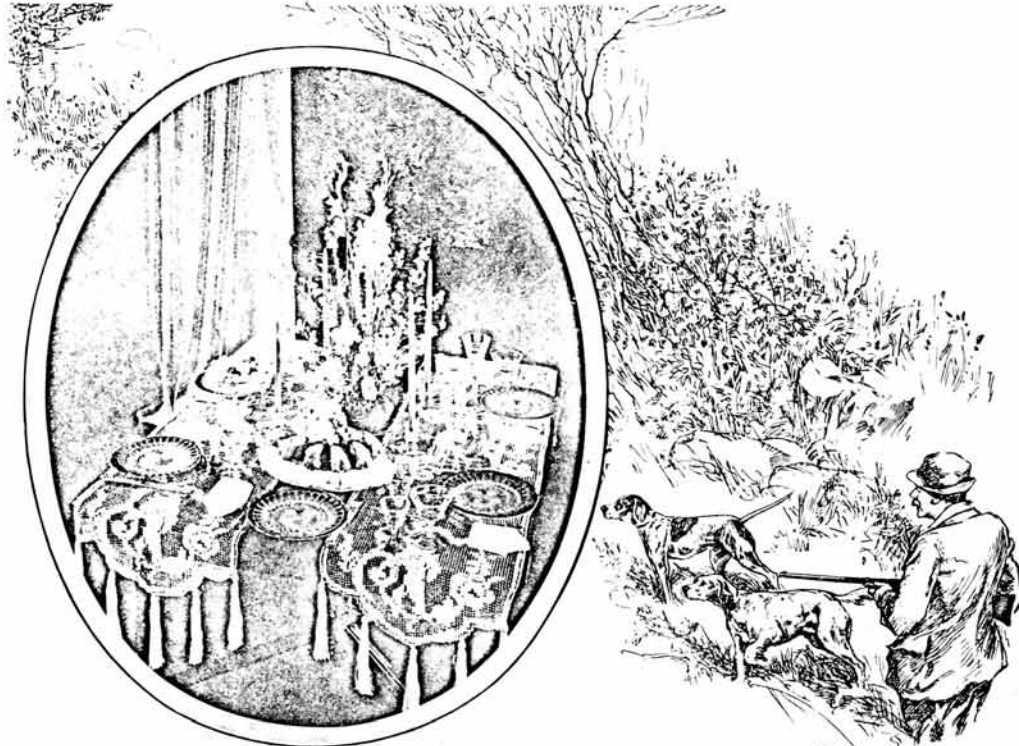



An Old Southern Recipe for Quail

When Bacon, a distinguished-looking old darkey, presided over the cuisine of the Peabody Hotel at Memphis, it was famed for smothered quail on toast. Game laws now forbid public serving of quail, but this recipe survives in the possession of a charming Southern hostess.

Keep birds cool and dry several days. Dress without washing. Split down the back. Wipe with dry cloth. Heat deep fat skillet and grease with garlic pod. Have enough water to keep birds from sticking. Put in bay leaf, lump of butter, pinch of salt and sprinkle black pepper. Put slice of bacon on each bird and place breast downward in skillet. Cook over and weight down. Cook 12 to 15 minutes, replenishing water to hold flavor. Stir in chopped mushrooms. Serve on platter with buttered toast.

Pour mushroom gravy over birds. Serve extra gravy, apple jelly, some of "cracklin" bread and black coffee.

My name is Katherine McCracken (please call me Kathy) and I am very happy to have assumed the position of Curator at the National Heisey Glass Museum. As I write this report, I have been at work for almost two weeks going through files, catching up on correspondence and accessioning, and getting to know more about HCA. It promises to be an interesting and busy job and I look forward to meeting and working with all of you.

My husband, Gordon Morrell, is a professor of British and Russian/Soviet history at Denison University. We moved to Granville one year ago from East Lansing, MI where Gordon completed his Ph.D. Both of us are from southern Ontario, Canada and we are getting to know central Ohio.

My background is in historic sites, museums, and historic preservation. I have an honors B.A. in history from the University of Western Ontario and a M.A. in public history from the University of Waterloo. I have worked at outdoor historic sites in Alberta and Ontario, Canada and was the director at the R.E. Olds Museum in Lansing, MI. Prior to moving to Ohio, I was employed as the Preservation Planer at the Michigan State Historic Preservation Office. Postal Alternative

For some time, HCA has encouraged members who experience an undue delay in receiving their newsletters to contact their local post office or postmaster to file a complaint form. Additionally, HCA made an attempt to alleviate the problem by putting "Dated Material" on each issue mailed. These measures for some were helpful, but for others were not. Therefore, the Board of Directors has authorized another alternative for those members who continue to have a problem and desire to receive their *Heisey News* in the most timely manner possible. That alternative, effective with the February issue, will be the opportunity to have your newsletter mailed to you in an envelope marked and stamped for a First Class mailing. This procedure will incur a cost of \$13.00 in addition to your yearly dues. (\$1.00 per issue, the 13th issue being the Benefit Auction List.) The fee is based on First Class postage, envelopes, and special handling. It will not be possible to have single issue mailing.

Since the effective date begins with the February issue, you will need to pro rate the \$13.00 to your membership renewal date. Check your membership card or the address label to determine how many issues remain until your renewal date from January 1, plus the Auction issue. Send that amount by January 1 to receive a First Class mailing of the February issue. Your next membership renewal notification will then reflect your dues, plus \$13.00 for First Class mailing of the newsletter. Contact the membership secretary at the HCA business office, if you wish to make arrangements for this First Class mailing of your newsletter.

Membership Report

At the September Board meeting, the membership report showed 3,373 associate members and 521 voting members for a total of 3,894 members. It is noteworthy that the voting members represent only about 13% of the total membership. HCA is a large organization which operates a fine museum and faces issues which need the input of its voting members. If you are not a voting member, please consider contacting HCA about adding your name to the voting membership roster.

Diamond H Trademark

Concern was expressed by the Board on the unauthorized use of the Diamond H trademark. Since January 31, 1984, the Diamond H has been registered by the United States Patent and Trademark Office for the ex-



clusive use of Heisey Collectors of America. In order to use the trademark in any way, requires review of proposed use and written authorization by HCA. For information, contact HCA, or submit a written proposal to the President or Secretary of HCA.

The Expansion Committee Report

Sam Schnaidt, Committee Chairman



Our committee has been very active and we have been meeting frequently since June. Several out-of-state and out-of-town members have made the effort to attend meetings. I appreciate this and feel this is reflective of the importance of this committee. At one meeting we agreed to recommend to the Board to proceed and engage the Bill Heim Company to assist in a feasibility study. Bill Heim advised that we needed to determine costs of the project first and also raise about \$1,000,000.00 before they started. After getting estimates on construction from three separate sources and figuring other necessary costs, we came up with figures that exceed \$1,280,471.00. These figures made us reconsider.

The Committee felt that the above mentioned figure would probably be unobtainable and questioned whether it would be advisable to spend this much money at this location. We felt our next step would be to explore possible alternatives.

After discussing the proposed alternatives, the Committee is pursuing to reduce the size and scope of the project and is considering building to the rear of the present office for additional library and archival use.

Contractor Bill Kelley and his son Tom met with the Committee on October 1st, and listened to what we had in mind. They are to meet with us again on October 16th and give us an estimated cost of the scaled down project. We hope to present a proposal at the December quarterly meeting.

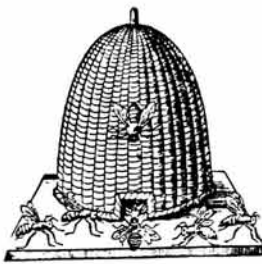

A number of small souvenir pieces in Cut Block, a Custard Winged Scroll puff box; a Fancy Loop creamer in Emerald and Crystal celery dip; a Puntly & Diamond Point hotel creamer; a Cut Block footed jelly; a pair of silver overlay Lariat fan vases; the Twist 8" low-footed bowl with stepped base, cut; various stems, in particular a Plymouth cocktail with the Barcelona cut; a #435 tumbler (Vogel, Book IV, page 164); a #473 Narrow Flute with Rim Nabisco tray (quite an obscure piece); a #5 Patrician candlestick. In Moongleam: the #354 syrup; an Oak Leaf coaster; an 8" Eagle plate; and a Wabash goblet with polychrome enamel decoration. In Sahara: a Trident candlestick and a Yeoman D/O cruet. In Marigold: The #1210 6" relish (The Collectors Encyclopedia of Heisey Glass, Bredehoft, p. 386). In Cobalt: A 16 oz #1404 Old Sandwich beer mug, Wow. Other items of interest were a #315 Panelled Cane cruet, a Crystolite mustard, with paddle and a 14" torte plate with fraternity letters cut into the center; a #331 Straw jar bottom, which stimulated a lengthy discussion about the two different covers apparently used on this piece; a pair of marked Heisey towel bars and a pair of shoe display holders; a fabulous #352 cigar jar; and a hard-to-find Urn goblet.

Already suffering from sensory overload, we were then presented with a Pillows cracker jar and cruet, the Monte Cristo cordial with Olympiad etch, a Waverly

chocolate box, Orchid etch, and a 10" #4198 vase in Orchid!

Have you seen or heard of this before?

A Dear R.S.

My guess is that they are Heisey and that the Hobbs Brockunier signature is a forgery.. I have never come across any indication that Hobbs Brockunier ever used a signature. It is unlikely that Heisey would have been granted a patent, unchallenged for a design which had already been made in glassware. That style of candlestick would not have been typical of the glass made during the Hobbs - Brockunier period.

diamonds are forever....

I was thumbing through a few articles on the Yachting Center, and I came across an old menu from the year 1909 - thought my friends would enjoy seeing the prices. A complete fish dinner - \$1.00, a bowl of clam chowder - 15 cents, fried clams - 20 cents, lobster - 50 cents, french fries - 10 cents, apple pie and ice cream - 10 cents. Today a good fish dinner would be around \$12.00!

I saw a Heisey salesmans' catalog order form, dated 1943. It listed #1503 Crystolite: 10 oz goblet - \$9.00, 3-1/2 oz claret - \$9.00, 2 qt. ice lip jug - \$21.00, 10 oz pressed tumbler - \$3.60, 2 light candlesticks (no prisms) - \$36.00, mustard and cover - \$6.00, 3 oz oil bottle - \$10.80, #1540 powder box - \$18.00, square ashtray - \$5.40, and lily vase, cupped - \$18.00. The above prices refer to price per dozen. Today you couldn't purchase one of these items for any of the prices listed above.

Forever Heisey dropped me a line to brag about the following items: the #1231 Ribbed Octagon rum pot in Flamingo, never seen before in this color.¹ This water jug, usually called a rum pot by collectors, is the most desirable piece in the pattern and was made circa 1933-1937. The #1469 Ridgeleigh, pair of bobeches in Trial Blue, never seen or known to have been made. Previously, #1469 star relish had been seen in Experimental Blue.

The Steadfast Colleague has been on a business trip, pleasure also, but before he went I was told about a couple of interesting finds: #1519 Waverly cream, #170 Cut Block plate (2) one flat & one rolled edge, #1503 Crystolite cigarette box with cover, along with the #1503 floral bowl, #1540 Lariat cup and saucer (2 sets) and the #300 four light candelabra, definitely a keeper.

The Gator Guy and Gal did a wee bit of shopping while in Minnesota. Found were a pair of #1533 Wampum candlesticks, these were found the second time around the shop, along with a Flamingo #1184 Yeoman compote. It appears to be made from a 6 oz champagne that had the bowl partially flattened; it has the same stem as the Yeoman champagne. It measures 3 7/8" tall and has a diameter of 5" across the top of the compote, the bowl has a depth of 1-1/8" with a hint of a rim. Unusual, maybe a teeny bit rare!! There were two, and they left the other one for someone else to discover.

The Farmer is taking the winter off; just sitting by the fire warming his toes. That gets rather boring and he jumps into his truck and heads for the "fleas" etc. to scout out some Heisey. There was (1) #1205 Fancy Loop 9" square nappy, (9) #433 Greek Key 8" plates, a #1401 Empress 11" Dolphin footed floral bowl in

Alexandrite, (1) #1401 Empress 14" oval platter in Moongleam, a #1415 20th Century 9 oz footed tumbler in Dawn, (1) #1404 Old Sandwich individual ashtray in Cobalt, (6) #1425 Victorian 5 oz juices, (1) #351 Priscilla 7" sweet pea vase, and (6) #136 colonial 7 oz tumblers. This is terrific, *Mr. Farmer*, now how about another list for *Yours Truly*, it is time. *The Kansas Yankees* found nine each of stemware, goblets, iced teas, sherbets, champagnes and wines, in the Old Dominion, diamond optic in Sahara. *The Foxy Kitten* reports a pair of #305 Puntly and Diamond Point colognes, with sterling tops.

Yours Truly has a #100 Centennial 6" candlestick, etched, #109 Petticoat Dolphin candlesticks - two pair, one in Crystal the other in Flamingo, #1231 Ribbed Octagon after dinner cup and saucer, Flamingo and the #360 hotel creamer.²

Again I ask for your input. I need your letters to keep me writing throughout the long cold winter.

Remember what Jeffrey A. Timmons once said: "Always do what you say you are going to do, it is the glue and fiber that binds successful relationships"

HEISEY IN THE TRADE JOURNALS

No. 429 Plain Panel Recessed

by Tom Felt

Sometime around 1910, Heisey added yet another to their already varied selection of colonial lines. No. 429, known to collectors today as Plain Panel Recessed, is distinguished from the other by its wide panels and by the angular "recess" which appears at the base of each of the pieces. It was a small line, with less than three dozen different items offered, and yet boasted a total of five design patents.

The first of these, filed March 10, 1910 and approved May 10, 1910 as D40,686 was for the hotel cream (figure 1). Catalog pictures show this piece with a cover. It's

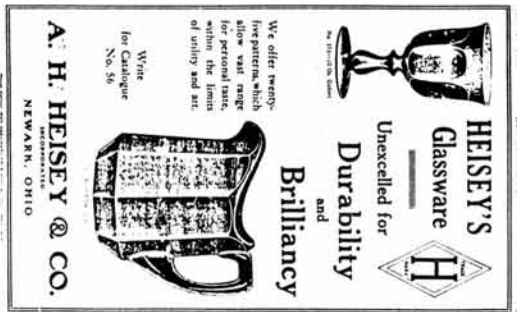

likely the pattern was introduced at about this time, but as was often the case, during this period, it wasn't advertised until late the following year, when the 1/2 gallon jug was featured in *Iron Age-Hardware* (figure 2). This was



the largest of four sizes of jugs available in the line. (Note that this ad mentions that Heisey was offering twenty-five patterns--all but one of which were colonial in style!)

Another patent was filed for on October 10, 1912. It was approved January 7, 1913 as D 43,437 and was for the crushed fruit. This piece was made in both one and two quart sizes-- the latter can be seen in figure 3, which



appeared in the *Confectioners Journal* in March 1913. As with all of the other pieces in this pattern, the designer was Andrew J. Sanford, the man who was responsible for the majority of the early designs made by Heisey (including, I suspect, many for which he was not credited).

Three more patents were approved in 1913 : D43,703 (filed May 6, 1912 and approved March 11, 1913) for the

tumbler (figure 4); D43,853 (filed February 3, 1913 and approved April 15, 1913) for the cruet; and D43,781 (filed January 11, 1913 and approved April 1, 1913) for the No. 28 salt shaker (figure 5). (The latter may not have officially been part of the No. 429 pattern, which did include another style of salt, but it clearly matches the remainder of the line and has generally been accepted as part of it.) In his article on the #429 pattern in the March 1977 *Heisey News*, Joe Lokay mentions that Hazel Atlas and one other company made salts very similar to this one and warns that the Diamond H should

always appear on the side of this shape of salt shaker.

A few of these pieces can be found advertised in popular magazines in 1912 and 1913. *Country Life in America* included an advertisement in December 1912 with the tumbler featured. In the September 1913 issue of *House Beautiful* and in the October number that year of both the *Ladies Home Journal* and the *Woman's Home Companion* there was a full page ad which included the egg glass amongst pieces from several other patterns. Finally, in December the two latter magazines once again included advertisements, this time devoted to the #429 pattern, with the oil, 3 pint jug and 8 inch nappy pictured.

In addition to the pieces already mentioned, the 1913 catalog also offered four other sizes of nappy, three oval nappies, three sizes of celery tray, a goblet, an ice tea, an individual salt, a finger bowl, a custard cup and a low footed sherbet. At some point after this catalog was issued and before the 1915 addendum came out, a punch bowl and base was also added to the line, with either the sherbets or custard cups doubling as punch cups. Although apparently the last piece created, the punch bowl seems to have had the longest life, since it is the only item in pattern #429 still being offered in 1928, the remainder of the line having been discontinued probably early in the 1920's.

There are no molds still in existence for this pattern and it was never reissued by Imperial.

More Stem Stuff - #423 Diamond Band by Carl Sparacio

Diamond Band is somewhat of a mystery pattern - there is so little known about it. The goblet has been a subject of controversy but we'll deal with that after we pin down what we've been able to piece together about #423 Diamond Band.

I can say without fear of contradiction that Diamond Band is a rare pattern. How about that for raw courage? Over the years I've found a set of nappies as well as the cover for a sugar bowl. I did see a coverless sugar bowl in less than pristine condition at a show but it was priced ridiculously high for what it was, chipped, sans cover and without a creamer. My cover remains bottomless. I had a punch cup at one time and I saw an egg cup a couple of times. I've also seen the jug and the goblet at the museum. There you have the sum total of my Diamond Band encounters in more than twenty years of Heisey hunting. Embarrassing, isn't it?

Diamond Band is a pleasing pattern and the glass (we experts usually say "metal" but I'm talking down to you now) is bright and clear. In the February 1979 issue of the Heisey News this pattern is noted briefly and twenty items are listed. It mentions that "Diamond Band is not an original name...." this may be so, but I've not heard it before so it sounds original to me. If they had called it "Candlewick", then I'd agree that it lacked originality.

Later, in the *Heisey News* of March 1981, Tom Bredehoft did a bit on #423 diamond Band in his column on tumblers. In his research he dug up a circa 1910 price list which listed 26 items and then yet another copy of the same price list (No. 155) which listed only the punch cup. Isn't that weird? No reflection on Tom, of course.

Vogel's books contribute little more than conjecture, but he also mentions a copy of the No. 155 price list. His copy listed five items, one of which was a footed ale which I'd like to see.

So, what have we learned so far? We've learned that Heisey collectors might want to try for a complete set of No. 155 price lists.

Since this is a stem article, we'll skip on to the goblet, a piece that has presented a problem of sorts. I know of only one genuine Diamond Band goblet and that one is

in the National Heisey Glass Museum, sometimes affectionately known by its nick name, "The Heisey Museum." You would think that a goblet in this pattern would be simple to identify, but there are problems. A few other "Diamond Band" goblets, all guaranteed to have come out of THE Heisey home, are making the rounds at rather stiff prices and, near as I can tell, they are pretenders to the throne.

"Egads!" and "Gadzooks!" you exclaim, "How can this be? A Heisey pattern out of THE Heisey home and not genuine Heisey?" Alas, my friends, it's true and you are indeed fortunate to have an expert to set you straight. A usually reliable source has reported a look-alike Diamond Band goblet identical to those reputedly out of the Heisey home and it was signed "Val St. Lambert", the fine French glass concern, though I've not seen one signed. There are obvious differences between the Diamond Band goblet in the museum and those believed to be French.

Somebody copied from somebody. A lot of that goes on in the glass business. We will not cast aspersions but we do know who's glasses were found in whose house, don't we.

I wrote to Val St. Lambert but have not received a response. I would have called France but my French is limited to "Ou est la salle de bain", which I learned at the World's Fair up in Quebec in the sixties. Not much sense calling to ask the location of a bathroom, I can't afford to visit.

For all their apparent similarity, the goblet in the museum which is 100% pressed and has a large Diamond H under its foot, is quite different from those said to be out of the Heisey home. The latter are unsigned and all of the design elements are cut. The glass, too, is more brilliant than Heisey's and the "diamonds" are a bit smaller as are the flutes. Nor do the number of flutes match. I counted 15 on the signed Heisey goblet and only 14 on brand X.

The drawings included here are not precise. They were sketched by a very shaky hand but they do show size and design differences. If I could draw fuzzy they would look better. There can be no doubt that these goblets did not come out of the same mold. The bowl on the one that may be Val St. Lambert is not as deep and consequently the goblet appears shorter though both goblets are actually the same height.

The good news is I did get a Diamond Band goblet for my collection. It was bought at a June HCA Convention show. The bad news is that mine is unsigned, it is cut, it has a star bottom, small "diamonds", 14 short flutes on a short bowl, and was very expensive.



I wish I had known an expert.

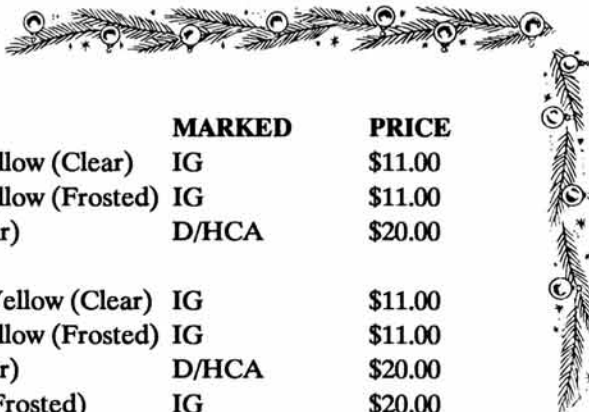
