

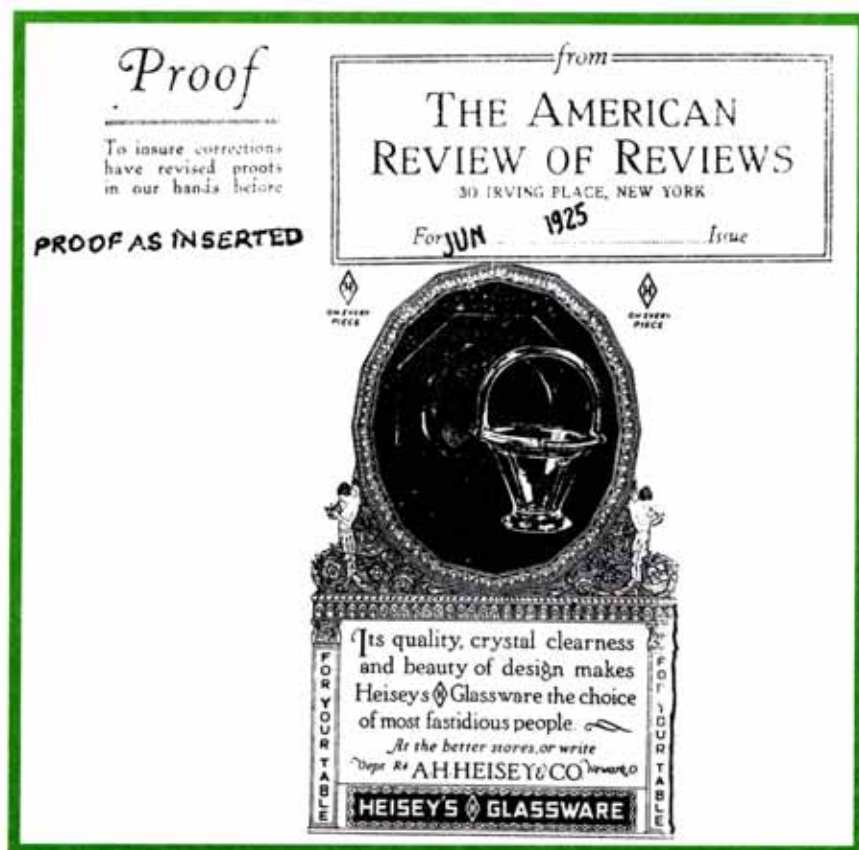

## President's Update

The 1995 Benefit Auction is now in HCA's history annals as the most successful ever. The total gross of the auction was in excess of \$108,000. The preliminary figure as I write this Monday morning following the auction is more than \$20,000 for the Museum Operating Fund. Donations for the Endowment Fund resulted in \$2300. What contributed to the unqualified success of the auction? One of the main reasons is the fact members consigned more than 100 lots over last year. That would not have been enough had it not been for the fact so many of you participated by sending in mail bids and attending the auction. I was amazed to look out over the audience and see members from coast to coast: Washington, California, Texas, Colorado, Florida, New York, New Jersey, North Carolina, Michigan and more. Thanks to all who supported this effort. Bob Rarey, Norm Thran, and members from the Dayton Area Study Club and the Hoosier Heisey Study Club deserve kudos for producing the event. Thanks also to the auctioneers: Tom Bischoff, Paul Robison, Sam Schnaidt and Larry Stickle.

Drawing favorable response at the auction was the preview of the sample cobalt Show Horse which will be offered for sale on a pre-order basis to *members only* (one per member) during a 30 day period starting May 18 through June 18. There will be **no seconds** offered for sale in the museum shop and **no frosted pieces**. Made by Dalzell Viking, they are nothing short of spectacular. Look for details in the May newsletter. Eager and interested new members were signed onto the HCA roster in anticipation of the offering!

Sitting beside the Show Horse and drawing interest was the sow and piglets in Lavender Ice. This is a fun set (particularly when referred to as the "sow and bunnies set" ... but then you had to be there) and the glass is Lavender Ice at its best. The set would be a great addition to the other Lavender Ice animals in your collection.

To the sounds of calypso music, the weekend was capped off by the 200 Dinner '95. Although not all tickets were sold before the dinner, prior to the drawing tickets were offered for sale to those in attendance. There was a frenzy of activity in response and the remainder of the tickets were sold in a matter of minutes. The elated grand prize winners were Fred and Doris Mossman of Newark. Frank Frye and the committee, including John Eshelman and Dick Smith, ticket sales, are to be commended for a job well done. The festive Carnival Cruise atmosphere for the evening was artfully created by Debbie Johnson and Heidi Schnaidt.

The board of directors met in a Sunday morning (and part of the afternoon) session following the gala evening. Good news started the meeting with the membership report showing 4020 members. Voting member numbers stand currently at 622. Members participating in one of the endowment levels are 302. Active study clubs number 41. For all of you who have taken action on the membership drive proposal to distribute information and membership forms to outlets in your areas, good news! To this date 16 new members have signed on. Keep up the good work by helping build awareness of HCA and inviting people to join.

Elsewhere in the newsletter will be the treasurer's report. It shows a strong standing for the first quarter which is expected to continue throughout the year due to the success of projects to date and scheduled projects for the remainder of the year. We have penciled in the possibility for unexpected expenses, but keep your eraser handy. After a three month review the board agreed to continue the bookkeeping procedure of daily data transactions into the computer accounting system with actual accounting procedures handled by the Newark accounting firm of Wells and Priest.

Due to the fact the museum is short staffed at the present time, a person will be sought to fill the position of museum assistant. This person will report to the administrator and will aid in doing the myriad of duties required to be accomplished by various key members of the staff. Currently the job search is under way.

The board approved a proposal to adopt the Scottie as the new convention souvenir starting in 1996. We anticipate just as long a run for this item as Oscar. Sales for this year's Oscar in "Goodness Gracious Brown!" are strong. However, it is not too late (at this date) to order yours. Don't miss out on Oscar's last run.

At the general membership meeting, the proposal for the revision of the constitution and bylaws as recommended by the Bylaws Committee and approved by the board for ratification, was presented. During discussion, ideas and suggestions from members were directed to the committee for further evaluation and consideration for future refinements. The proposal was adopted after a show of hands by the voting members. Adoption at this time, for one thing, means greater flexibility in absentee voting at the annual meeting. Look for details in May at the time the slate of candidates is featured.

There were no nominations from the floor. You can read about these candidates in the May issue of the newsletter. Serving as director is a commitment not just for one project, but for a whole range of duties more than four times a year over a four year period. These people are to be applauded for agreeing to serve HCA.

With sadness I announced the passing of three dedicated and long time HCA members: Helen Kennon, Ruth Perloff, and Liz King. They had been with the organization since the beginning and through their years of service and association, HCA grew to something of which they were very proud. I shall always remember them with great fondness.

Louise Ream continues to recuperate following a stroke. Many of you have asked for an address. Write to her at the Mann Nursing Home, 25 West Home Street, Westerville, Ohio 43081. I know you all join me in extending your best wishes for a speedy recovery.

Be sure to mark your calendars for two important upcoming HCA events. First, June 14-17 are the dates for Convention 1995! Preparation has been in full swing since LAST June: only last minute details are being worked out. Secondly, mark your calendar for September 8-9 the dates for the quarterly meeting in Greensboro, North Carolina. Members of the North Carolina club have been working on a schedule for a great weekend of activities featuring the annual Percy Moore Souvenir Dinner. I'll see you there! ♦

## Fainting Goats and Heisey Glass

When I started collecting Heisey, near the end of the Jurassic era, Heisey was plentiful, cheap and just this side of unknown. If I said, "Say, nice piece of Heisey you have there, " to the Brontosaurus and Pterodactyls who manned booths at antiques shows, they mostly replied, "Huh?"

The entire Heisey collecting fraternity consisted of twenty collectors in Newark, Ohio, and me. If they were aware of me at all, which is doubtful, they probably weren't worried about the competition. I imagined the folks in Newark, Ohio, picking Heisey off the streets, stashing it under their beds and worshipping at the smoke stack with the big Diamond H. No matter, I contented myself being very picky about the Heisey I selected at flea markets and antiques shows in North Jersey, such was its abundance.

The problem with this heavenly scenario was that unless a piece was "Colonial" and wore a big Diamond H, I didn't have a clue that it was Heisey, or could be. To this day I wake up in cold sweats from a recurring nightmare of missed treasures passing before my uneducated eyes. Please understand, stupidity had nothing to do with this. No, sir, my ignorance was honestly earned. Very little research material was available back then.

There were rumors of books on Heisey and I managed to track one down. I forget its name but I do remember it was by a Ms. Viola Cudd. If I find my copy I'll let you know the published date. As I became more knowledgeable I realized that perhaps Ms. Cudd's book was not as intensely researched as it could have been. With its help, I did manage to add glass to my collection, glass that Heisey never dreamed of making.

At about the same time (the late 60s,) Concetta Emanuele published *Heisey Gems I* (1968) *Heisey Gems II* (1969). Unfortunately, these volumes were a well kept secret in the east. I remained unaware of Ms. Emanuele's books until she published a book called *Stems* in 1970. *Stems* covered assorted stemware and only incidentally included Heisey's. It's a small book with limited coverage but it taught me that Heisey made more patterns than #300 Peerless.

About the same time, the HCA's own Kay Darling published a couple of articles on Heisey in Columbus, Ohio, newspapers. Unfortunately our newsboy didn't deliver Columbus newspapers in New Jersey; in fact, he often didn't deliver New Jersey newspapers (something to do with Little League, I think). Clarence Vogel's Book I, *Heisey's First Ten Years*, also hit the market in 1969. Talk about a revelation! Did you know that everything Heisey made **wasn't** marked with a Diamond H? I didn't. There was Fandango and Cut Block and Puntty Band and Plain Band and Puntty and Diamond Point and Fancy Loop and I could go on and on. I began to haunt the EAPG dealers (known as "Early American Pattern Glass" dealers to amateurs).

Heisey in color? Aw, c'mon. I didn't believe it until Loren & Virginia Yeakley's *Heisey Glass in Color*, which was also published during this productive period, revealed color to the rest of the world (me). I saw more patterns I never knew existed in colors I never imagined.

Enter the Heisey Collectors of America (HCA) in 1971, a group determined to single handedly destroy the Heisey monopoly I held in North Jersey. It began with their dedication to education. From the beginning, every monthly issue of the *Heisey News* offered information, then they rubbed salt in my wounds by offering books on every manner of Heisey subjects as well as catalog reprints. Soon the word spread that here was something we

didn't have to be stupid about. It wasn't long before Heisey became the collecting world's worst kept secret.

I complain about the HCA's education overkill but I do appreciate it. I'm a sucker for research. Offer a book and I'm sure to buy it, point me at a library and you send me towards heaven. When I do research for my newspaper column, no matter what the subject, I can always find some relationship to Heisey.

Case in point, there is a group called the *Fainting Goat Association*. Honest, I read about it in the *Smithsonian* magazine. It's an association of people who own fainting goats. A fainting goat, I learned from the *Smithsonian* article, is a small goat native to Asia that faints, flat out, at any loud noise. Clap your hands and the goat keels over—plop. Just like that. Apparently association members get their jollies this way.

"Hey, bring a gong and come over tonight. We'll scare the bejeebers out of our goat." "No thanks, we're going to stay home and hassle the puppy with a rolled up newspaper." Burning with curiosity, I pulled the three very LARGE volumes that make up the *Encyclopedia of Associations* from the reference section of our local library. This encyclopedia lists and gives vital information on most American associations and some international ones as well. It contains 22,000 names of associations, organizations and clubs in its 1995 edition. If you're a joiner, the *Encyclopedia of Associations* will reduce you to tears.

I could not find the *Fainting Goat Association's* listing as the *Smithsonian* promised. No matter, I know their magazine wouldn't lie. What I did locate, instead, was a dormant hernia revitalized by lugging that set of encyclopedias to the library reference table. Striking out on the fainting goats, I chose to sit quietly glancing through these volumes until the pain subsided.

I found a listing for an *American Council of Spotted Asses* but chose not to research that organization further. The truth could hardly be more fun than the speculation. My guess is it has something to do with the new Congress.

I was surprised to find a listing for the Heisey Collectors of America though I shouldn't have been. We are, after all, a legitimate association. Actually, most glass organizations were included, Fostoria, Fenton, Imperial, and so on. Cambridge's glass collectors organization, however, was conspicuous by its absence. Maybe they don't really exist.

The HCA was number 19,947 in a listing of 22,000 associations in this 1995 edition of the *Encyclopedia of Associations*. This means we can't shout, "We're number one!" Shouting, "We're number 19,947!" is a little awkward, especially when you try to hold up all those fingers.

I couldn't resist taking a peek at our entry. I wondered if its information was up to date. The encyclopedia says that the HCA was founded in 1971, has 4,000 members and a staff of five. Its budget is \$250,000 a year, it has forty state groups and a reference library. It also lists publications, committees, meetings and conventions. Oh, yes, It says our president is Schnaidt. President Amy Jo Jones may have a problem with that but I'm not going to be the one to break the news to her. Perhaps she'll make the 1996 edition.

Because they belong, all HCA members are educated collectors. An educated collector is a fierce competitor. I hope this column has inspired you to take advantage of all that HCA has to offer. Take advantage of your local library, too, it's full of useful knowledge. I learned not to lift three heavy volumes at one time. ♦

Not only that, but I did want to do some lead ins to the Heisey advertising exhibit to open in June. Fortunately this dandy was ready and waiting in the wings.

Immediately upon coming aboard HCA I started sorting the materials at hand. The archives room in the new building was not quite ready for occupancy and I had much with which to become familiar. It has not been until recently that I have been able to record those items I had first seen and placed in boxes or folders over a year ago. Today I came across one of these, a folder upon which I had written, "ADVERTISING!"

Now I suppose every businessman gets his share of criticism, suggestions and/or praise. There is always the question of what to ignore, what to take to heart, and what suggestions to incorporate into the ongoing operations of the organization. With suggestions, in particular, the good executive should be aware that the innovative genius in 'most all of us, just itching to burst forth, should not be stifled. The contents of the previously mentioned folder gives evidence of such blossoming. One cannot help but wonder how many other "Executive Pres." heard from this gentleman. Did they all disregard his offer? I see no evidence of encouragement.

Of library quality, the cover will be the same dark blue with gold lettering as was previously used. The price for binding is \$22.00 per volume, plus \$4.00 per volume if return shipping is required.

Back issues of the Heisey News will be bound for the same price. If some back issues of the Heisey News are missing, some may be available from HCA. Check with the museum staff if you need back issues.

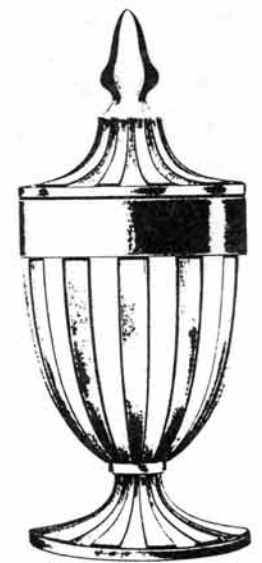

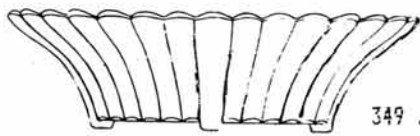

**The New Bedford Whaling Museum announces A New Exhibition: "Smith Brothers Fine Decorated Glassware" from October 14, 1994 through October 15, 1995.**

In 1870, when William L. Libbey moved the Mount Washington Glass Works from South Boston to New Bedford, he hired Alfred Smith, a skilled glass decorator, to establish a decorating shop on the new Mount Washington grounds. Within the next year or two, Alfred's brothers Harry and Samuel joined him, and shortly there after they established their own firm under the name of Smith Brothers.

The Smith Brothers firm was to earn a world-wide reputation for the quality of its decorated glass, an achievement recognized by an award of merit at the US Centennial Exposition held in Philadelphia in 1876.

As the popularity of art glass faded at the end of the century, so too did the fortunes of the Smith Brothers. In 1903, Alfred Smith, the remaining partner, closed the doors of the firm after nearly 30 years as leading glass decorators.

This exhibit, assembled with the help of Adjunct Curator Louis O. St. Aubin, Jr., will bring together more than two hundred pieces decorated by Smith Brothers, as well as documents, photographs and catalogs relating to the business.

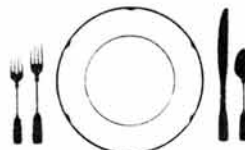

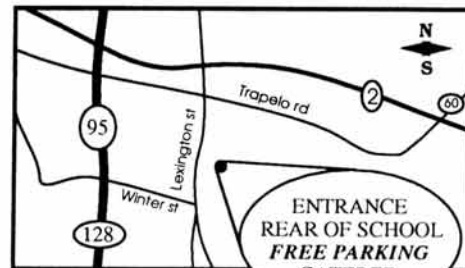
