As any HCA member is aware by now the purchase, moving, storage, maintaining, preserving, studying, use of, and paying for the Heisey glass moulds has been the prime concern and driving force of the Club, since January of 1985. Many of these concerns have been, or will soon be resolved, as are many things with hard work and time. If you were at the Annual meeting in June, you are aware that a motion was made and passed unanimously that "any disposition of any moulds be the function of the Board of Directors of HCA in total", not just the Executive Committee. Both the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors want to be responsive to the desire of the member - ship in all respects of the functioning of HCA. With this in mind suggestion boxes were strategically placed during the convention. Seventy-nine (79) persons placed suggestions in these boxes. Forty-three (43) were signed, thirty-four (34) were not signed, some had multiple suggestions. The eight (8) most prevalent suggestions were (1) Keep - 33. (2) Use - 17. (3) Destroy - 9. (4) Keep, don't use - 6. (5) Keep some - destroy some 6. (6) Sell parts to members - 9. (7) Don't make quick decision - 9. and (8) Adopt a mould (1-5 dollars per year) to help pay maintenance and storage.

There were a number of suggestions made by only one person, all have been read and noted for use in making decisions about the moulds. I think it is safe to say that the moulds will be kept and that some of the moulds will be used to make items for the Gift Shop and in special circumstances i.e., the Sparky for the June souvenir. By the time you read this we hope to be well on the way toward completing the move of OUR moulds to OUR warehouse.

It has been suggested that if the Endowment Fund had enough money we would not have to make glass to sell to maintain the HCA. (Membership fees do little more than pay for the newsletter). This premise is true but simple arithmetic indicated that the Endowment Fund would have to contain in excess of \$5,000,000.00 just to pay staff and maintain the museum. Unless we have some "Angels" with large quantities of money to put in the Endowment

As of August 12, we have received the following cash and pledged monies:

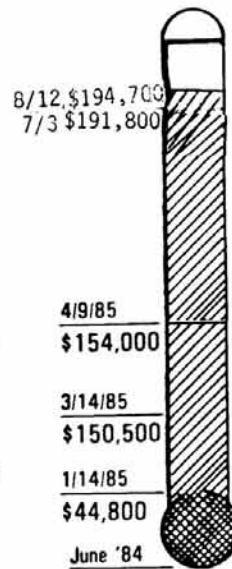

HEISEY CANDLESTICKS

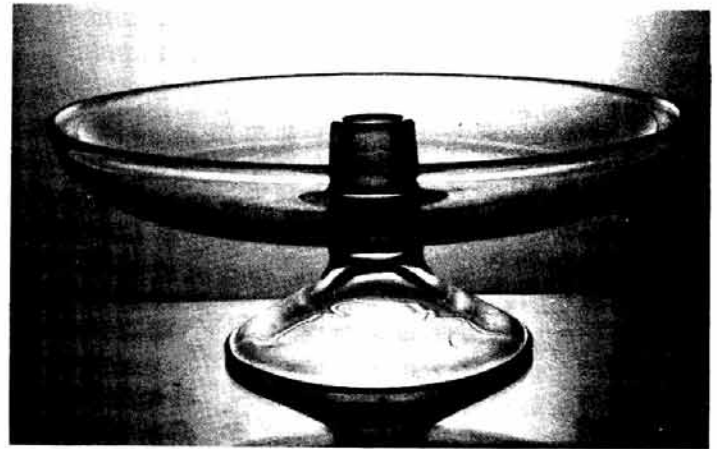

Although Heisey's Yeoman pattern was a fairly large one, dating back to 1913 and continuing in production all the way to 1957, there was only one "candleholder" associated with the line and it was not introduced until the mid-1930's. (Actually, it is more appropriate to speak of the Yeoman patterns, since Heisey used that name for pieces in a whole series of lines numbered from 1184 through 1189, mostly related by the simplicity and plainness of their design.) This one item, in fact, was not even originally intended to be used as a candlestick, but was only later offered for this purpose.

It is, however, closely related to two earlier no. 1183 Revere candleholders -- the vase candlestick, made from 1926-1927, and the four-light base and candleholders, which was made from 1933-1937. As a matter of fact, the epergne candleholder was even sold as part of the Revere pattern later in its production.

It was first made around 1937, at about the time that the Revere four-light candlestick was discontinued, and it has the same sort of very simple design associated with both the no. 1183 Revere and the various Yeoman pattern lines. From 1937 to 1944, it was listed as no. 1187. It was discontinued at that time for the duration of World War II and was



not reintroduced until July 1950, when it appeared in the catalogs as no. 1183 Revere. It only remained in production for about two years in the 1950's and was discontinued for a final time in 1952.

In the earlier period, it was listed as an epergne and was offered with various sizes of the no. 4233 vase, like that shown in the accompanying photograph. It was not until 1950 that Heisey began to list this item under the heading, "candlesticks for epergnettes." At that time, it could be purchased with the 6 inch no. 4233 vase, the 5 inch no. 5013 vase, or the small no. 1519 Waverly epergnette -- or the base could be bought alone, presumably for use as a candleholder. It was around this time, of course, that the epergnettes introduced by Heisey in the late 1940's were at their most popular, with many items being offered which combined candlelight with floral displays.

In April 1942, Heisey advertised this epergne in Better Homes & Gardens, showing it with no. 507 Orchid etch. It was pictured with flowers in the insert vase as well as floating in the bowl.

The bowl itself is about 9 3/4 inches wide and relatively shallow, making it appropriate for this kind of use or for displaying fruit. The height of the bowl is 4 inches. It was made in crystal only, and the ones I have seen have not been marked. This may be one reason why it does not seem to be seen very often, despite a total production period of nearly 10 years.

It was not reissued by Imperial.

These were napping but, in the same shop "yours truly" picked up a cute little #1469 Ridgeleigh mustard with cover, both pieces marked, for less than a movie ticket. Things like this offset the pieces I pay dearly for - which are many, believe me.

The "Terrific Lady" (ma) has a pair of #1489 Puritan oil and vinegars plus the #335 Prince of Wales Plumes toothpick/good gold. Another Bay Stater (ma) came up with the #462 Nail 7" nappy, square; and from still another section of the Bay were found twelve (12) octagon nut dishes in moongleam.

The "double steppin couple" sure did some fancy steppin when they came up with a #1509 Queen Ann ice bucket/Tally Ho etch and a beautiful Bird of Paradise Vase/Dorothy Thorpe.

"One of the Lucky Seven" from the Palmetto State (TX) has a #300 Peerless individual cream petticoat base; a #112 sahara candlestick; #1472 Parallel Quater 3" stick and a # 1229 Octagon d/o moongleam Bon-bon.

Let's talk about "a friend in deed" - this friend always seems to come up with some scarce and interesting pieces, #4163 54 oz. tankard/Tally Ho etch and a #4036 $\frac{1}{2}$ decanter/cut. Now "Twinkle Toes" on the other hand has a beautiful #300 Claret Jug.

"The Busy Bee" was flitting around gathering a bit-o-honey and she brought back to the hive #357 Prison Stripe 10" nappy; while the "sharp eyed friends" have a #2516 Circle Pair $\frac{1}{2}$ gal. water pitcher in flamingo; #6 8" Vase with sterling

base and a #1200 Cut Block ind creamer, ruby stain and souvenir Revere Beach 1905 "Mother".

At show and tell our last meeting a very strange thing occurred: two members brought in the identical piece, the #1413 Cathedral Vase, both marked. The only difference, one was plain moon-gleam and the other, also moongleam, Artic Etch, whichever one they were great!!

The "Mr" and I had company drop in the evening we were going to watch "Malice in Hollywood" on T.V., the show about Hedda Hopper and Louella Parsons, you know, the two hollywood gossip columnists. So we taped the program. The other evening we watched the tape for the first time and all of a sudden there on the TV screen was a punch bowl. "OK", I said. "Back up and stop." Was it or wasn't it, ahhh yesss, as big as life the #433 Greek Key Punch Bowl. Boy, you really have to watch TV close or you might miss a great piece of Heisey.

"The Wpirit" has moved to the "Garden State" (NJ); she just became the very proud owner of a #3397 Gascony Cobalt Decanter with nine (9) wines. Beautiful, beautiful!!

"The Empire State of the South" (GA) reports a #352 Flat Panel ice cream holder and a pair of #1540 Lariat 3 lite sticks.

Motion by Percy Moore that gift shop items approved by the Board be ordered by gift shop personnel as needed. 2nd by George Schamel. Passed.

Butch Jones made a motion to purchase a building at 150 Clinton Street, Newark, Ohio, for the storage of moulds and excess gift shop stock, for a purchase price of \$35,000.00. 2nd by Al Miller. Passed unanimously.

Report on tables by George Schamel. 220 8' tables, 25 6' tables, 12 4' round tables and 1 5' round table. (The round tables are for the display area)

Motion by Odell Johnson to show appreciation and recognition for past service, "I move that the present HCA Board approve and direct that for the 1986 June convention badges similar to those worn by present officers, be issued to past directors.

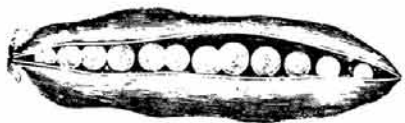
The badges besides having the wearers name shall also be inscribed "past director" or past president". 2nd by Ray Ziegler. Passed unanimously.

1483 Stanhope, pressed, and 4083 Stanhope, blown were shown in only one Heisey Catalog. This is a 36 page supplement dated 6/1/37. The only other patterns in this Catalog are 1469, 1469 1/4, 1469 1/2, and 1469 3/4 Ridgeleigh, plus 1485 Saturn, 1486 Coleport, 1488 Kohinoor and 4069 Ridgeleigh, blown.

The Stanhope pattern was developed by Von Nessen, a New York designer. Carl Cobel, a free lance designer from Newark, the son of master mouldmaker Ray Cobel, was working for the Von Nessen firm at the time and designed some etchings for Stanhope.

Apparently Von Nessen and Heisey had great expectations for this modern pattern. It won an award for its use of plastic buttons (called "Placon") which were inserted into the open handles of most pieces.

The plastic buttons came in five colors - red, blue, black, yellow and ivory. They screwed together so were easy to insert or remove.

Even with a big advertising campaign, Stanhope never became popular.

In 1980 Imperial made the tall two-handled vase, in a color called Stiegel Green, for the Smithsonian Institute. It has also been seen in emerald and both are marked L.I.G. for "Lenox Imperial Glass". Most of the earlier items are unmarked.

Only two pressed items are known in color. One is the 2-handled 12" Celery, with two known in Sahara. The other is the unusual two-light candelabra with one pair known in experimental blue, absolutely beautiful and probably are worth a fortune.

The 4083 blown Stanhope was made in crystal only and crystal with a Zircon stem. Of course, the Zircon is far more valuable.

The following pages show the entire Stanhope line with the exception of the blown 8 and 12 oz. sodas and the 1 oz. cordial which is rare. I wonder if it exists in Zircon.
