HEISEY'S LITTLE THINGS

There are a few salt dips in the upcoming March Auction. One that is certainly worth trying to buy is the #1183 Tub Salt in Cobalt. As far as I know, none of these has ever been found with the Diamond H, yet it is listed in Cobalt in a price list. These very seldom come on the market so someone is going to add a rarity to a collection next month.

No. 337 referred to as "Plain Touraine" in the catalog and in advertising is next in line and was first advertised in February 1902. Touraine was a great change from the elaborate patterns of earlier years. The surface is completely plain and the only identifying feature is a swelling bulge on every item. The glass is also thinner than the former patterns. This pattern, again, has little to offer the HLT Col-These include the punch cup with its star bottom, the #3 salt and pepper, the 1 oz. cordial, a toothpick, (could easily be mistaken for a bar glass) and a 1-1/2 oz. wine. All of these should be marked.

The cordial is very similar in shape to the later #3317 which is actually blown, not pressed, as is the #337 Touraine. Undoubtedly the #337 line had great influence on all this later blown line as the shape is nearly the same.

To relieve the plainness of Touraine, Heisey applied a number of decorations. There are: #56 gold edge with one wide and two narrow bands; #63, same as #56 except it has a wide green band; ruby lustre on the bowl; and light and dark amber on the stemware. There may be others.

The first ad for #339 Continental was in the January 15, 1903, issue of <u>CROCKERY AND</u> GLASS JOURNAL. This is another heavy colonial panel and, like Touraine, was named by Heisey.

All Continental pieces have a bulge an inch or so above the bottom. On the butter dish lids, the bulge is at the top. This bulge is much more predominant than on the Touraine. Little things in this pattern are scarce, there being only the salt and pepper #2 and #3, the toothpick, punch cup and small wine.

No. 310 Ring Band was made around 1900 and can be found both marked and unmarked. It is most often seen in Ivorina Verde or Ivory (both now called custard glass) and seldom found in crystal. The toothpicks are usually in custard and may have souvenir dates and places. Tumblers are also often souvenirs. The decoration can consist of gold or green on the bands. The only "little things" would be the toothpick, salt and pepper and punch cup. Mr. Vogel earlier called this pattern #1245, but it was later learned, from a colored insert page which I have, that the pattern is really #310, which has been named Ring Band. No. 1245 is the number for another pattern which has been named STAR and ZIPPER. I know of no little things in this.

Have any of you been adding anything to your HLT's? 'Let me know so that I'll know if anyone reads these articles. I hope that new

members are also becoming aware of old patterns from the pictures I've been using.



NO. 142 CASCADE CANDLESTICK

This was one of Heisey's earlier multiple light candlesticks which, like the No. 134 twolight Trident, was destined to become a standard in Heisey's line. It is not too surprising to realize that up until 1929 all of Heisey's candlesticks were single light (candelabra excepted), and by introducing their first three-light candlestick, the No. 129 Tricorn, in June of 1929, Heisey was keeping up with the popular trends of the day. Their next three-light was the No. 136 Triplex which came out in January of 1931, and in about June of 1933, the No. 142 Cascade became the third three-light to be introduced. These were followed over the next eighteen years or so by ten more three-light candlesticks, mostly as parts of their larger pattern groups such as Crystolite, Lariat, Whirlpool, Waverly and Plantation. However, the No. 142 had the longest life of them all. It was produced for twenty four years by Heisey and then ten years by Imperial.

In addition to being the longest produced three light, the Cascade had another claim to fame. It was the last in the long series of candlesticks which had a three digit pattern number assigned to it alone, that is, it was not part of a pattern group. Just four years earlier in 1929, Heisey began making candlesticks as parts of pattern groups which were assigned four digit pattern numbers. This started a trend which Heisey was to follow with its candlesticks until 1957.

The Cascade was truly a "child of its time" in the sense that it was produced during those middle years when Heisey was using a mixture of figural, geometric and abstract designs of curves and swirls.

As seen in the photo, this candlestick is three-tiered with each candleholder (cup) rising about 1-1/2 inches above the next. Each candleholder is supported by a curved arm almost reminding us of the "reverse s" of the Athena pattern, or the curls and loops of the Lariat pat-

tern. The candleholders, on the other hand, are composed of eight panels with eight corresponding shallow punties around the center portion, reminiscent of the colonial or early American motifs. The arms and candleholders were pressed, while the foot was applied by hand after the arms were removed from the mold.

Perhaps this candlestick's third claim to fame is that it was the second most popular blank to be used for cutting by Heisey. It was offered over the years with at least forty-six different production cuttings and eight etchings. The only candlestick used for a greater variety of cuttings was the No. 134 Trident. To give an idea of how popular this candlestick was, Heisey factory turn book data from July 1938 to February 1946 tells us that somewhat more than 32,000 were made during this period. And although these are relatively common today in crystal, it is the cobalt and sahara colors that are rare. Price list #210 from June of 1933 indicates this was made briefly in both these colors. The HCA museum now owns a cobalt example, thanks to the Bay State Heisey Collectors Club. It is currently on display upstairs with the rest of the cobalt items and as with most of Heisey's cobalt candlesticks which had an applied foot, this one also has a crystal foot

an applied foot, this one also has a crystal foot.

Because of its versatile design this candlestick was mixed and sold with many of Heisey's patterns and as parts of console sets. During the '40s it was illustrated in many Heisey ads in such popular magazines as House Beautiful, House & Garden, Bride's Magazine and Ladies Home Journal.

Oddly enough, it is seldom marked with the Diamond

Three seems to be a magic number. Two baskets, the #465 8" in crystal and the #462. From the Bay State, I hear that a very distinguished fellow came across a #1776 Kalonyal sugar shaker with enamel decoration and a brass top ... Keep up the good work.... another Bay State collector called to tell me that she had received a call asking if she would like to look at, and possibly purchase, a collection of Covered Candy dishes, (era depression). She, of course, at least wanted to look. There was a real nice assortment spread nicely on a large table. Much to her surprise was, mixed in, a #343 Sunburst covered butter; a #1489-1/2 6" cigarette box with the horsehead cover; a #353 Flat Panel covered butter and two (2) #379 Urn covered hotel sugars. Perhaps the candy dish collector thought all were candy dishes, who knows. The Bay Stater didn't care, she wisely purchased them all..... again we hear from "The Point", two (2) beer mugs with Fox Chase etching were found..... real nice finds the last few months. I am waiting to hear from you again..... quite a lovely find was reported from "The Buckeye State", the #1541 Athena cream and sugar with a beautiful cutting. This was not a sleeper..... also from the "Buckeye State" came news of more goodies; #471 cruet; #1184/109 Flamingo Petticoat Dolphin Comports, cut - this was not one, but a pair..... nice! also a #1235 tumbler and #1469 Ridgeleigh bitters bottle..... keep those finds coming!... Mustn't leave out "Yours Truly", I've added to my collection the #305 Punty & Diamond Point Paste Pot; Pair of #2 Salt & Peppers with sterling tops (sleeping soundly); #1404 Old Sandwich individual ash-tray in Flamingo and the Kingfisher Flower Frog, clear; that one was a real find, perfect and signed..... From "The Sunshine State", I hear of an Alexandrite mayo and ladle (no pattern given, must be Empress?); #355 Quator rectangular sugar and cream in

Sahara, and the #1469 Ridgeleigh cigarette box and four (4) ash-trays in Zircon..... keep sending those super finds "Sunshine"..... the "Tipper" claims six (6) #2930 Plain and Fancy tumblers with #163 Monticello etch; a Cygnet; a Kicking Colt; a #470 Intercepted Flute 8" nappy and he sort of mumbled something about a #429 Plain Panel Recess 6 oz oil, this one, he says, needs a stopper..... my First Convention Heisey Friend tells me about a 7" footed #433 Greek Key compote with a deep bowl.... the Constitution State wrote about a half dozen #3408 Jamestown stems, 9 oz, with Narcissus Cutting and a #365 Queen Anne Spooner..... the #351 Priscilla 6 oz, straight sham, and three (3) #1233 Pressed Diamond Baked apples in Hawthorne were found by our Wolverine State collector.... there were a few things reported seen, but not purchased; the #310 Ring Band tumbler in Custard; eight (8) #1425 Victorian 7" plates; #160 Locket on Chain wine, Ruby Stain, with Gold decoration (this item commanded a dear price); and twenty pieces of #1405 Ipswich in crystal, mostly stem pieces.....

The February meeting of The Gateway Heisey Collectors Club was on February 5th, with 13 members and four guests present. We began by having dinner at Chin's Polynesian Restaurant, and then we all went to the home of Joe and LaVerne Lokay for delicious punch, coffee and dessert. The usual business meeting was conducted, and the committee chairpersons were selected for the coming year.

Following this, two programs were presented. Guests Lucy and Al Clayton gave an interesting talk on a glass pattern named "Paneled Forget-Me-Not" made by a Pittsburgh glass company called "Blair Brothers" in the 1870's. The collection was begun by Mr. Clayton's mother in Missouri, and Al and Lucy keep adding pieces to it. A celery, covered compote and oblong serving dish were brought along as examples of

this beautiful glassware.

Darlene Sanders then presented a program on the No. 10, Oak Leaf Coasters. All five colors were displayed (crystal, moongleam, flamingo, sahara and hawthorne), as well as a variant of this pattern. Several other coaster patterns were also briefly shown and discussed.

As usual, we had a fine "Show & Tell" period. We will be doing this again in the near future since it seems to be a service which is appreciated.




