# NOTES FROM YOUR PRESIDENT...

Over the past couple of years, there have appeared on the antique market, several products bearing the Diamond H trademark which were not products of the A. H. Heisey & Co. Through the efforts of members of the HCA, it was determined that some of these pieces were being imported and wholesaled by an importer of St. Louis, MO.

The pieces in question are the pink chamberstick and the various covered animal dishes (similar to old Westmoreland dishes) in both purple slag and pink glass. Other colors are possible. Some collectors, unfamiliar with Heisey's production, have had unfortunate experiences with these pieces and the HCA's Board of Directors decided to ask the importer to stop using the mark since it was causing confusion.

Through our attorney, we contacted the importing company and they have agreed to remove the marks from their moulds so that any future production will not contain them. The company should be commended for their willingness to cooperate with antique collectors.

Don't forget, this is the time to be getting your glass to Newark for the March Auction. The deadline is January 1.

One of the HCA members has indicated that he is going to donate an extra 5% in addition to his 20% on the March Auction to go to the Endowment Fund. This is a great idea and if anyone else wants to follow his example the money will be very welcome. Just indicate on your glass list if you intend to do it.

I hope to see many of you at the Christmas

dinner on December 9.

#### HEISEY SALTS

#### #10 SMALL SQUARE



This small square salt is often found. problem comes when trying to decide if it is genuine Heisey or the product of some other company. With such a standard, simple shape, the salt was made by many different companies. is very difficult to tell Heisey's from other companies and I really don't know a reliable way. Of course, if the salt has a known Heisey decoration, the problem is easily solved.

Until just a few weeks ago, I would have said that this salt was always unmarked. Since then I have been shown one example of a marked #10. It was marked on the top of one side with a very tiny Diamond H. All others I have seen were unmarked. Usually the bottoms are completely ground and polished, but this is not always the case. It was made only in crystal and was in production for a long, long time - approximately from 1908 to 1955. Examples I have seen and have known to be Heisey were of excellent quality glass and well fire polished.

Heisey listed the salt with Minuet etching, and these would indeed be quite a find. The salt was also used for vaious cuttings, some production ones and some special ones. Several I have seen were geometrics - one with all-over diamonds comes to mind - very attractive. Sometimes stars were cut into the base which was otherwise plain, being cut shut. I have also seen a #10 which was entirely cut and polished -

a superb piece of Heisey.

Various tops were listed for use on the #10 since it had such a long life span. Some were: #4 glass; #60; AA silver plate; 682-2; 336; others described simply as "best cast nickel top," "White metal with heavy silver plate" and "spun metal silver plate."

In late years, the #10 salt was adopted into he #1951 Cabochon line when the true Cabochon

salt shaker was discontinued.

The name "small square" is derived from a description of the salt used in one of Heisey's original price lists. The price lists were not consistent in the descriptions of the salt and other terms were "square," and "family table, cut shut." Small square seemed an apt description, so I have adapted it as the name for the salt.

Dimensions of the salt are as follows: 2-3/4+" tall (without top), 1-1/4" wide, 2-3/8" tall to shoulder. The shaker is usually ground

on top.

#### #11 LARGE EIGHT FLUTE

This large salt was variously described in Heisey price lists as "Restaurant and Saloon,"
"Restaurant size" and "Large Eight Flute" - the latter from which I took its name. Other lists simply referred to it as "colonial."

The salt was available in crystal and has been seen in Moongleam, although I have not found price lists indicating that it was made in color.

Because of the Moongleam shaker known, it is also highly possible that some were made in Flamingo.


The salt is marked on the tops of 2 opposite panels. It may also be found unmarked. The salt was made from approximately 1908 to 1935. Thus it should not be too difficult to find, but I have not seen very many of them. I think many of these simple colonial salts go unrecognized as Heisey because they are so like other salts and also because many people look for the Diamond H only on the bottoms; and the salts are often found marked at the tops of panels. It really pays to examine colonial salts of good quality glass closely for the Diamond H.

This salt has a companion or a little brother, the #12 which is very similar except it is smaller. The #12 salt is one of Heisey's most interesting and deserves a column all its own, so I will save information on it for later.

The dimensions of the #11 salt are as follows: 4" tall, 2" across bottom, 3-3/8" tall to shoulder. My example has a ground top.

#### THE FIRST PIECE OF HEISEY GLASSWARE?

On January 11, 1946, at a dinner given by Heisey in honor of the members of the Diamond H. Club and the Quarter Century Club, T. C. Heisey, the toastmaster, was given a surprise in return when John Maurer, a 49-year member of the firm, presented him with a glass bell on behalf of the members of the two clubs. This bell was reported to have been made by a Frenchman and to have been one of the first pieces of glassware ever made in the Heisey factory.

The picture, which was taken on this occasion and which appeared in the March 1946 issue of The American Flint, unfortunately is not a very clear one. The bell seems to be quite large with a bowl that appears to be made of "spattered" glass. (Spattered glass is a form of variegated glassware with flakes or streaks of different colors in it, sometimes incorrectly referred to as "end of day" glass.) The handle is either a piece of solid dark glass or is made of some other solid-colored material. It would be quite intriguing to know where this bell is today-and if, indeed, it really was one of the very first pieces of glass ever produced at the Heisey factory.

The Diamond H and the Quarter Century Clubs, incidentally, were formed to honor employees of the factory who had been with the company for 25 years or more. It is interesting to note that in 1946 there were 50 members of the Quarter Century Club (employees with from 25 to 39 years of service) and 23 members of the Diamond H Club (with 40 to 49 years of service). That's quite impressive, particularly in an industry whose members seemed to move from one glass factory to another so frequently and it certainly speaks well for a company that could foster that kind of loyalty.

#### Ed. Note:

We have substituted the original picture of the bell (which is one of many pictures from this dinner in our Archives) for the one in the American Flint which Tom sent. I believe that the handle is made of glass.

Since many members of Former Employees families are members of HCA I thought it might be interesting to print the report of this dinner, the original of which is in our files.

We have records of the members of these clubs through 1950. The first mention of the Half Century Club was in the list for 1947 though seven of those listed had become 50 year employees in 1946. John Young was not pictured. In 1947, Harry Gruber also became a 50 year employee. In 1950, all of those pictured were still living.

#### THE AMERICAN FLINT - March 1946

The A. H. Heisey Co. entertained the Diamond H Club and the Quarter Century Club with an informal dinner party at Granville Inn. Mr. T. C. Heisey acted as toastmaster. He informed us that we were to have a better party this fall at which time we would honor the following members who have served the company for 50 years: Miss Louise Adkins, Benjamin Brown, Forbes Gamble, Albert F. Grubber, John Maurer, John Young, Gottlieb Zinn and Fred Chapman. The Quarter Century also received five new members, Marie Johns, Joe Brogan, Charles Moats, Clarence Coen, and Alexander Frater. They were happily welcomed into the club and were presented with a beautiful little gold pin.

You perhaps might be intrigued with some interesting figures on years of the association with the A. H. Heisey Co. as follows: Eight have been here 49 years; one, 48; two, 47; three, 45; one, 44; one, 43; two, 42; five, 40, two, 39; one, 38; three, 37; five, 36; one, 34; four, 33; one, 32; three, 31; three, 30; four, 29; three, 28; nine, 27; six, 26 and five, 25.

There were some who were unable to attend: John Goss, C. S. Whipple, Thomas Holman, Miss Madge Kennett, Herman Foremen, and Charles Moats, Fred Odenahal, Joe Copley and James Kelly. Some were out of the city and others had previous engagements.

We also have five of our members who were with us last year who have taken that journey from which no traveler returns. They were men and women of highest integrity and loved by their associates: Patrick Giblin, Lewis Rebbeck, Dora Baughman, Fred Gebhart and Benjamin Hughes.

Mr. T. C. Heisey congratulated us on our record of years of association, we members of the Diamond H Club and Quarter Century Club and as a peerless record of which we all can be proud. We are confident no one can boast such record here in county, state or country who have as loyal association as to A. H. Heisey Co. We think this record speaks well for its craftsmanship and loyalty and congenial spirit toward one another. Mr. Heisey then presented the speaker of the evening, Major Norman A. Omrie. He gave us a very fine address and mighty fine slogans.

I am passing one of them on which I feel has been worthwhile. "Do the best you can, wherever you are, with what you have."

### HEISEY'S LITTLE THINGS

William Control

This month I am continuing with Colonial patterns and #352 Flat Panel is next in the numbering system. First date for Flat Panel is 1907. As in all colonial patterns, the glass is heavy, clear and well finished.

In our HLT category there is not a large number of items. These include the individual cream and sugar (with or without lid), the matching mustard and cover (with or without lid), the toothpick holder, knife rest, and 2 oz lavendar jars.

The toothpick holder is one of the prettier ones and has never been seen marked as far as I know. It was made with a puntied bottom (concave) or ground flat on the bottom and well polished. According to the Jones toothpick book and Heisey price lists, the dates for the flat grinding were 1909 to 1912. From 1913 to 1929 they used the puntied bottom which really seems to add class to the piece. This should really stand out among a group of toothpick holders which you may see for sale.

The knife rest should be marked either on the side or one end and sometimes in both places. This is an individual knife rest and has been found in sets sometimes.

The two ash trays are interesting if you want to add them also, though they are a bit large for HLT's. The covered horseradish is interesting too. I also like the ice cream holder which was made both straight and flared and sometimes is referred to as a violet vase. It also is larger than what we usually consider to be miniatures.

No. 353 Medium Flat Panel, ca 1908, is the next colonial pattern. This is the first pattern to have an individual nut dish, often called an almond dish. The Flat Panel nut dishes are identical to those in the later 393 Narrow Flute pattern. These were made in crystal which is almost always marked and also in flamingo, moongleam, sahara and hawthorne. Many times those in color are not marked. The moongleam and flamingo are fairly easy to find but the sahara and hawthorne are not as plentiful and should command a good price, especially the hawthorne since the color was made for only one year.

The marmalade jar is larger than some of the others. A large knife rest was apparently merely two stoppers on the "bust-off" which were left together rather than being cut off as stoppers. I have included a picture of the cologne bottle which used this type stopper. Baby chicks were made on each end of a rod such as this.

An interesting ash tray was made which has a place for a small box of matches which are seldom seen today. These are known in flammingo and are sometimes marked on the top of the center part where the match box fits.


Again, there are seven sizes of lavendar jars but only the 2 oz and possibly the 6 oz size are small enough for us to use.

Other jars the same shape as the #352 and #353 jars, but with different shaped stoppers, would be great finds as they are seldom seen. These are pictured only in Catalog 76, 1915, which HCA has published. The numbers were changed to indicate that they are different.

One of the most interesting toothpick holders belongs to the #353 pattern. It is the only lay-down toothpick that Heisey ever made, a very interesting addition to your collection.



#### TUMBLERS

101, 145 & 160

I did it again. I bought a tumbler I can't identify. The person I bought it from told me he thought it was some number, but either I misunderstood him or he was misinformed. The number I remember wasn't used for a tumbler. Anyway the mysterious tumbler holds 8 ounces, has a sham and a ground rim on the plain bottom and is signed outside. The problem arises when you look at the corner where the side and the bottom meet. It has a nice round shoulder. The tumblers with this shoulderlist as 10 oz tumblers and don't appear to have the sham in the bottom. The 8 oz tumblers, which have a sham all seem to have a square shoulder.

If this tumbler didn't have its sham, it could be #101, made from 1897 to 1929. If it didn't have the round shoulder, it could be #145, made from 1908 to 1916. If its shoulder were in between square and round and it held 9 ounces, it could be 160, made between 1908 and 1936. However, it is none of these. I can only hope that some day all of Heisey's samples will turn up, with numbers engraved on them and all these

mysteries will be solved.





# HEISEY CANDLESTICKS

NO. 1519, WAVERLY CANDLESTICKS (cont'd)

In January of 1950, Heisey introduced its third candlestick in the Waverly pattern (photo #1). This is one of the most charming little candlesticks produced by Heisey. It is a solid block and its design is especially conductive to showing off the sparkling quality of Heisey's crystal. It follows in the tradition of the initial Oceanic pattern introduced in 1940, being imitative of a small ocean wave with seafoam. It stands only four and a half inches high and was made only for about two years. Its last appearance is in Supplement 2 of Heisey's Price List 31 dated October of 1952. It was even offered with the no. 507 Orchid etching! Partial information gleaned from the Heisey factory turn books tells us there were 312 of these made in May of 1950 and 306 again in December of 1950. This is a scarce candlestick to find today but is probably not quite as rare as normally believed. Because it was a late production item, it has not come onto the collectors market as yet and we know that at least 618 were made, putting it in a somewhat less than rare category. It was not reissued by Imperial and will probably never be found marked with the Diamond H trademark.

At the same time Heisey was producing the one light candlestick, they were also making two

other rather versatile candlestick-related items. a gardenia centerpiece (photo #2) and a fruit centerpiece (photo #3). These bowls had already been in the Waverly line and were modified for this purpose by the addition of a candleholding element to the center of both bowls. Little information is available on either of these but both were being made about the same time as the one light candlestick and were made for about two years, from 1950 to 1952. They were both offered with the Orchid and Rose etchings. The gardenia centerpiece could be used with a single candle surrounded by flowers or instead of the candle, the six and a half inch cupped Waverly epergnette or the six inch deep epergnette could be used. The bowl was also offered with the no. 5013 five inch insert vase or the no. 4233 six inch vase. Likewise, the fruit bowl could be purchased by itself or with the same options as the gardenia bowl. Both bowls are thirteen inches across and are designed in the typical Waverly motifs with an optic swirl on the outside of the bowl and beads or bubbles around the edges. Neither were reissued by Imperial and they are usually not marked with the Diamond H.

Other candlestick related items in the Waverly pattern were the three sizes of epergnettes. They were made by the hundreds and used with patterns other than Waverly as well. They are usually marked \*with the Diamond H and two of them were reissued by Imperial.

When "Mountain Gal" takes her "mountain truck" and heads for town she never knows just how much trouble she will get into. She just packs it full and sends her finds to me: #1225 Sawtooth Band Toy sugar/cover and the creamer: the Toy Spooner she already owned (which makes it quite nice) #1405 Ipswich 4 oz Saucer Champagnes in Sahara (4); #1519 Waverly Individual Cream and Sugar/Orchid etch; #353 8" Vase, crystal; #355 Quator footed cream & sugar in Flamingo; #1225 Sawtooth Band Toothpick: #1503 Crystolite 13" Oval Floral Bowl; #1216 Crystal 8" nappy/#1 Braid Needle etch. This piece has the large diamond H and is very old and worn. What stories they could tell if only this glass could talk!! #4211 8-1/2" D/O Vase in Flamingo; and #1255 Pineapple

& Fan #2 Salt & Pepper.

My "first Convention, Heisey friend" reports two (2) Water Sets; a seven piece Ring Band and a nine (9) piece "Donna"/Orchid etch. Lovely to say the least.

"My Rebel Cousins," sigh, sigh, reported two (2) favor vases to me, a #4227 in Flamingo and a #4229 in Sahara.

"My Good English Buddy" still has all kinds of good things going; a 14" #150 Banded Flute Punch Bowl/Stand and ten cups; also the Tankard/ cover; #433 Greek Key almond; and #5072 Rose Stem/Rose Etch. 9 oz Goblets; 6 oz Saucer Champagnes; 3 oz Wines and 4 oz Cocktails. Not difficult to take, right "Buddy"?

That "Terrific Lady" put a #381 Heisey Quilt

nappy on her table this past month.
"Evergreen Friend" found a pair of Dolphin Footed Candlesticks for as little as a song and an Orchid Etch sugar for less than a song. also saw the #1469 Ridgeleigh 2-handled Ice Tub. Other news from the Evergreen State was four (4) #150 Banded Flute 8 oz Footed Goblets, marked.

"The Tipper" has some #393 Narrow Flute, six medium finger bowls and a low footed Grapefruit; #473 Narrow Flute/plain rim 9" Nabisco Tray; now the very choice piece - perfectly lovely - #1519 Waverly 5½ Cigarette Box (seahorse handles)/cover & Orchid Etch. His feet hardly touched ground on leaving "flea market.'

"Curly" has a #1776 Kalonyal Covered Sugar, Ruby stain; and a little beauty, the #4163 12 oz Beer Mug with #462 Fox Chase Silhouette Etch. Great buy! In the Addendum to Encyclopedia of Heisey Glassware Etchings and Carvings on Page 36, you will find the #27 Salt with the #9082 "Blackberry" Plate Etching. 


