Thanks, too, to all of you who consign your glass year after year, and to those who also make donations of glass to sell. This is one of our best moneymakers and has been for the past 13 years.

Some of you are confused about the auctions at the Appletree Auction House and send here for their lists. We have no connection with the auction house for any auction except this one.

Help will be needed at set up time. Contact Bob Rarey at the phone number at the top of the first column on page 2 of this newsletter if you want to help. Bob will also need lots of volunteers to help with the actual auction.

We have a very nice assortment of glass to sell with most colors represented. There is more alexandrite and tangerine than in most auctions. Patterns are from all periods with several good round butter dishes, two emerald Pineapple and Fan toothpicks, very nice cordials, 4163 Whaley mugs, six with Cobalt handles and Fox Chase etching, #46 opal novelty plate (rare), elephant handled child's mug and animals. One highlight is a 3481 Glenford bar in alexandrite (also very rare). A 48 piece set, which includes 10½" dinner plates, 8" plates, cups and saucers, sugar and cream, all in Yeoman; a tankard and 4091 Kimberly goblets, sherbets and footed sodas all with an outstanding cutting. This should make someone very happy.

If you have missed getting a newsletter lately we are sorry. We are still waiting for our second class permit which will hopefully solve the problems as this class of mail is supposed to be sorted right after first class mail. If you write us, we'll send you copies of the newsletter(s) which you have not received.

A. H. HEISEY & COMPANY - A CHRONOLOGY

Part 9, 1935-1937

1935 - January. The no. 4055 Park Lane stemware line was advertised, with the no. 838 St. Moritz rock crystal cutting.

February. Marshall Field and Company in Chicago installed a permanent Heisey display in their store. This idea was not new in the case of certain better known lines of housewares, but was considered "somewhat novel with respect to glassware," according to the House Furnishings Dealer.

The no. 3418 Savoy Plaza stemware line was advertised as new this month, with the no. 846 Neo-Classic cutting.

March. The no. 842 Singapore cutting was advertised.

April. Two new carvings were mentioned in the Crockery and Glass Journal: no. 5015 Stripes and no. 5016 Stars and Sripes.

May. The pieces from the Metropolitan Museum of Art's American industries display were exhibited at Heisey's showroom in Chicago.

No. 4054 Coronation was shown in Chicago at the Merchandise Mart, as one of "many new items," none of which "attracted more attention from buyers than the soda line for beverages and liquors".¹

June. No. 1469 Ridgeliagh was advertised as new.²

July. In response to the National Recovery Act being abolished, T. Clarence Heisey was quoted in the Crockery and Glass Journal as saying, "We think that the Supreme Court's decision in reference to killing the NRA is the greatest thing that has happened to this country since the Declaration of Independence. This means the end of the un-American policy of the present administration of nosing into everybody's business. We are again free, white and twenty-one. We hope that industry as a whole will continue to show their employees the same equitable consideration of wages and hours as they did under the Blue Illegal and I believe 90% of them will."

The no. 480 Normandie plate etching was advertised as new this month.

August. At the Merchandise Mart's Glassware, China and Pottery Market in Chicago, nineteen model table settings by different companies were displayed and, after the show's closing, photographs of each table were mailed with ballots to the glassware and pottery buyers of America. Some 500 buyers responded and 1st prize went to a cocktail table set by the Dunbar Glass Corporation. 2nd prize went to Heisey for a formal Christmas table, featuring square footed stemware and square plates,³ with a centerpiece of poinsettias and holly. The table was set by Sara Durant, who was in charge of the Heisey display at Marshall Field and Company.

The first of the matte etchings⁴ was presented, no. 602 Simplex.

September. The Crockery and Glass Journal reported that Emil Krall Sr. had become the foreman of Heisey's engraving department. During the Glassware, China and Pottery Market at the Merchandise Mart in Chicago, referred to above, he demonstrated his skills as an engraver.

October. The no. 859 Cohasset cutting was advertised.

Other new lines in 1935 included no. 1454 Diamond Point* and no. 1463 Quaker.

Other new stemware lines included: no. 1437 Flint Ridge*, no. 3421 Avignon*, no. 3422 Loren*, no. 3424 Admiralty, and no. 3428 Brittany*.

Other new plate etchings included no. 477 Japanese Scene.

Other matte etchings introduced in 1935 included no. 600 and 601 Satin Finish and no. 603 Bandolino.

Other new carvings included: no. 5010 Vanity Fair, no. 5011 Chevy Chase, no. 5012 Amfulala Tree, no. 5013 Nymph and Satyr and no. 5014 Swan Dive.

Other new cuttings included: no. 834 Moulin Rouge, no. 835 Larkspur, no. 836 Pretoria*, no. 837 Cristobal, no. 839 Bonnie Briar, no. 840 Briar Cliff, no. 841 Wyandotte, no. 843 Tahiti, no. 844 Piccadilly, no. 844½ Cromwell, no. 845 Fontaine, no. 847 Streamline, no. 848 Botticelli, no. 849 Nomad, no. 850 Del Monte, no. 851 Kalarama, no. 852 Navarro, no. 853 Pinehurst, no. 854 Lombardy, no. 855 Fuchsia, no. 856 Marquette*, no. 857 Catalina*, no. 858 LaPaloma*, no. 860 Vienna*, no. 861 Neopolitan*, no. 862 Morocco*, no. 863 Contessa*, no. 864 Blue Willow*, no. 865 Florentine, no. 866 Kent, no. 867 Chateau, no. 868 Minaret and no. 869 Capri*.

A number of colors were discontinued about this time, including flamingo, moongleam, alexandrite, and tangerine.

Heisey's mare, Goodness Gracious, won the open and grand championships at the Madison Square Garden's National Horse Show this year and the open and grand championships at Toronto, giving her recognition as one of the country's outstanding show horses.

1936 - February. No. 4069 Ridgeleigh stemware⁵ was advertised as new.

March 20-April 19. Heisey participated in an exhibition of American glass, conducted by the Industrial Art Department of the Brooklyn Museum. More than 60 firms were represented in this exhibit, which also included demonstrations of glassblowing cutting, etching, etc.

July. Heisey's mare, Goodness Gracious, won the open and Longport stake (which ranked as the highest honor, or first prize) at the Atlantic City Horse Show. Goodness Gracious, a 14-2 walk trot mare, was described by the judges at that show as having "the greatest trot of any living saddle horse."

July 19-25. Heisey's new pattern, no. 1483 Stanhope,⁶ was introduced at the New York china and glassware show and, from August 3-15, was also on display at the Chicago show. Designed by Walter Von Nessen, this innovative pattern with its varicolored Plascon inserts in the handles of many of the pieces was awarded a plaque in the Modern Plastic Competition for 1936.

October. Following a siege of serious illnesses, Heisey's New York representative, E. G. Nock, killed himself by jumping from his tenth story apartment.

December. Joseph J. Lower became Heisey's representative in New York. He had originally travelled as a salesman in the midwest for Heisey and more recently had had New York State as his territory.

The no. 885 Incognito was advertised on the new no. 4083 Stanhope stemware line.

One new matte etching was added, no. 605 Frosted.

Other new cuttings included: No. 870 St. Albans*, no. 871 Sophisto, no. 872 Mariemont, no. 873 Edwardian, no. 874 Exotique, no. 875 Sylvia, no. 876 Honolulu*, no. 877 Pueblo, no. 878 Sea Glade, no. 879 DaVinci*, no. 880 Salem, no. 881 Kashmir, no. 882 Yorkshire, no. 883 Royal York, no. 884 Vincent*, and no. 886 King's Ransom.

Price list 211-16 was issued in 1936.

E. Wilson Heisey was state manager in Ohio for Alf Landon and also served as a delegate to the Republican national convention.

1937 - February. No. 1485 Saturn and no. 1488 Kohinoor, two new patterns by Walter Von Nessen, were advertised. Blown stemware in Kohinoor (no. 4085) was also shown, with the no. 493 Coronation⁷ plate etching.

March 15. Price list 212-17 was issued.

April. Table Talk, Heisey's monthly "house organ" (which was primarily distributed to salesmen, but which was also available to customers) was reintroduced,⁸ coinciding with a new advertising campaign in Life and the New Yorker. Leaflets describing the major patterns and two-color window display cards were also produced at this time. This was seen as a "return to the national advertising picture in which (Heisey) once occupied the position of 'first' of the domestic glass factories."⁹

The issue featured several "rock crystal cuttings and etchings," including the no. 888 Madeira and no. 890 Churchill cuttings and the no. 494 Swingtime plate etching.

May 21-July 4. Walter Von Nessen sailed on the S. S. Bremen for Europe on what he described as a "general scouting trip" on Heisey's behalf. He attended the Paris Exposition and it was announced that he would return with plans for a new fall line.¹⁰

June. Emil Krall Sr. exhibited his engraving skills at Bloomingdales in New York.

No. 1486 Coleport was introduced this month.¹¹

July. The no. 4092 Kenilworth stemware line was featured in the July-August issue of Heisey's Table Talk. The no. 893 Carlton and no. 896 Sungate cuttings were also shown in this issue.

August. The no. 895 Waterford cutting was shown in the Crockery and Glass Journal. Two silhouette etchings were also shown: no. 495 Polo Player and no. 496 Skier.

September. Two more patterns came out for the fall trade, no. 1489 Puritan and no. 1495 Fern, the latter designed by Walter Von Nessen. The no. 4090 Coventry line was also new at this time.

Zircon, "Heisey's subtle new color," was also introduced in September.

October. The 1496 Mahabar smoking set was advertised as new. (In 1938, this pattern was expanded to a full line and became no. 1503 Crystolite.)

December. The no. 497 Rosalie and no. 500 Belvidere plate etchings were advertised.

New stemware patterns also included: No. 4091 Kimberly.

Other new plate etchings included: no. 490 Maytime, no. 491 Frosty Dawn, and no. 492 King House*.

Other new silhouette etchings included: no. 1 Short Sailboat, no. 2 Tall Sailboat, no. 3 Motor Boat, no. 481 Lancaster, no. 498 Modern Polo Player and no. 499 Good Morning.

One new carving was also introduced, no. 5017 Sailboat.

Other new cuttings included: No. 887 Southampton, no. 889 Sheffield, no. 891 Pembroke, no. 892 Berkeley Square, no. 894 Brambleberry, no. 897 Northwest*, no. 898 Trafalgar*, no. 899 Norfolk*, no. 900 Saratoga*, no. 901 Delft Diamond, no. 902 Orlando and no. 903 Zeuse.

* Original pattern name unknown; named by researchers.

Note: I have attempted to gather information from as many sources as possible, to verify that information from multiple sources when available, and to include the most likely "guesses" based on our current knowledge, when the sources disagree or reliable information is not available. 1. House Furnishing Dealer. A patent for this pattern was not filed until February 7, 1940.

2. The earliest patent for this pattern was not filed until January 24, 1936.

3. Probably no. 3424 Admiralty stemware and no. 1469 Ridgeleigh plates with the no. 602 Simplex matte etching.

4. A process whereby entire pieces or portions of them were uniformly "frosted", or given a satin finish.

5. Also referred to as Reis Ridgeleigh in early sources.

6. Patents were filed for this pattern in July 1936.

7. Originally designed for the coronation of Edward VIII of Great Britain, but only in production very briefly, since Edward abdicated at about the time the etching was introduced.

8. Table Talk had initially been published in the 1920's, but had ceased publication after only a few years.

9. Crockery and Glass Journal, April 1937.

10. No. 1495 Fern.

11. A patent was filed on June 21, 1937, and approved July 27, 1931.

diamonds are forever....

The Yachting Center boasts many Artists, among them Prescott W. Baston, a master of miniatures, and he has created many historic figures of Lilliputian stature. He was a graduate of the Vesper George Art School in Boston.

In 1938 Prescott Baston opened his own studio, the Sebastian Studios, Inc., right here in the Yachting Center. Clay is used for sculpting each of his miniatures, a plaster mold is then made which enables the studio to cast its "molding piece" from gypsum cement. Each figurine is hand painted. For many years there was a lovely French Lady who painted all the faces with a tiny brush with just one hair. She was, and still is, a very good friend of Lloyd and myself. (she retired several years ago because the fine work involved was very hard on her eyes).

Over four hundred different subjects exist. Colonial pairs, historic persons, regional couples, Dickens Characters plus many more. The three truly Marblehead figurines are "The Spirit of '76", "The Lobsterman" (with exact replica of the trap used by our native lobsterman) and "The Skipper".

Since we're speaking of miniatures, one of the "Lucky Seven" from the Lone Star State has a cute little #1220 Punt Band individual sugar in Custard; a #433 Greek Key 2 oz Sherry and two #1404 Old Sandwich 1½ oz Bar glasses in Cobalt. Now in regular size he reports the #459 Round Colonial 8" Basket/cutting.

"The Midnight Riders" can't seem to be held back, especially Mr. Rider; he is always bringing something home in his Saddle Bags for all to envy: A pair of #300 1 light candelabra with "A" prisms. The prisms were a sort of "red/orange" in color and could have been made by one of several different companies - not Heisey prisms. Also in the candlestick department was a pair of #16 sticks in crystal. In color they found two (2) 8" square Empress plates in Cobalt and two (2) #3381 2½ oz Creole footed Bar glasses in Alexandrite!

I thought that when the New Year rolled around the "Hanging Judge" (MA) would turn over a new leaf, but no such luck. He is still keeping things in wraps, such as a #1503 Crystolite smoking set - consisting of four ash trays and the covered cigarette box - all marked and paper labels, and in the original box. Now he said that he was going to keep them that way and not let them loose. What can I say, he's the Judge. He also has a #427 Daisy and Leaves 8 oz tumbler and the #1404 Old Sandwich Cigarette Holder in Crystal.

After a House Sale had been going on for three days the "Evergreens" from Maine decided to go and see what was left, probably not much after such a long time. Ah-ha, one nice piece; the Rooster Cocktail Shaker was found (trimmed with wood) along with some glasses which were not Heisey. You see things don't necessarily go the first morning of a sale, but don't plan on it to be that way. Also she has a #1001 Caswell Cream with Moongleam handle and foot d/o; a Knife-rest, marked, and the #1220 Punt Band salt and pepper, ruby stain.

"My Rebel Cousins" (KY) tell me that things have been "coming up green" lately and all in the #1255 Pineapple and Fan pattern. They had only three pieces in this pattern in Emerald until just recently, an 8" Vase, a custard cup and a 6" bon-bon; now during the last few months they really outdid themselves.

First, at an auction they purchased an 8" Bowl (the auctioneer called this piece "Prince of Wales"); at an Antique show two souvenir tumblers with good gold were purchased. The names on the tumblers were "Alice" and "Sylvester" dated 1898. Another tumbler, also with good gold decoration was found; this one said "Nellie Overholser: also dated 1898. Next stop, flea market, a 5½" round handled jelly; the frosting on the cake, a pair of salt and pepper shakers. As I said everything in Emerald! I'd better not turn "green with envy" or they might add me to their collection!

The "Mr" has come up with another decanter (maybe I should put that in the plural) a pair of #1425 Victorian 27 oz Rye Bottles/#99 PS. in a chrome holder. They are beautiful and have paper labels. Perhaps they were an unused wedding gift to someone years ago. They look as if they were never used. He also found the #7013 Puff Box; a soap dish and cover; a #1541 Athena sugar and a #347 Prison Stripe sugar (no handles).

During this past Christmas season we were strolling thru a beautiful new Mall where there was an abundance of small expensive novelty shops. Looking in this one window, there was an Antique Chest, on top of which were three Decanters filled with colored water (to look like different kinds of liquors) very attractively done. The one with "creme-de-menthe" (green colored water) took my eye. I did a complete double-take, grabbed the "Mr" and said, "take a look, the Heisey Penguin Decanter". We rushed into the store and to the surprise of the "Mr" I asked the salesperson if I could purchase the decanter. I was told, very nicely, that it was a store decoration and the owner was out of town. We left our card and as of this writing we are still awaiting the answer! Maybe next month I can report a second Penguin Decanter to go with the one I reported last month.

The "Cruet Man" (CA) has so many beautiful cruets that one would think there were no more for him to discover, needless to say here are two more: #6009A Roundale 6 oz cruet in Dawn (hard to find) and the #352 Medium Flat Panel 8 oz Vinegar and Oil in Flamingo. That one must be gorgeous!

"The Wiz" reports a #329 Pillows footed Rose Bowl and the #341 one pint jug.

"The Orchid Lady" now owns the #1519 Waverly 6" round covered dish with bow-tie handle!

"Mr Crystolite" has a pair of #31 Jack-be-nimble candle holders along with a pair of #1519 Waverly Epergnes.

"The Farmer" (MA) has a #433 Greek Key 12½" French Roll tray and the #429 Plain Panel Recess two quart Crushed Fruit Jar!

My "Sharp eyed friends" came up with a #1506 Whirlpool 5 oz soda or juice glass and the #1541 Athena 5½" Mayonnaise along with a cute little #473 Narrow Flute/rim Strawberry and sugar. I really like that piece.

As for Yours Truly, I couldn't stand all that Emerald that was found by our Rebel Cousins so I thought I'd just tell you about my piece of Emerald; a #1205 Fancy Loop 8 oz Tumbler in perfect condition - no gold. We forget sometimes that we have many new members who have never heard of an "Oscar" and have no way of knowing what it is.

It is the Heisey plug horse, Sparkie, Spark Plug, or called the Pony Stallion when made by Imperial. Since the Heisey salesman had named it "Oscar" when it was first made and because it was listed that way in one catalog we decided to call it "Oscar" when it became our souvenir.

This little figurine has been our souvenir item since 1977, appearing in a different color each year. Those of the early years have steadily increased in value each year when a new one came out. They were made for us by Imperial through 1982 when they went into Bankruptcy. In 1983 and 1984 Viking made them in tangelo and ruby. Again in 1985, while Imperial was still in Chapter 11, they made us one in black opaque. In 1986 Viking made them in clematis, an alexandrite look-alike. This year they will be made by Fenton. All of these are marked HCA and dated.

Oscars are still available in some of the earlier colors but at advanced prices. Please write us for prices.

You may still order the 1986 Oscar at \$24.00 plus \$1.50 shipping. If you send an order for them do not do it on the 1987 form.

The figurine is very popular with the members and has somehow become our "mascot". This is our biggest fund raiser of the year.

You may order for pickup in June and if they are to be shipped this will be done as soon as they get here.

Crystal opalescent is very attractive. We expect that the ears, tail and mane will appear opalescent. Order now. There will be approximately 1500 made. "Heisey by Fenton" sounds like a good combination to make a popular collectible. Louise Ream.
