FROM YOUR PRESIDENT . . .

Dear HCA Members,

My report this month will focus on the Special Board Meeting I called for October 24 to consider the report of the Committee on Reorganization and Job Descriptions of paid employees. As I reported in the September HEISEY NEWS, the Executive Committee felt a study of the job descriptions and scope of paid employees needed review and updating. I appointed the following: Charles Wade, Chariman, Liz Stickle, Neila Bredehoft and Stan Darling (HCA attorney).

This committee met on several occasions and presented their detailed report at the September Board Meeting. Stan Darling, acting as spokesman, enumerated the committee's findings and recommendations with the understanding that no discussion would be held until a later date, after all the Board members had had the opportunity to study their copy of the report in detail. This report basically paralleled one done in 1978. Charlie Wade was chairman and Stan Darling was a member of that committee.

Fourteen of the nineteen Board Members were in attendance for the special meeting. After lengthly discussion, the Board voted thirteen to one to implement the report as amended, as soon as possible. The major change this action implements involves the Executive Director who now becomes Museum Curator. As Museum Curator, Louise will be relieved of some of the tasks heaped upon her as the Executive Director. It will be her responsibility to oversee the operation of the Museum and the Gift Shop. Working under the Curator will be a Museum secretary (new position) and the Shipping Clerk. Louise will continue as Editor of the HEISEY NEWS. The Club President, Vice President and immediate Past President will act in an advisory capacity to the functions of the Museum, the Warehouse and the Newsletter. The Curator's office will be located in the Museum in the present docents' lounge.

The HCA Secretary will advise and assist the Receptionist-Membership Clerk (new title) who will be responsible for all the membership functions. This office will be located at the north end of the library.

All cabinets in the museum will have mirrors now. Phyllis McClain and Mary McWilliams have been helping me with the glass.

Christmas decorations should be up before Thanksgiving and we'll have Open House on Dec. 6th

along with the Davidson House next door.

The cover this month is a copy of an Original Heisey Christmas Card and was in a group of Heisey material donated by Harold Dunham, former sales manager of the company.





# ALL HEISEY - Benefit Auction

MARCH 11 & 12, 1988

It is time to prepare for our 15th Annual All-Heisey Museum Benefit Auction. The Auction will again be held at the Apple Tree Auction Center. It will, as usual, be held in conjunction with the Quarterly Meeting.

The Annual Christmas Dinner and Quarterly Meeting on December 4th would be a good time to bring your consignments to the Museum in the afternoon, or after the dinner, and avoid the Christmas rush. DEADLINE FOR GLASS IS JANUARY 1, 1988.

The same policy as the last few years will again be followed. LIMIT IS (12) TWELVE LOTS PER FAMILY (excluding donations). Items such as 8 goblets or 12 plates together would constitute one lot. Any consignments OVER 12 lots will be considered as donations. The consignment fee remains at 20% with a \$5.00 MINIMUM per lot. HCA receives the 20% selling fee. Please consign only Heisey or Verlys by Heisey. NO IMPERIAL PLEASE.

Be sure to include a list (including pattern number, name, color etc., if possible) along with your name and address. Arrange the list in desired lots and identify which lots are consignments and which are donations. Don't forget to make a duplicate copy for your records.

The Benefit Auction is one of the major fund raising projects of the year and all proceeds go for support of your Museum. There is very little expense associated with the Auction. You can help by donating items for the Auction. Remember, donations are full value tax deductible. The consignment fees are also tax deductible. Get your glass in early and plan to be at The Apple Tree Auction Center on March 11 and 12.

In order to bring the best prices for both you and the Museum, please don't send damaged items unless the items are seldom seen.

Glass will be sold in the order it is received.

Mark your calendars - this is going to be one of the most fun events of the past several years. We need your good glass !

If you'd like to help at the auction, let me know. We'll have assigned hours for helpers so no one gets overworked.

CHINA GLASS AND LAMPS. JAN 1, 1896

Heisey's first advertisements which appeared weekly from January 1st through the 29th, in 1896, in CHINA, GLASS AND LAMPS were all two-page spreads featuring pieces in the No. 1200 Cut Block line on one side and similar items from the No. 1201 Fandango pattern on the facing page. Like Cut Block, Fandango was also advertised as a "full line," but actually ended up being an even more extensive pattern, with over 90 pieces. (Of course, as was usually the case, many of these items were made from the same molds; in the advertisements this can be seen in the case of the 3-cornered jelly, which was made from the round jelly, and the 9 inch nappy, which was created by flaring the sides of the 8 inch nut nappy.)

As was the case with Cut Block, the sample pieces which were on display at the Monongahela House in Pittsburgh were made by the Robinson Glass Company in Zanesville, not far from Newark.

The January 1st ad featured the ubiquitous table set; however, the variety of pieces available was already evident in the January 8th advertisement which included the bar tumbler, ice tub, water bottle, and small cracker jar. Later ads included the wine, molasses can, and rose bowl. In all, 25 items were pictured in these five ads.

Fandango remained in production a little longer than Cut Block, but had dwindled to only 27 pieces in the 1902 catalog. By 1905, there were only 4 articles still available (the ice cream tray and nappy and two sizes of oil) and these were discontinued shortly thereafter.

Because it's an early pattern, it is never marked and it was made in crystal only. This is not surprising, even though some of the earliest colors had been introduced while Fandango was still in production, because it was intended to be an imitation of cut glass. Cut glass was both highly popular and quite expensive in the 1890's and it was the fineness of some of the pressed imitations, such as Heisey's Fandango, that would eventually spell an end to the era of rich cut glass. It has been noted that Fandango is very similar to other pressed patterns, such as the U.S. Glass Company's Massachusetts, which came out in 1898, presumably to meet and compete for the same market.

Fandango is sometimes found with a gold decoration on the edges and old factory records exist which indicate that selected pieces were also available with both orange and blue decorations.

Like most of the early patterns, this one was not named by Heisey. Ruth Webb Lee first called it Fandango in her VICTORIAN GLASS. Minnie Watson Kamm, in A FIFTH PATTERN GLASS BOOK, uses the name Diamond Swag and this will also sometimes be encountered in older reference works.



If you remember, in October, I told you about the lamplighters and the fires caused by the kerosene and candles. I'll relate one such devastating fire. It was the year 1877 on June the 25th one of the Yachting Center's most serious disasters struck at 1:30 am. An old barn behind the Marblehead Hotel burst into flames and the strong wind whipped the sparks down Pleasant Street igniting one wooden building after another. Every able fireman responded by foot and, or horseback, the water shortage was desperate and men on horseback galloped to two near-by towns for help. Fortunately help arrived in time to keep the conflagration to the central business area. By dawn we had lost seventy-two buildings, houses, shoe factories, stores, hotels, the newspaper, railroad depot, the South Church and the Central fire station. This grim fire resulted in a \$500,000 loss, 90 homeless families and 1500 jobless. The mottos "Don't give up the Ship" and "Marblehead never Retreats" were self-assuring. Every able bodied man rallied and the town was rebuilt!

Let me pass on to you some of the things found by a very cheerful lady from Virginia, who in spite of her problems found the time to do what she likes best - Heisey Hunt. #1159 punch cups, eight of them, plus a #1252 Twist cruet in moongleam. These were all sleepers which added to her cheerfulness.

The "Hilltoppers" have a #1485 Saturn crystal wine, cute little thing. While "A friend in deed" has the #6003 Tempo cordial, also a cute little thing.

While we are talking about cordials, wines, etc., I might as well tell you that "The Wiz" has two #5067 Plantation cocktails.

"Yours Truly" claims a #300 Peerless 3/4 oz cordial (which was fast asleep) plus a little

Flamingo #1252 wine.

"The Keystone Cops" left the house with their "night-stick" by their side, just in case they encountered any big trouble while trying to "out-steal" Heisey from another. No trouble occurred however, and they came home with: #1205 Fancy Loop 9" vase, a #150 Banded Flute 18 oz mug and a #325 Pillows bulbous pitcher in flamingo. FLAMINGO!!

"The Wolverines" (MI) picked up a Yeoman 73 oz jug and 7 oyster cocktails in sahara with the

Empress etch.

"The Farmer" put his plow in the barn and went out for a holiday and picked up a few pieces of Heisey for all to envy: six #3357 King Arthur goblets with moongleam stems; two #3408 Jamestown 12 oz footed sodas, Barcelona cut, the 8" Fighting Rooster (which he tamed) and a #3408 beer mug with Equestrian etch. Not too bad for a day out of the "Hayfield".

"Yours Truly" has a #300 Peerless claret jug and a #433 Greek Key cruet; #1489 large Horsehead cigarette box and a #1404 Old Sandwich flamingo

ketchup bottle.

"The Midnight Riders" rode off into the night with a #352 15" oval platter and a #1519 Waverly Orchid etch center bowl.

"Shy Gal" acquired the #1252 Twist flamingo

mustard, very sweet!

A #463 Bonnet basket was discovered by the "Double Steppin Couple" (MA) while from (NH) "The Pilgrims" said they had a #406 Coarse Rib cream and sugar in Flamingo. Seems like a lot of flamingo this month.

Speaking of flamingo, "The Felicitious Flamingo Hunter" has a #325 Pillows 7" rose bowl in good condition; a knife rest; #3308 Bob White wine and also cordial with #366 Peacock etch; #1776 Kalonyal mustard bottom and a pair of #27" sticks.

Again from Louisiana comes great things; Six 1401 Old Sandwich cobalt 10 oz low footed tumblers, and at a real good price. I should follow him around.

Now "Odie and Minnie" from the Land of the Muskies "Vont" to report again: "yah" ready: #3381 Creole alexandrite 10 oz footed tumblers, two of them; four #3390 Carcassonne cigarette holders; a #1193 Inside Scallop conserve in flamingo and the cute little #1252 Twist mustard also in flamingo. "Vell", I think these things are "quite the berries".

"My sharp eyed friends" found two #1951 Cabochon footed compotes and a #1506 Whirlpool div-

# Question & Answers

#### by LOUISE REAM

These are questions I have answered by mail in the last several months. We thought you might be interested in the answers

Catalogs and advertisements say that "Every article manufactured by us bears our trademark." Since this obviously is not so can you explain it?

Usually the wording includes these words in smaller type, "Stamped in the glass, or on attached adhesive label". Of course Heisey was not making glass for collectors at the time and so was not particularly interested in making the mark permanent. The label sufficed so that the customer would know what he was buying. Great quantities of Heisey glass are marked (more than of any other company and all collectors should be very happy that this is so since it adds greatly to its value and popularity).

There are other reasons for it not always being marked. In the first place they made glass for several years before the mark was designed in 1900 and it was not registered until 1901. Secondly there is never a mark on a blown piece of stemware with a pulled stem. An applied pressed stem may be marked but only on the stem, never on the bottom. Other blown items are not marked either. Third, all companies did not want the mark. That probably includes some of those who bought Heisey for decorating Fourth, the moldmakers tell us they never put the mark back in the mold if it should be polished off when molds were cleaned unless specifically ordered to do so.

Fifth, some marks are so small or so hidden that many people do not find them. As was stated above look on the pressed stems of blownware and look hard with a glass since many of them are either tiny, faint or very well hidden such as those on Rose, Orchid and Plantation. Look under handles on \$500 Octagon variety trays and certain pieces of #1229 Octagon, on the side of relish or celery trays in #1401 Empress (almost at the bottom and sometimes half ground off; inside the foot of dolphin footed pieces, on the sides near the top of some

salt and peppers, in the borders of some items. In short it may be found anywhere. Many, many items in late patterns were never marked. A.H. Heisey himself was the one who really wanted all glass marked which is probably why more glass from 1901 through the colonial period is usually marked.

Did Heisey only make the #1425 Victorian pattern in crystal?

No. In the October 1974 issue we printed a catalog page showing the full line in both sahara and cobalt. Pieces are also known in two shades of moongleam and in flamingo. In the museum we have pieces in sahara, cobalt, moongleam and flamingo. The latter two may very well have been experimental. Imperial reproduced this pattern in color but not in any color in which it was made by Heisey.

Was #1428 Warwick ever made in Hawthorne?

Not that we know of. The purple color which you occasionally see is Imperial's Heather or the item is sun-purpled. Imperial never marketed the Warwick pieces in Heather and Verde green so we assume they were experimental. They are very rarely seen. The double candlestick shown in the Yeakley book as being hawthorne has been identified as Imperial's Heather and the candlesticks have been placed by them in the museum's "Heisey by Imperial" cabinet. Much has been learned since early authors and researchers put out their books.

What items were made in #1433 Thumbprint and Panel?

Floral bowl, two branch candlesticks. 8½" vases straight or flared and cheese and cracker dish. Colors are cobalt, flamingo, moongleam and sahara.

Is #1495 Fern signed? What colors was it made in?

The only items which signed, to my knowledge, are the individual cream and sugar. Colors are crystal and Zircon (Limelight). A few items were

modified for use with the #1519 Waverly pattern and some of these are marked. They have the beads of the Waverly pattern on the rim but the Fern design at the base of the items. A few items of Fern are known in Dawn. These are rare since this was not a production color for the pattern.

Q Does #1503 Crystolite come in color?

The ash trays and cigarette boxes came in sahara and zircon. In a 1937 Table Talk they were pictured, but at that time the pattern number and name was #1496 Mahabar. Coasters are known in light amber. There are a few compotes in cobalt. A bowl in charcoal (Imperials name for a smoke color) is believed to be Imperial glass, made on special order.

What colors was #1506 Whirlpool made in?

Heisey made this pattern in crystal and limelight (zircon) only. Imperial made large quantities of it in various colors all of which have been discontinued sometime ago.

ls #1511 Tourjours pattern marked? This pattern is hard to recognize.

Most pieces are not marked. The individual cream and sugar and covered apple marmalade jars are exceptions. Most of this pattern is clear crystal. However, the museum owns the candle vase, in moongleam. Tourjours comes with Minuet etching and George IV cutting usually.

#### RECRUITING LETTER

(The following is a copy of a recruitment paper from the files of Harold Dunham, who donated many paper items to HCA a short time ago.)

"WHY HEISEY'S NEED MORE WORKERS: NO. 1 IN A SERIES"

"Whew! The Holidays certainly kept us humping to maintain a glitter of glassware on the shelves of more than 3500 Heisey dealer stores from coast to coast.

"As a matter of fact, we didn't begin to satisfy the pent-up demand for Heisey's hand-wrought crystal because, frankly, we didn't have the workers to do it.

"All we could do was maintain our own rationing of Heisey crystal as best we could, and apologize all over the place, when it was necessary to disappoint our customers, salesmen or dealers.

"One dealer was so anxious to get Heisey crystal that he wired: "Send 2,000 of anything available." Others pleaded and even threatened. Now we know how nylon hose makers feel!

"In 1946, we anticipate an even greater demand for Heisey crystal, but until workers are secured, we must continue to ration our glassware and turn away new dealers, anxious to feature Heisey crystal.

"The opportunity for new workers is unique, because Heisey workers are more than just employees. They are the personality behind the product. Here is an industry where skill, team work and individual craftsmanship determine the success...."

NOTE: The last paragraph is marked in pencil "rewrite". We don't know whether this was ever used or even if it was ever finished. We feel it does give some insight into the Heisey company from about 1945 when the glass industry was beset by many problems stemming from WW II.


