All information included in these financial statements is the representation of the management of Heisey Collectors of America, Inc.

A review consists principally of inquires of the Organization's personnel and analytical procedures applied to financial data. It is substantially less in scope than an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, the objective of which is the expression of an opinion regarding the financial statements taken as a whole. Heisey Q & A

We received several comments from members saying that they were happy to see the Q&A in last month's newsletter, but we **have not** received any submissions for the column.

Please take another look at last month's Q&A (it was on page 5), and let us know if you know the answer to any of the questions posted. Or, submit your own question for December's column. To submit a question or answer, just call the Museum or send your comments via mail, fax or e-mail to "Heisey Q&A."

In the meantime, here's a question we received at the Museum a few weeks ago which should be helpful to newer members.

Q: Did Heisey ever make a miniature Winged Scroll covered butter dish in "dirty" pink with gold decoration?

A: No, this piece was made by the Guernsey Glass Co. of Cambridge, Ohio. In addition to the opaque pink, it was made in clear emerald. The Museum has one of each on display in the lower level of the King House. The emerald dish is stamped "R. WETZEL" on the bottom, for Robert Wetzel, who designed the mold. These dishes measure 5" in diameter and just under 1" in height. The covers measure 3 1/4" in diameter and stand roughly 2 1/4" tall.

LET THE BUYER BEWARE

Most Heisey Collectors I know do not have tunnel vision in that they will buy another manufacturer's pretty glass. Cambridge, Old Boston and Sandwich, Pairpoint and all of the great cutting shops to name a few. Reproductions and reissues have always been a problem until they have been properly identified to the general public. Many have been issued not as a fraudulent item, but as a genuine new item, this notice being a case in point.

After the closing of the Tiffin Glass Co. of Tiffin, Ohio, a company known as "Cristol Traditions" became its successor. (This company is owned by two women of the Tiffin area. It is a new company.) Cristol Traditions purchased all of the molds, pattern rights, and copyright trademarks.

Trademarks—this is where things become interesting. Tiffin Glass owned the rights to the name and trademarks to the famous "Hawkes" cutting shop of Corning, NY, you all know of Hawkes cutting. They even cut a lot of Heisey blanks. There is NEW marked Hawkes cut glass on the market. They have every right to do this as they own the name and trademarks.

The experienced collector should not be fooled by the new items. The blanks are of very high lead content and are being imported from Europe. The shapes are of modern design, being mostly vases and bowls. The cuttings I've seen are not of the type one usually expects from Hawkes. Most pieces are acid polished to clear, but there are some that a partially clear polished and gray line cut. Cristol Traditions is presently running a small blow shop, acid polishing, and carving operation (Carway Sandblasting). The cutting is being done by two men, one in Ohio and the other in Pennsylvania.

At Cristol Traditions' store, they are very up front about the new Hawkes. At this time they are not using any of the thousands of Tiffin molds they own.

So if you are at an auction and they hold up an item and say "signed Hawkes," ask to see it before you jump in with a big bid.♦

FINAGLING WITH FANDANGO

The Internet is sometimes called the Information Highway and it is indeed that. I can't imagine anything you can't inquire about on the Internet - the secret to success is finding out where you have to go for the information you require. On the Internet you can even hone up on supermodel statistics if that's your thing. I'm not into that, of course. In the interest of accuracy I checked it out while testing my theory on the wide range of information available. If you want a good look at Heisey, for instance, you need only go to the Heisey Museum's web site for an extensive lesson in the glass we're all hooked on.

There are some things you can't learn on the Internet but, even so, some answers can be reasoned to. A case in point: I placed a Fandango covered butter for sale on an auction site recently. I was pleased with the action it generated and didn't anticipate any problems, so you can imagine my surprise when I received an e-mail inquiring about its finial. Hey, the finial looked just like all the finials I've seen on Fandango covered butters. What's the beef? Then, reading further, the e-mailer asked if it looked like the one on page 66 of Vogel's Book IV. What nonsense, of course it did! I checked anyway and, wouldn't you know it, it didn't.

I thought that perhaps I'd better read the rest of the e-mail to see if there were any other surprises. The only thing I found, though not a surprise, was that the e-mail was sent by Norval Heisey. I'm not kidding folks - he's for real. I've known Norval for years. "Heisey," like "Sparacio" is not the kind of name you make up (I'm not sure about

"Norval," though). Actually, folks who have known Norval for a very long time (his dear mother and me) call him "Sonny."

Speaking of the Heisey name, it's not as uncommon as you might think. There's an undertaking establishment (read that, Funeral Home) in Hershey, Pennsylvania that goes under the name "Heisey." It's been rumored that they are using the Diamond H in their advertising. I'll check it out next time we pass through Hershey. If it's true I'll insist that the HCA get a commission on each burial (or at least a discount for members).

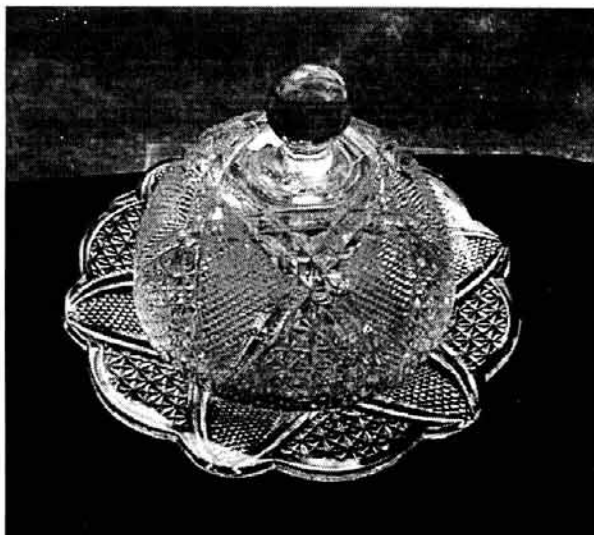
I digress, we were talking about Fandango. Indeed there is a difference between the catalog rendering and the actual finial on the Fandango covered butter. The catalog picture shows a pointed finial while mine has a round knob. I have two and they both are round though there is a slight hint of a pimple on top of the ball, which could be called a point if it weren't so barely discernable.

Having been involved in the past in completing a catalog in time for a trade show, I have reasoned to what may have happened at Heisey. The brand new company was

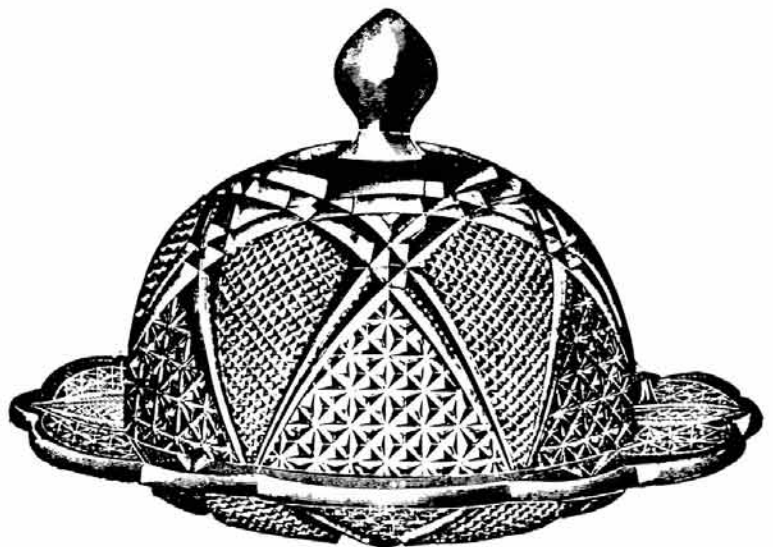
committed to introduce its new line before all of it was ready. The designer then prepared pictures for the catalog so the salesmen would have something to sell from the not yet completed line. Carrying this further - ease of production probably caused the switch from the pointy finial as originally drawn, to a rounded finial.

It's not unusual for a company to offer for sale things that have yet to be made. This is one of the reasons an item that appears in a catalog might really never exist. If no orders were written, that item was discontinued before it was ever made. Of course this scenario is conjecture on my part but it is plausible, as those of you who have ever been connected with merchandising know.

I've never seen anything but a round knob on a Fandango covered butter but I'd be interested to know if anyone has ever run into a Fandango butter cover that looks like the one in Vogel's catalog reprint. Don't be afraid to tell me if you have - I won't be embarrassed (though, in appreciation, I may send a pick-up order to the Heisey Funeral Home with your name on it). ♦

MORE PUNCH CUPS AND NAPPIES NEEDED FOR CHRISTMAS PROJECT

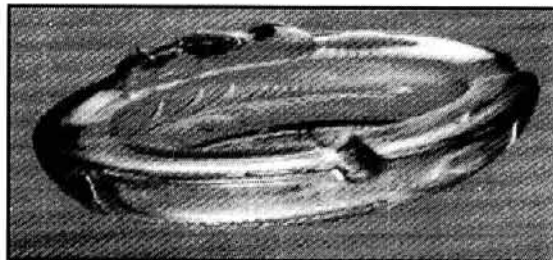

RESULTS OF SEPTEMBER'S BRIDGE CONTEST

Nine of the fourteen contestants in the first round of our bridge contest scored 100 percent. These nine were put into the monthly drawing from which our winner was chose. And the winner is: **Carole Stepinski!** Congratulations to Carole and the other eight contestants with winning bids. And thanks to all of you who played! Keep those bids coming in.

The following explanation comes from the judge of our Heisey bridge contest:

1. 2 HEARTS OR 2 CLUBS

Most players of today would bid 2 clubs, which is the bid to indicate a strong hand when playing weak two bids. I would guess that Milton Work (the bridge authority who originally designed the problems for Heisey) would have bid 2 hearts, which was the strong bid used in the days before weak twos was devised. There are other conventional bids acceptable (for instance, in the precision system, 1 club is the strong bid), however, I think that we should keep it simple here. Some people chose to bid 3NT. This bid is unwise due to the singleton diamond.

2. 1 CLUB

Again, today the acceptable bid would be 1 club as 4 card major openings are not common now. In Mr. Work's day, 1 heart would be acceptable.

3. 1 CLUB

Same explanation as above. Again, some chose 1NT. Points are there, but it's unwise due to singleton.

4. PASS

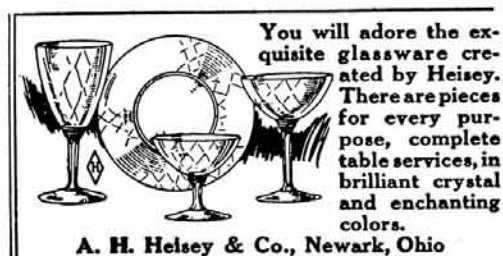
Not strong enough for an opening bid. Distribution is attractive and a good rebid is available, but spade suit is weak and diamond king could be wasted values. Only those known to live on the edge would open this hand.

5. 1 CLUB

This should be the bid today and yesterday. If partner does not have a heart bid, 2 clubs is a convenient rebid.

6. 2 CLUBS

The strong bid in olden days and today. ♦


