


You will find a form that contains the terms and conditions of the sale elsewhere in

LOCKET ON CHAIN

Accompanying the article was a request for information concerning the availability of Locket on Chain Toothpick Holder in Collections in North America.

This is to up date status of this pattern as reported Fall 1999.

Crystal 13: 8 mint, 5 chipped; mint. chipped: Ruby/Gold 2 9: 7 Emerald/Gold 7: 6 mint, 1 chipped: Yellow 2: 1 mint, 1 chipped; making a total of 31. Eleven were reported by Heisey Glass Collectors, NTHCS Toledo Convention 7 in attendance reported having Locket on Chain in their collection. There are no doubt a few that have not been reported. A tabulation will continue as we inventory this rare Heisey pattern. •

Q: I have a small "ribbed" basket about 4 inches square with a nice brass square handle. Where the handle is attached to the basket, there are glass leaves, berries,



and what appears to be apples attached. It is a beautiful glass basket and I have been unable to find anything on it in the different Heisey books that I have seen. Can you tell me anything about it?

A: At first glance, we didn't think this item was Heisey since we'd never seen anything like it before. After learning that the piece was marked, the first place we checked was the Ridgeleigh book and, sure enough, there

it was—a marmalade without its cover! We still don't know if this piece is a one-of-a-kind whimsy or if a decorating company produced these baskets. Any ideas from our readers?

HEISEY FROM HOLLAND?

We've been extolling the wonders of the Internet of late as a

great source for just about anything - you can buy Heisey, you can sell Heisey and you can learn about Heisey on the Internet (you may notice that my definition of "just about anything" is limited). If the Internet has a drawback it's that the amount of information on it is overwhelming. Where does one begin to know where to go? If you're as single-mindedly focused as I am, you just type in the name "Heisey" and go where that leads you.

Typing "Heisey" serves my purpose, but every once in a while I learn there's more on the Internet than placing "Heisey" on a search engine to see where it will take you. This was brought home recently by an e-mail from HCA member Richard Garnett. Richard didn't elaborate, he just said, "Carl...check this information out about Heisey's Tangerine vase." With that cryptic sentence he included this e-mail address: www.glass.co.nz/leerdam.htm. And check it out I did.


This is a glass museum site. I'll have to do a little condensing here or this article will go on until next Tuesday. Leerdam is in The Netherlands, near Rotterdam. I learned it's the name of a place and a glass company that began operating in 1878. It started out as a bottle plant and later extended into the kind of wares that Heisev became noted for. The beginning of its site starts with the name "Leerdam Glass" and has a photo of a vase they call "The Orange Apple." You wouldn't mistake this piece for Heisey, but the color looks suspiciously like Tangerine. The article goes on at great length about the company's glassware and its designers and ends eventually with another photo of yet another piece called, "Orange Apple." different is that this one is the spittin' image of Heisey's #4224 Ivy Vase and its color shouts "Tangerine!"

The information supplied next to the vase says, "The vase on the right is Lanooy's design to celebrate Queen Juliana's 18th birthday in 1927, and is entitled 'Orange Apple.'" Obviously this raises a lot of questions and requires further research. I tried briefly to look into it but found myself stranded on pages that were all in Dutch. Since my entire vocabulary in that language consists of, "Hans Brinker," I gave up.


This glass museum site is worth checking into as it has links to other glass sites. Give it a shot and let me know what you think of the "Orange Apple." My attempt to download the picture of Queen Juliana's Orange Apple from the Internet failed.

Last month I wrote about the finial on the #1201 Fandango Butter because I have yet to see one that looks like the one pictured in Heisey's catalog. George Schamel (HCA Past President) called me to say that these finials have every indication of being tooled after they were removed from the mold. I don't dispute George because he's in a tie with Walter Ludwig for the title of "Mr. Know-it-all." There's not a question I can ask that either one of these Heisey-men can't answer. And you know what? I'm getting sick of it! (Just kidding guys.)

George mentioned that the cover of the Fandango sugar bowl had the same treatment. I checked mine - it doesn't, it looks close to the finial pictured on the sugar bowl in the catalog. What does this tell us? It says it doesn't matter what form the finial has - it's still Fandango.

RESULTS OF OCTOBER'S BRIDGE CONTEST

Our second round of bridge hands was much more difficult, with only one individual submitting correct answers. And October's winner is... Carloyn Felger. Congratulations Carolyn! And once gain, thanks to all of you who have been submitting bids. Keep them coming!

The following explanation comes from the judge of our contest. If you have any questions or comments, please contact the Museum and we will pass them along. ◆

I find this set of bridge hands very interesting. I would love to know what Mr. Work was thinking, but since we cannot find his answers to the problems, I shall try my best to find answers. I would welcome your comments if you disagree with my bids. There are a variety of ways to look at these hands.

- 7. 1 CLUB was the unanimous answer to this hand, and I agree.
- **8. 2 DIAMONDS OR 2 CLUBS** (weak twos). Even though your long suit is rather weak, game is all but assured in your hand alone.
- 9. This hand is tough. Although you do not have the points for an opening two, I would open this hand 2 HEARTS OR 2 CLUBS (weak twos). The distribution justifies a strong bid. Two diamonds is not a correct bid because with two suits of equal length, you want to bid the higher first to keep the rebid of the other suit at a lower level.
- **10.** Another quandary. I would again lean towards **2 SPADES OR 2 CLUBS** (weak twos) because of the distribution. You do not want partner to pass this hand. I would not open 4 spades in first position. In third position with a passed partner, I would open 4 spades.

- 11. I would like to talk to Mr. Work about this hand. It is exactly the same as hand 10 but in different suits. He had a reason, but I don't know what he is trying to convey. I would open it 2 HEARTS OR 2 CLUBS (weak twos) just like 10. However, I also accepted 1 HEART he may have said to open this due to the lower value of the suit.
- **12.** Although you have the same amount of points in this hand as in hand 9, I would open this hand **1 SPADE**. Your second suit (hearts) is not as strong or as long as in hand 9.◆




