A NEW FIND FROM MINNESOTA

A few Saturdays ago Marvin & Jo Ann Christenson from Minnesota dropped by the Museum for a visit. They brought a few items that they had not been able to identify and were hoping for some

assistance. Among the items was what I believe to be a mayonnaise set that I had never seen before. As a matter of fact, if both pieces had not been marked with the Diamond H I would not have taken them for Heisey at all. We did take some pictures but did not do any exact measurements on the pieces so you will have to take my approximations for now.

There is no doubt that both pieces come from the same mold with





one made into a bowl and the other a plate/saucer/under plate. There is no ring on the plate so the bowl would just sit on it. The bowl is about 6" across and the plate maybe 7". What sets these pieces apart is how thick the glass is including a bottom foot on both pieces. Both pieces have a plain $\frac{1}{2}$ " rim but below that going all the way to the foot is a very unusual stippling. This stippling reminds me

of the experimental screen optic pieces we have in the Museum but a comparison shows that this is much finer. I am not sure how the stippling effect was achieved but the most likely scenario is that it actually is in the original mold.

Given that as far as I know these pieces have never been seen before, it is possible that they were feasibility items that were tried out but never reached full production. They certainly are something very different in the way of Heisey.



2014 FALL AUCTION WRAP UP

All who came to our 10th annual Fall Select Auction on October 11 at the BMP Local 244 Union Hall on Hudson Avenue had a chance to buy some wonderful Heisey glass and had fun too!

Our bright and sunny Saturday in Newark started off with our volunteers coming to the Union Hall at 9 A.M. to arrange the room for the auction and to unfurl the 306 lots of glass from our 18 consignors and 2 donors. We were finished in time for the preview which started at 12:00





P.M. and lasted till 1:00 P.M. The glass as always looked wonderful on the tables. Doesn't Heisey glass display well!

The Union Hall was a really good place to have the auction. We have had our Spring Benefit Auction there for the last several years. Craig Connelly and cohort Jeff Baird were our auctioneers and we had the "Pie Man" Gerry Dush and family provide the concessions. Wonderful food again!

Our auction began promptly at 1:00 P.M. The turnout for the auction was good with a crowd of approximately 100 and with 67 individuals picking up bid cards and an

additional 18 absentee bidders. The auction was completed around 4:30 P.M. Our 47 buyers picked up their glass and we held glass for 15 successful absentee bidders.

We had total revenues of \$29,335.60 with glass sales of \$29,246 for the 306 lots. Our payments to consignors and other estimated expenses totaled \$20,785.68 so we have an estimated net profit for the Museum of \$8,549.82. We came in well over our 2014 budget projection of \$4,000 for a couple of reasons. First, we had some really fine pieces in this auction, perhaps our best variety of Heisey glass ever! Secondly, and likely the main reason, is that we had 22 lots donated totaling \$3,794.00, with 19 of them donated by the Rarey family. Please note that 100% of the proceeds from donated glass goes to support the Museum. We hope others will also consider donating glass as we begin preparing for



the upcoming spring auction! This has been our second best fall auction in terms of net profit for HCA. Our highest



total was last year when we netted \$10,957.50 with donated glass totaling \$7,575. The auction prices per lot are shown on pages 7 & 8.

Putting on an auction is a team effort and HCA has some great volunteers! I want to thank the 25 volunteers who helped to make this a successful venture. Their names are listed in this Newsletter and my apologies if I missed anyone. I want to give special thanks to two individuals. Karen Taylo who has always clerked for us and did another great job with the able assistance of Roy Eggert. Second, Walter Ludwig who volunteered his time to help us catalog and properly list the glass and who also wrote a wonderful preparatory article highlighting the glass.

Thanks again for all of you who consigned and donated glass for this

auction and for those of you who purchased this wonderful Heisey glass. Hope to see you all at the Museum Holiday Open House on December 6, 2014 and at the 2015 Spring Benefit Auction on April 17-18, 2015. Please continue to support your Museum!

ANNOUNCING THE HEISEY CREAM & SUGAR PROJECT – 2015

After the success of our Heisey candlestick display at Convention this year we wondered what we could do to follow that up for Convention 2015. The impetus for that display was the republication of the Felt and O'Grady book <u>Heisey Candlesticks</u>. The display came together very quickly because between the Museum collection and those of a few members we were able to do a very comprehensive display.

We have decided to highlight Heisey creams and sugars at Convention 2015. Given more lead time we have decided to be very ambitious and mount a display in May of 2015 and run it through August 2015. The display will include all Heisey creams and sugars, dice sugars, sugar sifters, as well as full table sets from the earlier patterns. Since table sets – cream, sugar, spooner, and covered butter – were sold together as a unit it was felt that the full set should be included in the display. Color variations will be shown but not variations in decoration (etchings and cuttings).

To go with the display we hope to have available at Convention time a new book which will feature all production creams and sugars of A. H. Heisey & Company. We have already begun the project by creating a thorough list of all known creams and sugars done by the company. Our next step is to reach out to the membership to try to locate as many of the items on our list as possible. We will be touching base with a few known cream and sugar specialists, but we know that there are some sets that will be elusive. We need sets for measurement, photography, and for the display. If you have any that you consider rare sets, we ask that you contact the Museum or you can send me a message at WalterRL@windstream.net. Let us know what you have and how you can participate (even if it is only to provide measurements and/or photographs that will be important). As we start filling in the blanks in our database, I will let you know our progress and will be publishing lists of those sets which we have not been able to locate.

This project is headed by myself, Walter Ludwig, with the able assistance of Mike Morgan for book production and Eric Tankesley-Clarke, Dennis Headrick, and Tom Files as researchers. We could use someone to coordinate photography.

This is an exciting project that is going to take a lot of work to complete. With the help of the membership I know we can produce a great display as well as an exciting new book for your Heisey library.

Each owner may consign a maximum of forty (40) lots to the auction. A list of glass being consigned or donated and prepared by the owner is attached as an integral part of this contract. There is no limit on the number of items in each lot, but HCA retains the right to increase / decrease size / make up of each lot. Each owner may donate an unlimited number of lots to HCA for sale at the auction. HCA, however, at its discretion, will consign donated items for auction, add donated items to the museum collection, and/or sell donated items in the museum shop.

The HCA Auction Committee is authorized to reject any glass not deemed acceptable for this auction. These items may be returned to the consignor if they desire, at their expense. Otherwise, these items become the property of HCA.

Commission:

Owners of glassware to this sale will be charged on the following sliding scale of commission per lot: 5.00-50.00=40%; 50.01-200.00=30%; 200.01-20%; 400.00=20%; 400.01-750.00=15%; 750.01 and over=10\%.

Settlement:

Payments (settlement) to the owner for glass sold will be made in full not later than fifteen days after the completed auction from the HCA Auction Trust Account. Said account is set up and operated consistent with ORC Section 4707.024. The owner and HCA agree that no other payments will be required to be made in less than fifteen days. HCA will pay expenses including auction site rental, advertising fees related to this auction from its commission from this account. Collection of funds, bad checks, debts, and unpaid auction lots is the responsibility of HCA.

Responsibility:

It is the responsibility of the owner to deliver the glassware to the National Heisey Glass Museum on or by January 15, 2015. HCA accepts responsibility for the glass after it is received at the Museum and until it is sold except that any glass damaged in shipment to the Museum will be referred to the shipper and owner. All glass damaged or lost while in the possession of HCA prior to sale will be valued by a qualified appraiser or appraisers and the owner will be paid on this basis, less commission.

Auction and Bidding:

The auction will be a reserve auction. A reserve auction means an auction in which the owner or agent of the owner reserves the right to establish a minimum opening bid, the right to accept or reject any or all bids, or the right to withdraw the real or personal property (lot) at any time prior to the completion of the auction by the auctioneer.

HCA and the owner agree that:

- 1) the items will be sold to the highest bidder without reserve,
- 2) HCA and/or its auctioneer, has the right to accept or reject any or all bids,
- 3) HCA has the right to establish a minimum opening bid,
- 4) the owner may not withdraw the lot(s) at any time prior to the completion of the auction,
- 5) in the event no bids are received on a lot, that lot becomes a donation to HCA.

The minimum opening bid per lot is \$5.00 with a minimum bidding increment at the discretion of the auctioneer.

The owner and HCA both agree that absentee bids will be accepted by HCA. The minimum absentee bid on a lot will be \$15.00 with a minimum opening bid of \$5.00. Absentee bids are bids left by buyers prior to the auction and are executed in a competitive manner. Per HCA policy, HCA does not use the full bid amount as a starting bid. Bidding is initiated in the audience and then offered on behalf of the absentee bidder at the next increment continuously until bidding has stopped. (Example: Absentee bidder leaves a bid with a maximum amount of \$500.00. After item is sold through competitive bidding, the absentee bidder is successful for \$325.00). HCA reserves the right to accept or reject any and all absentee bids. HCA is not responsible for misfiled bids that are not executed.

The owner or a person on behalf of the owner may make a bid on a lot the owner consigns or has donated if the auction is a reserve auction and the auctioneer provides full disclosure before bidding that the owner retains the right to bid. Absent this disclosure, owners cannot bid or have others bid on their behalf on their own consigned or donated items. Said bidding would constitute bid rigging and be in violation of ORC 4707.023.

General Auction Terms and Conditions:

- 1) All lots sold in numerical cataloged order.
- Payment: Cash, traveler's check, certified check or personal check or money order with proper ID. Visa, MasterCard and Discover cards are accepted. 5% buyers premium. Buyers premium deleted for cash or check payment. Cash only payment may be specified for individual bidders at HCA's request.
- 3) HCA has endeavored to describe all items to the best of their ability; however this is not a warranty.
- 4) All items are sold as is and where is. The auctioneer has the right to make any verbal corrections at the time of sale and to provide additional information. Inspection is welcomed during preview and before the item is sold.
- 5) In the case of a disputed bid the auctioneers have the authority to settle disputes to the best of their ability and their decision(s) is/are final. Resale of items will be handled at the auctioneer's discretion.
- 6) The auctioneer has the right to set opening bids and reject any bid raise not in line with established bid increments. Items are sold without reserve, unless advertised otherwise.
- 7) All sales are final and all items must be paid for each day of sale. A moving and storage fee may be assessed for items not picked up within seven (7) calendar days after the last day of sale of the auction.
- 8) Buyers assume full responsibility for items once they are sold unless otherwise specified by HCA or the auctioneer. Buyer must have receipt in hand to pick up items.
- 9) HCA (an auction firm) and all auctioneers used by HCA are licensed by the Ohio Department of Agriculture and bonded in favor of the state.
- 10) Bidding on any item indicates acceptance of these Terms and Conditions of Auction.
