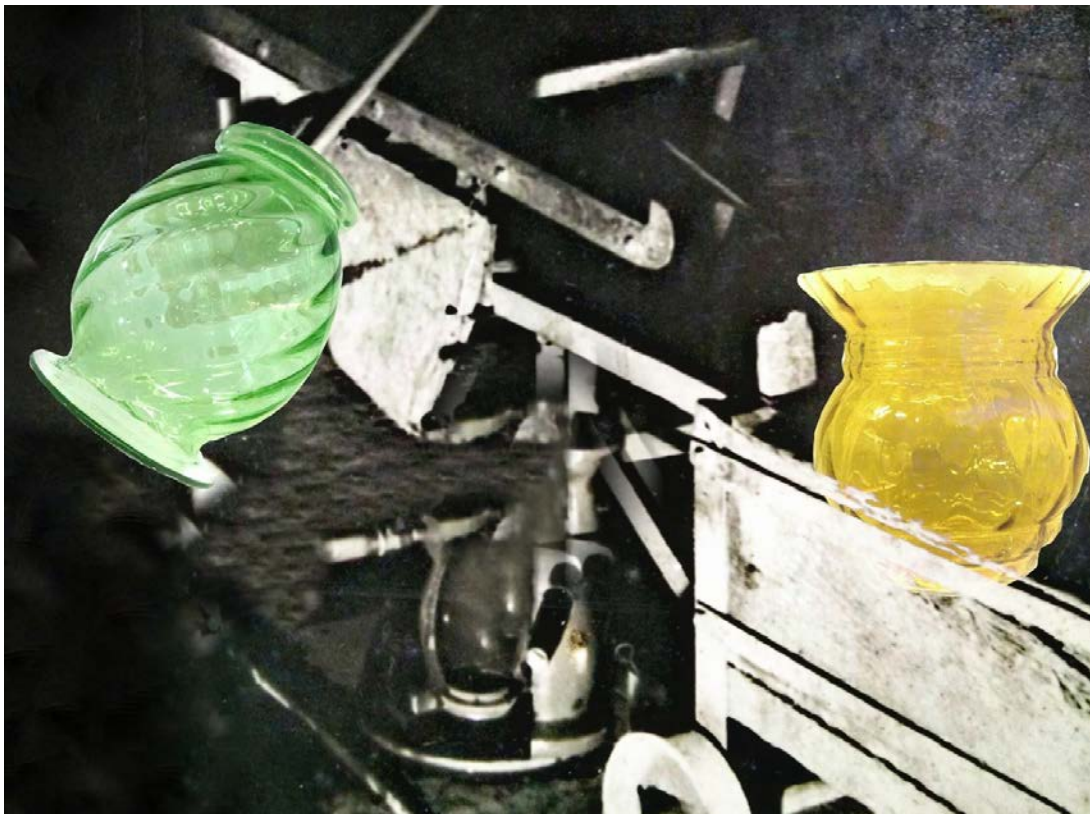
The recently completed blown vase display was a big success. It allowed us to present something that had never before been seen here at the Museum. Being able to see almost all of the blown production vases that Heisey made in all of the colors that were known really made a powerful statement. We will continue this series on vases next summer with a display of Heisey pressed vases from the beginning until 1920. A third display will follow in 2018 on pressed vases 1920 to the close of the factory. I am hoping to publish a list of early pressed vases that are needed for next year's display by the end of the year so that members can participate in that display.

Before the display was dismantled all of the vases were photographed and you can now see some of them on Facebook. A video was also taken that can now be viewed on the Museum website to allow a virtual tour of the display. It is hoped that once all of the vase displays are finished a book can be put together covering all Heisey vases.

Highlights of the 2016 Fall Select Auction

The Fall Auction has now been cataloged and I can hardly wait to tell you all about it. On October 15, there will be 231 lots offered for sale. Some items are fairly common while others are seldom seen. Our aim was to have something to appeal to every level of collector from the beginner to the advanced collector.



Near the beginning of the auction we have a nice grouping of early patterns including 8" compotes in 405 Puntty and Diamond Point (Lot 8) and 160 Locket on Chain (11). In 1250 Fancy Loop we have a 7 oz. molasses (9), a cracker jar (14), and a set of 1250 ½ salt and peppers (10). Other early pieces in color include a beautiful Custard seven piece berry set in 310 Ring Band with poppy décor (15) and an Emerald 1280 Winged Scroll pin tray (20).

We have 13 different Heisey baskets both crystal and colored including a rarely seen 500 Octagon in Marigold (40).

There are many different sets of creams and sugars including 3397 Gascony (52), 1255 Pineapple and Fan in Emerald (63), 406 Coarse Rib in Hawthorne (97), 1483 Stanhope with red knobs (98), and a complete table set in 433 Greek Key (64).

Among the Heisey animals in the auction are 1 Airedale (80), 104 Gazelle (85), 103 Tiger paperweight (88), as well as 15 Duck floral frogs in crystal (82) and Flamingo (77). Related there is a 7064 Girls Head stopper (93) and a 132 Small Horsehead stopper (94). The 357 Duck ashtray is available in all three production colors: Flamingo (153), crystal (154), and Moongleam (155).



There are many good sets of candlesticks but among them are some that are a bit unusual. We have a 4085 4" ball vase that has been modified by molding a candle cup into the bottom of the piece (129), we have been told that another collector has a pair of these. There is a beautiful pair of 300 Old Williamsburg candle lamps (173) with the globes engraved with the same engraving that appears in a factory photograph (see Heisey Candlesticks book page 184). We also have a 4263 Charter Oak water lamp in Flamingo (172).



We have ten lots of 1252 Twist in Moongleam (213 - 222) including goblets, footed ice teas, tumblers, 4-footed utility plate, and Kraft cheese plate. There are five lots of Alexandrite (205 - 209) including a 1401 Empress cream soup and three 3380 Old Dominion finger bowls. There are ten lots of 1401 Empress ahara (42 - 51) including one lot with a variety of pieces etched with Lotus' Classic etch. There are two pieces of Harvey Amber - 353 Medium Flat panel footed soda (189) and 586 Harvey House 5 oz soda (190).

Other unusual pieces in the auction include a Heisey doorknob (108), 1951A Elephant handled beer mug in Amber (140), 1183 Revere 9" plate in Vaseline (123), 1519 Waverly lion trinket box (182), and a 132 Sunburst floral bowl (211). If you enjoyed our blown vase display we have the 4209 Oval 9" vase in Moongleam (65), a 4045 Heron 9" ball vase in Sahara (67), and a 516/1 vase in Hawthorne (71). Among the pressed vases available are a 1421 Hi-Lo in Cobalt (68) and a 501 Fogg flower box in Flamingo (72).

Space prevents me from listing more but the full auction catalog is available to you in this issue of the Heisey News. Please consider coming to this outstanding auction, or, if you cannot make it, send in an absentee bid on any of the great lots available. I will be there and I hope to see you, too.

General Auction Terms and Conditions:

- 1) All lots sold in numerical cataloged order.
- 2) Payment: Cash, traveler's check, certified check or personal check or money order with proper ID. Visa, MasterCard and Discover cards are accepted. 5% buyers premium. Buyers premium deleted for cash or check payment. Cash only payment may be specified for individual bidders at HCA's request.
- 3) HCA has endeavored to describe all items to the best of their ability; however this is not a warranty.
- 4) All items are sold as is and where is. The auctioneer has the right to make any verbal corrections at the time of sale and to provide additional information. Inspection is welcomed during preview and before the item is sold.
- 5) In the case of a disputed bid the auctioneers have the authority to settle disputes to the best of their ability and their decision(s) is/are final. Resale of items will be handled at the auctioneer's discretion.
- 6) The auctioneer has the right to set opening bids and reject any bid raise not in line with established bid increments. Items are sold without reserve, unless advertised otherwise.
- 7) All sales are final and all items must be paid for each day of sale. A moving and storage fee may be assessed for items not picked up within seven (7) calendar days after the last day of sale of the auction.
- 8) Buyers assume full responsibility for items once they are sold unless otherwise specified by HCA or the auctioneer. Buyer must have receipt in hand to pick up items.
- 9) HCA (an auction firm) and all auctioneers used by HCA are licensed by the Ohio Department of Agriculture and bonded in favor of the state.
- 10) Bidding on any item indicates acceptance of these Terms and Conditions of Auction.

Absentee Bid Instructions

As absentee bidders, we will bid competitively for you at the HCA Heisey Fall Select Auction, October 15, 2016. In case of duplicate bids, the earliest postmark wins. Bids must reflect the listing in the catalog as to lot number, pattern, description, and condition. The minimum absentee bid per lot is \$15.

You set the maximum amount you are willing to pay on each lot. If successful, the remainder will be refunded. Please use good judgment in arriving at your maximum bid figure. Remember, there are minimum limits to raises that the auctioneer will accept (smaller items \$2.50, larger items \$5, \$10 or as much as \$25). Lots containing multiple items will be as one lot to the successful bidder. Normally, these are not split up, however, there may be some exceptions to this.

Please indicate on your bid the desired condition of the item on which you are bidding. We have endeavored to describe all items to the best of our ability and a bid on an item reflects your acceptance of the condition as listed. (As you know, if no flaws are noted, that means the glass is in generally good condition.) If you mark your bid "near mint only," we will use no discretion in your bid. If there is a variance on a lot not called in the catalog (such as unlisted damage or a difference in the number of items in a lot), we will not bid on that lot for you. Please use the form (or a copy) available in the *Heisey News*, or from this catalog, or from our website www.HeiseyMuseum.org to submit your bid. Absentee bids can be submitted by e-mail, fax, or postal service.

PAYMENT Cash, check, cashier's check, or money order payable to HCA Auction, and Visa/MasterCard/Discover Card accepted. A 5% buyer's premium will be added. Buyer's premium is deleted for cash, cashier's check, money order, or approved check payments. You may send a separate check for each lot or you may send one check covering the maximum amount of all bids. Absentee Bidders must make their own shipping arrangements. See Shipping section below for further information.

In addition, if you would like to pay by check, **Please** consider leaving the amount blank. Designate in the memo blank of your check an amount not to exceed the total amount of your bids. The Auction Manager or HCA Treasurer will fill in the exact amount of your purchase, thus greatly cutting back on refunds. Surplus bid money will be refunded. Send in a self-addressed, stamped envelope to return your checks. HCA reserves the right to reject any bid.

SHIPPING Buyers must make their own shipping arrangements including payments for shipping directly to the shipper. Glass is available to be picked up by your shipper on Tuesday, October 18, 2016, after 10:00 AM at the National Heisey Glass Museum, 169 W. Church St., Newark, OH 43055. HCA is aware of the following area shippers: Express Pack and Ship: 740-366-1325, Pakmail: 740-522-2564, and UPS Store 3910: 614-939-5195. HCA is not responsible for any services provided by these vendors. HCA will work with these vendors to make sure your glass is available.

BID SUBMISSION Absentee bids must be **received** no later than Saturday, October 8, 2016, at 4:00 p.m. Eastern Standard Time. When using a credit card number, bids must be faxed to (740) 345-9638 using the absentee bidding form. When your Fax is complete, please contact the Museum to ensure it has arrived and is removed from the Museum Fax machine as soon as it arrives. The Absentee Forms with personal checks, et. al., must be mailed to Absentee Bids, National Glass Heisey Museum, 169 W. Church St., Newark, OH 43055. HCA, Inc. must have credit card information or cash, a personal check, money order, or travelers check in its possession prior to executing a bid.

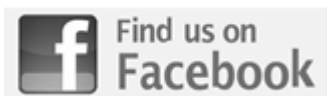
