# TREASURER'S REPORT

It's always great to have more than one set of eyes looking at the financial reports. Each month I share the Gift shop Sales Report, the Budget vs Actual Statement and the Financial Statement with the Board Members and the Finance Committee.

After sharing the December (Year End) Financials, Tom Files noticed the Miscellaneous Income on the Financial Statement was not reflected on the Actual vs Budget Statement. We don't budget this line item, but we do have revenue throughout the year that doesn't "fit" anywhere else. A quick phone call to our accounting firm, Wells & Priest, and the \$1,272 was added to the report.

This means our total revenues for 2017 were under budget by \$571, not the \$1,843 as reported in the February Heisey News.

When I was recalculating the "bottom line" I realized the Acquisition Expense of \$180 should not have been included in the actual expenses....Acquisition Revenue and Expenses are not budgeted and are paid for through a separate account. As a result, our expenses were over budget by \$3,034 (instead of \$3,214).

I understand if you're getting dizzy and your eyes are beginning to blur from all the numbers. It's happened to me quite often since I took over as Treasurer. The new bottom line: we missed budget by \$3,605. My bottom line: I'm still upset with the elevator inspector!!



# WANTED LATE HEISEY PRESSED VASES

We are in the process of assembling our next exhibit for Gallery 3 at the Museum. This exhibit will run from the beginning of June through Mid-August. We are concluding the series that we started two years ago on Heisey vases. This exhibit will be on pressed vases from about 1920 to the end of Heisey production in 1957.

The pressed vases during this period tend to be part of major patterns often with several different styles to a pattern. Only during the early 1930s did Heisey produce some pressed art vases which were not part of a major pattern.


We have lined up a great array of vases from Heisey's later patterns, but there are some vases which have eluded us so far. So, we are appealing to the membership to see if some of our missing vases might be out there in collections. I will talk about these missing vases in chronological order.

In Tudor we would like to find the 411 footed compotier with floral block. In 412 there are 8" and 10" crimped vases listed. These look like they were made from the tankard without a handle.


We have many examples of the 1413 Cathedral vase but would like to have either style (flared or straight) in Flamingo, and the flared style in Sahara. There are many vases in 1425 Victorian but we are missing examples of the 6" footed and 5 ½" flat Warwick (1428) is well represented but we still need to find an example of a swung vase in the pattern. We do need help in 1433 Thumbprint and Panel. The only examples we have are straight vase in Flamingo and straight and flared in crystal, we would like other colors in both straight and flared. In 1485 Saturn we would like to find a rose bowl and a 9" footed vase crimped and a footed vase as shown in "Bredehoff: 1896-1957" page 258 (these are two different vases – not variations on the same vase}.

1485 Saturn rose bowl


Crystolite (1503) has many vases and we are fortunate to have as many as we do. But there are a few we still need including the 7" floral urn and two of the hard to find 9" vases – we need the straight Calendula and the ruffled (we have the cupped Lily and flared Aster).

There are several Verlys by Heisey vases that I would like to add to the display. Currently the only one we have is a 1060 Mandarin and it is not frosted. Other vases that were produced by Heisey include 1070 Flowers, 1080 Autumn-Spring, 1085 Winter Summer, 1157 Gems, and 1284 Love Birds. Any of these in Turquoise would be a bonus.


Finally 6009A Roundelay has a bud vase which is the same as the oil bottle without a stopper.

One other vase that would be nice to find is a 7180 Haphazard. This is shown in the latest reprints of the Vogel books (Volum3 3, page 114). As far as I know only one has ever been seen and that is in Flamingo.

If you have any of these vases, or any other unusual vase from the era, please contact Jack or me at the Museum. We would love to hear from you.

## Absentee Bid Instructions



As absentee bidders, we will bid competitively for you at the HCA Spring Benefit Auction, April 13- April 14, 2018. In case of duplicate bids, the earliest postmark wins. Bids must reflect the listing in the catalog as to lot number, pattern, description, and condition. The minimum absentee bid per lot is \$15.

You set the maximum amount you are willing to pay on each lot. If successful, the remainder will be refunded. Please use good judgment in arriving at your maximum bid figure. Remember, there are minimum limits to raises that the auctioneer will accept (smaller items \$2.50, larger items \$5, \$10 or as much as \$25). Lots containing multiple items will be as one lot to the successful bidder. Normally, these are not split up, however, there may be some exceptions to this.

Please indicate on your bid the desired condition of the item on which you are bidding. We have endeavored to describe all items to the best of our ability and a bid on an item reflects your acceptance of the condition as listed. (As you know, if no flaws are noted, that means the glass is in generally good condition.) If you mark your bid "near mint only," we will use no discretion in your bid. If there is a variance on a lot not called in the catalog (such as unlisted damage or a difference in the number of items in a lot), we will not bid on that lot for you. Please use the form (or a copy) available in the *Heisey News*, or from this catalog, or from our website [www.HeiseyMuseum.org](http://www.HeiseyMuseum.org) to submit your bid. Absentee bids can be submitted by e-mail, fax, or postal service.

**PAYMENT** Cash, check, cashier's check, or money order payable to HCA Auction, and Visa/MasterCard/DiscoverCard accepted. A 5% buyer's premium will be added. Buyer's premium is deleted for cash, cashier's check, money order, or approved check payments. You may send a separate check for each lot or you may send one check covering the maximum amount of all bids. Absentee Bidders must make their own shipping arrangements. See SHIPPING section below for further information.

In addition, if you would like to pay by check, **Please** consider leaving the amount blank. Designate in the memo blank of your check an amount not to exceed the total amount of your bids. 



# HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2018 SPRING AUCTION

## Walter Ludwig

We have finished cataloging the items for the 2018 Spring HCA Auction. After four full days we have 1,394 lots for you to consider. These offerings represent the full range of production of the Heisey Glass Company from their beginnings until the doors closed in 1957. There is something for everyone in this auction from the standard production to true rarities that you never are given a chance to buy.

This is the auction to come to if you would like to start a collection, find the ideal wedding gift, or if you are a long time collector needing to add a special piece to your collection. The auction abounds in those old standbys of 1503 and 5003 Crystolite (including Lot 691, the rarely seen 5003 blown comport), 1540 and 5004 Lariat, 1567 and 5067 Plantation, 507 Orchid etch, 515 Heisey Rose etch, and many examples from Heisey's colonial lines. This is an auction rich in candlesticks and baskets, but also this year we have an outstanding number of smaller stem pieces including cordials, wines, clarets, and cocktails.

This auction is especially heavy with 1469 Ridgeleigh with runs of the pattern at lots 115-193, 649-675, and 944 – 954 which includes 15 pieces of the blown 4069 line. Special pieces of Ridgeleigh include four roly poly cocktail sets being sold choice (658 A-D), a cocktail with the variant stem (950), and the 8" three sided vase (666). This year we also have a large selection of 503 Minuet etch (1144-1164) as well as a lot of four dinner plates (54). There is quite a lot of 1401 Empress in Sahara throughout the auction including lots 19 – 44. This auction is especially rich in pieces of 150 Banded Flute with many rare and unusual pieces (lots 1165-1168, 1185-1188, 1225-1228, and 1231-1243). Included are a two piece oyster cocktail with a seat in the bottom piece (1242), footed schoepfen (1231), root beer mug (1232), and many unusual sizes of stems and sodas. There are also two 10" high footed compotes (575 and 1165). The #1 water set (1227) as well as the #3 bedroom set (1228) are also being offered.



The animal collector will not be disappointed with the wide array of offerings including both Fillies, head back and head forward (lots 1011 and 1012). Almost every figural stem is represented including the rarely seen 5047 Dancer's Leg cocktail (417).

Among the old patterns, 1205 Fancy Loop is represented with an ice tub (569) and a footed cake basket (568). We have a full set of 465 Recessed Panel candy jars including an 8 pounder (293-298). Lot 1250 is a 4 piece griddle set in 473 Narrow Flute with Rim. We also have a 353 Medium Flat Panel measuring cup (1251).

Outstanding pieces in color include a 1519 Waverly footed candy in Amber (78) and a 1218 Simplicity 9" plate in Vaseline (1096). There are 1401 Old Sandwich 8 ounce beer mugs in Amber (1036) and Cobalt (928). Other interesting pieces in Cobalt includes a 4045 Heron 6" ball vase with 469 Mermaids etch (1034) and a 1469 Ridgeleigh square cigarette holder (949). Lot 350 is a 1415 Arch tumbler in Tangerine. There is a 1488 Kohinoor 13" floral bowl in Zircon (585) with some damage to the bottom rim – but it is gorgeous. An interesting stem is the 3386 Diamond Rose sherbet in Sahara (409). Also in Sahara is an elaborately cut 4225 Cobel Cocktail shaker with four 4002 Aqua Calientes (1040).

Candlesticks are exceptionally strong with examples spread throughout. Of special note are a 31 Jack-Be-Nimble toy candlestick in Moongleam (1321), a 109 Petticoat Dolphin candlestick in Sahara (604), a single 127 Twist Stem candlestick in Flamingo (112), and a pair of 105 Pembroke 6" candelabra in Moongleam (820). We also have a 300-5 Old Williamsburg 5 light candelabrum complete (300).

We have an especially good group of colognes in this auction including a 4035 Seven Octagon with Duck stopper in Moongleam (696), a 515 Taper in Hawthorne (694), and the super rare 1405 Ipswich cologne (693).

Other interesting pieces include a 1567 Plantation cigarette box (1255) and a 1486 Coleport ice bucket with two sodas (280). A great advertising piece is a tin store sign for Heisey "Moongleam, The Green Supreme" ware (603). There are two whimsies in the auction – these are pieces that were not made for production: a 1506 Provincial basket that was made by adding a handle to a sweet pea vase (9) and a 3350 Wabash 13" vase made from the tankard (194).

Space limitations prevent me from going on, but as you can see there is plenty for offer in the auction. I hope you will be able to join me and all of your Heisey friends for this great event. I look forward to seeing you April 13 and April 14.




To entice you to Minnesota, we plan to share some of the highlights of our home state with you in the Heisey News over the months leading up to the big event.

This month's highlight, suggested by Bob Heisey, is the architectural marvel that is the Minnesota State Capitol. Take a free, guided tour of this magnificent building, where a \$30 million restoration was just completed - in time for Heisey visitors!

The capitol approach is dramatic with the eye catching Quadriga (*Latin for four-horse chariot*) sculpture, re-gilded with 23.5 carat gold leaf, greeting visitors from atop the capitol roof. Inside the building you can stand in the rotunda and gaze upward at the world's second largest self-supporting marble dome (the larger one is in Rome). Surrounding the inside of the dome are many paintings, which have been painstakingly restored to bring out their vivid colors.

Free 45-minute tours are offered 10 am to 2 pm Monday through Saturday, and 1 to 3 pm Sundays.

There were the lovely flamingo Greek Key and Ring Band custard cups.
