
We will be closed both Monday & Tuesday for January and February of 2019

Message from the President

At the Museum the slower months are usually January and February - when I say slower I mean in foot traffic. The winter hours of the Museum restricts visitors to Wednesday – Sunday visitation and the Ohio weather tends to keep visitors at home. Even our digital footprint drops during these colder months with 22 visitors to our business page on Yelp! vs the 28 average. Visitors may slow during the winter months, but that does not mean things are "slow" at our Museum. The staff and volunteers capitalize on this slower time to be attentive to the many tasks that need to be accomplished for the coming year.



The Spring Benefit Auction Cataloguing has begun thanks to our wonderful volunteers and the Museum gets an extra deep interior cleaning as the holiday décor is packed away. This year we are transitioning staff areas to be more efficient in our work. One area of focus is the Guest Reception area in the entry to the Museum. This is currently where Susan's desk is now. We have realized that Susan, who has been doing a great job balancing membership clerk and welcoming guests, is not able to fulfill all of the demands required for the membership clerk, due to the location of her desk.

She is our Membership Clerk and many of you enjoy calling and talking to her, as she enjoys hearing from you too! But this front desk area is a Welcome Center- not a place where the staff should be on the phone. It is to be a friendly welcoming place for guests to be attended to, and to come ask questions, unfortunately she is not available for guests due to the membership clerk responsibilities. For example, many times Susan is on the phone and the doorbell rings and she has to end her call to answer the door. There are many more scenarios that prove it would be more efficient for Susan to be relocated to a more private area. Although she is still available at an ears' reach if we move her working area to the clerk office. In this new location she will be able to make her important phone calls to members, and keep our members connected to their Museum. Jack and I will be painting and reworking this space for a welcoming and cheerful transition for Susan and the clerks- who will now be stationed at the entry desk for guest and member services.

On January 26, I was proud to be part of the Identification and Appraisal Committee that informed the community of what their Heisey heirlooms and discoveries really were. The Buckeye Heisey Collectors Club sponsored this event at the Museum. We had a very good turn out and some really cool Heisey items were dusted off and brought to the Museum so their owners could learn more about them. What better location to get HOOKED ON HEISEY but Our Beautiful Museum.

Our HCA study clubs are a support system for the Museum while engaging interest and support from new members and collectors- as well as enjoyment for the veteran collector! If you are not part of a Heisey study club, I highly encourage it! It's a great way to meet others with a similar passion, ask questions to knowledgeable members, and support the Museum in their projects and fundraisers, and the best reason...the FOOD, served on Heisey of course! We are excited to have THREE new and aspiring study clubs, Kentucky, Hoosier (Indiana) and Georgia area. Projects and assistance that clubs provide to the Museum are great as-well. The Texas Heisey Collectors club creates the Heisey calendars and donates them to the Museum- so all sales are 100% benefiting the Museum. The Michigan Collectors Club is working on a new book- on Heisey's newsletter to their salesmen- "Table Talk." These Table Talks have very insightful information that was meant for the salesman. They announced new patterns and colors- as well as sales techniques and industry news. They provided a view into the Heisey glass marketing strategies and are filled with great photos of salesrooms and artwork.

As with any archival "paper-work" we are lucky to have what we do. Our AMAZING volunteer Archivists, Chuck and Amy Jo Jones, have compiled a list of what editions we have of Heisey Table Talks- What we are missing and what we have a black and white copy of (and need a better copy!). 

HCA's LAVENDER ICE GEM SERIES

There have been questions asked about the Lavender Ice Animal set. Why were they made, when were they made, who made them and how many were made. Hopefully this article will answer some of those questions, but First a little History.

In the fall of 92 the HCA BOD was looking for fundraisers to fund the construction of the Museum Addition. This was accomplished thru private donations, the Rosealene animal set by Fenton, and the Lavender Ice set by Dazel Viking, plus a few other animals in cobalt. These projects raised ALL the money (approximately \$1.2 million dollars) for the addition without borrowing anything from the line of credit that HCA had established just in case.

The Lavender Ice Gem Series set consisted of 12 animals, Bull, Pouter Pigeon, Show Horse, Large Elephant, Medium Elephant, Small Elephant, Rearing Horse Bookend, Mallard wing up, Mallard wings down, Mallard wings half, Scottie Dog and the Kingfisher. The color was formulated by Ken Dazel for HCA exclusively. Each set was numbered 1 of 450, 2 of 450, etc. All seconds were frosted.

This set went on sale Jan. 23, 1993 with only 450 set to be made and sold at \$600 per set. Sold only to HCA members (in 1993 we had approx.. 4000 members supporting our projects). Due to anticipated response, we set up a special phone bank to take orders. Our members answered the call and the response was great. By 11 a.m. we had sold 350 sets and by the end of the day we had sold 423 sets. The last 27 sets were sold early the next day. Our members answered the call and we sold all of them in just over 1 day.

Survey shows member satisfaction with the work of staff

(Third in a series of articles on results of the HCA Member Survey. See October and December 2018 issues for previous stories.)

The online survey conducted by Heisey Club of America (HCA) last summer gave generally high marks to museum staff. One 10-part question asked members to “rate your level of satisfaction with the performance of museum/HCA staff.”

For each of the 10 items, members were asked to indicate if they were “always satisfied,” “generally satisfied,” “sometimes satisfied” or “rarely satisfied.” Because many survey participants had never visited the museum or had little or no experience with some of the items in question, they could also respond “don’t know.” In calculating the level of satisfaction percentages for each item, the “don’t know” responses were excluded so they would not skew results in cases where the number of “don’t know” responses was quite large.

Six of the 10 items received very high marks, with 90 percent or more of the survey respondents marking them either “always satisfied” or “generally satisfied.”* A survey research expert indicated that for surveys of non-profit organizations, satisfaction levels in the 90 percent range are considered very strong and those above 75 percent should generally be considered quite satisfactory. Items that receive satisfaction levels below 75 percent should receive some attention.

HCA members who participated in the survey were most satisfied with how staff members respond to inquiries by phone; 94.8 percent indicated that they were always satisfied or generally satisfied. An almost identical number, 94.6 % were always satisfied or generally satisfied with how staff respond to inquiries in person. Staff also received very high marks for ensuring the Museum is clean, inviting and well maintained and for making visitors feel welcome: these items were tied at 92.7 percent. Providing efficient service in the gift shop (91 percent) and providing information about the A. H. Heisey Company and history to visitors also received very high marks (90 percent).

Responding to inquiries by mail came in at 88 percent, which is still quite strong. Two more items came in above the 75 percent threshold: responding to inquiries about glass identification within four weeks (78 percent) and handling communication with study groups (76.6 percent). Only one item dropped ever so slightly below 75 percent - acknowledging contributions with timely letters (74.3 percent).



In addition, a number of written comments indicated satisfaction with the work of Museum staff and volunteers. “There have been numerous improvements in recent years. The Museum now has beautiful table settings for the season, interesting special displays, and a visible gift shop. The grounds could not have been prettier during my latest visit, and the doors are a beautiful addition to the Museum,” wrote one member in response to a survey item asking participants to describe how HCA could improve the museum.

STORIES OF OUR LOVE AFFAIR WITH HEISEY GLASS

Betty Pease of Andover, Massachusetts found her way to Heisey through a friend, a chicken farmer, who invited her over for tea one afternoon to see her Heisey collection. Betty loves HCA and the Heisey museum because she finds them to be welcoming too. She remembers visiting the museum once when Louise Ream was curator. Louise gave them a tour of the museum. "We were just floored by all the different patterns, the King House and the new addition." she said. She has also been very impressed by Walter Ludwig over the years. 


