TREASURER'S REPORT

Our "Off to the Races" Convention has run its course; the conditions were perfect and every event was a winner!! Here are some preliminary race results:

In the first race, A Night at the Museum led from start to finish. This was an Endowment Event where the Mint Julips were flowing. The sloppy track (yes, it rained) didn't damper the enthusiasm of the crowd. The payout: \$651 for the Endowment Fund.

The Friday slate of races began early in the morning. The lineup of horses in the first race was impressive: Acquisitions, Operating, Endowment and Capital Fund. Endowment took the early lead, with Operating in second, Acquisitions in third and Capital Fund running a distant fourth. It seemed like another sure win for Endowment until the clubhouse turn when Capital Fund made its move and won in the homestretch. Race payouts:

Capital Fund:\$36,488
 Endowment: \$11,725
 Operating: \$3,325
 Acquisitions: \$650

The evening races were equally as hard fought. The Silent Auction race card had 26 events. Each race was hotly contested with everyone jockeying for position. In the end, the winning payout equaled \$2,795. The final race of the evening was the Live Auction Derby.... the winner (HCA) took home \$3,325.

Saturday saw a Trifecta from the Heisey Collectors Club of Michigan. The Show: The publication of the Table Talk book. The Place: Sold at the Glass Show on Thursday, Friday and Saturday. The Win: The Endowment! Sale of the books brought in over \$1000.

Congratulations to all our jockeys for running such a wonderful event. And, thank you to all our race enthusiasts for your continued support.




Earle who is also an avid model train collector showed pieces from his 1928 B&O china service.


