Our "Off to the Races" Convention has run its course; the conditions were perfect and every event was a winner!! Here are some preliminary race results:

In the first race, A Night at the Museum led from start to finish. This was an Endowment Event where the Mint Julips were flowing. The sloppy track (yes, it rained) didn't damper the enthusiasm of the crowd. The payout: \$651 for the Endowment Fund

The Friday slate of races began early in the morning. The lineup of horses in the first race was impressive: Acquisitions, Operating, Endowment and Capital Fund. Our next meeting will be July 13th at Replacements, Ltd. at 12:00.























