





# 2018 Year End Financials

The December Financials are in, so let's see if we finished the year with a bang! Follow along as we discuss the information on the 2018 Budget VS Actual statement.

As a reminder, four revenue line items are not included in the Total Income: Donations – Specified Project, Donations – Video Projects, Donations – Museum Capital Fund and Acquisitions Donations. This revenue was not budgeted so it has been excluded from the total. On the Expense side, there are two line items not included in the Total Expenditures: Advertising – Video Projects and Acquisitions. As with revenue, these expenses were not budgeted.

First we'll look at our Revenue: December Sales were very good at \$7057.89 (Gift Shop and eBay revenue). While we made up some ground, we ended the year below our Sales budget (\$8,007). Also below budget: Membership (\$2,455), Newsletter Ads (\$152), Glass Identification (\$25) and Convention (\$1,715).

On the positive side, we exceeded budget in a number of areas: Cash Donations (\$3,224), Shipping (\$1,413), Admissions (\$992), Benefit Auction (\$2,251), and the Dave Spahr Select Auction (\$9,128). The Percy & Vivian Moore weekend event, hosted by the Northwoods Heisey Study Club, exceeded budget by \$1,700. We also had \$1,472 in Miscellaneous revenue and the Endowment Transfer was \$8,742 more than budgeted.

When you do the math, Revenue exceeded budget by \$16,570.

Now let's look at a few line items on the Expense side: Salaries and Wages were over budget by less than 5% (\$4289). The YTD Cost of Sales reflects an adjustment to the inventory valuation based on the physical inventory completed in October 2018. Christa, Mary Ann, Charlene and I spent a fun filled day looking in nooks and crannies and counting beads and books and glass, oh my!

The Museum Expense line item includes the cost of software upgrades approved at the November Board meeting. This included moving from Windows 7 operating system to Windows 10 on all the computers as Windows 7 will no longer be supported by Microsoft in early 2020 (yes, it's right around the corner!!). Also part of the upgrade: QuickBooks Point of Sale software in the gift shop and QuickBooks for the Financial Coordinator....it had been 10 and 7 years, respectively, since this software had been upgraded.

Overall, expenses were under budget by \$3,546.

So, we did finish 2018 with a bang....here's looking forward to more fireworks in 2019.

# HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2019 SPRING AUCTION

## Walter Ludwig

We have finished cataloging the items for the 2019 Spring HCA Auction. After four full days we have 1,249 lots for you to consider. These offerings represent the full range of production of the Heisey Glass Company from their beginnings until the doors closed in 1957. There is something for everyone in this auction from the standard production to true rarities that you never are given a chance to buy.

This is the auction to come to if you would like to start a collection, find the ideal wedding gift, or if you are a long time collector needing to add a special piece to your collection. The auction abounds in those old standbys of 1503 and 5003 Crystolite, 1540 and 5004 Lariat, 1567 and 5067 Plantation, 507 Orchid etch, 515 Heisey Rose etch, and many examples from Heisey's colonial lines. This year we also have a good number of lots in 1469 Ridgeleigh and 1506 Provincial. This is an auction rich in candlesticks (Lot 1063 is a 1619 Block Five with insert vase) and baskets (including Lot 1150 a 477 Hairpin with cutting), but also this year we have an outstanding number of smaller stem pieces including cordials, wines, clarets, and cocktails.

The animal collector will not be disappointed with the wide array of offerings including 1 Rearing Horse bookend (Lot 933) and a 1540 Plug Horse in Amber (1047).

Among the old patterns, we have a 1776 Kalonyal water bottle (1101) as well as a nice array of footed compotes including 325 Pillows 10" shallow (98) and 9" ruffled (817), 357 Prison Stripe 8 ½" (1019), and 1250 Groove and Slash 9" shallow (1025). Candy jars include a 465 Recessed Panel 8 pound (1097) and a 341 Puritan 5 pound (1082). There are several punch bowl sets including 343 Sunburst (62), 335 Prince of Wales Plumes (97), 365 Old Queen Ann (124) and 1205 Fancy Loop (147). There is a 300 ½ Peerless three handled loving cup (670).





Outstanding pieces in color include a 56 Sweet Scroll match holder in Opal (828). There are several pieces in Vaseline including a 350 Pinwheel and Fan 4" nappy (1051), a 151 Visible Cookware 3" ramekin (1046), and an 1186 Yeoman 9" oval fruit (1053). Among the Emerald pieces are a 1280 Winged Scroll cologne (821), a 150 Pointed Oval in Diamond Point jug (1048), and a 160 Locket on Chain 8" pickle (1049). In Moongleam there is a pair of 1183 Revere candle vases (792) and a 1421 Hi Lo vase (793). For Flamingo there is a 4034 Seven Circle cologne with original Flamingo label (848). Hawthorne is represented with a 4162/1 6" vase (950) and an 1186 Yeoman ashtray with "Heisey for Director" etch (934).



Stemware is well represented with the outstanding lot being number 799 - a 4085 Kohinoor Rhine wine. There are a great assortment of cordials in this auctions with runs of lots at 411-431, 450-505, 938-949, and 1189-1220. Barware collectors will not be disappointed with the 4004 Impromptu decanter (1098), 5060 Washington Square 12 oz. soda (1122), and three sizes of 5087 Comet sodas (1123). Unusual bars include a pair of 2323 Navy with Cobalt bases (539), a 1446 Octagon Panel (685), and a 1425 Victorian in Sahara (1061).

Other interesting pieces include a 437 Ribbon Candy pitcher (307), a 440 Facet ashtray (773), and a 395 8" low footed bowl (367).

There are a lot of large lots with a variety of items in them. These are perfect for the beginning collector. But if there is something in the lot you really want, the rest of the items will make good gifts or you can consider donating them back to the Museum for our fund-raising efforts.

Space limitations prevent me from going on, but as you can see there is plenty for offer in the auction. I hope you will be able to join me and all of your Heisey friends for this great event. I look forward to seeing you April 5th and April 6th.

## Absentee Bid Instructions

As absentee bidders, we will bid competitively for you at the HCA Spring Benefit Auction, April 5 - April 6, 2019. In case of duplicate bids, the earliest postmark wins. Bids must reflect the listing in the catalog as to lot number, pattern, description, and condition. The minimum absentee bid per lot is \$15.

You set the maximum amount you are willing to pay on each lot. If successful, the remainder will be refunded. Please use good judgment in arriving at your maximum bid figure. Remember, there are minimum limits to raises that the auctioneer will accept (smaller items \$2.50, larger items \$5, \$10 or as much as \$25). Lots containing multiple items will be as one lot to the successful bidder. Normally, these are not split-up, however, there may be some exceptions to this.

Please indicate on your bid the desired condition of the item on which you are bidding. We have endeavored to describe all items to the best of our ability and a bid on an item reflects your acceptance of the condition as listed. (As you know, if no flaws are noted, that means the glass is in generally good condition.) If you mark your bid "near mint only," we will use no discretion in your bid. Absentee bids can be submitted by e-mail, fax, or postal service.

**PAYMENT** Cash, check, cashier's check, or money order payable to HCA Auction, and Visa/MasterCard/DiscoverCard accepted. A 5% buyer's premium will be added. Buyer's premium is deleted for cash, cashier's check, money order, or approved check payments. 


