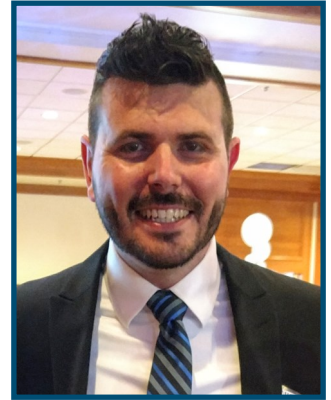

As many of you know, work is constant at our Museum. I am working with Museum Director, Jack Burriess to develop a Museum Property Needs List. This will allow us to develop a plan and hopefully achieve completion on many projects such as replacing 25 year old carpeting, renovating 33 year old bathrooms, much needed HVAC replacement, security system upgrades, etc. Working at a home improvement retail store I see the importance of planning for the upgrade and/or repair of projects listed above. We want to be represented as best as possible, remain compliant and be responsible too. Look for more updates to come.

I am anxiously awaiting the release of our newest product in our Museum Shop. Heisey Pumpkins for the Autumn season. These glass pumpkins are not made from Heisey Glass but were created from a real Heisey mould. The #7000 Sunflower tumbler mould was used as a form or design to create the pattern to the pumpkins. Originally the Heisey Company made the mould be a pressed item. To make the pumpkin we have blown the glass in the pressed mould. Using the mould in this manner actually creates the optic pattern to the pumpkins, so the patterning is subtle yet striking.

Using this technique in other pressed moulds yearly we hope to offer new shapes, colors and sizes so that you can add to your "Heisey Pumpkin Patch" each year. These pumpkins are adorable and cute. Those who have seen the prototypes have found appreciation for them and wants to know when they are available. The pumpkins will be numbered and dated in limited edition style sets much like our ornaments. We will send out a Heisey-gram when they arrive from the glass artist and are available for purchase. See the photo of the prototypes below.

I hope to see you all at the Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction, (October 20, 2018). There are some fabulous items in this auction (as I have been admiring them in the Gallery 3 display). Thanks to all of those who are traveling for this event and to our wonderful Volunteers. 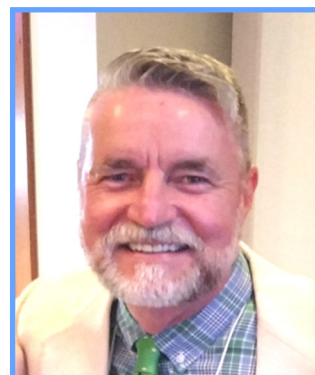

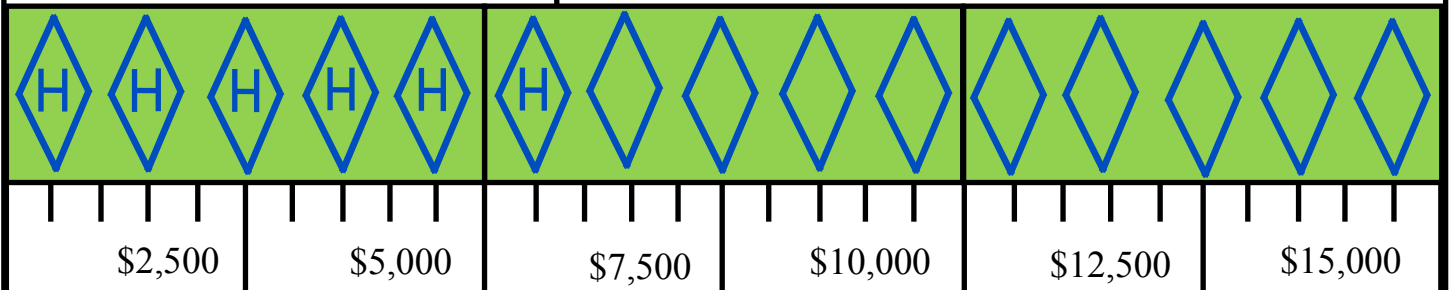

Highlights of the 2018 Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction

The Dave Spahr Fall Auction has now been cataloged and I can hardly wait to tell you all about it. On October 20, there will be 333 lots offered for sale. Last year's auction was exceptional in its quality, and I can truly say that this year we come very close to that high mark. We have rarities throughout this auction – items which you may have never seen and have never had a chance to purchase. I will list a few of these wonderful items here but be sure to look at the catalog because I just do not have the room to mention all of the great items we are offering in this auction.

The auction starts out with a group of water pitchers and jugs including the rarely seen 464 Ribbon Candy jug (Lot 3) and is followed by 8 Heisey baskets. There are groupings of smoking items (56 – 72) including cigarette boxes in 1183 Revere – 679 Windsor cut (66), Sahara 1184 Yeoman (67), and 1447 Rococo (69). Animals include a 1 Airedale (151), 1 Bull (152), 104 Gazelle (154), and Amber 1540 Plug Horse (156) and 1522 Standing Colt (157). We also have 14 Kingfisher floral frogs in Moongleam (140) and Flamingo (141) and 15 Duck floral frogs in Hawthorne (142) and Flamingo (143). Candlesticks are also well represented including pairs of 1405 Ipswich (43), V-1485 frosted Verlys Saturn (46), a single 141 Edna (45), and 31 Jack-Be-Nimble toy candlesticks in Flamingo (116) and Moongleam (117).

We have pieces in almost all Heisey production colors. Among the special items are a Cobalt 4224 Ivy vase (202), a Moongleam 150 Banded Flute 13" tray (330), and a Hawthorne 3362 Charter Oak tall compote (129). There are 11 lots of Alexandrite (81-91). This auction is especially rich in Zircon and Limelight with 18 lots (299 – 316) including a 1485 Saturn two part relish (303).



There are a good number pieces of stemware including figural cocktails (lots 233 – 235) and a rarely seen 6006 Hourglass cocktail (48). Lots 165-190 offer a number of hard to find cordials including 5086 Plantation Ivy with 516 Plantation Ivy etch (168), 5067 Plantation with 1038 Pine cutting (181), 3389 Duquesne with 813 Pyramids (187), and 3365 Ramshorn (188).

Exciting vases included are a Moongleam 4202 Bamboo (22), 4222 Horseshoe with 5009 Diana carving (209), and a pair of 341 Puritan 12" cut urns made from candy jars (324). Among the nice pieces in early patterns are a 1200 Cut Block celery vase (36). There is a good selection of colognes including a Moongleam 4035 Seven Octagon with 77 Duck stopper (110) and 4043 Johnson (113).

We have a good selection of lighting items in this auction including four electro-portable lamps (325-327, 329) and a 52 Princess lamp on a 5" Classic base (328). A related item is a 1503 Crystolite hurricane with a 300 shade cut 913 Everglades (232).

Other special pieces of note are a 50 Cabochon advertising sign (121), 49 Warehime three tier epergne (320), and a cream and sugar in 1483 Stanhope with 491 Frosty Dawn etch and blue knobs (75).

Space prevents me from listing more but the full auction catalog is available to you in this issue of the Heisey News. Please consider coming to this outstanding auction, or, if you cannot make it, send in an absentee bid on any of the great lots available. **I will be there and I hope to see you, too.**

- 1) All lots are sold in numerical cataloged order.
- 2) The minimum starting bid per lot is \$15.
- 3) Payment: Cash, traveler's check, certified check or personal check or money order with proper ID. Visa, MasterCard and Discover cards are accepted. A 5% buyer's premium charged for credit card payment. Cash only payment may be specified for individual bidders at HCA's request.
- 4) HCA has endeavored to describe all items to the best of their ability; however this is not a warranty. All items are sold as is and where is. The auctioneer has the right to make any verbal corrections at the time of sale and to provide additional information. Inspection is welcomed during preview and before the item is sold.
- 5) In the case of a disputed bid the auctioneers have the authority to settle disputes to the best of their ability and their decision(s) is/are final. Resale of items will be handled at the auctioneer's discretion.
- 6) The auctioneer has the right to set opening bids and reject any bid raise not in line with established bid increments. Items are sold without reserve, unless advertised otherwise.
- 7) All sales are final and all items must be paid for each day of sale. A moving and storage fee may be assessed for items not picked up within seven (7) calendar days after the last day of sale of the auction.

SUBMITTING YOUR BID:

All bids and payment must be submitted on the Absentee Bidding Form found on page 19. Absentee bids must be **received** at the Museum no later than *Friday, October 12, 2018 at 4:00 p.m.* Eastern Standard Time – no exceptions. Your method of payment must be in the possession of HCA prior to executing a bid.

PAYMENT:

Payment can be made by Visa, MasterCard, Discover Card, personal check, cashier's check, traveler's check, Money Order, or cash. Mail you bid form and payment to:

If using a credit card - a 5% Buyers Premium will be added for all credit card payments. You can Fax your form to the Museum at (740) 345-9638. Please contact the Museum to ensure the Fax has arrived and has been retrieved.

If paying by check make all checks payable to: *HCA Auction*. You may send a separate check for each lot or one check covering the maximum amount of all bids. Any surplus bid money will be refunded. Send a SASE to return your checks. Consider sending one blank check and designate in the check memo blank an amount "not to exceed" the total amount of your bids. The Auction Manager or HCA Treasurer will fill in the exact amount of your purchase.

SETTING BID AMOUNTS & LIMITS:

The minimum absentee bid per lot is \$15. The auctioneer usually raises in increments of \$5, \$10, \$25. You set the maximum amount you are willing to pay on each lot. Lots containing multiple items will be as one lot to the successful bidder. HCA reserves the right to reject any bid.

On your bid form indicate the desired condition of each item on which you are bidding. We endeavor to describe all items to the best of our ability and a bid on an item reflects your acceptance of the condition as listed. HCA will bid competitively on your behalf. If you mark your bid "*near mint only*" we will use no discretion in your bid and if we find a variance on a lot that is not called in the catalog we will not bid on that lot for you.

SHIPPING ARRANGEMENTS:

If you are a successful bidder, you will need to arrange for your items to be shipped to you.

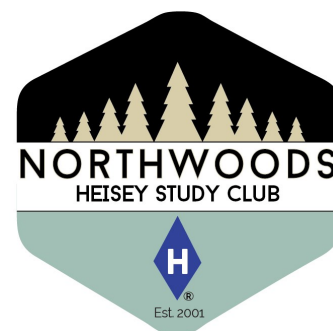
