2020 Spring Benefit Auction



We have all had a very challenging year so far. Sadly, we will need to postpone the 2020 Spring Benefit Auction until October due to the Coronavirus and all the uncertainty that surrounds it, and call it the **2020 Heisey Fall Benefit Auction**. This auction will take the place of the Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction and will be held in conjunction with the 2020 Percy and Vivian Moore Weekend. We will still have activities associated with the PVM weekend and have a two day auction instead of the one day Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction. This auction will be held on October 16 and 17, 2020 and will operate just like the Spring Benefit auction would have in April. Craig Connelly and his crew will be on hand for the auctioneering.

We will be enhancing the catalog with some very nice glass worthy of the DSFSA from other consignors. A new catalog will be posted in the next few months with the updates but if you have already marked up your current catalog with the lots you want to bid on those lots will remain the same. For the absentee bidders, we can either keep your bids as submitted (with payment) or we can remove your bid, destroy the payment and you can resubmit them as we get closer to the auction date. Please let us know.

What this means is there won't be a 2020 DSFSA and we will not be requesting consigners to send in their list for consideration.

Those who have consigned glass to the SBA will not have to do anything. We will sell whatever glass you consigned for the SBA in October and send you a check within 15 days.

For 2021 we will resume the usual schedule with the SBA in April and the DSFSA in October.

Thank you for bearing with us as we work through these trying times.

2020 HCA ABSENTEE VOTING INSTRUCTIONS for Electing HCA Board of Directors

Mary Ann Spahr, HCA Secretary

All HCA Voting Members in good standing are eligible to cast votes at the Annual Meeting in June. We will be electing three people to serve on the HCA Board of Directors. Candidate information will be published in the May 2020 issue of the Heisey News. As your HCA Secretary, one of my duties is to oversee this election.

You, as a Voting Member, may vote in person at the June Annual Meeting or by Absentee Ballot. The current HCA Voting Members list was published on pages 12 & 13 of the March 2020 issue of the Heisey News. Check your status on the list to be sure we have it correct. *You must be a Voting Member by June 1, 2020 to vote in the June elections*. If you have any questions, please contact the Membership Clerk at the Museum.

You may request an Absentee Ballot any time after the beginning of the calendar year, however the Absentee Ballots will not be prepared until after nominations are closed. Absentee Ballots will be available after May 1, 2020.

Due to the Covid-19 emergency, we are modifying the usual procedures for Absentee Ballots. Though the Museum is closed to the public until further notice, you may contact the museum and request an Absentee Ballot be mailed to you. You may also mail your request to:

Along with your written request, be sure to include a self-addressed envelope. If you affix a stamp too, it would help to defray expenses. As your request arrives at the Museum, it will be assigned a voting number. When the Absentee Ballots are available, a blank corresponding-numbered Absentee Ballot will be placed in a new envelope, with your name and voting number written on the outside. This new envelope will be put into the self-addressed envelope you provided and mailed back to you.

When you receive your Absentee Ballot, remove it from the envelope, cast your vote, place the Absentee Ballot back into the envelope, and seal it. Put this envelope into a new envelope, addressing it back to the address above. *Note:* <u>To be included in the election, your Absentee Ballot must be received by the Membership Clerk by 4:00 pm (EST) on Friday, June 5, 2020.</u>

After the polls are closed, the absentee votes are combined with votes cast by the voting members present at the Annual Meeting and the ballot tallying begins.

Please note that according to HCA By-Laws, Article VII, Section f, as approved in June 2011:

"If the number of nominees equals the number of Director vacancies, the ballot voting shall be deemed unnecessary when approved by the majority of voting members present."

PROFILES of FORMER HEISEY EMPLOYEES

James A. Hartman By Evelyn M. Allen

James A. Hartman, born in 1898, now lives at the rear of 417 E. Indiana St. in a small trailer. He has many pleasant memories of his work at the Heisey plant. His beginning at the plant is a little different than most of the employees I have talked to. He played in a lumber yard next to the Heisey plant, where the Burke Golf Co. is now located. His father who was a presser at Heisey, was losing work because he had no carry out boy so Jimmie Hartman would climb over the fence to help him.

One night A. H. Heisey went over to the lumber yard and asked the boys to work at night. This was the beginning of James Hartman's employment. He was 12 years old. After this A. H. Heisey paid a \$1000.00 fine for having school boys working at night.

In 1914, at the age of 14, he quit school and went to work full time as a gatherer. When the Heisey Company started making animals this was one of his jobs. He said they had a rate to meet and when they made this many perfect items they could go home. They were never allowed to linger around the plant.

He remarked how immaculate A. H. Heisey had the plant kept. He, too, like Paul Fairall, remembered wearing knee pants and long stockings. He quit work in 1958 at the Heisey plant and has never worked since due to bad health. He doesn't own any Heisey but said at the price animals are selling for he wished he had just a portion of what he had made. The following poem was written by him and well expresses his feelings about his job at the age of 19.

"THE GATHERING BOY'S TROUBLE" By Jimmie Hartman September, 1917

The head presser is the money man, he gets the biggest pay. The finisher comes in second best, but don't have much to say. The gatherer does the hardest work by rushing to and fro. The presser says, "Bring them on, don't be so dog-gone slow." He rushes on and on and works like hell all day And when he goes to count his pay, You've guessed it, he gets the smallest pay.







Some people think the glass trade is grand With easy money put into your hand But believe me I have another say I work like mad for the smallest pay.

Now when you think you have made a real good turn And anxious to see what you have earned You go back of the lehrs to see how your ware came through, But find a hundred bad pieces marked against you.

But the gathering boy he has no say, He just works on for the smallest pay When the gatherer stops to turn the ring The presser calls him everything.

The mold gets cold, the presser gets mad It means a dozen more that's bad. But he gathers on in the same old way For the same things happen every day.

They will argue to the point and the presser will say, "It's the gatherers' fault again to-day." But he has nothing to say And just keeps working for the smallest pay.

And when the ware is sorted, and you lose so many bad You know the presser and the finisher will be fighting mad. You look them over, to find what the defects may be, It may be a crooked bottom of fine glass maybe.

Or it may be they are cordy, or blisters that you see But no difference what the trouble is, it's the gatherers fault you see.

But then he keeps on going, with nothing much to say, For when the week is over, he gets the smallest pay.

Now when you go on gathering, take a warning lad Just take a job for anyone, except your dear old Dad. For the whole darn week he grumbles and has it all to say, And when the week is over he wants the whole darn pay.

Financials

Love was in the air during February at the Museum. Sales for the month equaled \$1861 against a budget of \$2000. Even though sales missed budget, they were significantly better than the same time last year (2019 = \$830). Our top seller was Real Heisey accounting for \$610 of the total. Also selling well, Beads, Leaves and Hearts, oh my! Hearts, you may ask? February saw the introduction of the new Heisey Hearts made from damaged beyond repair Heisey glass. Each Heart is embedded with a copper diamond to make it a true Heisey collectible. Donations to the Endowment totaled \$1345 and the Operating Fund added another \$1450.01. We also received \$1000 for Michael's Dreams....

Old Williamsburg By Michael Maher

It's no secret that Heisey's #341 Old Williamsburg has been one of the longest lasting glass patterns on the American Market. Heisey developed the pattern by combining several early colonial pattern lines. The very recognizable tall goblet started out in 1911 as part of the #373 pattern line. A design patent by Andrew Sanford was filed in



1912, and so the success began. The #373 stemware line was produced until 1937, when it was combined into the NEW #341 Old Williamsburg line. Other early successful colonial lines contributed items, including #300 Peerless (individual cream and sugar), #367 Prism Band (decanter), #353 Medium Flat Panel (comport, 10" round tray), #352 Flat Panel, and #1150 Colonial Star (plates). It was quite a mash up of patterns, but they all worked very well together.

The #341 pattern line was produced continuously until the Heisey factory closed in 1957. The Old Williamsburg name for this pattern was first used in the 1939 Heisey price list. When Imperial Glass purchased all remaining assets, orders, moulds, etc. from Heisey's bankruptcy, they quickly produced the Old Williamsburg pattern and it kept them in business through their hard years. It was a timeless pattern

that fit so many styles. Imperial produced and promoted the #341 (#373) stems in many colors!

When Imperial closed in 1984, the moulds became available. HCA wanted to obtain them to protect the market from fakes or poor quality glass. We paid \$220,000 for the Heisey moulds in 1984...all of the moulds, except for one pattern line.... #341 Old Williamsburg. There was a competitive bid that I have heard was equal to what we paid for all other 4,000+ Heisey moulds. Note this hand written note suggests they were willing to pay \$75,000. Early HCA board members decided with the amount of items that had already been made by Imperial (in clear and colors), there was little reason to invest the additional money to

purchase the 300 or so moulds in the #341 line. They were sold to Lancaster Colony, and have remained off the market ever since. I have often wondered why a company would purchase the moulds for such a successful pattern and do nothing with them. Why invest that kind of money and do nothing?

Some recent discoveries have been made that answered some old questions and posed new ones. There is quite a stir in the Glass archives world right now from "The Glass Paper Fanatics" a group of dedicated glass enthusiasts who are actively purchasing and scanning glass advertisements, catalogs, salesman info and anything that can be a resource for future collectors. I have been in close contact with leading members of

this group to learn all I can for our own Archive digitization project. They discovered the old Lancaster Colony bid sheets with hand written notes explaining why they had interest in obtaining the Old Williamsburg moulds. It is very interesting that they wanted to acquire the pattern to "bury it". It was such a strong pattern line, it posed a threat to the company's sales (even in the mid-1980s!) So we finally have an answer as to why the pattern hasn't been reproduced since...the moulds were intentionally purchased to prevent competition.





Also discovered amongst glass paperworks was a November of 1985 Fostoria Glass - New York show list of items which records Old Williamsburg for Fostoria being made by Indiana Glass, and one advertisement shows Old Williamsburg stems in a very late (just prior to their closing) Fostoria brochure.

The Old Williamsburg line had been purchased, trialed by Fostoria (owned by Lancaster Colony) and then "buried" whether that means literally or physically, we may never know until the moulds or reproductions surface.

On a very recent trip to Mosser Glass, I asked Tim Mosser, the owner, if he had heard about Lancaster Colony purchasing the Old Williamsburg moulds to take them off the market. He had not, then said, "I think we have a few Old Williamsburg moulds"... I was dumbfounded! I said "You think you do? Are they here?" Tim took me to one of his off-site mould storage areas and showed me the moulds. He did indeed have the #341 Old Williamsburg goblet and iced tea moulds (2 of each).

It was a very exciting discovery to see they had survived the Lancaster Colony "burial and death". Mosser bought the moulds from Fenton when they closed and were liquidating about 5years ago. I asked if Mosser had plans for the moulds or if they were for sale. Tim indicated they had no interest in selling them as they plan to start producing them very soon. Yes...Old Williamsburg will soon be available again for New purchase. At first I thought this was a shame to add more colors and reproductions to the pattern line, but after thinking about it, how great is it that a wonderful long lasting pattern will soon be available to add to existing tableware items in fresh, new modern colors!

I have emailed the owners of Mosser giving some history of the pattern's success and its abundance in crystal (made by Heisey and Imperial) and also listing the colors made by Imperial. I am not sure what colors Mosser plans to produce, but as soon as I do know I will be sure to let the membership know.
