

PROFILES of FORMER HEISEY EMPLOYEES

“Lillian Miller”

With all the agitation about woman's lib, we decided it was time to interview one of Heisey's many women employees. Our journey led us to the home of Lillian Miller.

Mrs. Miller was born in Newark, Ohio in 1909. She went to school in Newark, but at age fifteen she went to work for Heisey. This was the year 1924.

Lillian Miller was hired by Lou Adkins to work in the cutting shop. Here she wiped and wrapped glass. She quit work after two years, but went back in 1927. Now she worked in the tumbler room, under Mrs. Maude Lawn. Lillian wiped and wrapped tumblers. The usual number done was from 700 to 1000 per day depending on the type of tumbler. If it had ridges, a brush run by a machine was used on it. She remained in this department for two years.

Lillian then moved into the stock room as an order clerk, where she assembled glass to fill orders, then the glass was put on a bench for the packer. After being packed in a barrel or keg it went to the shipping room. Mrs. Miller left the Heisey Company in July of 1948. She had worked a total of twenty four years for the company. That's filling a lot of orders.

The employees were busy all the time. Her boss in the stock room was Bud Hinger. There were three order girls and three packers. There was parcel post in the stock room operated by Jeanette Swartz and Thelma Forbes.

Mrs. Miller said the working conditions at Heisey were good. In fact, she thinks it was the best place she ever worked, and she was employed by other companies later.

Her first pay check for a week was \$9.25. She moved on to the stock room where one could get a bonus, too. Her salary was average for a woman at that time, but, alas, not equal to men's pay.

When Lillian first began work, she was considered Heisey's baby. She had to go home earlier than other workers, as she was not yet sixteen years old. When she reached her sixteenth birthday, she could work a full day.

Lou Adkins had charge of the cutting room, tumbler room, and blow shop. Mrs. Miller said she was a wonderful woman to work for.

She remarked that they were glad to see Paul Fairall every morning as he brought the orders to Bud Hinger. The orders were then parceled out to the girls.

Lillian left Heisey in 1948 to marry Clarence Miller, a deputy sheriff. Later she went to work for Grants where she remained for nineteen years. The Millers are now retired and spend their winters in Texas.

Lillian lavished the usual praise on Heisey glassware. She said it was considered the best in the world. That is one opinion we don't dispute.

It was interesting to learn that when a Heisey employee got married they were given a barrel of glassware. There couldn't be a nicer gift, now could there?

Mrs. Miller has one daughter, one grandson and one great granddaughter. This lady is very youthful looking and attractive to have a great grandchild. It was a delightful afternoon spent in the Millers attractive home listening to Lillian reminisce about her enjoyable years as a Heisey employee.

We will have 1228 lots of beautiful Heisey glass and Heisey made by other glass manufacturers in the Heisey molds. The 2020 Spring Benefit catalog was mailed the end of February to HCA members who consigned glass and to successful bidders from the last two years. We will have catalogs available at the clerk's table for those who did not receive one.

The Spring Benefit Auction is HCA's largest fund raiser of the year with 100% of all proceeds going to support the Museum. If you cannot attend in person and would like to bid, an absentee bid form and instructions are available in this issue of Heisey News.

All absentee bids must be submitted by **Saturday, April 4, 2020 by 4:00 PM**. There will be **NO EXCEPTIONS!**

If you are a successful absentee bidder you will need to make arrangements to have your glass shipped. Some local shippers are listed on the absentee bidding instructions. HCA does not endorse any particular shipper and is not responsible for any of the services provided by these shippers. HCA will work with the shippers to make sure your glass is available. The glass will be available for pick-up at the museum the Tuesday following the auction, April 21 after 10:00 AM.

Our auctions cannot be carried out without the help of lots of volunteers. Volunteers are needed to help hold up the glass as it is being auctioned (Vanna), and to move the glass to the holdback area and clean up after the Auction. This is a great way to meet fellow collectors and learn about Heisey glass. If you are interested in volunteering please contact me at 240-361-8146.

2019 Year End Financials

The December Financials are in so let's see how we finished the year. Follow along as we discuss the information on the 2019 Budget VS Actual statement.

As a reminder, four revenue line items are not included in the Total Income: Donations – Dreams/Other, Donations – Video Projects, Donations – Museum Capital Fund and Acquisitions Donations. This revenue was not budgeted so it has been excluded from the total. On the Expense side, there are three line items not included in the Total Expenditures: Museum Expense – Dreams, Advertising – Video Projects and Acquisitions. As with revenue, these expenses were not budgeted.

First we'll look at our Revenue: December Gift Shop Sales totaled \$4,200.72 against a budget of \$6,000 for the month. While we did not meet our sales goal for the month, we ended the year ahead of budget by \$559. We exceeded our Cash Donation goal for the second year in a row, bringing in \$17,485.

In fact, we exceeded budgeted revenue in a number of areas: Newsletter Ads (\$12), Shipping (\$629), Admissions (\$101), Benefit Auction (\$1,392), and the Dave Spahr Select Auction (\$822), and Convention (\$2,246). The Percy & Vivian Moore weekend event, hosted by the Kentucky Heisey Collectors Group, exceeded budget by \$920. We also had \$1,355 in Miscellaneous revenue and the Endowment Transfer was \$2,411 more than budgeted.

When you do the math, Revenue exceeded budget by \$9,709.

Now let's look at a few line items on the Expense side: Salaries and Wages were over budget by less than 7% (\$6143).

Museum Expenses exceeded budget by \$2501. The Advertising overage of \$2121 was a result of Video project payments. Michael raised over \$11,000 for the project but needed a little help with the final payments. Can't wait to see the end result!

We had computer issues throughout 2019, resulting in additional support and equipment expenses. The Computer & Website line item was over budget \$3559. In December, the Board voted to replace the Museum server. The Lease Equipment line item was over budget by \$2142.

Overall, Expenses were over budget by \$13,740.

As a result, we missed budget by \$4031 or 1.8%. Anna, Jack and I would prefer to say we made 98.2% of budget.

I would like to include, in the budget discussion, what a stellar year we had as a result of Michael's Dreams. A total of \$62,717 was donated in 2019 for the following Dreams, Big and Small:



You set the maximum amount you are willing to pay on each lot. If successful, the remainder will be refunded. Please use good judgment in arriving at your maximum bid figure. Remember, there are minimum limits to raises that the auctioneer will accept (smaller items \$2.50, larger items \$5, \$10 or as much as \$25). Lots containing multiple items will be as one lot to the successful bidder. Normally, these are not split-up, however, there may be some exceptions to this.

Please indicate on your bid the desired condition of the item on which you are bidding. We have endeavored to describe all items to the best of our ability and a bid on an item reflects your acceptance of the condition as listed. (As you know, if no flaws are noted, that means the glass is in generally good condition.) If you mark your bid "near mint only," we will use no discretion in your bid. If there is a variance on a lot not called in the catalog (such as unlisted damage or a difference in the number of items in a lot), we will not bid on that lot for you. Please use the form (or a copy) available in this Heisey News, or from the catalog, or from our website www.HeiseyMuseum.org to submit your bid. Absentee bids can be submitted by e-mail, fax, or postal service.

PAYMENT Cash, check, cashier's check, or money order payable to HCA Auction, and Visa/MasterCard/DiscoverCard accepted. A 5% buyer's premium will be added. Buyer's premium is waived for cash, cashier's check, money order, or approved check payments. When using a credit card number, bids must be faxed to 740-345-9638 using the absentee bidding form. When your Fax is complete, please contact the Museum to ensure it has arrived and is removed from the Museum Fax machine as soon as it arrives. HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2020 SPRING AUCTION

We have finished cataloging the items for the 2020 Spring HCA Auction. After four full days we have 1,228 lots for you to consider. These offerings represent the full range of production of the Heisey Glass Company from their beginnings until the doors closed in 1957. There is something for everyone in this auction from the standard production to true rarities that you never are given a chance to buy.

This is the auction to come to if you would like to start a collection, find the ideal wedding gift, or if you are a long time collector needing to add a special piece to your collection. The auction abounds in those old standbys of 1503 and 5003 Crystolite, 1540 and 5004 Lariat, 1567 and 5067 Plantation, 507 Orchid etch, 515 Heisey Rose etch, and many examples from Heisey's colonial lines. This year we also have a good number of lots in 1469 Ridgeleigh and 1506 Provincial. This is an auction rich in candlesticks and creams and sugars, but there is also a large number of "little things" including an unusual number of ashtrays, nuts, and salt and peppers available.



The animal collector will not be disappointed with the wide array of offerings including a 4 Swan/5 Cygnet (Lot 65) and a 1540 Plug Horse in Cobalt (380).

Among the old patterns, we have several nice pieces in 160 Locket on Chain including table cream/sugar/lid (1118). molasses (1122), and a beautiful molasses with ruby stain/gold (1119). We have a complete 1235 Beaded Panel & Sunburst wine set – tray, decanter, and 6 wines (1201). Candy jars include a 465 Recessed Panel ½ pound in Moongleam (1121) and a 341 Puritan 5 pound (1120). There are many full punch bowl sets including 1235 Beaded Panel & Sunburst (18). 433 Greek Key cupped (45), 343 Sunburst (61), 341 Puritan (74), 1506 Provincial (76), 1205 Fancy Loop (336), 1540 Lariat (677), and 350 Pinwheel & Fan (703). I think one of

the most outstanding colonial pieces that Heisey made is the 351 Priscilla 10" extra high comport which we are offering as Lot 1011.

We have an exceptional number of lots in 150 Banded Flute this year including: 10" high footed bowl (668), molasses (758), and the rarely seen three piece oyster cocktail set (766). The oyster cocktail set includes underplate, large bar (oyster cocktail), and a fingerbowl that has a seat to hold the oyster cocktail.



Outstanding pieces in color include a pair of 1405 Ipswich candlevases in Flamingo with crystal inserts (1056) and a 1951A Elephant handled mug in Amber (968). Lot 1213 is a pair of 1251 Unique plates in Moongleam; they are called unique because they are so unusual in that they have a built in well to hold cocktail sauce or the like. One consignor sent us four 1506 Provincial footed candy jars in Limelight (Lots 835-838) and they will be sold choice. Among the many cordials available there is a 3416 Barbara Fritchie with Sahara bowl (394).



Barware collectors will not be disappointed with the array of 3397 Gascony decanters with different decorations: 460 Club Drinking (338), 455 Sportsman (828), and 454 Antarctic (1059). Lot 1057 is a 4027 Christos decanter with 469 Mermaid etch. We also have an 8 ounce soda in 2401 with 2 Tall Sailboat etch (538).

Other interesting pieces include a mounted doorknob with the crisscross design (14), 7025 Twelve Rib compote (117), 1447 Rococo muffin (354), 3408 Jamestown bell with 913 Everglade cut (840), and a 3416 Barbara Fritchie comport (1014).

There are two 517/197 Daniels tumble up sets available in this auction (155 and 1013). Probably the cutest item is a little whimsy made in the 464 Ribbon Candy pattern (1077). A nappy has been cupped to make a 2 ½” rose bowl and then further enhanced by frosting the ribbon candy band.



There are many large lots with a variety of items in them. These are perfect for the beginning collector. But if there is something in the lot you really want, the rest of the items will make good gifts or you can consider donating them back to the Museum for our fund-raising efforts.




