

These little darlings are one of my favorite Fall comfort foods. They work equally well in both sweet and savory situations. Here they are pictured on Greek Key as a simple snack with butter and cinnamon sugar. My grandmother had a shaker just like this one that she used to make our cinnamon toast when we visited. I think of her every time I use it!

Sweet Potato Biscuits

Emie Heisey – Savannah, Georgia

Makes 8 – 12 biscuits depending on the size

$\frac{3}{4}$ cup Sweet Potato, cooked and cooled

$\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon White Vinegar

1 $\frac{1}{4}$ cups Cup4Cup Gluten Free Flour (or All Purpose)

2 heaping Tablespoons Granulated Sugar

4 teaspoons Baking Powder

$\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon Salt

$\frac{1}{4}$ cup Unsalted Butter, softened (+ $\frac{1}{4}$ cup, melted butter to brush the biscuit tops if desired)

2 – 4 Tablespoons Whole Milk (depending on the moisture of the potatoes)

Preheat oven to 450 degrees F.

In a large bowl, mash the sweet potato with the white vinegar. Add butter and combine with a pastry cutter until the butter is the size of small peas. Put the mixture into the freezer to chill.

Sift together flour, sugar, baking powder, and salt.

Add the sifted ingredients to the potatoes and cut in, until just blended.

Add the milk, one Tablespoon at a time to make a very soft dough.

Turn the dough out onto a floured board and toss lightly until the outside of the dough looks smooth. Roll the dough out to $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch thick and cut with a biscuit cutter. The biscuits will rise better if you do not twist the cutter.

Place biscuits on a parchment paper covered baking sheet and bake for about 15 minutes.

Watch your oven. If the biscuits are browning too quickly, lower the temperature 25 degrees. If desired, brush the biscuits with melted butter and cool on a wire rack.

July Financials Revisited

Last month I reported on our revenue for July. Total revenue for the month equaled \$7,223 against a budget of \$8,070. Our year-to-date total income showed a negative variance to budget of \$7,309. Pretty amazing given we have cancelled two major fundraisers (Spring Auction and Convention).

Twice a year we have three payrolls paid in a month. July was one of those months. As a result, we were over budgeted expenses for the month by \$1,035. We are still under budget year-to-date by \$6,349. The Museum staff continue to monitor expenses closely.

Leave A Legacy

You may have noticed in the "A Special Thank You...Continued" article a donation to the Operating Fund from the Estate of William Lake. We were notified Mr. Lake had included our organization in his will and received his donation in August. What a wonderful gesture on Mr. Lake's part!

As a result, I wanted to remind everyone of the Museum's Leave a Legacy program. There is a brochure available at the Museum describing how you can support the Endowment Fund by donating through a Planned Giving Gift. Cash Position...now and going forward

I'm happy to report our cash position continues to be stable. August financials are on the horizon and it was a good month for revenue which should strengthen our position. The cancellation of PVM and the Fall Auction will be another "hit" to the budget, so your support, through donations and purchases, will be crucial to maintaining a strong financial position.







Witch Balls have been very popular since the 18th century. First in England, then in New England, but their actual origin is considered to be much older. For well over 3 centuries hollow glass spheres have been hung in windows to ward off witch's spells, evil spirits and ill fortune. Hanging these decorative glass balls in the window or on the porch is thought to tantalize mischievous spirits which may be threatening a home's tranquillity. The wayward spirit is mesmerized by the ball's reflective beauty. When the spirit touches the sphere it is absorbed and trapped in the web-like strands of the glass inside the ball.




