
H.C.A. 2021 CONVENTION NEWS


MEET ME AT THE CONVENTION DISPLAY ----

They served as an excellent reminder of some of the most missed, but best parts of HCA. Details are still being worked out, however, the very good news is that there will be an opportunity to buy Heisey in a spring auction this year!

On another positive note please enjoy our cover. These are some of the items that, thanks to your generosity and kindness, we were able to add to our Museum collection in 2020. I find this especially positive this year. TREASURER'S REPORT

November Financials

November was a great month. Revenue for the month equaled \$10,051 against a budget of \$5,864. Sales and cash donations both exceeded budget for the month. As a result, the year-to-date total income shows a negative variance of only \$92.

The Museum staff continue to do a good job of monitoring expenses. We had to repair the guttering on the warehouse in November due to the fire next door. This was an unexpected expense, but very necessary before the onset of winter. As a result, overall expenditures were over budget by \$1,637. Year-to-date, we are still under budgeted expenses by \$13,223.

PPP Loan Update

I am happy to report the SBA approved our PPP Loan Forgiveness application in late December. The full loan amount has been forgiven. The funding covered almost 3 months of wages for our employees and allowed the Guest Member Services Associates to return to work while the Museum remained closed due to the pandemic.

Cash Position

Our cash position remains good. This is a testament to the wonderful support you provided throughout 2020. To each and every person who donated money or purchased items from the gift shop, please accept my heartfelt thanks!

Developing a budget during a global pandemic...I can check that off my Treasurer's bucket list! Normally, revenue and expense trends from the current year are used in developing the new budget. But, 2020 was anything but normal so there were a few more challenges than usual.

The 2021 Budget has been approved by the Board of Directors. The budget document includes actual revenues and expenses for 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019 and the budgeted numbers for 2020 and 2021. Final 2020 numbers are not available yet. There will be a year-end wrap-up in next month's newsletter.

The 2021 budgeted Sales goal remains the same this year. As was the case last year, real Heisey was our best seller accounting for 25% of total sales revenue. Pumpkins and ornaments provided strong revenue streams, accounting for 17% and 16% of total sales, respectively. Beads, leaves, and the newly introduced hearts sold well through the year.

Cash donations increased to \$18,000. We have met the cash donations goal each of the last three years. Your generosity in 2020 was overwhelming and greatly appreciated. With the continuing uncertainties we face in 2021, your support means more than ever.

The budget relies on our ability to hold regular fundraising events throughout the year: Spring Benefit Auction, Convention, Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction and Percy & Vivian Moore Weekend. We will make decisions on the viability of these events as they draw near, keeping the health and safety of the membership foremost in our minds.

Expenses are consistent with the 2020 numbers. The 3% increase in salaries and wages reflects anticipated annual wage increases for the Museum staff.

Last year, I ended the 2020 budget article with the following: "Your continued support of the Museum is key to our success. We hope to see everyone at our 2020 events." The first sentence rang truer than ever in 2020...YOU were the key to our making it through the year so successfully. Let's hope the second sentence, modified to reflect 2021, can (safely) come true sometime this year! Stay safe, my Heisey friends!

2021 Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction

As your Auction Committee is getting ready for the 2021 Spring Benefit Auction in April, we are making plans for the 2021 Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction.

This auction will take place in conjunction with the Percy and Vivian Moore weekend in October. A date has not yet been determined.

For this auction, each consignor (HCA member) may submit a list of glass they wish to place in the auction. This list of no more than 40 lots of clean, damage free, pristine Heisey glass must be submitted by 1 May. The Auction Committee will evaluate each list and choose the rarer, hard to find and more desirable Heisey items. Consignors will be notified in early June which items have been selected. There is no limit on the number of lots you wish to donate.

Please do not send or deliver any glass to the museum until you have been notified which items have been selected. Once you have been notified of which lots to ship or deliver, you will have until 30 July to have it at the museum. Please keep in mind there have been issues with shippers and the post office in delayed mail and packages so ship as soon as you are able. HCA is not responsible for lost, misdirected or late mail.

We will inspect, catalog and photograph the selected glass in early August and have the catalog printed, mailed and online by the end of August.

We hope to have 250-300 lots of wonderful Heisey glass for your bidding and buying pleasure. Remember this is a large fund raiser for the museum, please bid often and bid high! Support your museum!

A LOOK BACK AT HEISEY HISTORY

Art Before Design: The Cherub Candlestick

While working at the National Museum the other day, I had the pleasure of meeting a gentleman, viewing his glass, and assisting him with some research regarding his Heisey sow and piglets. Treasured pieces of his eclectic collection, they were originally owned by his mother or grandmother – one of the first things he retrieved from her house after her passing. All of the piglets were in sore shape, all with numerous chips, cracks, and the like; while I did my best to clean them, he related how he used to play with them as a child, throwing them "like dice."

Goodness, how surprising! It was a wonderfully unique story and I am honored to have been allowed to handle such beautiful pieces, each practically worthless monetarily, yet in every way priceless for this particular individual. It is strange to think, but some of my favorite pieces have been those doomed by their everyday use; that the value I sometimes emphasize is intrinsic rather than that of scarcity, condition, or material. I do love a good story after all. I told the gentlemen that instead of referring to the piglets as beat-up or abused, he should consider them "well- loved." I believe the sentiment was well received — there is no shame in really loving your Heisey.

Art Before Design: The Cherub Candlestick



Sometime after the HCA's acquisition of the Heisey molds from Imperial, pattern no. 111 was colloquially renamed to its current designation as Heisey's "Cherub" candlestick. Unfortunately, nearly all other

information on Heisey's no. 111, rephrased or otherwise directly restated in other reference works, can be detailed by Felt and O'Grady in their book, Candlesticks Candelabra and Lamps:

"The no. 111 was the third in the series of reproduction candlesticks to be made by Heisey in the mid-twenties. It was first made in October 1926 – well out of sequence, since by then the no. 112, 113, 114, 116 and 118 candlesticks had already been issued. The pattern numbers assigned to candlesticks during this period probably reflected the order in which they were designed; variations in the sequence of actual production are probably due to the various difficulties encountered in executing certain designs. For in stance, in the case of no. 111, it is known from a former employee of the company that this was one of the most difficult molds the mold making ship had ever

been called upon to produce. Reportedly, it took a total of nine months to complete.

It is uncertain whether the no. 111 is an exact reproduction of any particular early American candlestick. Similar designs were made in the 1880's and 1890's by Central Glass Company1 and the United States Glass Company2 among others. However, it is equally possible that the original model for this particular candlestick may have been French.3

At any rate, after having taken so long to produce initially, Heisey's no. 111 was then made for little more than three or four years at most and is the most difficult of the three reproduction candlesticks to find today. It was made in all three colors both a clear and with a satin finish, but is found more often with the satin finish. Like the other reproductions, it is never marked.

Felt and O'Grady appear to be justified in their assumptions. While information on the United States Glass Company's no. 17 could not be located, Central's no. 691 looks to have begun production in 1882, and the earliest instance of the corresponding Baccarat design seemingly appears in a catalogue from 1893 with another source claiming a similar sighting in a catalogue from 1895. In contrast, Heisey's Cherub design began production in October of 1926 which supersedes the others by a substantial amount of time. Unfortunately, original sketches of the Heisey design either no longer exist or never did in the first place, nor do there appear to be any published design or engineering patents. Examples of marketing were similarly unaccountable.
