



## Financials

Actual income for February was \$7,625 against a budget of \$5,918, resulting in a positive variance for the month of \$1,707. Our year-to-date total income shows a positive variance to budget of \$1,762. Overall expenses were under budget for the month by \$113 and under budget year-to-date by \$3,870.

March Gift Shop sales totaled \$2,786.10 against a budget of \$3,000. Our top seller was Real Heisey accounting for \$1,959.90 of the total. Endowment donations totaled \$2,480 and the Operating Fund added donations totaling \$2,351. We received a \$50 donation for the Acquisitions Fund. We also received donations totaling \$1,266.92 designated for the new auction computer and a Dreams donation toward a new front awning.

I would like to acknowledge the Heisey Collectors Club of Michigan's \$1,000 donation to the Endowment Fund. The donation was made in memory of Jean Parrett and Diana Rose. Thank you!

## Cash Position

Our cash position remains good. We have continued to use our "reserves" to cover expenses. The proceeds from the Spring Benefit Auction will be available in the next month or so. This infusion of cash will be welcomed.

Cancelling Convention will create a \$10,000 hole in the budget going forward. Study Club donations will also take a hit, as many clubs have not been able to meet and fund raise. Last year we received \$12,000 in club donations....








### ANDY BALDUS

If you have come to a Heisey auction or to the National convention, you may have seen me. In recent years I have volunteered as a “Vanna” at the auctions. Last year and this year, I helped with cataloging and photographing for the on-line auction. At the last couple of conventions, I helped with the sales at the booth of my wife, Lisa, and her brother, John Martinez. I also helped Mary Ann Spahr with the children’s craft table.

My first introduction to Heisey glass came while courting my wife in the mid-1980s. Her parents’ house was filled with many punch bowl and cup collections, pitchers, and decanters. ## NORTHERN VIRGINIA STUDY CLUB NEWS

### *My First Heisey Stories*

*"Just like I remember my first kiss, I still remember the joy in finding my first piece of Heisey glass," said Sue Pankey. Do you remember your first piece of Heisey glass?*

*Members of the Northern Virginia Study Club have looked into their cabinets to find and reminisce about their first piece of Heisey. We hope you will do the same and share your "story" in future editions of **Heisey News**.*

*Interestingly each of us knew someone, whether a friend or relative, who owned Heisey glass before we became collectors. Therefore, our obsession can rightfully be blamed on someone else! Here are our stories:*

**Ken Baksey-** "I was first introduced to Heisey glass in 1990 by Mary Lee Allen who owned a local general store in the Lake Jackson area of Manassas, VA called "Allen's Trading Post." Ms. Allen also owned an antique shop on Bristow Road called "Granma's Attic which I helped her operate on weekends.

My first piece of Heisey, No. 1150 (5 inch) "Colonial Star" 1908-1957 (became part of #341 Old Williamsburg after 1939), in crystal was acquired in the summer of 1991 (at 17 years old) at the Tillet's Auction Barn in Arcola, VA. It was purchased as a box lot of other glassware for the total cost of \$1.00! Ms. Allen taught me to look for the diamond "H" on the glassware and I was absolutely thrilled to find my first piece.

I still have the piece today (30 years later) as well as an assortment of approximately 300 additional Heisey pieces of all styles and colors."

**Sue Pankey-** "I received many invitations to attend a meeting of the local Heisey study group before I decided to attend. Why should I go when I didn't own a single piece of Heisey glass? The reason was simple, I needed to go to learn what Heisey glass looks like. Little did I know that there were so many patterns, but I also learned to look for the Diamond H on most pieces. At the first meeting I attended, someone showed a piece with the Greek Key design. It was easy to remember such a classic pattern. Not long after that meeting, I was in the local Goodwill Store and spotted a small piece with the Greek Key design and picked it up. Sure enough, there was the Diamond H! It was all of \$1.99 and with that purchase I was on my way to becoming a Heisey collector. That first piece is the Heisey #433 Footed Banana Split Dish (1912-1938). It still sits on my kitchen counter and holds mints."

**Suzanne Parker-** "Being a young teacher, antiquing was a favorite pastime. You didn't have to spend any money to enjoy seeing (and touching) beautiful things. My first purchase was a Colonial cream and sugar purchased at the antique shop next to the high school in Nokesville, VA where I taught. The glass was so clear, the pattern simple but elegant. I continued looking for Colonial pattern pieces as I thought that **was** Heisey. It didn't take long to discover the whole world of Heisey Glass! Credit goes to Virginia and Loren Yeakley, whom I had met at the Silver Spring All Heisey Show in Maryland, for my continued

education. As a new collector I bought indiscriminately. Loren suggested I focus on one item and suggested biscuit jars.

Little did I know that the Fandango pattern biscuit jar would become my life's quest. I just know there is one out there that needs to belong in my collection."

**Ann Patterson-** "I was in Salisbury, NC....went to an antique mall in the old downtown part of town. This is where I acquired my first piece of Heisey which was a Colonial serving bowl that had been lovingly used. I also acquired a hard-back blue book that day. Thus began my quest to identify and understand the art of Heisey. My Heisey Club has been instrumental in providing opportunities to learn about the vastness of offerings that the company produced over 60 some years of existence. After two years of Heisey hunting I am a bit more comfortable with finding pieces and developing my appreciation for the designs I am drawn to. I think Art Deco is my favorite."

**Russ Reopell-** "So my second-half at the time was left some stems of Heisey glass and had decided to start buying and selling Heisey. He had come back from an auction with what looked to be junk glass. The layer of filth and dust on this glass was appalling. Disgusted, I went to run errands while he washed what he had purchased. Imagine my surprise when I returned an hour later and sitting on the dining room table, highlighted by the sun streaming in the two floor to ceiling windows, was some of the most brilliant glass I had even seen! This was the first time I had ever seen Heisey's Crystolite pattern and although not the most delicate of Heisey patterns, it was the shiniest glass I had ever seen and thus began my Heisey collecting.

Two other Heisey collectors influenced my Heisey collecting as well, Jack and Maezene Walker. I had the privilege of helping Maezene develop a program on Heisey smoking items and before I knew it, I was obsessed with finding and collecting ash trays, cigarette holders and all things smoking. Jack, on the other hand, was a collector of candlesticks, and soon, I was starting my own candlestick/candleholder collection. ## 2021 47th Annual All-Heisey Spring Benefit Auction Wrap-up & Results

The 47<sup>th</sup> Annual Spring All Heisey Benefit Auction was a first-ever event for HCA! Our (expanded) three-day auction was held on-line on Friday-Sunday, April 9 – 11, 2021. Each day of the auction was well attended with 108 registrants on Friday, 122 on Saturday and 132 on Sunday. We also had 7 absentee bidders. We had 1,258 lots of glass from 40 consignors. Pre-bidding for the auction started on Friday, March 26, with live bidding starting at 12 Noon on April 9 for lots 1 through 420. Day two, April 10, saw more live bidding on lots 421 through 840. We closed out the auction on April 11, with lots 841 through 1228.

How did we do financially? We grossed \$70,990.55 (glass sales and buyer's premium) and after consignors and expenses are paid, we hope to make budget. We had a 2021 budgeted amount of \$16,500. Our average price per lot this year was \$56.43, about the same as 2019's average of \$56.68. We had 7 lots of donated glass which brought \$190, while in 2019, we had 18 lots generating \$1,525 – resulting in \$1,335 less than last auction.

On behalf of the HCA Board of Directors and Staff, I would like to thank all the volunteers who worked, starting in January 2020, unpacking, identifying, cataloging, and repacking the glass, and then returned in January 2021 to photograph the glass for the on-line auction. Thanks also to the volunteers who unpacked all the glass and repacked winning bidders' glass in April 2021. You make this event a success and HCA's largest fundraiser.

Special thanks to Walter Ludwig who graciously lent his time and Heisey expertise whenever asked; to Jack Burriss and the Museum staff, who helped coordinate events in Newark: and to Mary Ann Spahr and Karen Taylo, whose work made the on-line event possible.

Also, thanks to Kevin Burchett who helped us navigate some of the nuances of on-line auctions. And to GMP Local #244's own Jimmy Gill who assured the hall was ready for us to use in April.

Thank you to all the consignors who consigned and donated glass to HCA and who waited patiently for us to be able to hold this event. Lastly, thank you to all the auction "attendees" and absentee bidders who purchased that wonderful Heisey glass and made our first on-line auction such a success.

Hope to see all of you at the Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction in October.





