HHS Mt. Laurel All-Glass Show

The Heisey Heritage Society outdid themselves with their second annual All-Glass Show October 22 and 23 at the Mt. Laurel Hilton, Mt. Laurel, N.J. Thirty three dealers from seven states had set up beautiful displays of Heisey, Duncan-Miller, Cambridge and Fostoria with a smattering of New Martinsville, McKee, etc., as well as some pottery and china. Carl Sparacio, Show Chairman, glowed with well-deserved pride as he told us that they now have a waiting list for next year. Six hundred people attended this show.

Heisey glass dominated the scene as did Heisey buyers. Every production color made by Heisey was offered. Tom and Neila Bredehoft, columnists for Heisey News and new authors, were there and bought some items for the museum. A moongleam candlestick never before reported as being seen went back to the museum where we will all have an opportunity to see it. A number of #3324 Delaware stems, shown in Bradley, Ryan and Ryan's stem book, surfaced in the

shade of Hawthorne (sometimes referred to as Heliotrope) and with the "checker" optic. This stem had previously been known primarily in flamingo. (The museum had it in a parfait and oyster cocktail in hawthorne checker optic and has now added the goblet). These were soon snapped up by avid stem collectors.

Everywhere one looked there were goodies -- a flamingo tulip vase, a #4206 10" electric water lamp with moongleam base, Kingfisher flower blocks in hawthorne and flamingo, a beautifully cut mail box, Greek Key punch set in flamingo, ruby stained fish bowl, #417 hawthorne basket, many old patterns such as Pillows and Punty and Diamond Point, etc., in jellies and compotes, beautiful etchings, and a real honest-to-goodness storybook mug, Heisey not Imperial. Other items included a pair of Plantation hurricane lamps and a punch bowl set complete to the cup holders in the same pattern, cobalt cocktail shaker, alexandrite stems and cathedral vase, a War-

The museum recently purchased a number of original factory advertisements in quantities that permit us to offer some of them to the membership. There are 8" x 10" photographs of Jane Wyman advertising the movie "The Glass Menagerie" showing the large swan. These will sell for \$1.00 each.

A Cabochon ad, as shown in a November "Living For Young Home Makers" and a December "House Beautiful." It is 10-3/4" x 14-1/2" and is black and Red on white in color. There are full color ads for Rose stem, with Rose Etching, Plantation stem with Plantation Ivy etching; Lariat with Moonglo cutting; Crystolite; and Tyrolean stem with Orchid etching. Another Unknown Bites The Dust

We have been aware of this item since our first display in 1970 when one was loaned to us by Gus Heisey. We have also had one in the museum since it opened. As we suspected all along, the item is a #1231 water jug. The catalog listing a #1231 Water Jug and giving colors for it also lists it with a stopper. References to it by several former employees and other people have always been that it is a rum pot. In Colonial days a similar pot was made of pewter and was often referred to as a rum pot also. Our guess is that the item was called a water jug for the same reason that the #3397 Gascony item which looks like a martini mixer was called a tomato juice pitcher. We had prohibition in those days.

The jug has been seen in crystal, sahara and cobalt, called "Stiegel Blue"

in this addition to a #109 catalog. We have had all three colors in the museum on loan. The jugs are not marked and came with or without the panels on the sides.

Once again the hectic holiday season is upon us. I would like to take this opportunity to answer a few of the major questions on the Amendment to the By-Laws concerning paid help.

In July, 1976, I was appointed Chairman of a committee to study the feasibility of paid help for the museum and club. This committee, consisting of myself, five other board members and the club's attorney met on many different occasions to discuss this issue.

Finally in June, 1977, our findings and recommendations were presented to the Board. As our June meeting was a night-owl session, and many items were covered, this matter was continued to our all day marathon July meeting. At this meeting the Board unanimously approv-

ed the recommended by-law changes.

If passed by the Board we originally had planned to submit this to the voting membership in June when most of our voting membership is present. As this matter required a lot of careful consideration, time and effort from all involved, our due date quickly passed by. Since the September meeting has the second best attendance, the Board decided to present the recommended changes for a vote at this meeting.

As to the urgency of this matter we must ask ourselves this question: "If due to ill health or removal of key personnel and no volunteers are available, who would do the many day-to-day jobs required to operate the club and the museum?" We are a large organization with a membership now in excess of three

thousand. We cannot let the loss of a single person for whatever reason cripple the museum and club in any way. Therefore, we must be prepared when the time comes to hire the people that will be needed.

The amendment is meant to be general. No one at this time can foresee exactly what the museum and club's needs will be in the coming years. Therefore, to keep from amending the amendment everytime a new job is required, it should be kept general.

I sincerely hope I have answered the key questions on this issue. If any of you still have any questions, please don't hesitate to write.

From all of us here in Heiseyland, may you and yours have the happiest of holidays.

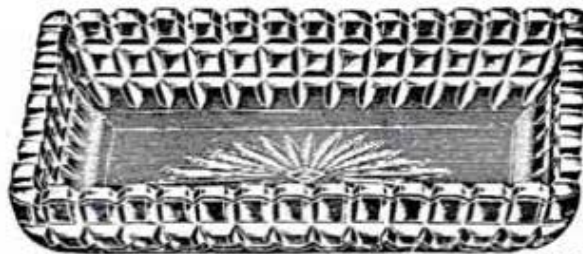




#52 PRINCESS LAMP

Once when trying some tests with the black light I put it on this goblet and found that it turned a yellow color the same as much Heisey does. A similar Heisey goblet only reflected the black light as does most lead ware of either company. However, I have just made another discovery and many of you can check this out for yourselves. The four souvenir clarets in the Oxford line which HCA purchased from Imperial for 1973-76 all turn yellow under the black light. So much for the black light!! It is definitely true that much Heisey does look yellowish under the light but then so does that of many other companies.

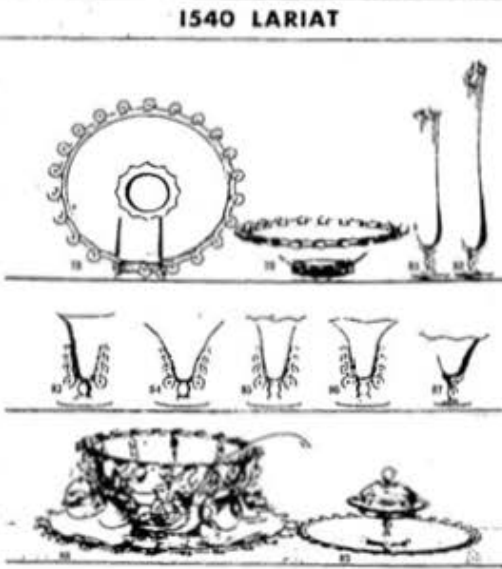

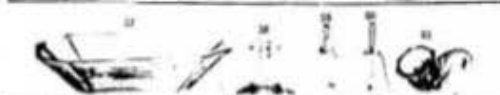

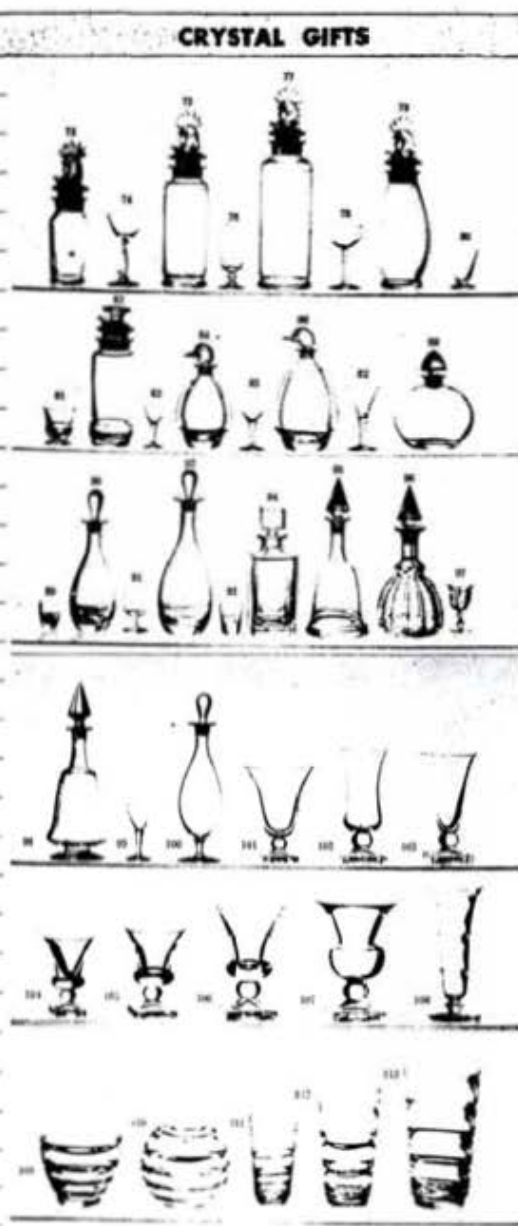

465 Recessed Panel Basket

by JOSEPH D. LOKAY

The design for the #465 Recessed Panel basket was patented by Andrew J. Sanford. The patent application was filed on March 1, 1915 and US design patent #47,736 was granted on August 17, 1915. Figure I shows the design drawing that accompanied the patent application.

There were three sizes of the basket: a 7, 8 or 9 inch. The dimension refers to the height of the basket, but as they got taller, the other dimensions also got larger to maintain the configuration of the basket. Pictures of the three sizes are shown in Vogel book II, page 100. (Also

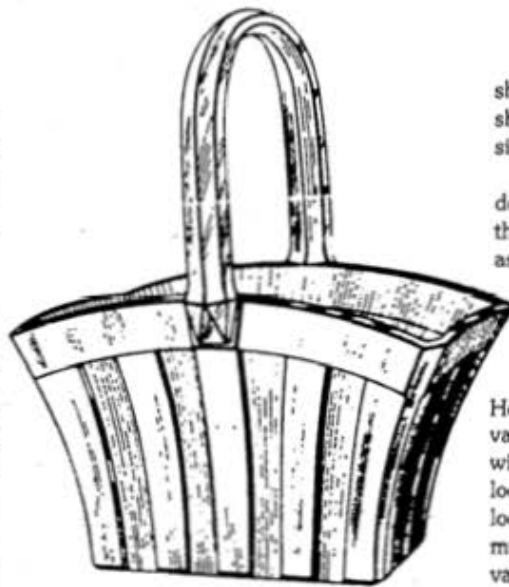

shown in Figure II. Note that the ad shows the price for the baskets in each size.

I have been using the word basket to describe this piece of glassware. Note that the design patent refers to the item as a vase. The Heisey catalogs and the

Heisey ad refer to the item as a basket vase. The Heisey ad displays the item with flowers in it like a vase, yet the item looks like a basket. I guess one could say; looks - basket and use - vase. Heisey must have used the two words "basket vase" to cover both concepts. In the later Heisey catalogs, i.e. catalog #109 circa 1928, only the single word basket is used on the catalog page showing the #465 basket.

The panels and collar, while small in width, did provide flat surfaces where cuttings, etchings or enamel decorating could be placed. The new etching book makes reference to the #349 Margaret* and the #9005 Rosette Band etchings on the #465 basket.* I have seen the basket with cuttings and with enamel decorating on them. I have even seen one with the word Mother on it, probably for a gift.

shown in Catalog #102, and #76 at the museum)

The design for this pattern is a series of vertical panels with every other panel recessed; thus the name "Recessed Panel". A plain band or collar around the top ties the panels together. The basket part is rectangular in shape with the rectangle getting larger as you go up towards the top of the basket. The basket handle is a typical Heisey handle found on many of their baskets. The bottom of the #465 basket is ground and contains a star. The basket is known in crystal only, and the production period is estimated at 1915 to 1930.

The #465 basket is signed with a large diamond H located in the center of the bottom on the inside. I have seen baskets with a "Pat. 8/17/15" around the diamond H. I have also seen baskets that do not contain the Pat. 8/17/15 as part of the mark. One might think that that portion of the mold was just worn away for those baskets without the patent date mark. To me, the glass surface around the diamond H looked clean and clear so that I think that the molds perhaps used in the latter production years for this basket did not contain the patent date mark.

The #465 basket was pictured in a Heisey ad that appeared in the March 1916 issue of the Ladies Home Journal. The same ad also appeared in the March 1916 issue of the Womans Home Companion and in the February 1916 issue of Good Housekeeping. A copy of the ad is

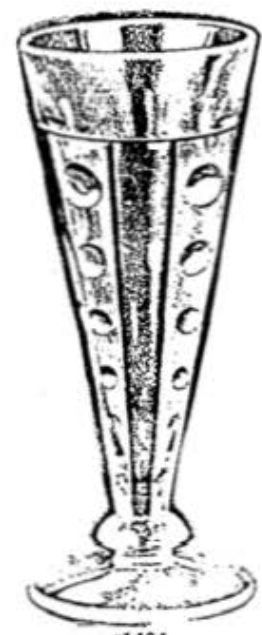

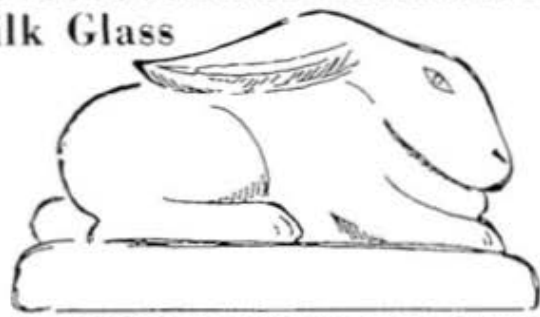

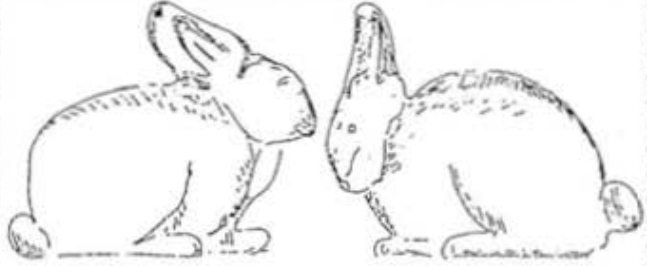
