On August 31, Imperial finally went into Chapter 7 Bankruptcy and a trustee was appointed. Bob Stahl had "bought" the factory in the fall of 1982 by paying \$100 for the stock and taking over the debts, which, of course, he never paid. He immediately returned to Minneapolis after the last hearing. Mike Nocera, who had been general manager of the company, is also gone.

Viking Glass Company and the city of Bellaire's "Save Imperial" committee were negotiating to pay off Lenox Glass and operate the factory together. However, Lenox had been willing to settle with Stahl for \$450,000 but now has gone back to the original \$2 million plus that was owed them in 1982. That is probably because Nocera had convinced them that HCA and others will pay a fortune for some of the moulds. For instance, they think the Heisey animal moulds are worth \$500,000.

Now it is possible that the assets of the company will go to auction. If so, HCA may have a chance. We are still accepting donations and pledges but we have no idea when a sale will take place, nor if it ever will. The amount of funds which we have so far probably will not go far but then we don't know who else might be interested. Let us hear from you. We will be keeping our ear to the ground for news. If something comes up suddenly, you may hear from us again by letter.

The doors at Imperial are closed at this time, including the gift shops.

Peggy Miller, wife of Al Miller, A Board Member, became ill at an antique show in Columbus the day after our dinner here and ended up in a Columbus hospital. Al had to return to his home in Shelbyville, Kentucky, where he is to have surgery on Monday, the 17th. We hope that Peggy has been able to leave the hospital and that both are doing well at this time.

The fakes are reappearing. We have a report from St. Louis that new items are showing up with same fake H in a diamond. Needless to say, steps are again being taken by HCA.

Dick and Ginny Marsh have had a bad time lately. First Ginny lost her father suddenly. All of HCA offers her sympathy in her loss. On the Saturday following the funeral, Dick was doing some work at her parent's farm and cut his foot very seriously with a chain saw. As of now he is still having difficulties and has not been able to work. Hurry up and get well, Dick! We need you!

We believe that the show advertised by the "Glass Collection" at Wheaton Village on October 6 and 7 may be the Heisey Heritage's Annual Show but we received no information nor an ad for it. You might call the number in the ad for details.

HEISEY'S LITTLE THINGS

This issue of Heisey News is so full of ads of glass for sale and the auction list that I will be brief.

I had a letter from a lady concerning the #400 punch cup. She said she has one with 8 panels which does have the pleats around the bottom. I don't have any punch cups to compare but there are several collectors who have most of them. What can you tell me about these Ann, Jarda, Valli, Harold? Those are the big collectors of punch cups of which I am aware. Does anyone else have these? At this moment, I have no explanation. It is possible, however, that the first 400's still had the pleats.

I believe that I have not yet written about #429 Plain Panel Recessed. This is, again, a very high quality thick glass and many pieces in this pattern were purchased by cutting companies to be used for lovely cuttings. Some of these are of the intaglio type and had to have been done by a high quality cutting company such as Hawkes or Pairpoint.

The best piece for an HLT is the cute little footed salt. This is marked on the side of the stem and usually only the tips of the diamond show. You will see many other colonial footed salts offered as Heisey but this is the only one which they made, and it is worth hunting. It is approximately 1-3/4" high though that could vary a little.

The only other HLT's in #429 are the 4 oz. custard and the salt and pepper with four different tops offered.

If you happen to be a goblet collector also, you might like this beautiful goblet which is rarely seen. It also comes with a six-sided stem and is not as attractive as the one pictured here.

A wholesale company in Pennsylvania is offering items which they list as "Heisey Alexandrite" Flying birds. We sent for one and it is like the one shown as Haley Glass in Evelyn Zemel's Glass Animals A to Z on Page 95. We do not know anything about Haley. This may be a copy of an older piece. They also list many other items in Heisey Alexandrite. It is lavender and they say it was made by mistake. It does not turn blue under fluorescent light.

They also have little figurines advertised as pink Heisey animals. These are 2-1/2" tall and include a unicorn, squirrel and elephant.

Do not buy any of these animals as Heisey. Steps also will be taken to stop this use of the word Heisey.

HEISEY AMBER

Although the A. H. Heisey & Co., made a lot of amber glass for the Fred Harvey chain of restaurants, the color was never mentioned in a catalog or price list until 1952. At that time, it was advertised as "Sultana." It is sometimes referred to as "Cherry" amber, no doubt because of the red tones in it.

The earlier amber was very different in shade, having a pinkish cast, and it was sometimes called Harvey Amber. Neila Bredehoft has written articles in Heisey News in the past about the items made for Fred Harvey.

In 1952 supplemental price list, many items are listed under Sultana. Some of these have been seen but others have been elusive. The list includes the following, all of which are very scarce:

- Horsehead Bookend (2 known)
- Giraffe, both straight and head turned (none known in Heisey at this time.)
- Flying Mare (also known in the lighter shade of amber).
- #1624 Patio, 10 oz. Tumbler, 6 oz.
- Sherbet, 5 oz. Juice and 12 oz. Footed Iced Tea.
- #1593 Prism Ash Tray
- #5057 Suez Stem line, crystal with amber stem, 10 oz. Goblet, 6 oz. Sherbet, 3-1/2 oz. Claret, 1 oz. Cordial, 3-1/2 oz. Cocktail, 3-1/2 oz. Oyster Cocktail (no Cordial is known in amber).
- #1609 Plate (same as 1183 Reverse)
- #1591 Cabochon 8" Plate
- #6092 Cabochon blown bowl, pressed base, 10, 12, 14 oz. Beverage, 16 oz. Sherbet, and 5 oz. Juice. These items have blown crystal bowls with thick rounded square pressed base in amber.
- #5077 Legionnaire was made with crystal bowl and amber stems. Items include:
 - 10 oz. Goblet, 6 oz. Sherbet, 3-1/2 oz. Claret, 1 oz. Cordial (never seen), 3-1/2 oz. Cocktail, 3-1/2 oz. Oyster Cocktail, 5 oz. Footed Juice, and 12 oz. Footed Ice Tea. Few of these items have been seen.

Miscellaneous items also listed in this price list supplement include:

- #4057 10-1/2" Vase with Saturn Optic, Also known in 5" size.
- #5012 Urn 10" Square Footed Bud Vase
- #5013 Vase for an Epergne
- #5048 Rooster Head Cocktail, Stem only amber.
- #5074 Seahorse Cocktail, Stem only.
- #5058 Goose Cocktail, Stem only.

The last three are rare and very high in price.

Other items in Sultana include:

- #341 Williamsburg Epergnette (for candlestick - 2 known)
- #1404 Old Sandwich Beer Mugs, though the date of manufacture is not known.

- #1503 Crystolite Baby Swan Nut Dish (1 known) and coasters
 - #5044 Constellation Soda (1 known)
 - #1540 Lariat Champagne (lighter than Sultana)
 - #1566 Banded Crystolite Candlestick, (1 pr. known)
 - #1503 Crystolite Rosette Candleblock (1 pr. known)
 - #1469 Ridgeleigh Cone Salt and Pepper (1 set known)
 - #1567 Plantation Coaster and Ash Tray
- Other items made in the lighter amber are:
- All Three Colts
 - Sparky (Oscar)
 - Flying Mare
 - Clydesdale (probably never marketed in amber)
 - Rooster (not put on the market in amber)
 - #1519 Waverly Low Compote, Sugar Bowl and Covered Candy With Sea Horse Finial
- Miscellaneous items in dark amber are:
- #1952 Dumbo Mug
 - Elephant Handled Mug
 - #110 Amber Dolphin Candlestick
 - Stippled Diamond Punch Cup, Experimental

After Imperial went into Chapter 11 Bankruptcy, the new owner, Robert Stahl, didn't care how much he hurt Heisey Collectors. They made a number of amber animals for which they charged big prices. Almost all are marked with one of Imperial's trademarks, including the I.G., L.I.G., and A.L.I.G., and at least part of the Flying Mares were marked N.I. for "new Imperial."

Many collectors have purchased these and Russ and I have bought some too, as Imperial, not Heisey.

The amber ones include the Flying Mare which is the only one made by Heisey in the exact shade of amber. Imperial had the formula for Sultana which they call "Heisey Amber" and is identified as such on their batch cart. They did make several other amber animals which Heisey had made in the Harvey Amber or a variation of it.

Those made by Imperial in amber, all in limited number are:

- Clydesdale
- Show Horse
- Sow and Piglets
- All Three Colts
- All Three Mallards
- Giraffe, Head Straight and Turned
- Filly, Head Forward and Head Back
- Tiger Paperweight
- Rooster
- Ringneck Pheasant

Imperial made a lot of animals in the two year period prior to going into Chapter 7 Bankruptcy, on August 31, this year. They also made several feasibility ones which are scarce. Eventually we will put a list together but we need more accurate information in order to do this. This probably will be done as an addendum sheet for your "Heisey by Imperial" book. It is already accurate up to the period just prior to the Chapter 11 Bankruptcy.

The booklet fell open to the double page featuring "salts," and there in the center was the #23 blown salt or pepper with a #57 metal top, just the pair I came home with today. Also remember the issue that Mr. Vogel featured a #1445 Grape Cluster candlestick on the cover, we had just a few short days previous purchased the same with bobeches and prisms; now the newest issue arrived and again on the front cover is a picture of the #102 9" candlestick which we have just added to our growing number of sticks. Strange how this happens...

Let me share with you my special find. The Mr. and I headed from the Yachting Center one nice Sunday this past summer, but in a different direction than usual, stopping here and there along the way. Came across a few pieces of #1252 Twist (7" Moongleam plates) passed - too dear; another stop and again another piece to high in price - #325 Pillows large compote - plus there were a few good chunks out of the edge. The next to last stop had a glass cabinet in the back which for some reason I saved until last to view. Finally all other pieces of glass had been carefully looked over and I headed for the glass case. Inside was a basket that on first glance I thought was the #417 Double Rib & Panel... Having the case unlocked was next so I could get a real close look. Was I ever excited... it wasn't a #417 but a beautiful #1503 Crystolite 6" basket. Oh, what JOY!!

From Maine "the Evergreens" had a most profitable summer; #1404 Old Sandwich sugar; a pair of #1 9" Candlesticks; two Fandango salts with silver spoons; #417 Double Rib & Panel basket in Hawthorne and to top all this was a pair of Moongleam #110 Dolphin Candlesticks which the dealer thought were depression. What does that tell you? You're right - sleeping!

Heard from "Mountain Gal" (CA) this month and regardless of very bad weather conditions she managed to get her "lil red MGB" down the mountain and thankfully back up again with a couple of real nice things: #1295 Beaded Swag souvenir creamer/ruby stain - dated 1901; #411 Rib and Panel two handled plate with a floral cutting; #341 Puritan 3-Pint Squat jug; #22 Candlesticks with bobeches and prisms (pr); Scotty and the #353 6" automobile vase.

My phone rang last evening just in time to spoil my supper with a list of beautiful color from my "good English Buddy" (MA) #1401 Empress Dolphin footed cream & sugar plus salt & pepper in Sahara; in Moongleam was the #461 7" Basket; Cobalt was next on his list, the 9" Warwick #1428 Horn of Plenty; in Zircon, the #1485 Saturn flared vase plus the cream and sugar in #1506 Provincial (Whirlpool). Last on his list was not in color but will turn us all moongleam with envy - #433 Greek Key 5" Almond dish and five individual almonds.

Let's see what else was found in the Bay State (MA); #1404 Old Sandwich 12 oz. ice tea in sahara plus a 10 oz milk pitcher in crystal; #1225 Plain Band 4 oz. oil; Flamingo Duck Flower Frog; #310 Ring Band salt shaker, custard - souvenir "Everett, Mass"; #379 Urn individual salt; #500 Octagon Frozen Dessert in Moongleam and the #433 Greek Key cruet.

The Empire State (NY) reports a #1205 Fancy Loop salt and a #1404 Old Sandwich individual ash tray in Cobalt.

"The Tipper" comes thru again - he had a lady call him to look at some glass - and buy - Out of three boxes of glass that he purchased, there were a few pieces of Heisey; Two #1184 Yeoman perfumes (plain but perfect); a #1252 Twist ice bucket, with silver plated handle, in Flamingo. Perfect condition; #1503 Crystolite covered candy dish with the Candle Block for a handle plus a real pretty little #1503 Vase, which, by the way, he says his wife keeps flowers in at all times.

We have had so much hot, humid, sticky weather here in the Yachting Center that it was "cool" (pun intended) to hear from the "Arizona Snowbird"; #1200 Cut Block cruet with the correct stopper.

The "two Guys" from Conn. have the #1210 Double Confection in Flamingo; #5022 Graceful Cordial with the Orchid Etch (both sleeping soundly) plus eight (8) Cups and Saucers and eight 8" Plates in #1231 Ribbed Octagon in Moongleam. It is sure strange how things go because the Mr. and I found four sets of cups & saucers in #1231 Ribbed Octagon - also Moongleam - just a little while ago.

I have a new addition to my column this month and one that pleases me greatly. The "California Kid" he is a student at UCLA and I love to hear that the young people are interested in our favorite glass. That kind of interest will keep our Museum going. He has reported to me (no less!) a pair of Dolphin Footed Empress Candlesticks in Alexandrite!! Keep up the good work both in Heisey Hunting and in your Grades. Let me hear from you often.

The other day while I was at work, a man I know came in and was passing the time of day. We discussed all sorts of things along with my favorite topic Heisey. He was telling me that when he was in one of our local antique shops, a man came and wanted to sell two Show Horses to the owner of the shop. One was perfect and one had slight damage (he didn't remember where); he said he wanted \$35.00 a piece. The owner didn't know the value and passed up the sale. Needless to say, the Mr. has been all over town and no shop has any Show Horses for sale or was even approached by anyone. Can you imagine anyone turning down a deal like that?

THE SALESMEN'S CONVENTIONS

Every year through the 1930's until America's entry into World War II in 1941, the Heisey's Sales-force enjoyed a week at the factory in June. These meetings, or conventions, as we called them, were held at Wilson Heisey's "cabin."

I use the quotation marks because the only resemblance to the historic log-cabins of our ancestors was the fact that it was made of squared off logs (The 1939 picture shows it well). The building was out in the country and was situated in a large park-like preserve, which was carefully groomed and maintained. It slept sixteen or so adults and had kitchen and living rooms to match. The decor was very masculine with saddles and halters on the walls and Navajo rugs scattered throughout.

Mr. Heisey brought in for this convention a railroad dining car chef who cooked the kind of food that you read about but seldom encounter.

What was this all about? Wasn't there a depression on? Wasn't the factory struggling to keep alive?

All true - but if there was one thing you could say about the Heisey owners it was that they lived and entertained well. Actually calling salesmen together and announcing plans for the coming Fall Season is customary and traditional in the trade. I attended scores of these meetings, but with most companies meetings are usually held at the principal show-room; one eats hotel food, sleeps in hotel rooms, and spends most of his time wishing this thing would get over so he could go home.

The Heisey meetings were distinctly different. For one thing, the important Heisey line-executives were present for at least one four hour give and take session in which they showed and explained in technical language the new lines. Ray Cobel, the master mould-maker, would show the new shapes he had created. Emmett Olsen, the chemist, showed new colors and experiments going on; and new cuttings would be exhibited and discussed. Actually as many as fifty cuttings would be shown on a variety of stemware shapes and these would be reduced (by sometimes heated arguments between management and salesmen) to perhaps ten numbers. Sometimes a cutting would be taken back to the factory and, by some over-night magic, show up the next day on a different stem! Rol Wooles, the etching chief, would hold the floor for several hours and I still remember the excitement when we first saw 507 "Orchid." We knew we had a winner at once!

As these were depression days, transportation costs had to be held down and it was customary for the men in the East to car-pool. George Granville would come to New York from Boston to meet Joe Lower and myself and we three would drive to Philadelphia to pick up Harry Bortz, the Pennsylvania representative, and then to York, Penna. to pick up Hal Coveland and Ed Bakee who had driven up from Baltimore. This was long before the Pennsylvania and Ohio turnpikes and we had to

tool our way along the Lincoln and National highways for about eighteen hours, with six large men in a 1930's car! Yet, it did not seem a chore; all of these people were master story-tellers and jokesters (salesmen, after all). The time went quickly as reputations of our competitors and buyers were thoroughly destroyed as we drove along. At Wilson's cabin the meetings were organized and chaired by Rod Irwin, our Sales-Manager, and a great deal of material was efficiently handled.

This all sounds like fun perhaps but what do fifteen or so adult males do for entertainment, isolated in the country as we were. Number one with a large group was a marathon poker game that seemed to go on until dawn every night. My own pleasure was to get behind several of Ohio's famous 3.2 heels and listen to the old timers reminisce (and lie, I am sure) about the early days of the Heisey factory and about Colonel Heisey and starting a glasshouse from scratch and the problems encountered. I am happy now that I did listen because such information is now history. Of course we younger men had Gus and George Heisey as contemporaries and they knew the location of every watering spot in Licking County for our enjoyment. However, work and plans were our main concern. Representatives from our advertising agency always made a presentation of what our advertising would say and what would be presented to the consumer as well as the professional buyer during the heavy Fall Season.

To me, a rather narrowly brought up New England person, it was fascinating and broadening to listen to, and exchange views with men, some twice my age (I took a lot of kidding) and with people from Florida to Washington State and Kansas to Boston. It was even more wonderful to listen to relatively uneducated men who could create gossamer bubbles of crystal and artistically decorate them. And indeed, they were artists, blending their designs with good American common sense.

Other times, other customs, the cynic might say but they were good times, when the world was young and life as we know it today was impossible (thankfully) to imagine.
