

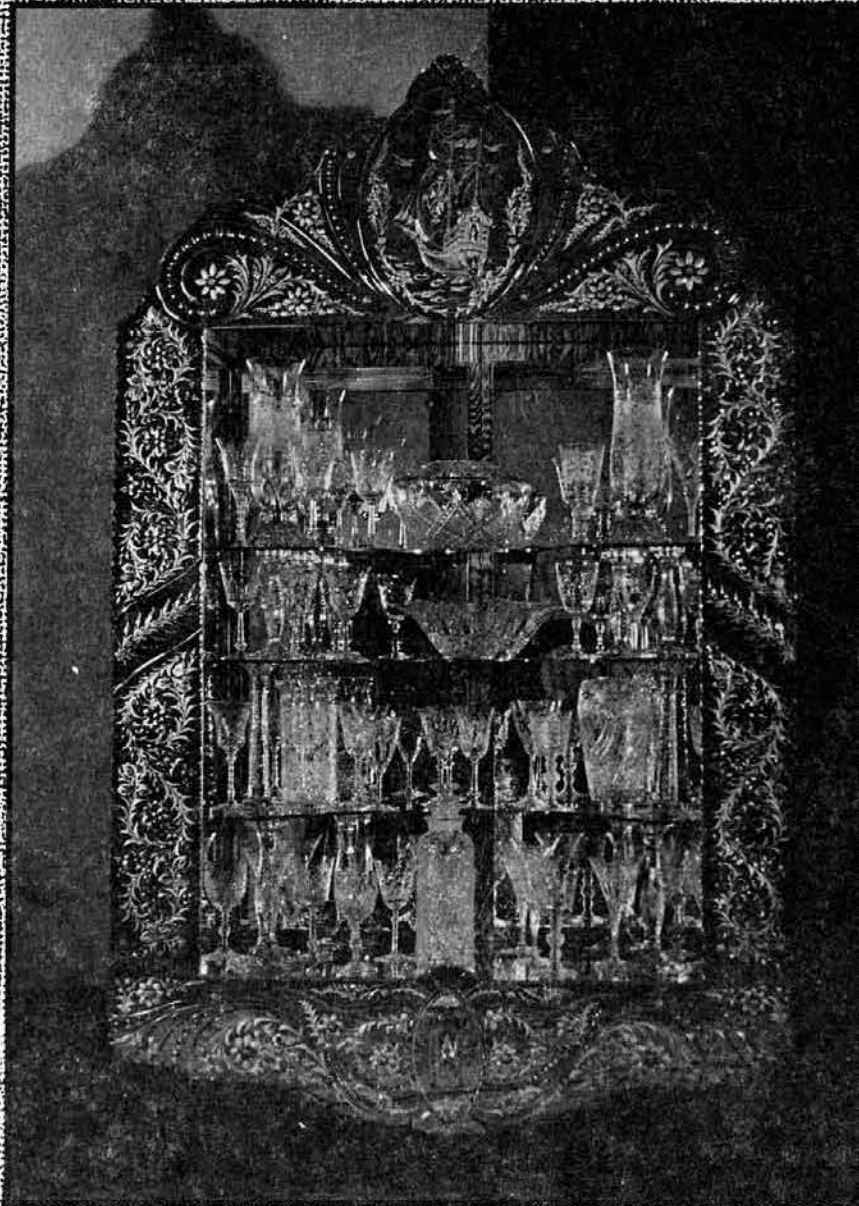

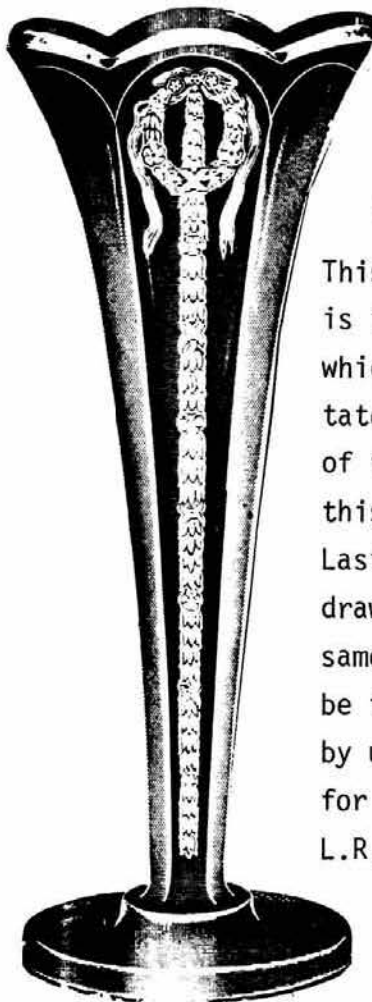

IN MEMORIAM

Percy M. Moore

After several weeks in the hospital, Percy Moore died on August 10 at the age of 80. He had been a resident of Newark for over 45 years.

Surviving him are his wife, Vivian, son, Ronald, three grandchildren, two great-grandchildren, and five sisters.

He was the owner of Moore Bros. Frame And Wheel, retiring in 1969. He served in the United States Navy during World War II, was a member of Disabled Veterans and ACME Lodge 97 F & AM, was a founding member of HCA and past member of the Board of Directors. He also belonged to the Newark Heisey Collectors Club.

HCA members from near and far must have pleasant memories of Percy. He was the first person to offer financial help to the club when it wanted to start a museum. In the early years he was at the front door nearly every day the museum was open. His sense of humor and some of his stories kept us all well entertained.

Percy had purchased all of the glass left in the Heisey factory after the salesroom had closed. He and Vivian had a Pottery and Gift Shop on Route 40 near Reynoldsburg. It was here that they sold much of the glass which they had acquired and was where Viola Cudd* bought vast amounts of the glass and the famous Krall cabinet, all of which she moved to Texas.

As we all have said many times, "there is only one Percy", and he will be greatly missed by the World of Heisey.

Our heartfelt sympathy goes to Vivian and her family.

* Mrs. Cudd wrote a book on Heisey in 1969 which pictured much glass purchased from the Moores.

ROYAL HICKMAN

Royal Hickman seems to have begun designing for Heisey on a free lance basis in 1941. The first connection of his name with Heisey's in print, however, was not until May, 1942, when a full page ad appeared in the Crockery and Glass Journal featuring the no. 1550 Dolphin (fish) candlesticks with a 9" fish floral bowl:

Royal Hickman designs the Dolphin Group for Heisey

Here's big news! Royal Hickman, the famous ceramic designer, has found another outlet for his genius. Now he is working in Crystal -- Heisey Crystal -- and the group . . . illustrated is an example of his master touch in designing.

The playful dolphin candlesticks and the flower bowl will offer your customers delightfully NEW possibilities for their table decorations. Put them on your display tables and watch the women who come in "just to look around", find them to be just what they were hoping to find. This dolphin group -- and many other exciting Hickman "figurines" to be announced later -- will make the cash register jingle for you. Why not stock up on them NOW?

The dolphins were originally produced in 1942, but it was the prior year that the first of the animals were initially introduced. There are many who believe that it was the popularity of these animals which in large part were responsible for helping Heisey to get through the very difficult War years. There's no doubt that they contributed considerably to the company's financial well-being during these years. The four ordergrams issued in 1943 each highlighted one of the mainstays of Heisey's production: Crystolite, Lariat, Orchid etch, and "Gift Items" (mostly animals).

Royal Hickman is known to have designed many of these animals, including the following:

In a letter written in July, 1969, just months before his death, Hickman indicated that there may have been others, as well:

I designed many pieces for Heisey and, of course, I cannot remember all of them . . . the Heisey horses are mine with the exception of the bookends . . .

I think the prize pieces I made for Heisey (commercial value) are a pair of penquin decanters in two sizes, the chanticleer cocktail shaker and a cocktail glass with a stem being the leg of a dancer, the leg frosted, or acid etched.

As to the number of animals I made for Heisey I really cannot say, but there were many. In the movie "The Glass Menagerie" they showed all of my Heisey figurines . . .

In addition, he is known to have created the large horse head decanter stopper, the no. 1552 Four-Leaf candleblocks, the no. 1558 floral bowls, the no. 1565 Leaf candlesticks, the no. 1569 floral bowl, the no. 1570 Lotus Leaf candleblocks, the no. 1575 flower bowls

and the no. 1603 flower bowl. As I was preparing this article to send in to Louise, I received the August issue of the Heisey News where it was announced that considerable correspondence between Royal Hickman and Rod Irwin, Heisey's sales manager, has been found in the items recently added to the archives, which presumably will make it possible to update the information above, giving us a complete list of the animals and other pieces designed by Hickman between 1941 and sometime around 1947 or 1948. (That's one of the perils of doing research away from Newark these days -- sometimes your work goes out-of-date before it's even submitted for publication!)

Hickman, of course, was even better known for his work in ceramics and many similar animals, also designed by him, can be found in that medium as well. In fact, many of his glass animals were probably adapted from pieces originally done in ceramics. For instance, in January, 1942, a pair of "dolphin agate green candleholders" were pictured in House and Garden -- the same month that Heisey's Dolphins initially went into production. Although the ceramic candlesticks are not attributed, it is obvious that they must be Hickman's, since they are virtually identical (with the exception of a loop that extends from the back of the dolphin's head to its tail, forming a handle which does not appear on the glass dolphin).

Hickman's work was not confined to glassware and pottery, however. Like the two other renowned designers who worked for Heisey (Walter Von Nessen before him and Eva Zeisel after him) Royal Hickman had a peripatetic and truly international career. He was born in 1893 in Willamette, Oregon. Although his artistic abilities were apparent from an early age, he does not appear to have considered a career along these lines. During the First World War he was employed by a shipyard in Takoma and, later, during the Depression, established a small construction company which had a contract to work on the Madden Dam in the Panama Canal. The intense heat seems to have been injurious to his health, however, and he suffered a stroke, despite being still a young man.

It was during his recuperation from this illness in California that he began working with clay as a form of therapy. With recovery came an association with the Garden City Pottery and the creation of a vividly colored dinnerware line called "RaArt Pottery," which became highly successful after Gump's department store in San Francisco decided to handle it.

Hickman next went to Europe, on behalf of J. H. Venon, Inc., of New York. There he created designs in glassware for the first time, developing a stemware line known as "Ingrid" (described by an article in the May, 1940, issue of Arts and Decoration as "the American version of modern stemware for every occasion") and a series of elegant, elongated vases which were made by the Kosta Glassworks in Sweden for importation by Venon. He also worked with glass factories in Denmark, Czechoslovakia and Italy before returning to this country where he accepted a post with Kosta Crystal in New York. Admirers of his later work for Heisey and Royal Haeger might be surprised by the graceful simplicity of his "Swedish" glassware.

It was in 1938 that Royal Hickman was approached by Edmund Haeger to join the Haeger Potteries to design their new Royal Haeger line. This was a well-established firm, which had been founded in 1871 and which is still active today. According to an article by Rena London in The National Glass, Pottery and Collectibles Journal in May, 1979, the name of the new line was coincidental and had already been decided upon before Royal Hickman joined the company (Mr. Hickman, himself, was never referred to as Royal, preferring to be known as "Hick.")

At any rate, Royal Haeger was tremendously popular, with sales demand so great that a second kiln had to be built. A year later, in 1939, the Royal Haeger Lamp Company was established. In addition to lamps, Hickman also designed sterling flatware and a line of onyx figures (both made in Mexico), as well as a group of four miniature wood planter tables and a series of large glass framed pictures, featuring exotic birds, flora and fauna, for this company. Hickman continued to be the chief designer for Royal Haeger until 1944 and later did further free lance work for them in the 1950's.

As you can see, much of the time that Hickman was designing for Heisey he was also employed by Royal Haeger, so it certainly isn't surprising that many of the animals he created for both firms resemble one another.

The chronology from this point on is a little confusing, since published sources differ. According to the article by Rena London, mentioned above, in 1944, he established a small pottery in Tampa, Florida. Other sources indicate that this business venture didn't occur until late in the 1940's or early in the 1950's. At any rate, it didn't last very long, since it was destroyed by fire shortly after production began.

In 1946, Hickman established Royal Hickman Industries in Chattanooga, Tennessee, to produce ceramic artware and lamps. Later that same year a notice appeared in Giftwares announcing that a new line of silver designed by Hickman was being shown by the Sun Glo Studios in New York. "Made of quadruple silver plate on copper the line is in the Swedish modern feeling with a beaded pattern" on the more than 50 pieces in the line, including coffee and tea sets, salad sets, punch bowls, candlesticks, etc. The name of this line was once again "Ingrid" (perhaps indicating that it matched the stemware made earlier by Kosta?) and it was manufactured by Three Crown Industries in Philadelphia. According to Giftwares, "the new line will be added to the Hickman Collection of lamps, art pottery, terrace ware and solid cast aluminum," indicating that Hickman was also in the process of creating a new dinnerware pattern.

The chronology remains confused for Hickman's later years, with reports that the lamp company was eventually sold to the Phil-Mar Lamp Company of Cleveland and renamed Ceramic Arts, Inc. Another report, in The Jewelers' Circular-Keystone, indicates that in 1953 Royal Hickman Industries was consolidated with Bernard Lipman, Inc., a distributor in New York, to become Hickman-Lipman Industries. The new company had permanent showrooms in New York, Chicago and Los Angeles, and it was reported that "Royal Hickman, well-known ceramic designer and manufacturer will head that end of the business in Los Angeles, while Mr. Lipman . . . will be in charge of all sales."

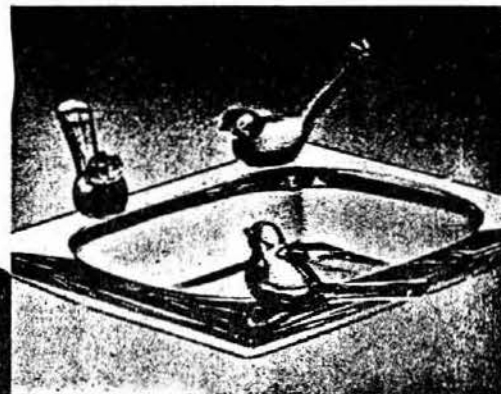

At some point after returning to the West Coast, Hickman also designed for Vernon Potteries for a short time. His final years, however, were spent in Guadalajara, Mexico, where he continued to create for Loza Fina, S.A., Dinnerware, while doing other free lance work along with his own artware. It was in Guadalajara that he died on September 1, 1969.

For much of the information in this article I am indebted to the new book by Lee Garmon and Doris Frizzel, entitled Collecting Royal Haeger. I would highly recommend this book to collectors of the animals or to anyone who is interested in ceramics. If you would like to know more about Royal Hickman or would like to see many examples of his work for Royal Haeger, including a number of look-alike animals, the book is available from the HCA gift shop.

LETTERS, WE GET LETTERS

. . . . Been wanting to write this letter since we became subscribers in late 1987, but other activities always seemed to take precedent. We are planning a motorhome trip to Lancaster, Pennsylvania, beginning August 1, and are scheduling a stop at Newark about August 20.

Our introduction to Heisey Crystal in mid 1950 is a memorable experience. Vi and I are originally from Pennsylvania -- I came to Tucson in January, 1946, from near Lancaster, and Vi from Warren in November, 1949. We first met the following month at a Christmas dance, married in August, 1950, and are about to celebrate our 40th very shortly.

In early June, a friend of Vi's, when seeing Vi's engagement ring and learning that my last name was Heisey, told her about Heisey Crystal. Later, Vi spotted an advertisement in a Better Homes and Garden magazine. When she showed it to me, I suggested, "Why don't we send them a wedding invitation?"

So, we did!! We didn't think anymore about it. However, when we returned home from our honeymoon the end of August, we were greeted by a big package on our front doorstep -- from the Heisey Crystal Company!! It was midnight as we unwrapped two beautiful hurricane lamps, each with a little blue diamond "H" sticker on the chimney and base. Each is 14" in height and has a base 5 1/2" wide.

We continue to place these in a prominent spot in our dining room.

Either way, I'm sure the Indian would be very intimidated by the sight of the strong young surfer.

When I think about the Indians I also can't help but think about pottery. The "Pottery Man", from the Show Me State, has had a great deal of luck adding to his Roseville collection, which is quite nice; but, ah, his Heisey collection is really multiplying in leaps and bounds with a select few pieces: #407 Coarse Rib 8 oz tumblers in mint guise, Crystal, and lest I forget, there were five (5) of them; #4054 Coronation half gallon ice tea tankard; #1540 Lariat 14" sandwich plate. The sandwich plate, by the way, was sold as "Candlewick". Did I mention the word "luck" - well I guess he practically stole them all and brought them back to his "tepee".

"The Cardinal" had a wonderful time at the Convention feathering his nest, so to speak. I'll just mention a few items: #451 Crossed Lined Flute 8 oz goblet; #1401 Empress juice, in Sahara; #5072 Rose stem with the #515 Heisey Rose Etch (this piece was one that he has always said he wanted to own). He would like to collect the Heisey Rose Etch. Also, he received as a gift, while at convention, the Crystalite #1503 blown tumbler (he now has an example of each). This one he prizes greatly because it was a special gift from a very special person. #2323 Navy glass with the ½ sham, medium optic with a curved in rim (elegant looking). Lastly, the singular most important item - #4163 Beer Mug with the #467 Tally-Ho Silhouette Etch. From the day this beauty came into his possession he utilized it every day at least once until he packed up and headed back to his nest. What an extraordinary convention! He is already planning for next year!!

As for "Yours Truly", I have managed to add a couple more pieces of #1404 Old Sandwich, my favorite pattern, to my table settings; two (2) plates and two (2) cups (of course all four pieces are the elusive Flamingo). I was delighted, to say the very least. I have never seen a saucer in Old Sandwich in color; so I always mix my Flamingo with the Crystal, which I think looks lovely. The other item that I was proud to acquire was a stem that I have wanted to own for several years. It is a piece that commands a very dear price. This year I broke down and it is now sitting in my cabinet occupying the place of honor. Ready? #5058 Goose stem 1 oz cordial - I'm pleased!

I always find it rather enjoyable to learn the why and wherefore of how people started collecting Heisey. The "Quality Seeker" has an engaging saga that was shared with me and I would like too, in turn, share with all of you. It all began when she was young, enjoying looking at, and picking up, broken pieces of old bottles and red tail-lights (when, at that time, they were indeed made of glass). Collecting began when, living in an old farm house, she dug up an old bottle. A metal detector was then purchased and six feet deep holes were dug looking for "out-houses" where, she was told, old bottles were very often thrown away. These "out-houses" were often dug up, covered over, and moved. Lots of fun and many hours were spent in this endeavor but with no luck along the way. Next, the "Quality Seeker" graduated to collecting "canning jars", after four hundred or so, it was discovered that regardless of "book" price, no one wanted old canning jars. Oh, well. From there the "Quality Seeker" progressed to Depression glass; this was around the time the public became aware of its collectibility. Hunt, look, find, purchase. Enough of that! At this point "Elegant" glass is the first love of the "Quality Seeker", which brings us to HEISEY! It is a learning experience, and loads of fun is being enjoyed each time out on the "field" going to estate sales and yard sales. Good buys are still being found as sometimes even marked pieces aren't recognized by the sales staff. Such as - eight (8) #1404 Old Sandwich 6 oz toddies, marked. These were not recognized by the "Seeker" until she got them home and found the mark. But "quality" they surely were. Also found was the #4057 Cecelia 10½" Saturn optic vase (unknown etch, a rubbing has been sent to the museum) for less than a tank of gas and "quality". She claims there is nothing like the thrill of finding a "quality" piece of glass at a sale, hurrying home to identify it and, low and behold, Heisey! (We can all attest to that feeling). "Quality", yes of course, see where her name stemmed from. Keep up the good work.

"The Friendly Fox" reports a #7000 Sunflower torte plate with a large Iris etched on one side and a Moth on the other side; also, one #1570 Lotus Leaf candlestick.

At a Canton flea market an #1170 Pleat & Panel 5" footed and covered compote was discovered by the "Texas Tornados", in Flamingo!

"My first Heisey Friends" have discovered many enchanting pieces of which I'll relate a few, keeping others for another column; Benson and Hedges Humidor #352 Flat Panel, Moongleam and marked! #379 Urn table salt, flared; again Moongleam is the #367 Prism Band decanter; and, in Flamingo, they boast, brag and crow about a beautiful basket, #461 Banded Picket. To discover a beautiful basket is to find gratification, and speaking of happinesses Joyee Brothers said, "when you look at your life, the greatest happinesses are family happinesses".

It is fun to learn how others started collecting Heisey, so write, tell me your story and let me share it with all "our" friends out there in "Heiseyland".

NORA KOCH
1935 - 1989

Otisville, Michigan - Nora Koch, age 54, publisher of Depression Glass Daze, died May 28, 1989, at St. Joseph Hospital, Flint, Michigan, after a long bout with cancer.

She was born January 11, 1935, in Saginaw and spent her whole life as a Michigander. She married Kenneth G. Koch in 1952, and they made their home in Otisville, together, the owners of a sporting good store for about 20 years.

Although Nora Koch was registered in the State of Michigan as a qualified Firearms instructor and worked several years in the Hunter Safety programs in Michigan, she started accumulating glassware of the Depression Era in the 50's.

In 1969 she became a dealer and did mail orders. In the spring of 1971 after building up a large mail order business, Nora, as she preferred to be called, started Depression Glass Daze. The first issue, dated March, 1971, was just four tabloid pages, and there were 400 printed. Now there are over 20,000 papers distributed monthly and paid subscribers reaching over 17,000.

When cancer struck in the early 80's, she continued publishing and editing the DAZE. When cancer recurred in 1988 she retired. Her daughter, Teri, has continued publishing the DAZE.

There was a private burial with no services in accordance with her wishes, at Smith Hill Cemetery, Otisville, Michigan. In lieu of flowers, donations can be made to the National Glass Clubs, P.O. Nora leaves her husband, Kenneth G. of Otisville, son, Kenneth Allen, of Otisville, daughter, Teresa Steele Greenman and husband, Don of Clio, Mother, Floy (Potter) Keller, Atlanta, Michigan, and a host of relatives and friends. She was preceded in death by her father, Lester Keller.
