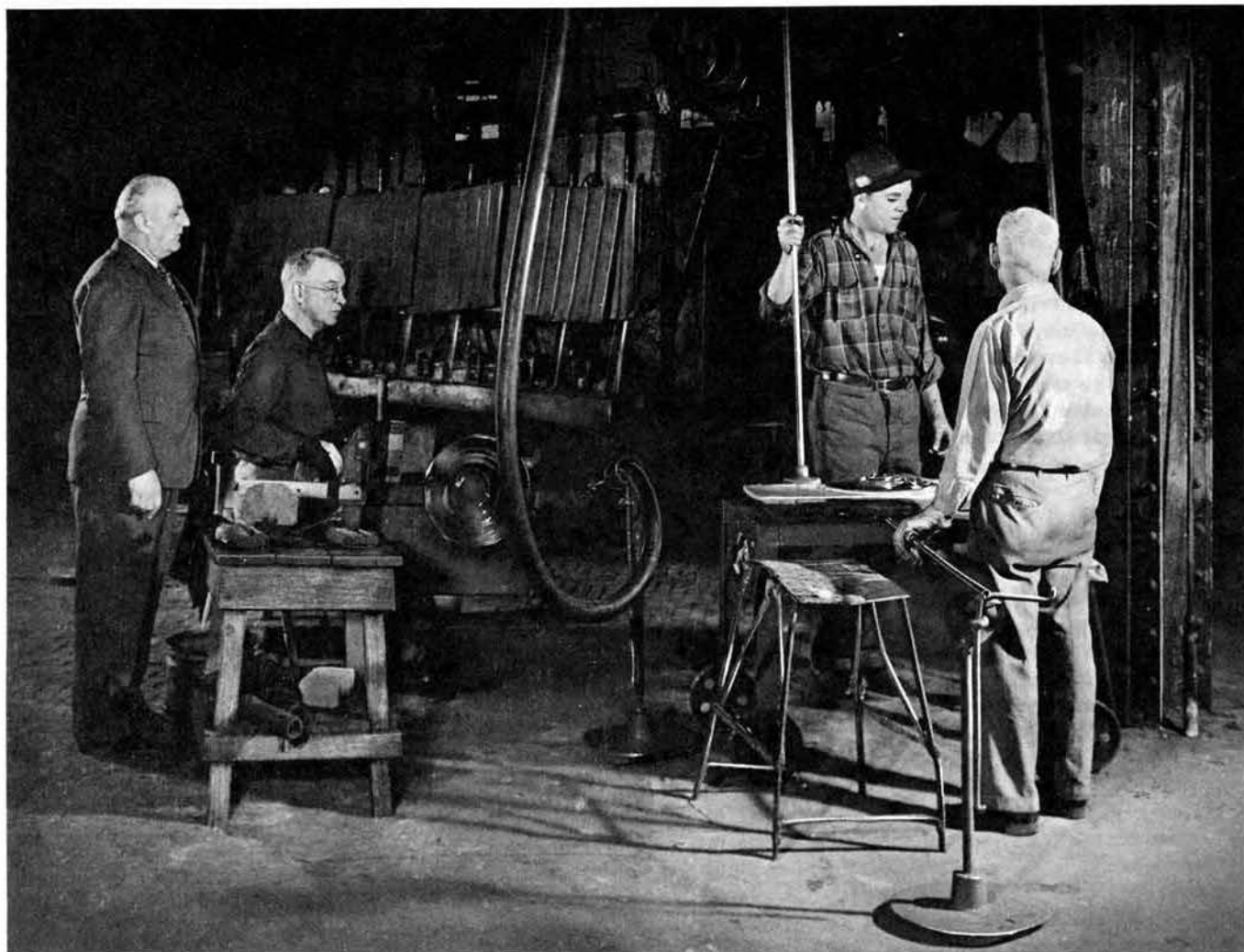

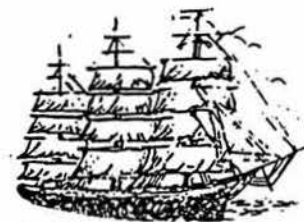

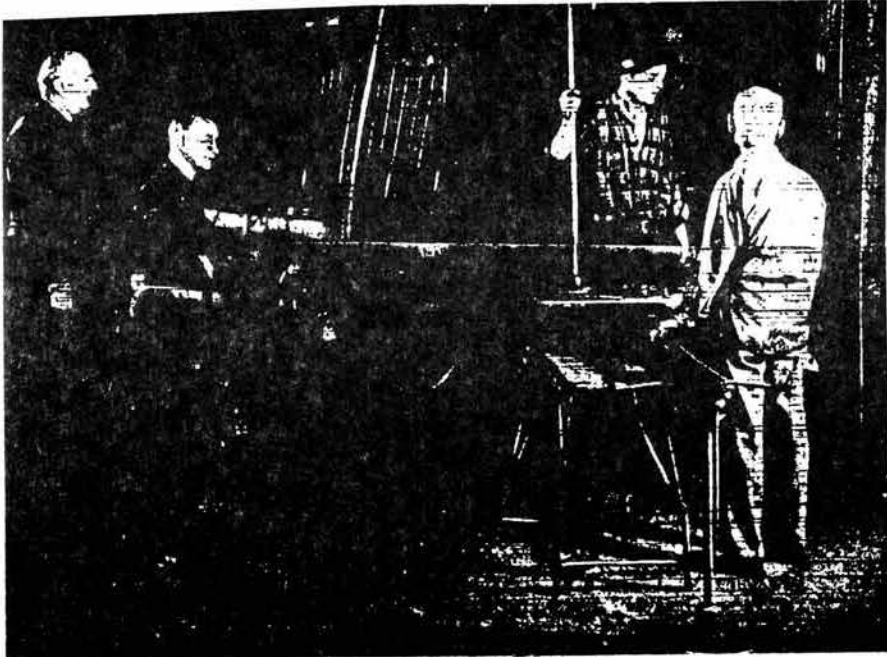

## Club Notes

### #44 National Capital Heisey Study Club

The National Capital Heisey Study club and the National Capital Heisey Collectors met together on June 12, 1991. Summer vacations reduced attendance, but we had an enjoyable evening sharing items from our collections which we consider rare, unusual and /or interesting. We also shared stories of the hunt associated with each piece. Items displayed by the members included a Gascony candlestick in sahra, an Empress footed tumbler in Sahara, a Cabochon cordial in Sahara with Colony etch, a sugar shaker in Kalonyal pattern, three cocktail shakers-- Cobel with cutting, mixer in cobalt with a metal cap, and "no-name" with Rooster stopper, ground bottom and prominent Diamond H centered on the bottom of the mixer. Also displayed were six favor vases in Cobalt-- three genuine Heisey pieces and the others of uncertain origin, an attractive vase in Plantation, a Fleur d' Lis plate in Sahara, a sugar in Pointed Oval in Diamond Point--Emerald, and the "winner of the evening, a #1 candlestick in rose.

Here's a sample of the stories that went with the items. Cabochon cordials--seen while browsing a New England flea market, opening selling price: \$30.00-- buyer conferred with wife and asked seller if there might be a discount. Seller consulted partner and came back with "final and best"--\$26.00. Thinking this was the price per each, buyer started to multiply 26 times 6. When the seller interrupted "That's the price for all"! buyer couldn't write the check fast enough!

Gascony candlestick-- seller, a self appointed authority, told buyer that the attractive yellow stick was produced by Cambridge and donated to one of the churches in Cambridge, OH. Buyer had a short lived urge to debate the issue, but in light of the price quoted decided to make the purchase without setting the seller straight. This lovely piece of Heisey is marked clearly at the base of the candle cup.

#1 Candlestick in Rose-- A truly rare item, pressed shortly after the turn of the century. No mention of this candlestick in Rose is found in the turnbooks, catalogs, or price lists. An inventory taken about 1901 listed 42 of them. It's rare on two count: 1)very few of the colonial candlesticks were produced in any color and 2)the production period of Rose color apparently was very short.

Our audience participation program revealed what we've always suspected--at least half the fun of collecting is the hunt and the occasional gem of instant expertise tossed in gratis.

*diamonds are forever.....*

In 1931 the U.S.S. Frigate Constitution, best known as "Old Ironsides", came into our harbor in July for a two day visit. The school children who went aboard were told the story of how the vessel escaped from two British men-of-war in the waters just off Marblehead neck in 1814.

"It was Sunday a.m. April 3. The alarm sounded. She was being chased by British Tenedos and Endymion. She was piloted by a "Header" Samuel Green and sailed in safely under the protection of Fort Sewall.

The vessel was coming back from a West Indies cruise, under Captain Charles Stewart. Off half-way rock they added sail, threw provisions, liquor and fresh water kegs over board to lighten ship during escape.

A bit later she sailed into Salem with Captain Knott Martin as pilot. The West Indies Captain Stewart remarked, "If I had you aboard the a.m., I could have saved 10,000 pounds, as I had to throw over that amount in prize goods."

Now, if indeed you want to discuss "prize goods" let's examine a few items from the accumulation of the *Steadfast Colleague*, starting with two #170 Square in Diamond Point (Cut Block) plates, one flat the other rolled edge, along with a #1252 Twist ice tub in Marigold, in very good condition.

The farmer reports a #1205 Fancy Loop toothpick in Emerald with excellent gold, a #17 Classic 16" candelabra with C prisms, a #1567 Plantation marmalade with cover and ladle (this one is milk glass by Imperial) and the #1205 Fancy Loop 7" crimped nappy.

I thought that since this year is the celebration of twenty years for HCA it would be fun to go back and see just what has been found by our members during the last twenty years. Remember this column hasn't been in existence that long, but anyway-here goes!

In the 1972 *Heisey News* the #1503 Crystolite puff box and two colognes was offered for sale for \$30.00. Also the #3480 D/O pitcher in Flamingo with six matching tumblers went for \$30.00.

In December of 1972 at the Hilbert Show in Springfield, OH, the collectors had to fight the impulse to hock the diamond engagement ring and buy everything in sight, such as: #1776 punch bowl and cups, #1245 Ring Band custard tumblers, a spooner in the same pattern and also in Custard, a Victory deep plate

etched cocktail glass, and a #1280 Winged Scroll toothpick in Custard.

1973 brought reports of a *North Ohio* family winning the green room for its' finds: two Everglade cut #5009 Queen Ann goblets, a Swan handled center bowl in Sahara, and a pair of #134 candlesticks with Enchantress cutting-the frog too. Also, a #1612 Batonic cigarette box complete with lid.

1974 there was news of a #1280 Winged Scroll molasses jug, two colonial vases, one in Flamingo the other Vaseline. Lastly, the #52 Princess lamp and a horse-head stopper.

1975 a *Wisconsin collector* rope-tied a Clydesdale.

1976 the *Cincinnati times* came up with a very cute #1184 Bow-tie handled ashtray in Moongleam and finally added the last colonial punch cup to their collection, a #300-1/2.

1977 boasts finds from the *Brooksville Kid* and his wife - #3389 Duquesne wine in Tangerine, a Penguin stopper, #1401 Empress three part relish with Waikiki cutting, #353 Flat Panel strawholder, the flat variety, and the #343 Sunburst small sugar.

1978 the *Keystone State* came up with 6" and 10" plates in #1503 Crystolite that have silver plate backs which look like mirrors.

1979 *Big Flea Charlie* reported stealing a pair of #520 candlelamps. The *Cincinnati Stitchesacers* came upon a #1000 Carlsbad cordial and claimed same.

1980 that couple from *Shelbyville, KY* wasn't letting the grass turn blue under their feet. They have a pair of the Plantation 3-lite candelabra, plus a sugar and creamer. The *Wicked Witch* found a Locket on Chain custard cup.

1981 *Some fella from Grand Rapids* found a pair of Zircon Ridgeleigh candlevases. Super nice!!

1982 *Bean-Town* reported a #1495 Fern 6" handled cheese dish and again Zircon.

1983 the *Evergreen Friends* bid on and won a Cobalt Tulip vase. The auctioneer didn't know one vase from another that day.

1984 the year the *Two Ducklings in the Old Dominion State* found an Amber elephant and the #4230 Tangerine favor vase.



1985 A #351 Priscilla toothpick was reported by my *Good English Budd* and the #352 Flat Panel toothpick was also picked up and taken home.

1986 *The Old Viking* finds the Baby Elephant.

1987 *The California Kid* bragged about #1401 Empress individual cream & sugar in Flamingo.

1988 I heard about the *Visionary Victorian* and the #365 Queen Ann etched two-handled jelly, and the #1184 Yeoman D/O cup and saucer in Flamingo. In fact, four of these were found.

1989 *The Hanging Judge* went to Gallows Hill and found a #1205 Fancy Loop orange bowl and the #500 Octagon 5" basket in Moongleam.

1990 the *Canadian Goose* came up with a #1205 Droop floral bowl in Moongleam. What a catch. My *First Heisey Friend* reported a pair of #134 candlesticks with Heisey Rose etch and the #170 Cut Block cruet with original stopper.

Now that brings me back to 1991 where I started this column. Perhaps you all enjoyed this. If so, I will do it again. Let me know, along with your finds, so I can share your good luck with the other avid Heisey collectors.

Your input is surely needed.

Again I say to you all, Convention was wonderful and I'm sure a lot of nice things were purchased that you could write me about. Also, the summer was the time for all those wonderful outdoor "Fleas" - something must have found its way to your house.

## HEISEY IN TRADE JOURNALS


NO. 427 Daisy & Leaves

by Tom Felt

After all of the colonial patterns featured in this column over the past several months, it might be pardonable to suppose that between 1905 and the early 1920's Heisey produced nothing but plain paneled or fluted lines. While these obviously were a mainstay during those years, there were departures from this trend now and then. One such line was #427, aptly known as Daisy & Leaves to collectors today. You'll note, however, that the pieces themselves (such as the cream and sugar in the accompanying advertisement) are classic colonial shapes and that it is only the addition of the impressed ornamentation that sets them apart.

The effect of a design like this, of course, was to imitate a certain kind of cutting. Heisey made few other items with similar impressed decoration, such as the #435 Thistle tumbler and the bowl to which Vogel assigned the name and number of #7011 Daffodil. I suspect the inspiration for these designs may have been McKee's popular Prescut patterns, such as their well

known Rock Crystal line which had come out in 1904 or their Puritan pattern, both of which utilized impressed floral motifs. Cambridge had a couple of Nearcut designs which were also similar, #2760 Daisy and #2780 Strawberry. In 1911 Fostoria offered both the #1819 I.C. pattern (a thistle motif) and their #1827 Rambler line. Although the Fostoria patterns remained in production until 1915, only the McKee Rock Crystal seems to have really caught the public's fancy.

The first mention of Heisey's Daisy & Leaf seems to have been in the January 13, 1910 issue of the Crockery and Glass Journal, where it was stated the "new pieces in some rock crystal effects are proving very popular." A few months later, on March 30, 1910, the Pottery, Glass & Brass Salesman reported that "the new rock crystal glassware...has already made a marked impression upon the trade." As far as I have been able to determine, Heisey's only advertisement for Daisy & Leaves is the accompanying one from the Iron Age-Hardware issue of December 3, 1910. The pattern probably didn't remain in production for much more than a year or so after that and was definitely discontinued prior to 1913.

Despite trade journal reports that it was soon to be added to, the line remained a small one. In addition to the cream and sugar, nappies were offered in 4, 4-1/2 and 8 inch sizes, both regular and flared, along with a 12 ounce ice tea, tumbler, finger bowl, and 9 inch vase. (The latter was available with a plain or cut top.) There were also two different half gallon jugs, one of which was designated #427-1/2 in the price lists. All of these pieces were offered clear or with the leaves and flowers frosted. At a much later date (ca. 1917-1923) a basket with the same daisy & leaf motif was placed in production, as pattern #480.

Pieces in this pattern will generally be marked with the Diamond H.
