HCA will offer a small quantity of these St. Francis Anniversary Madonnas to HCA members. Because there will be so few of these Madonnas available to us, it is important that we be clear about instructions on how they are to be ordered. *No* mail orders post marked *before* December 1 will be accepted. *No* phone orders, or walk in orders will be accepted *before* December 1. *No* "holds" will be allowed. Letter From the Curator

My first six weeks at the museum have been busy but I am now settling into a routine and making progress on the work to be done here. I would like to thank all of the volunteers, members, and especially the other staff members, all of whom have been very helpful.

These are exciting times at HCA. The Expansion Committee has been meeting regularly and discussing not only building plans but fundraising, membership and volunteer recruitment, and other issues essential to HCA. Subcommittees have been established to explore specific projects and to ensure good use of committee members' talents and expertise. The need for museum expansion is great. Without proper space for educational programming, multimedia presentations, and additional display, HCA will not continue to attract visitors to its museum. The Holiday Dinner and board meeting on December 7 is fast approaching. I would especially like to encourage all museum volunteers to attend the dinner, as we will take this opportunity to express our appreciation for your time and commitment.

Please feel free to pass them out to attract both new members to HCA and visitors to the museum. Club Notes

#5 Bay State Heisey Club *Susan Pescatore, President*



The October meeting of the Bay State Heisey Club was held on October 15, 1991, at the Follen Church in Lexington, MA. Carl Sparacio of Ramsey, N.J., accompanied by his lovely, long suffering wife Helen, graciously consented to share some of his Heisey experience and wisdom with us, focusing on early Heisey stems in his presentation. As Mr. Sparacio has been closely involved with HCA since the beginning and as he is a known humorist, as well as a columnist for his local newspaper and the *Heisey News*, his presentation was filled with interesting and anecdotal information.

After claiming that he is unaccustomed to public speaking, Mr. Sparacio launched into a comprehensive overview of Heisey's early stemware, primarily before 1920. A number of the examples from his personal collection were quite rare, and hitherto unseen by many club members. The following is a partial list of the pieces discussed: #1201 Fandango wine, #1205 Fancy Loop wine, #343 Sunburst goblet, #1235 Beaded Panel and Sunburst goblet, #160 Locket on Chain goblet, #1295 Beaded Swag goblet in Custard, #337 Touraine goblet in Amber, and #1183 Revere.

Another theme was Heisey's production of stemware for bars and restaurants-- solid simple glassware made to withstand rough treatment. Many of these pieces were unfamiliar even to experienced stem collectors.

Mr. Sparacio closed with "The ugliest pieces of Heisey I have ever seen". He presented a Sparkie, gaily decorated in black and gold, a #467 Helmet basket, completely enamelled in cerulean blue with polychrome flowers and gold (ugh), and an unbelievable #341 cruet totally covered with fuzzy lipstick-red paper somehow welded to the surface. (apparently a 1920s ladies craft called "flocking"). The writer admits to ownership of this item.

This was an evening to remember, and the entire Bay State Heisey Club thanks Carl and Helen for their time and efforts.

#7 The Dayton Area Heisey Club *R. Clarke West*

The topic for the October meeting was individual nut dishes, almond and salted nut dishes. Examples were displayed on a white table cloth, 45 in all! They appeared in Flamingo, Hawthorne, Crystal, Sahara, Moongleam, and Alexandrite. Narration was given by Carl and Charlene Bowman.

Here is a sample of the items we discussed at our Show & Tell: Locket on Chain cake plate, Puntty Band wine, Crystolite salt & pepper, Carcassonne sherbet in Sahara, Narrow Flute 9 oz soda (double mark), 1/4# Ipswich candy, honey dish, Heisey Rose etch on Waverly blank, Greek Key champagne.

Three new couples joined our group: Mr. & Mrs. Carl Young, Mr. & Mrs. Ken Rhoades, and Mr. & Mrs. Tom Phillips.

Our meetings are held monthly, September through May. We meet at the Huber Heights Public Library on Route 201 (Brandt Pike) at 6:30 P.M. every third Tuesday of the month.

#44 National Capital Heisey Study Club

The National Capital Heisey Study Club met with the National Capital Heisey Collectors on October 9, in the Oxon Hill, MD. Library. During our social hour we talked Heisey, munched on seasonal refreshments--vegies and dip, "Lo-Cal" donut holes and cider -- and admired finds. Members shared the following finds: #2 electric shade, a cream and sugar in Punty and Diamond Point, cream and sugar in Bead Swag with gold decoration, a lovely individual creamer in Emerald Fancy Loop, a great big sanitary syrup in Quator, a floral bowl in New Queen Ann with a beautiful cutting, and finally, a 12 oz Gascony footed soda with crystal foot and Tangerine bowl-- if it weren't in bad form we'd all have been green with envy!

After a short business meeting, Betty Heflin gave a program on #343 and #343-1/2 Sunburst, illustrated with slides and pieces from Bob and Betty's collection. Sunburst, introduced around 1904, is one of several Heisey patterns designed to look like cut glass. At the

height of production, some 115 items were available in #343 and #343-1/2. The hostess looking for just the right pieces for decorating, entertaining or as auxiliary pieces for the table could find the table set, an orchid vase, a rose bowl, bon bons, finger bowls and underplates, relish dishes, cake salvers, a variety of jugs, footed compotes, and punch bowls. And, similar to other patterns of the period, there seemed to be an endless choice of nappies. These ranged in size from 4 to 10 inches, and to provide the shopper with even more decisions, these could be had in straight, cupped, flared, shallow and crimped -- there were even square nappies. At the lower end of the scale, the shopper had to decide whether 4", 4-1/2" or 5" was just the right article.

In addition to describing the pieces available in the pattern, Betty pointed out decorations applied by the Heisey Company. Sunburst was advertised with "Ruby Lustre over the chrysanthemum", "Gold on plain portions above and between chrysanthemums or on plain portions surrounding chrysanthemum as the case may be, but with more or less variation", and the #76 Amber lustre over chrysanthemums. She noted also that there were several variations in the basic pattern -- one described by Vogel as "...Sunburst with Diamond Point' due to the diamond shape fine cut between the sunburst. Another variant is the punty band found in the tumbler and one style of jug. Cut circles on half circles around the sunburst is another variant found in the pattern. - custard cups, toothpick, goblet, egg cup, finger bowls, table set... are examples of this variant form." She mentioned also that the #17 handled decanter pictured in the 1905 Heisey catalog had been described by Clarence Vogel as a variant of the #3343 pattern.

Betty used the following sources plus her Sunburst collection in preparing her program: *Heisey News*, *Heisey Glass Newscaster*, *Heisey Catalogs*, *Vogels Book I*, and *Heisey On Parade* by Sandra Stout.

Heisey Musings

I admire people who can stand before an audience and speak. No matter that they can keep the crowd interested. What's important is that they are able to stand up and make intelligible sounds as all those eyes stare at them. Perhaps I admire these gutsy folk because I've been on the wrong end of a "please come and say a few words" request a couple of times. The assumption seems to be that if you write, you can speak. Boy, is that ever wrong.

I have spoken on Heisey glass and the HCA to promote them in the past, but I don't know why I agree to speak--I'm a basket case before, during and after. Then I fret over why I'm asked as opposed to someone who knows what he is talking about.

I think I have the "why" figured out: program chairmen are a desperate lot. A person is appointed his club's program chairman because he's stepped on the wrong toes over the years. Or sometimes the club vice president functions as its program chairman to give him something to do while he's waiting for the president to drop dead or become otherwise incapacitated.

The program chairman must come up with a dozen scintillating programs a year. Unfortunately, after the third monthly meeting of his reign, he runs out of scintil. There is a limit to how many pitches from investment counselors or Florida real estate salesmen a group will sit through.

A while back I was asked to be the guest speaker at a meeting of the Bay State Heisey Collectors. What was different about this gig is that I would be speaking to people who probably know more about Heisey than I do. This fact alone was enough to set the stomach butterflies flapping and flipping. In the past I always had an audience I could bluff.

"Why me?" I asked myself. I figure two things made me desirable--I had nothing to sell and the program chairman was very desperate. Could you say no to a fellow who has tears running down his cheeks? I can. It was the arms around my ankles that got to me and tugged at my heart strings as I tried to escape to the men's room.

"What would I talk about," I asked.

"Anything you'd like, the choice is yours," he replied. I mean this guy was really desperate.

"There are plenty of professional speakers around," I said. "They're too expensive," he said, unwittingly giving me another reason why I was so appealing.

The phrase, "Unaccustomed as I am to public speaking," was coined with me in mind. You are justified in wondering why anyone who has nothing to say and has a proven ability not to say it well, would agree to speak in

public. Well, there's masochism, of course, or perhaps an odd desire to throw up in front of an audience. There is also a touch of ego. You're flattered because you were asked. My ego has absolutely no immunity to flattery.

I made the commitment but, even as I agreed to it, I was apprehensive. On the up side, the meeting was months away. On the down side, time slipped by quicker than if I were waiting for the governor to call with a pardon.

To prepare myself I went to the library and borrowed a book on public speaking. It gave me the false sense of security I needed. All I had to do, according to the author, was to keep cool, look the audience in the eye and keep them loose with a joke or two. I could handle that. My wife added, "Don't jiggle the keys in your pocket - it's distracting." I could handle that, too.

So it was that my wife and I made the drive from New Jersey to Lexington, MA, just outside of Boston (I wouldn't think of making a fool of myself closer to home.) I must say that the good people of the Bay State Club did everything they could to make us comfortable and feel at home but their enthusiasm and gleeful anticipation of my talk caused me to break out in hives. There was no way I could live up to their expectation.
