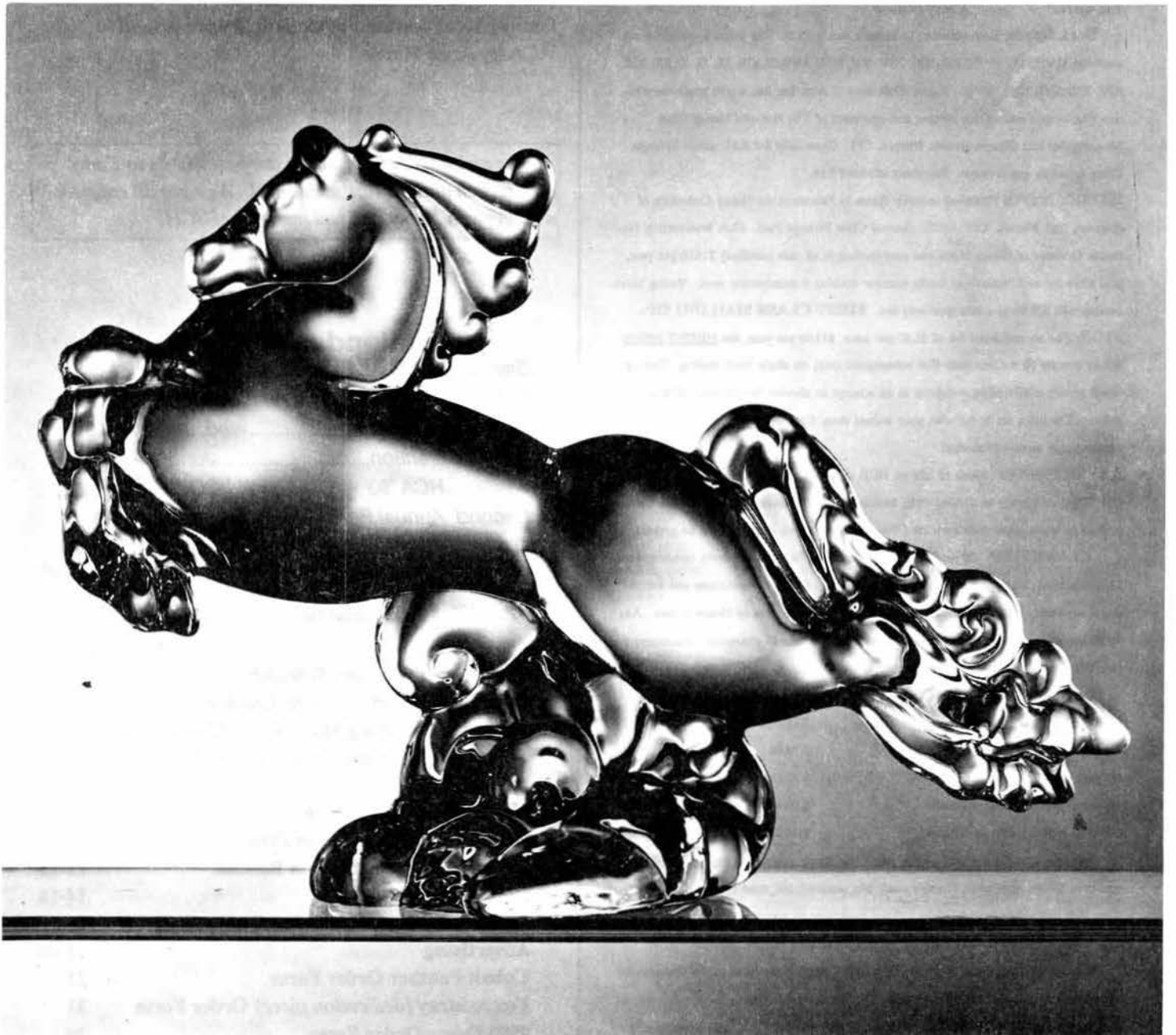

The Executive Committee also hired Joe Kennedy to temporarily help with the transition and to make some suggestions for possible structural and procedural changes.

We are receiving shipments of the Gem Series weekly from Dalzell-Viking. We completed the full sets to be shipped in late February and we are now working on the sets to be picked up as fast as we can. We are extremely pleased with the quality of Dalzell-Viking's work. I would like to remind all subscribers to this series to read Louise Ream's article in last month's newsletter regarding handmade glass. There are going to be imperfections in handmade glass and bubbles and mold marks are not considered flaws.

The addition is nearly complete. Carpet is being laid today in the addition as well as in the office building. Some of the new display cabinets have arrived and they are simply beautiful. I am working on plans for where the glass will go in the addition, but of course, it is difficult to know how it will fit in the cabinets until we actually begin placing the pieces.

MUSEUM EXPANSION COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Expansion and Museum Committees are proud to report that progress is being made on the interior of the new museum addition. The elevator has been installed and has passed inspection. Carpet is in place and most of the new cabinets are in place on the main floor as well as the second floor. Cabinet mirrors and shelving will be installed shortly. Carpet can now be installed in the lower level and should be in place by the March Benefit Auction weekend.

The archival materials have been moved into the new archival storage room and renovation of the second floor of the administration building is almost complete. The library has already been moved upstairs. Work on the first floor renovation is in progress. The King House renovation is about to begin.

The sample set of the Gem Series animals in Lavender Ice will be offered for sale at a later date. Gem Series over-runs will be frosted and offered for sale in the HCA gift Shop. No decision on pricing will be made until numbers are known.

The Lavender Ice Flying Mare will be a new offering, limited to 450, sold on a first come basis. They will be numbered and sales will be limited to 5 per person. The price for the Flying Mare is \$400.00 each, no discount, cash or credit card only. Sale will start on April 20, 1993 and close June 20, 1993 or when number 450 is sold, which ever comes first.

As with all pressed pieces, there are no two pieces identical. There will be fractional differences between each piece when comparing them side by side.

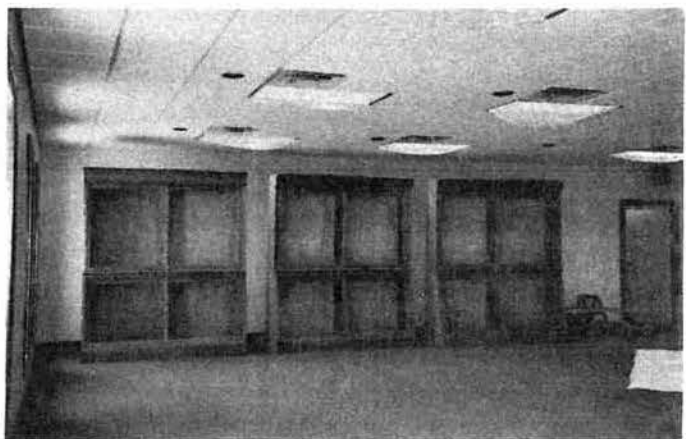

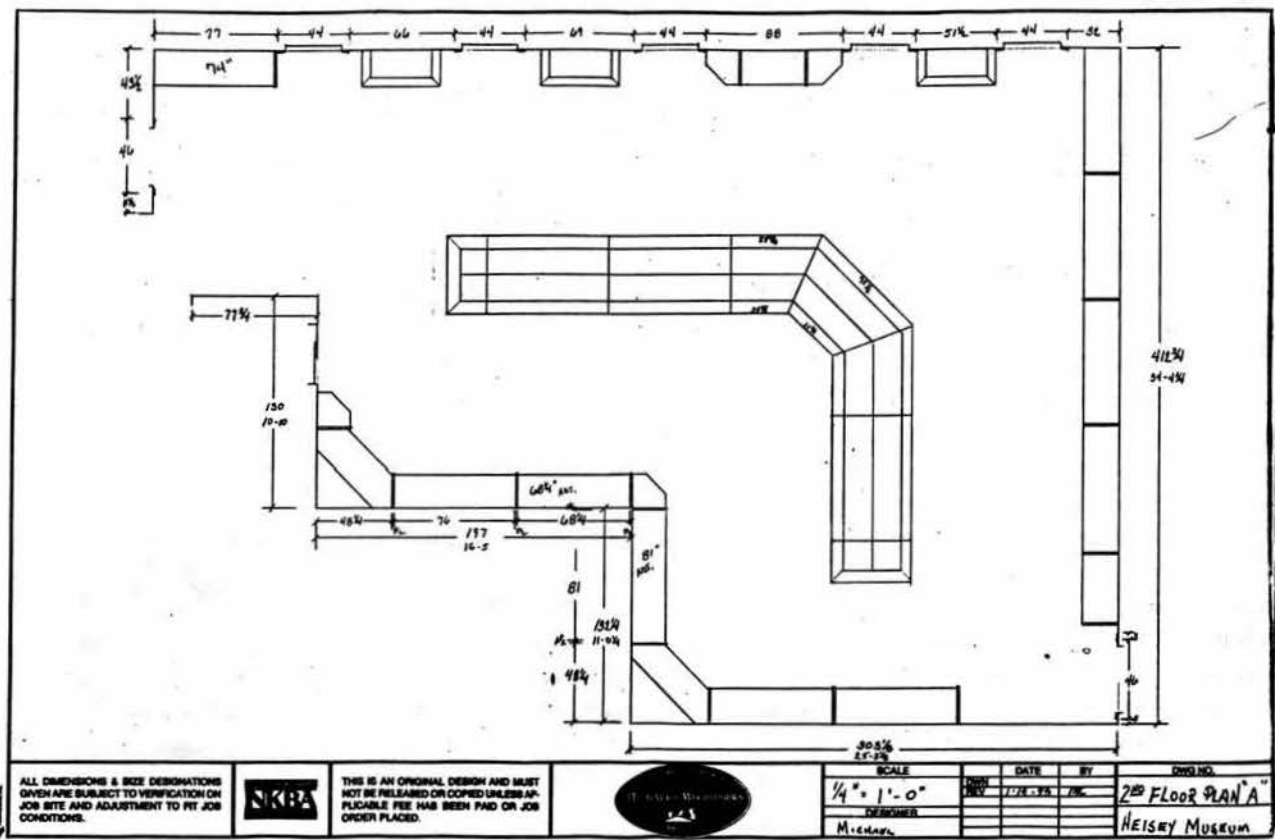
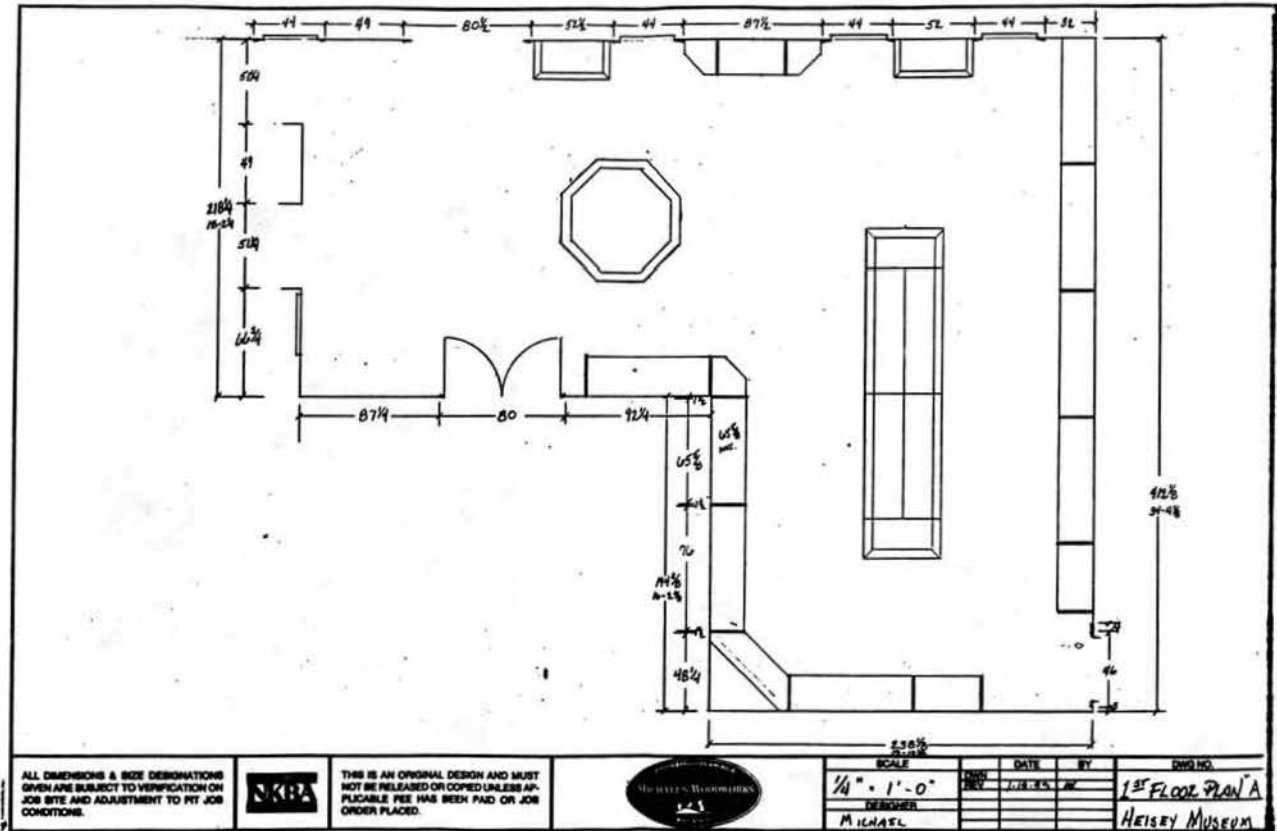
What's next? Will the Flying Mare be as successful in *Lavender Ice*, the beautiful color developed exclusively for HCA?

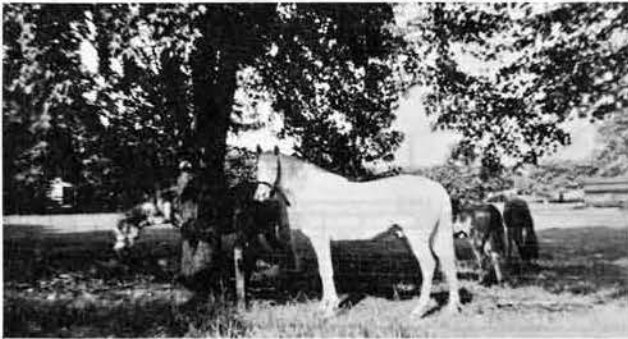
HEISEY AND HORSES

The Heisey family's love of horses and the history of their involvement with horses is truly an interesting story. As well, the influence this passion had in the production of horse related glass items was tremendous.

During recent conversations with Mary Heisey Merrill, Clarence Heisey's daughter, Anne Heisey Harris, Clarence's grand daughter, and Margie Evans, Clarence Heisey's longtime secretary, I gained some insight into the connection between the Heisey's and these beautiful four legged creatures.

E. Wilson Heisey, president of A. H. Heisey & Company from 1922-1942, owned horses but because his wife objected to having them at their home, he stabled them on the glass factory property. The picture below, donated by Mary Dennis, was taken at the plant by a glass worker and shows one of Wilson's horses. Margie Evans recalls that this particular white horse's name was



Ghost. Mrs. Evans also remembers that Wilson Heisey's horses performed at Newark's Idlewild Park. Idlewild Park, an amusement park and race track, was located on the site of the prehistoric indian mound called the *Great Circle Mound* – today it is a state park.

According to Mrs. Evans, Clarence's interest for the gentle beasts began when Mrs. Augustus Heisey took the younger children in the family on a trip to Denver, Co. It was there that T. Clarence Heisey, the youngest of the children, became acquainted with horses and began his life long love affair with them.

In adulthood, Clarence not only owned horses, he showed his horses in the most prestigious horse shows in the country. His home on Granville Street was home to his family as well as a trainer and a stable full of show horses. According to his daughter, Mary, Clarence originally named his horse stable *The Rambling Pear Stables* but because so many people mispronounced the family name, he renamed the stable *Hi-C Stables*.

Mary and brother Tim learned to ride but Mary's allergies to horses limited her involvement with them. Tim rode the horses in the top rated shows and won

many championships. Margie Evans took care of entering the horses in the various competitions and Tim would fly from prep school to the scheduled shows to perform with the horses.

It is said that Clarence's most famous horse, *Goodness Gracious*, was so named because that is what Tim exclaimed the first time he saw the horse. Between the years 1932 and 1935 *Goodness Gracious* won eight major championships including International champion 1935.



Rexanna Heisey Peavine and *Cocobolo* were two other champion showhorses owned by Clarence Heisey.

Though the Clarence Heisey house itself is no longer in the Heisey family, Anne Heisey Harris lives in the famous stable which she converted into a beautifully unique home. The stall which belonged to *Goodness Gracious* is now a bathroom. It contains lots of memorabilia from the famous horse's life.

Besides the elaborate stable where trainer William Lancaster Smith maintained an apartment under the same roof with the championship horses, there were other horse barns located beyond the stable. Once the site of barns, a training area and pastures, the property beyond the stable was purchased by the City of Newark in the early 1960s and is the site of Newark High School campus.

The first horse item offered by the Heisey Company was the horse head

bookend. Designed by Ray Cobel, it appeared in 1937 in catalog 212-17 on page 61. It was pictured with other miscellaneous items, such as spoons and ladles.

It is no surprise that so many horse figurines, horse



related items, and horse related etchings were designed and produced during the years that Clarence Heisey was president of A. H. Heisey & Co.

In the early 1940s, Heisey Company Sales Manager, Rod Irwin, corresponded with famous designer Royal Hickman. The subject of many of their letters was glass animal designs. Both men were interested in coming up with some good horse designs to present to Clarence. They felt horse related items would be good sellers. The letters below are just a sample of the interesting correspondence between the two men.

*Royal Hickman
Box 42 Dundee, IL
Sunday, 12/5/43*

Dear Rod,

I am expressing you in the morning two colts as a pair, to be sold as pair and feel confident they will sell. You remember I had the sketch at Newark with me. They are amusing enough to put themselves over I think.

Am also shipping the burmese cat, (paperweight as Clarence calls it.)

Cheerio

Dec. 10, 1943

Dear Hick,

Yesterday I received the two plaster models of the colts and the model of the leopard or wild cat or what have you. In one way I like these colts very much and in another way I don't. I think the one with the head facing front has too much "goiter" for a neck but maybe you made it that way. Clarence has been out of town & has not seen these, so I will give you his reaction when he returns.

The horse being discussed in the letters seems to be the Filly. The Filly design must have remained close to

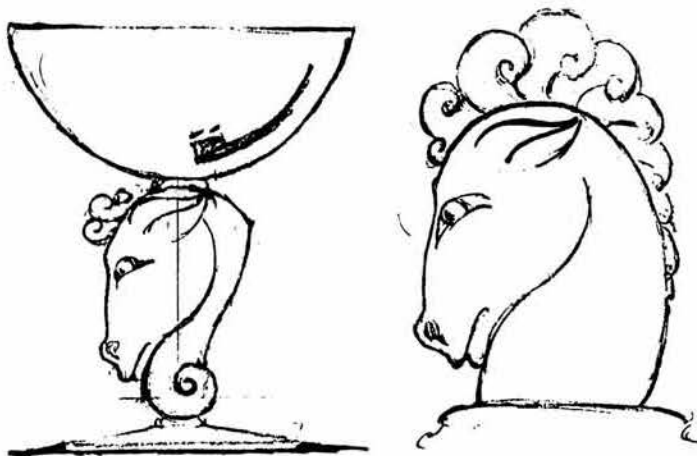


Mr. Hickman's design because the Heisey Filly was produced with that "goiter" neck Rod Irwin described. The *Burmese Cat* he referred to as a *leopard* and *wild cat* eventually became known as the Tiger Paperweight.

Royal Hickman designed many of Heisey's glass animals, including many of the horses. He also designed animal related items like cocktails and decanter stoppers. The excerpt below is another example of the beginning of an idea for some new items.

Dear Rod

... Here is a rough and I mean rough sketch of horse-head CT and CT shaker stopper. There are so many horsey people. I think this would go well. What do you think? Hick

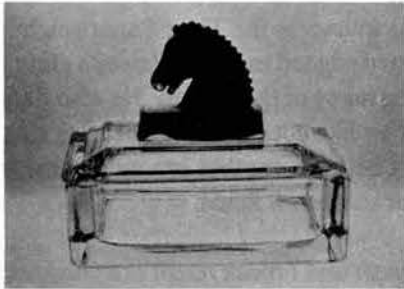


The two pieces were eventually produced by the Heisey Company but the final design varied somewhat from the original designs, as you can easily see by comparing the sketch to the photo below:



#5066 Horsehead cocktail and #4225 decanter with #132 horsehead stopper.

Other animal related items included #1489-1/2 Puritan Horse head cigarette box & ashtray.



In addition to the actual horses and horse related items, Heisey produced many items, mostly barware pieces, which were decorated with horse theme etchings. Carl Cobel, son of Ray Cobel, designed many silhouette etchings including:

- #462 Fox chase 1933-44
- #463 Equestrian 1933-44
- #467 Tally Ho 1933-52

Carl may have designed many more of the horse theme etchings, however, it is not always possible to determine exactly who was the designer. The list of other horse theme etchings includes:

- #1 Sport plate etching 1928-33
- #517 Winchester '73 1950-52
- #498 Modern Polo Player 1937-44
- #481 Lancaster etch 1937-44
- #9038 Tim Heisey on Goodness Gracious
- #4222 Horse shoe
- #4224 Steeplechase

The #481 Lancaster etch (pictured above) looks remarkably like the photo, (top right) on loan from Anne Heisey Harris, of Wm. Lancaster Smith on *Cocobolo*.

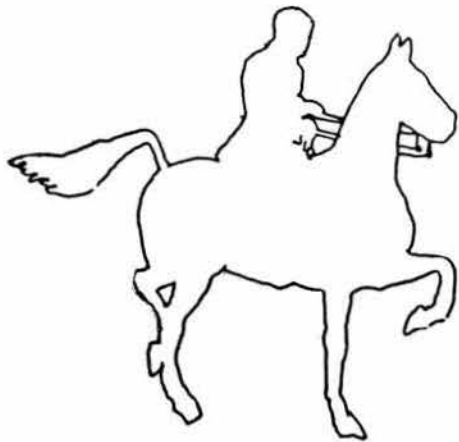
The photo (right) also shows trainer Wm. Lancaster Smith on Rexanna H. Peavine. Note the similarity between it and the #463 Equestrian etch.

The #9038 Tim Heisey on Goodness Gracious etch design may have been inspired by this photo of Tim

Heisey on the show horse named *Goodness Gracious*. The similarity between the photo and the etching is striking.

Among the animals listed above, only a few were produced in colors. The three colts and the plug horse

were produced in Cobalt. The three colts, the plug horse, the Clydesdale, the Flying Mare and the Horsehead bookend were produced in Amber.

The Plug Horse is probably the most well known of the Heisey horses. Company records of a July 1941 sales meeting indicate that the salesmen liked the cartoon style horse and wanted to call him *Oscar*. He is also known by collectors as Sparky. Today, no matter what you call him, he is the HCA convention souvenir. Since 1977, the *Plug Horse* has been produced in a different color each year and sold the club's convention souvenir.

Heisey's Flying Mare, the most impressive of their glass horses, continues to be a favorite of many collectors. A. H. Heisey & Co. made this magnificent animal in the early 1950s in Amber, Crystal, and Sultana. Imperial also produced a small quantity of the Flying Mare in the mid 1960s and again in the early 1980s.

The production of the limited edition Lavender Ice Flying Mare, by Dalzell-Viking for HCA, will mark a milestone for the club. It will be the first time since HCA purchased the Heisey molds that the *Flying Mare* mold has been used for a production piece. Until Dalzell-Viking proved that they could successfully turn out the mare, it was thought that it would never be done. The level of anticipation surrounding the production of the Flying Mare in Lavender Ice is unbelievable.

HCA is truly fortunate that the Heisey family's love for horses carried over into the design and production of such a fabulous collection of glass horses and other interesting horse related items. There must be just as many *Horse people* around today and as in years gone by.
