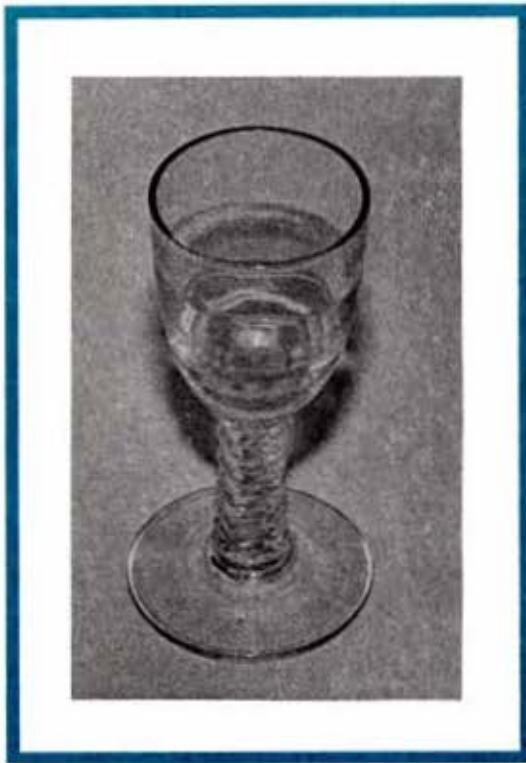

## Sam's Scribbles

As I write this column I am sitting down to relax after a very hectic and exciting weekend. There was only one big disappointment in the whole weekend for me—that I did not win the big prize last night at the Cadillac Lincoln Dinner. In last month's column I reported that we still had fifty tickets to sell. I am very pleased to report that we sold out thanks to a lot of hard work and support from our members. John Eshelman sold the last ticket some time around 2 p.m. on Saturday. The last two names to be drawn at the dinner were local people (not HCA members) both of whom I believe had purchased tickets every year. They decided to split the \$25,000 so they both went home winners. Everyone seemed to have a great time at the party. Frank Frye and his committee did a superb job on this project. The other event of the weekend was equally successful and exciting thanks to Bob Rarey and Jim Clark, who co-chaired this year's benefit auction. This was the biggest and best auction held by HCA. Both of these projects require hundreds and hundreds of people-hours to make them as successful as they are. If you helped—thank you, your efforts are appreciated.

Now for the numbers. The auction grossed more than \$98,000. Donated items brought about \$8,000 for the Endowment Fund, including the Vaseline Locket on Chain Pitcher which sold for \$3,100. The commission earmarked for the general fund will be about \$19,000 with very little expenses. The Cadillac Lincoln Dinner netted about \$19,000 after expenses and this will go into the Endowment Fund. This adds up to about \$46,000 coming into HCA.

On top of this, the Lavender Ice Rabbit Family sale is going well. The quality of the sets is excellent so you'll want to add them to your collection. The Special Projects Committee, chaired by Charlie Wade, handled this sale. He has done this so often now that he makes it look easy. Again, it takes a lot of dedication from volunteers and the museum staff to make limited edition sales run smoothly. While Lavender Ice is on your mind, plan for the next limited edition—the Tropical Fish Piece. People are already "oohing and ahing" over the sample in the Museum Shop. The item will go on sale in June for \$250. Ken Dalzell has extended an invitation to members to view the production of these beauties during convention week. Amy Jo Jones has worked this into the busy schedule.

Many of you will remember Miriam for the "beautiful bowls" she presented at our 1991 and 1992 annual meetings. These bowls were accompanied by a generous check and then were passed around for others to add to the "beauty" with contributions. I am glad that Miriam was able to see and enjoy our completed museum this past June. Miriam had also donated many fine pieces to the museum and we have been advised by the attorney for the estate that HCA will be the beneficiary of her entire glass collection. What a great tribute to a wonderful lady. ♦

### Focus on the Collection—#1483 and #4083 Stanhope

The latest purchase by the museum's Acquisitions Committee is the #1483 Stanhope cordial that made it's "debut" in the March auction. This unusual piece has a Zircon foot and bowl (with Saturn optic) and a Crystal stem.

Stanhope, named for Lady Stanhope, owner of the famous diamond of the same name, is a pressed ware line (#1483) complemented by a line of stemware (#4083) with blown bowls. The line was designed by Walter Von Nesson, a widely respected Dutch architect and designer. The pressed ware was made from 1936 to 1941, while the blown items lasted only until 1938. The latter were reintroduced for a brief time during the last years of the company.

The design features deep, swag-like indentations that circle each piece. On tableware the swags are on the lower portion; on plates the design shows from the bottom. The stemware line features the swags top to bottom on the stem. The most unusual feature for which Stanhope is known are the plastic knobs inserted in the circular handles of the glassware.

Heisey called them "round knobs" for flat handles and "T knobs" for rod-like handles. The plastic pieces came in such colors as red, blue, black, yellow and ivory and were screwed together, allowing for their removal. Heisey also worked with General Electric on a Stanhope coffee set wherein the knobs matched the color of the tray and coffee maker.

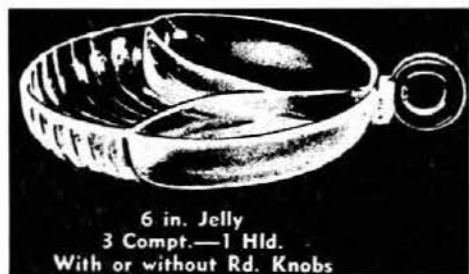
The pattern was made mostly in Crystal while table items are known in Sahara, a candlestick in experimental light blue and stemware in Zircon. Both Stanhope lines were used for cuttings and etchings. Look for #490 Maytime, #491 Frosty Dawn and #494 Swingtime etchings; #885 Incognito and #886 King's Ransom cuttings. Pieces are also featured with frosted swags.

While Stanhope was well received by the design trade, it apparently was not a good seller. Plans are known for additional pieces that were never completed, such as a cocktail shaker and mustard jar.

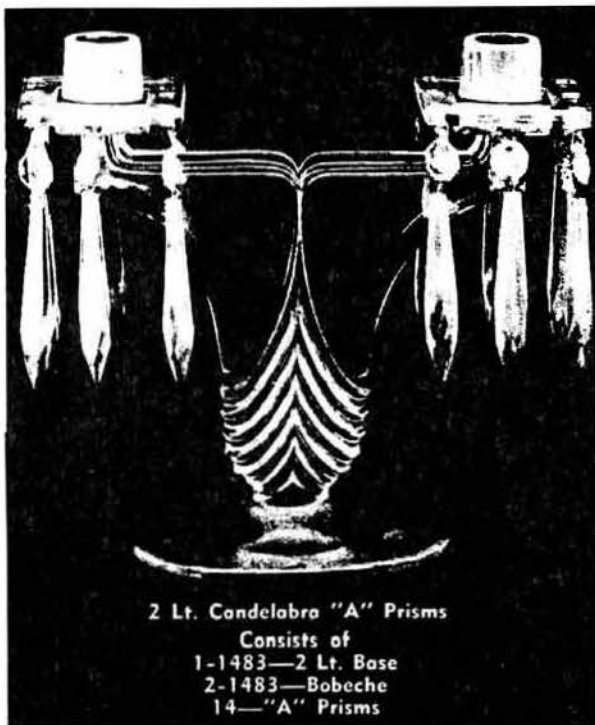
There are several pieces of Stanhope in the museum's collection. Look for a selection of pressed ware in the Sahara section in Gallery 2. Stemware examples are on view in Gallery 1, including a selection of goblets with unknown cuttings. The recent, and auspicious, addition in on view in the cordials cabinet in Room 1 of the King House, next to a Crystal example. ♦

## Everyone was a Winner!

No thanks to the weatherman, we made it out to Newark, Ohio for the March meeting this year. As you may remember, our trip out last year was aborted by the blizzard of 93. We stalled somewhere in the mountains of southwestern Pennsylvania, an area that gives new meaning to the word, "Gawdforsaken." I will say no more. If you don't remember my tale you're out of luck. HCA's annual All Heisey Auction and Cadillac Lincoln Dinner held for the benefit of HCA's Museum Endowment Fund was once more the focus of our trip. Heavy snow (is there really any other kind?) had been predicted all across Pennsylvania the day we were to leave. I said, "Damn the torpedoes, full speed ahead," and Helen, my wife said, "Good Lord, I'm going to travel with an idiot!" Getting to the auction and the dinner this time was a point of honor with me.

We checked into our hotel and then stopped at the museum on our way to the auction. I had no business but I like to look at it and marvel at all that's been accomplished. I make it a point to get in everyone's way while I'm there, first because it lets them know *I'm* a part of it and, second, it's what I do best.

Then it was on to the Apple Tree Auction Center to reserve our auction seats and, as a member of that group, put in time at a meeting of the Endowment Fund Committee. I'm not sure why I'm on the committee. I'm not good at discussing money. It does not come naturally to me. *Dividends, interest, equity*, et al were foreign words on the side of the tracks where I grew up. I can only assume the reports offered at the meeting were excellent as everyone else was attentive and nodded their heads in approval in the right places. I thought I'd shone when the committee was polled for suggestions for fund raisers. I said, "Let's put on a show!" What the heck, it works in the movies. My idea got a cold reception. Perhaps Ohio is too far removed from Broadway. I'll bet I was the only one in the room who knew what *My Fair Lady* grossed when it played New York. Mercifully, the start of the auction put an end to the meeting and saved me further embarrassment.

Everyone was upbeat as the auction started. Two days of nothing but Heisey glass to look forward to—more than a thousand pieces awaiting bids. The glass was available for preview in the anteroom of the auction center (Apple Tree donated its services). We got to examine the items we planned to bid on as well as handle pieces too expensive for our pocketbooks. Sam Schhaidt, his group and the Dayton Area Heisey Club run a great auction. It's fast and, because you're among friends, it's light. Bob Rarey highlights some of the prices realized on page 10, the list follows.

I learned a lot about auctions this time out. I'll share it with you here.

When the auctioneer is taking bids from your side of the room, it will appear that he is looking directly at you. Don't panic. Stay frozen in place and it won't cost you a cent no matter how hard he stares or how often he seems to be pointing his finger your way. I did well though I did break under the strain just once so I took home a pair of salt and pepper shakers for my goblet collection.

You must accept that oftentimes bidding will begin beyond the bid limit you set on an item you intend to buy. Don't be discouraged. Pushy bidders are just showing off. They play "Auction Chicken." The idea is to sucker others into bidding and drop out at the last minute. Don't despair, the game is open to everyone. It's a lot of fun. You can play but, until you get the hang of it, you might want to be sure you have a couple of active credit cards on hand.

Another thing, when the auctioneer holds up a piece and asks, "Who'll give me \$10 for this item?" you should know going in that he doesn't mean what he says. I raised my hand and I'll be damned if he didn't go on and accept more money from someone else.

Make use of his information and you'll have a great time at the next HCA auction. It was fun this year, especially when the bidding got heavy and the excitement mounted. As much as the auction itself, I enjoyed the refreshment counter. Great food and plenty of it—and there was lots of time to get up and move about when the expensive stuff was up for bid.

On Saturday we assembled early at the auction house again for the HCA quarterly meeting. I don't get to as many quarterly meetings as I would like but, even so, those I do attend are steeped in a Sparacio tradition. I always second the motion that the minutes of the previous meeting be dispensed with. It's an important job and it's something I'm proud to do. I don't know how they manage when I'm not there.

The talented auctioneers whizzed through the Saturday session and it was over by three in the afternoon. This gave revelers plenty of time to freshen up and prepare themselves for the evening's Cadillac Lincoln Dinner. And there was more than cars and a dinner involved—there's also money and a gambling casino. Talk about a bargain! Nobody goes home a loser. I won't keep you in suspense—I won one of the dinners.

You may have noticed that I judge everything by food. Feed me well and an affair will get top rating. I give the Cadillac Lincoln Dinner four stars—one star for quality, one for variety, one for quantity and one for service (as a serve yourself buffet, how could it miss). This affair was in danger of losing a half star when our table was called up to the buffet dead last, but Helen said I mustn't hold a grudge.

After the dinner the drawing began for the winners of the money prizes and the grand prize. You may think sitting in place as they draw two hundred names would be boring—and you'd be right. The \$1,000 prize, the 190th ticket drawn, belonged to Tom Schwartzberger.

This led way to the five remaining ticket holders who were ceremoniously seated at a Champagne Table so we could gawk at them and hate them in unison. ## From the Archives

My chance emergence into 1957 came like a dash of cold water. From the warm experience of becoming acquainted with T. Clarence Heisey, I stumbled upon the files for 1957. This carton contained not T. Clarence Heisey's correspondence but that of the sales manager, Emmet Olson, at that fateful time in Heisey history. From reading letters reflecting the excitement of record sales and promotional tactics of the late 40s, curtailed only by employment difficulties, I am now encountering problems of all sorts. It isn't pleasant. Persons I had vicariously accompanied through the difficulties of the war years are now at loggerheads. One of the cases I feel badly about is that of Joe Lower, sales rep in the New York office.

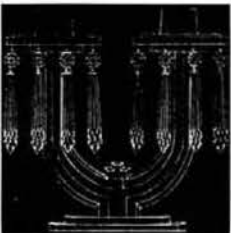
I first met Joe in 35 when there was discussion between Rod Irwin and T. Clarence regarding Joe Lower's promotion. The correspondence continues through his short army career to his eventual promotion to head of the New York office. By 1944 there was correspondence with Joe Lower in relation to meetings in New York. It was Joe who attributed the production of the donkey (in addition to the Republican elephant) to Tim and it was he who contributed to the change of design of #1503 large shell plates.

By 1957 Lower is feeling the pressure of poor quality control, a slowdown in shipment, erratic filling of orders and complaints from major New York customers, Bloomingdale's, Altman's and Macy's. One senses frustration in the letters between Olson and Lower. As early as March of 1957 Joe wrote:

I have had no answer to the following telegram sent to you ten days ago:

"We owe candalabras (sic) on long standing orders almost every account—some are wanting to cancel and order elsewhere—what is the situation and what should I tell them? It has been a struggle to get these on order in competition with imports and seems to me it might be best to forget candalabras and put my effort on other items. advise"

It was most important to have information or I would not have telegraphed. My



business in this highly competitive market has not been developed and maintained by ignoring my customer's requests for information and service and several customers need to know what is being done about their orders for candalabras and Hostess Helper sets. I am in the middle on this thing and it isn't pleasant to keep stalling and making excuses as to why I can't give them an intelligent answer.

The Williamsburg Inn Williamsburg, Va. needs the three dozen Candalabra on order since January. These are needed for a special event and it makes me appear negligent in not giving them information I promised them two weeks ago.

Bloomington Bros; lost a \$330.00 sale of HEISEY glass this week because I sat here seemingly indifferent to their request as to delivery of 4044 candalabra which were needed to complete an order that was to go to So. America....

and so on. (3/23/57)

In July Lower writes:

This past week I have had at least three stores that wanted to return bad ware and bad shapes. The worst complaint is on the #1519 14-inch Torte Plate. It is coming in shaped like a Gardenia Bowl!! This is serious and the item won't sell for a plate unless it is shaped like a plate the same as we have always done. (7/14/57)

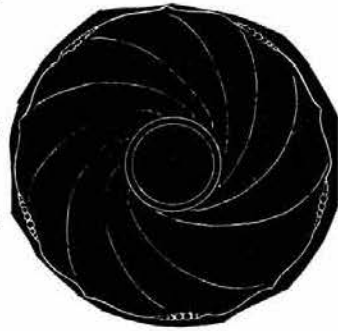
Later in the year, in response to a letter from Lower regarding an order by Bloomington's, Olson writes:

Dear Joe:

In reference to the many items involved in making shipments we wish to advise as follows.

- 1st. Bent Trays for #516 etching—have been ordered and will ship as soon as they come in and we can rush the etching through for shipment.
- 2nd. Your order #4764 has been sent through and we will rush shipment.
- 3rd. Silverware etc., will be taken care of so that we can get shipments moving.
- 4th. Prisms, Salt and Pepper tops etc., are being ordered rush so as to speed shipments.
- 5th. but not least. Please do not develop an ulcer because when you do I also get one hell of a headache.

Good luck to you and keep the good work up. Its tough sometimes but we have always been pretty good at weathering the storm. (9/26/57). ♦



## 1994 All Heisey Benefit Auction Update

The benefit auction is now 1994 history and as anticipated, it was a record-setting event. The 1,000 lots in the sale sold for a total of approximately \$98,600. Included in this total were seventy-two donated lots, proceeds going to the Endowment Fund, which sold for approximately \$8,000.

The highlight of the sale was the donated #160 Locket on Chain pitcher in Vaseline that sold for \$3,100. A donated Stanhope cordial with Zircon bowl sold for \$1450. Three Moongleam Favor vases totaled \$1760; two #1519 Waverly 6-inch deep epergnettes with Heisey Rose etch, \$2,200; #3440 Portsmouth goblet in Tangerine, \$1,300; a pair of #1485 Saturn 2-lite candleblocks in Zircon, \$550; Heisey mail box (no brackets) with Windsor cut, \$800; frosted Tropical Fish piece, \$1,100; a donated #310 Ring Band seven-piece water set in Custard \$700; U8024 Pineapple Stem sherry, \$600; a marked Fish Bowl, \$500; Tangerine Favor vase, \$525; Flamingo Favor vase \$600.

I would like to express my thanks and gratitude to all the volunteers who helped to make this auction the great success that it was. To the donors, consignors, buyers and especially Co-Chair Jim Clark and his group who set up and handled the auction glass. Again, thank you all. ♦

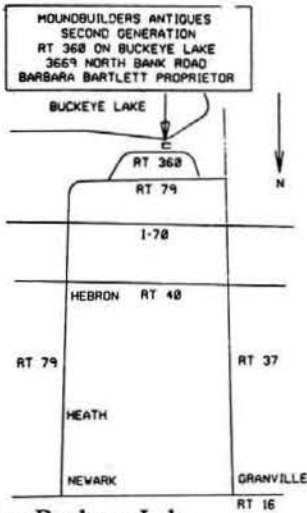

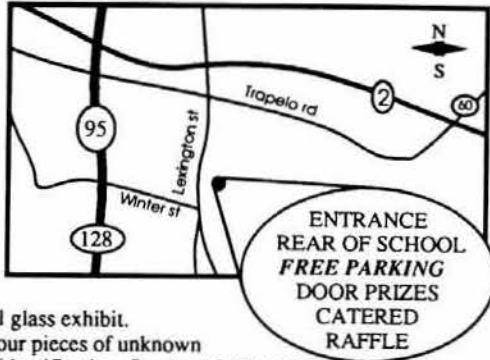

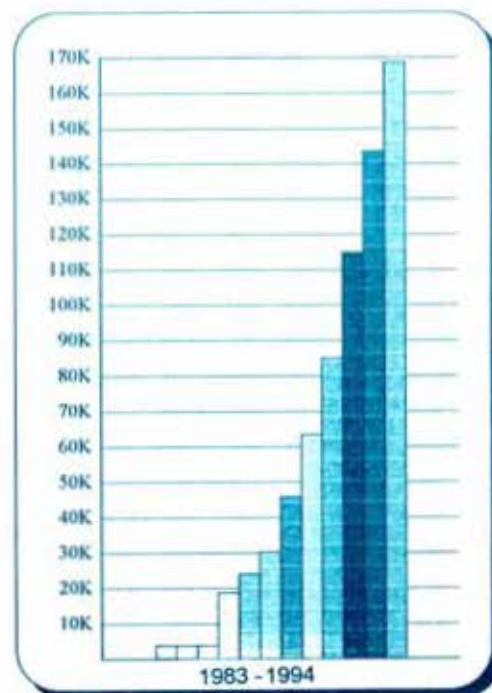
