FROM THE ARCHIVES—MORE ON T. CLARENCE

Again I turn to the packet of correspondence to and from Rod Irwin and, once more, I learn more of the character of T. Clarence Heisey. I never, and of this I am sure my readers will agree, seem to tire of reading things he has written. He had so many facets to his personality, and here is another.

In a portion of a 1945 Christmas letter to Rod Irwin, T.C. wrote a tribute to George Patton. Hollywood would have liked it. But the letter reveals more than his admiration of "Old Blood and Guts." The next to last paragraph of the portion I have chosen to include is T.C. Heisey, through and through. At the risk of divulging my pre-Vietnam War orientation I add: aren't you glad you collect this man's glass?



In the more than fifty years that we have enjoyed this wonderful life of ours, we know of no man who has so vividly shown us that the "Land Of Make Believe" in which we as children and even as men love to dwell, is a reality after all. George Patton was a swashbuckling troubadour, a showman par excellence, a poet, a man of letters, a devotee of the great outdoors, a soldier's Beau Ideal, a man who embraced all the qualities of greatness found in Agamemnon, Ulysses, Horatio, Hector, Aeneas, George Washington, Daniel Boone, Hobson, in fact all the ancient and modern heroes were wrapped up in this one man. He breathed truth into our mythical heroes and events with exception of Jonah and the Whale. Even Superman couldn't laugh that one off. He was a man of strong religious convictions indicative of his poems, such as:

From pride and foolish confidence,
From every weakening creed;
From the dread fear of fearing,
Protect us, Lord, and lead.

In fact, the name of Patton gives every red-blooded American the thrill he received when he first told his wife that she was the greatest gal in the world and still believes it. The name gives you the joy when you hear the voice of a dear, dear friend whom you haven't seen for years, or the kick you get when you listen to your college Alma Mater, or when you stand to the Stars Spangled Banner or the Stars and Stripes Forever.

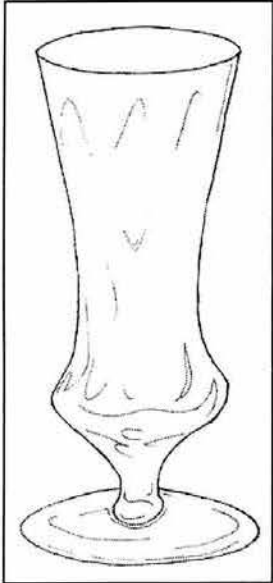

Just this: George Patton was a man of action and from his spirit we take inspiration to give you the smartest and best styled glassware that ever came out of the furnaces of A. H. SOMETHING OLD, SOMETHING NEW

This month, in a feeble attempt to match the excitement of the upcoming convention, I'm going to report on something new. I hasten to add, "new to me," because someone is sure to say, "Big deal, I've seen lots of them."



Something new

Stem collectors are aware of the no. 3325 Rampul stem (formerly U-8023 in *Heisey Stemware* by Bradley, Ryan & Ryan). The Bredehofts reported the actual number for this pattern in their *Encyclopedia of Heisey Glassware* and gave more detail than had previously been available.

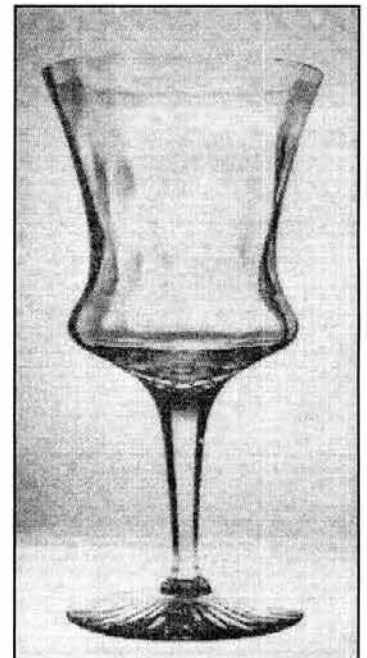
"Rampul" is not a Heisey name, it was given to the stem by researchers because its bowl matched that of Ramshorn (3365). It also lacks Ramshorn's pressed stem and has a pulled stem instead—hence the "Rampul" designation. Rampul also lacks the distinct "Ramshorn" optic of the Ramshorn line and uses the more traditional diamond optic featured in much of Heisey's stem lines.

Rampul, as noted, has a pulled stem. A pulled stem is made when the glassblower extends a glob of glass from the base of the bowl to form a stem after which a foot is slapped on to complete the piece (forgive me for being so technical.) Stem "experts" hate pulled stems because they invariably lose their credentials when asked to identify them.

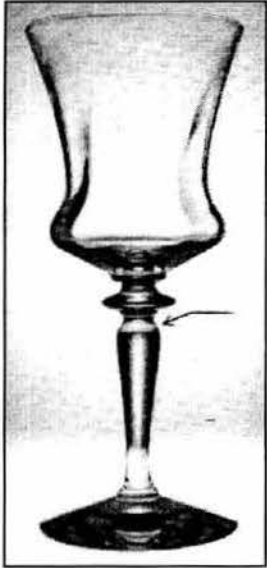
In *Heisey Stemware* it is noted that Rampul was advertised in a 1927 issue of *National Geographic* without a pattern number noted. This tells us that the stem, though scarce, was indeed intended for market. The *Encyclopedia of Heisey Glassware* makes note of the Heisey price list and the items offered. They were the goblet, cocktail, saucer champagne, sherbet, oyster cocktail and parfait. It's scarcity tells us that, though it was introduced, it never had wide distribution (perhaps other pictures in that issue of *National Geographic* diverted readers' attention).

Rampul is known in Flamingo and Hawthorne with the Flamingo pieces listed in checker optic only. I've only ever seen the goblet in Hawthorne (it is pictured in *Heisey Stemware* with a cut stem).

Last month a retired Heisey dealer friend came by to show me a set of parfaits he'd recently come upon. He thought I might be able to identify them. The beautiful Hawthorne color screamed HEISEY but the bowl was a puzzle. My first thought was Ramshorn but both the color and the optic were wrong (not to mention the pulled stem). The second thought was of Gayoso (no. 3312) but the base flare of the bowl was much more exaggerated. When the choice finally narrowed down to Rampul, I said to myself, "Nah, what would Rampul parfaits be doing on the east coast 500 miles from Mecca?"

I have not been able to answer that question but without further ado, allow me to introduce the lovely, the exciting, the Hawthorne, the Ramshorn bowly and the pulled stemmy Rampul parfait!

The drawing was done by my strikingly handsome twin brother Vince. He said I had to say that or he wouldn't do the drawing (I would have done it myself but my Etch-A-Sketch is in the shop for repairs).

Visit us at convention and have a look.

Not to change the subject but I promised I would never again mention the blankety blank marble that was lodged in my tulip vase. Unfortunately I've been taken to task for not revealing the method by which fellow HCA Board Member, Mike Rosenberger, removed that infamous marble. You'd surely be amazed, as I was, at how vehement some members have become about this.

"What are you, some kind of nut? We suffered over a year through your wailing about that damn marble and now all you've got to say is, IT'S OUT!"

That was one of the milder reactions.

"There are people waiting for my order to unscrew your knee caps!" was one of the milder threats.

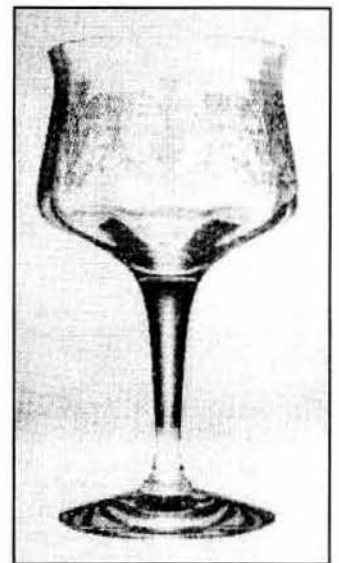
I got the message but you'll have to bear with me; I'm not mechanically inclined—true, I've mastered elastic bands but I'm still befuddled by pencil sharpeners. As it was told to me, Mike, after first protecting the inside of the vase, drilled down into the marble with a very long electric drill. Actually, the electric drill wasn't very long but the spiral thing he put into it to drill with was. Apparently there are stores that sell very long drilling whatchamacallits. Out of curiosity I searched but was unable to find one in my neighborhood. Our local hardware store was not very helpful and I found the holier-than-thou suggestion of where I might go, very unseemly.

Once the marble was hit with the drill, it broke into pieces and fell out when the vase was upended. Perhaps if our editor pressed him, Mike could supply the *Heisey News* with a description that will satisfy more technically minded readers. Not to make light of Mike's talent because it truly was appreciated, I have a suspicion that the vase simply gave up in fear—it didn't want to get hit with a heavy rubber mallet yet one more time.

To prove to those who've had enough that this saga is truly over, I will add that I sold the newly marbleless vase at an antiques show about a month ago. No. 160 LOCKET ON CHAIN—THE MYSTERY PATTERN

The collector of Heisey toothpick holders is fascinated by several rare patterns namely Winged Scroll no. 1280 Emerald, no. 325 Pillows, no. 337 Touraine, no. 1776 Kalonyal, no. 357 Prison Stripe, no. 356 Queen Anne and no. 433 Greek Key. However, the one holding the greatest fascination is no. 160 Locket on Chain. The owner of this toothpick holder is fortunate as it is the rarest of all Heisey toothpick holders.

The acquisition of a ruby and gold Locket on Chain by a friend several years ago prompted me to research the background of this rare Heisey pattern. The success of this research depended on two factors:

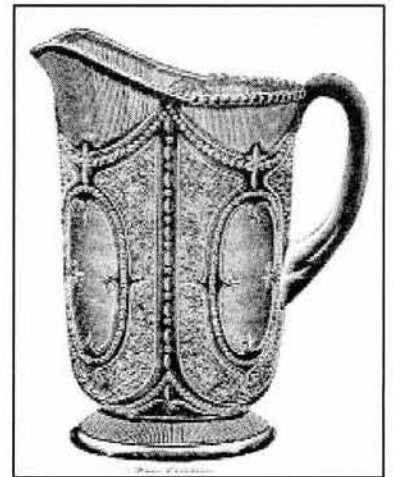
1. A survey of the known Locket on Chain toothpick holders in the collections of members of the National Toothpick Holder Collectors Society (NTHCS) and those in the collection of the Heisey Collectors of America, Inc.
2. Research in the archives of the National Heisey Glass Museum in Newark, Ohio by its archivist Don Valdes for data relating to the Heisey pattern no. 160 Locket on Chain. The museum houses extensive records and memorabilia dating back to the founding of A.H. Heisey and Company in 1895 with its first patterns sold in 1896, no. 1200 Cut Block and no. 1201 Fandango, toothpick holders were part of these table sets.

Based on my fifty years of research with seventy publications in national and international journals the desired factors were not achieved mainly due to the lack of response by owners of Locket on Chain Toothpick holders and the inability to get any documented information on this pattern from the Heisey archives.

This leads one to assume, despite repeated requests in the publications of the National Toothpick Holder Collectors Society and the Heisey Collectors of America for information on the Locket on Chain pattern, the number of toothpick holders in this pattern

is very limited and the prices they demand on today's market is justified. Toothpick holders apparently hold a low priority by collectors of Heisey pattern glass. The 1996 publication *A.H. Heisey and Company, A Brief History* by historian Thomas G. Felt makes no reference to the Locket on Chain pattern yet all the new patterns from 1898 to 1900 are mentioned.

There is much discussion on the actual year of introduction of pattern no. 160 Locket on Chain. A recent publication *A.H. Heisey and Company—A Chronology Part II* in the *Heisey News* June 1995, Tom Felt mentions the year of possible introduction of pattern no. 160 as 1897; no further reference is made to this pattern in future articles by this author.



Recent correspondence with Tom Felt has provided his thoughts based on this extensive research of Heisey glass. His letter of February 17, 1997, "Your reference to Locket on Chain as the "mystery" pattern is not inapt. It is one of the patterns that we have the least information on. Although Heisey advertised most of their early lines in the trade journals, Locket on Chain was an exception; it also seems to have escaped notice by reporters. Our best guess is that it was introduced as early as 1897; but that is actually based on another guess, namely that Vaseline (or Canary) was first made in 1897. Since Locket on Chain is known in Vaseline and in emerald (which was introduced in 1899), that at least gives us a ball park range of dates. Further, since Locket on Chain is never marked with the Diamond H, that suggests that production was prior to 1900 when the trademark first began to be used," provides reasonable assumptions on the status of Locket on Chain year of introduction.



A survey of the literature on this pattern Millare (1940), Kamm (1940, 1954), Revi (1964), Vogel (1969), Peterson (1970), Unitt (1974), McCain (1979), Jenks and Luna (1990) use an illustration in an undated (1897) A.H. Heisey catalogue for introduction year 1896. Heathcock (1974, 1977) lists 1898, Jones & Jones (1982), Bredehoft (1993) and Schamel (1994) list 1900, NTHCS (1992) lists 1900-1902. Since a majority of authors including the current Heisey historian (Felt 1995) list 1897 as the year of introduction of pattern no. 160, it appeared to have been marketed for a few years from 1897-1909.

The pattern was produced in clear, Emerald, Vaseline and milk white, a color currently unknown in toothpick holders. Clear pieces were purchased by the Oriental Glass Company, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, stained ruby, some gilded with gold and sold under their name, Jenks and Luna (1990).

The pattern familiar to all toothpick holder collectors consists of four large beaded oval medallions suspended on a beaded looped chain which separates each medallion vertically continuing to the base where smaller beads unite all the panels in chain link fashion. The top is beaded, with the base quite smooth, except a fine lineolated band, it is never marked.

Based on information provided by members of the National Toothpick Holder Collector's Society and HCA, Locket on Chain toothpick holders in their collections were Crystal 9; 2 were chipped or cracked, 6 were reported by HCA members. Emerald and Emerald/gold 5; 1 chipped on rim, 4 reported by NTHCS members; Ruby stain/gold 4; one with chip, 3 were NTHCS members, Canary or Vaseline 2; one with chip reported by HCA members.



I am sure the 19 reported represents a reasonable sample of the number of Locket on Chain toothpick holders in collections in North America. Perhaps many others exist, tragically we probably will never obtain an accurate count of this rare Heisey pattern. The author would appreciate being informed of the existence of others not included in this report. (Thomas R. Manley, R. #1, Box 269, Port Trevorton, PA 17864.)♦

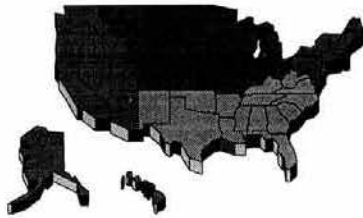
