THE PRESIDENT'S DISCOURSE

TOM BISCHOFF

Last night Linda and I returned from our weekend in Newark, Ohio where HCA events were in abundance. Thursday evening was the monthly Executive Committee meeting followed on Friday morning by the Quarterly Board Meeting at which, among other things, the Board decided to terminate the automatic dividend reinvestment plan of our Bob Evans stock holdings. Business decisions dictate we have not so many of our eggs in one basket. Easter is approaching as I write this, so please permit me the metaphor. More about eggs later!

There was also the Annual Benefit Auction; the operative word here being "benefit". HCA for the first time in my recollection used a sliding scale of commissions, all of which go to the benefit of HCA as the auctioneers donate their services. With less glass handled (fewer lots) more money was raised being approximately \$21,888.00. Less work and more money seems to make sense and the decision of the Board to try this method appears to have been correct, but we will wait and see what responses we hear from consignors.

Let HCA know if you as a consignor were happy with your particular results. Linda and I were and we calculated the difference in the commissions paid this year as compared to past years was only about two percent. More for HCA is OK by us. Donated glass sales through the auction also realized \$2385.00 and sales of the specialty items by HCA realized \$2085.00—a very successful weekend.

A few pieces of non Heisey were discovered to have been cataloged and were in fact sold but all at once (each day) and while this practice is not consistent with our goal of an *all* Heisey auction, we felt it best to proceed in this fashion rather than to send glass back or retain it for future sale if the consignors were not amenable to paying for the shipping expenses back. The committee had rejected several pieces as non Heisey. Consignors need to be sure of what you send for the Benefit Auction.

I cannot name and thank everyone who did such a wonderful job in handling this year's auction. Special thanks to Sam Schnaidt for providing his facilities and computerized operation. Maybe we should build our own conference-auction-show facility!

It was a special pleasure for me to have been able to acknowledge Bob Ryan whose concept of a benefit auction twenty five years ago has proven to be so successful as a major fund raiser for HCA. Thank you again Bob!

The Quarterly Membership meeting was held Saturday morning prior to the commencement of the auction. We are in good shape and a great slate of nominees for board members was presented both by the nominating committee and from the floor. Watch for biographical information about the candidates in this issue of the *Heisey News*.

I promised more about eggs. Linda and I concluded our Newark dream vacation weekend by attending a Molly organized HCA glass class session on Sunday morning and we made, yes, you guessed it, Easter Eggs! ♦

Due to the closing of Dalzell Viking Glass Company, temporarily or otherwise, production of Lavender Ice has been suspended. Refunds are being issued on Doe Head orders and a decision will be made shortly regarding the Convention Souvenir. 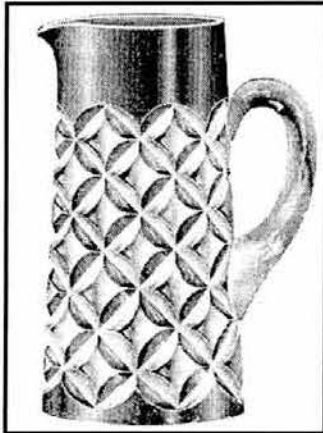

A REALLY BIG AUCTION

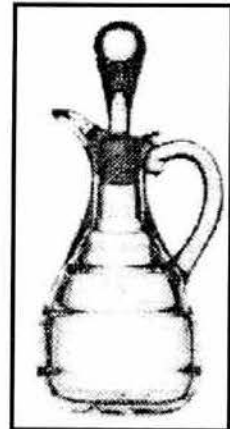
Those of you who missed last month's annual All Heisey Benefit Auction benefited in other ways. You surely have rumps that are in better shape than mine. Sixteen hours of sitting for two days of auction left me with two weeks of rear end numbness.



No matter, it was a wonderful auction. There was some great glass and prices ranged from the ridiculous to the sublime. You may have received your price sheet by now but I'll give an overview of a few highlights and low-lights anyway. This is for those not into the tedious job of copying prices onto the auction list.

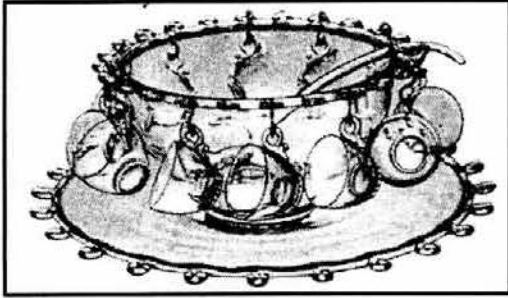
I attend these auctions on a regular basis though I don't usually bid very often. You see I'm afraid that my wife will. Bid, that is. I've mentioned before that she's like a junkyard dog when she's at an auction. There's no way she's going to let go once she's set her mind on something. Every bid against her is a challenge that must be answered. There's a sign at Apple Tree Auction Center that reads, "Only one stubborn bidder per family." I think Sam put it there for us. He's a kind soul—he gets upset when I cry.

The one way I get my kicks at these auctions is to fondle the pieces that are beyond my price range (I felt like Bill Clinton at this one—much was fondle-able). My hands were itching to get hold of the Pillows Flamingo 2 qt. tankard. I pretended I was a serious bidder and asked to examine it (it was stored on a shelf in the "peasants may not touch" section). It was in absolutely mint condition and, unless you count my fingerprints, I assume it still is. What a beautiful piece! If you can put a price on beauty, this one weighed in at \$1750 worth of beautiful.



As expected, Limelight (Zircon) and Cobalt prices remained strong although one Cobalt Spanish stem goblet was knocked down at \$65—about half the going rate but a Cobalt Gascony Crystal footed decanter whose foot had been glued on, still brought \$160. Go figure. Perhaps someone needed the stopper. Dawn prices were strong, too. A top bid of \$275 for a Dawn Saturn cruet was about as expected though I have seen them offered for more. A Limelight Madonna went all the way up to \$1600 before I dropped out. Actually, I was never in—bidding started above my limit.

Animal prices remained strong—a Donkey fetched \$225 and one Ringneck Pheasant went out at \$170 but later a second one had to settle for \$110. A Victorian Belle didn't fare too well at \$35 either. That's way under market. The Imperial Giraffe in Amber fetched \$240 and that raised my eyebrows.

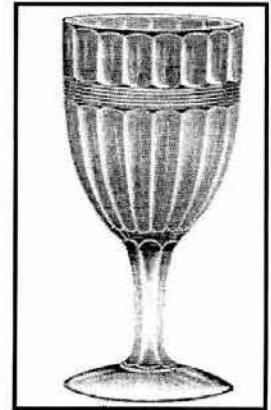


Baskets as always were sought after. A Crystolite basket at \$475 surprised me mostly because it just doesn't look like something that should be that expensive.

Punch sets seemed weak. A Lariat punch bowl complete with underplate and eight cups brought \$175 and a complete Greek Key punch set (base, ladle and twelve cups) was hammered sold at \$300. Show prices have been much higher.

Banded Flute, as always, remained strong. Six goblets sold for \$360, a beer mug with damage got \$150, the water bottle \$80, and the scarce Schoeppen surely made the seller happy at \$325.00.

Jumping around: a 1¼ oz. Flat Panel lavender jar sold for a respectable \$140, a pair of 1469½ Ridgeleigh candelabra \$230, a Hawthorne flower frog with the Duck insert got \$200 despite some beak repair.



Two cordials illustrated the difference desirability can make. A Barbara Fritchie cordial in Crystal went for \$65 while its mate, with a Moongleam bowl, was taken home for a whopping \$900. No matter that I'm mathematically disadvantaged, it doesn't take a genius to figure out that, at ¼ oz. of Moongleam in a Barbara Fritchie cordial, the going rate for Moongleam has risen to \$57,600 per pound. Is Moongleam the new Trial Blue? Probably not because, not surprisingly, later, an 8" Eagle plate in Moongleam was hammered down at only \$25 and thus discarded my theory. While still on Moongleam I should note that a 5" by 9" metal sign advertising Moongleam brought \$750. I would never have guessed that anything not made of glass could be worth that much.

The rarely seen Girl's Head stopper brought a respectable \$375 and a square Empress 7" plate in Cobalt was driven all the way up to \$230. Meanwhile, I was happy to win an unusual Sussex goblet with its colors reversed (Crystal bowl with Moongleam stem and foot for \$100). If my Moongleam Barbara Fritchie value formula came into play on that one, we'd still be bidding on it.



Speaking of expensive by the pound—a single very rare Bamboo candlestick with a Flamingo candle cup, garnered \$525. Figuring one ounce for the candle cup, the going price for Flamingo should be \$8400 per pound. Not bad for a "common" color.

Some old patterns showed new strength. A Cut Block spooner fetched a remarkable \$190. There were a few samples scattered throughout the auction that were made for HCA to study their feasibility. All of them brought high prices. This has become a strong collecting category. Many collectors are looking for unusual colors made in Heisey molds.

Since there were over a thousand pieces in this two-day auction it would be impossible to give my take on all of them. You'll have to do as I did—go over the list bit by bit until your eyes cross. ♦

FROM THE ARCHIVES—YOU CAN'T HOLD A CANDLE TO THIS ONE **DON VALDES**

In the course of going through a stack of photographs I came across a folder marked, "Floral Arrangements by Mrs. C.A. Dillon." Notes attached to most of the photos indicated that incorporated in the arrangement were Heisey epergnettes. A bell rang—Dillon—epergnettes. I checked in the correspondence but only found that Ann Lee Dillon had written Clarence Heisey about plastic ice tea coasters and suggested something of their style might be made in glass. The reply (7/27/54), somewhat negative in tone, didn't indicate that any previous acquaintance existed. But that wasn't the correspondence I recalled.

I went into my "patents" files and there it was, copies of the Dillon correspondence regarding patents! But there was a catch. The folder wasn't in the box! Way back, a few years ago, a Denison intern was working with us when a pile of material came to us from Ann Harris. Jennifer, the intern, went through the papers and appropriately recorded contents and where they were filed. Then we shifted computer systems and clearly (also literally) something got lost in the translation. Somewhere we have more of the story regarding Heisey, the Ms. Dillon, and epergnettes. Meanwhile, I would like to share some of the story with you.

My first step in preparing to write this month's contribution was to check on the appropriate meaning of the term, epergne. I checked in my trusty French dictionary for "epergne" and found—nothing. The next spot, and the one I should have gone to in the first place, was "the candlestick book." In their encyclopedic work, *Heisey Candlesticks, Candelabra and Lamps*, Felt and O'Grady provide us with something of the background of the epergne on pages 186, 364 and in the glossary on page 419.

EPERGNE (a-pern)—Derived from the French word, epergne. Refers to a centerpiece for table decoration usually consisting of...

Well, at least now I knew how to say it! Back to my dictionary. *epargne*-1. saving. -2 savings. Things are getting more confusing. What is the relationship between a dish of nuts stuck in a candlestick and "savings?"

To Felt and O'Grady, again. They point out that "The Dillons also applied for a design patent on August 4, 1948, for an 'epergne and candleholder adapter for candlestick.'" It sounds as though it might have been the Dillons who screwed up the spelling, let alone the meaning of the word. But where did the word "epergnette" come from? Felt and O'Grady imply (p. 186) that this was the company's doing. Somehow, I just can't believe T. Clarence Heisey would incorrectly employ a foreign term, even though he took German as an undergraduate.

Feeling a bit more confident about the subject I am set up for another blow—epergnion. This time I know where to look first. Felt and O’Grady define epergnion as an epergnette with prisms.

Having become completely fascinated by my confusion I turned to other terms whose meaning I had simply skipped over in the past. In other words, I read Felt and O’Grady’s glossary. There are some dandies. In addition to continually confusing the spelling of “candlestick” and “candelabra,” (is it le or el) I felt shaky on the difference between the two. The terms seemed to be used interchangeably. F and O’G point out that despite the characteristics I had thought distinguished the two (one base, one candle vs. one base, two or more candles) a candelabra is “any candlestick with bobèche(s) and prisms attached, even it held only one candle and had no arms.”

Again I hit a snag. I think I know (by inference) the meaning of “bobèche” but I’ve been fooled too many times before. For the fun of it, and because it was right there next to me, I first looked up “bobèche” in my French dictionary. You guessed it. The closest I found there was *bobard* from the verb, *bobard*, to fib! Clearly, the glass manufacturers have developed their own version of the French language. Nevertheless, F and O’G confirmed my original belief, “A disk or saucer affixed beneath the candle socket of a candlestick or candelabra to catch the wax drippings.”

Another term I had encountered in my “candle holder” cataloging seems worthy of tossing in here. Surely, there must be someone out there who has, like me, come across the word, “girandole” and never bothered to look it up. I’ll save you some time, don’t bother with a French dictionary, instead try the bottom of page 420 in F and O’G.

Table—it was perfectly BEAUTIFUL. The cloth is White Satin, Two 5 branch candelabra—on either side—using Epergnettes. You should have seen the INTEREST displayed, by the guests, in the Epergnettes. The table was almost as popular as the BRIDE. I had to stand near to explain the Epergnettes to hundreds of guests. ♦

I’ll leave you with a few photographs Ms. Dillon sent to the Heisey company along with her own promotional explanations of the arrangement. I find it interesting that the glassware used was not always Heisey. The emphasis is that of Ms. Dillon.

Picture no. 1: “This shows how three INEXPENSIVE GLASS candle holders—may be made into a lovely centerpiece. This idea “went over” BIG. It is pretty when looked at from ANY angle. I am anxious for your salesmen to display this idea. So many people do not have candelabra.”

I was struck by the immodesty displayed in this one:

He would buy practical pieces he could use that had this mark on them. It was several years before he learned that these pieces were Heisey Moongleam with the famous Diamond H mark.

He joined HCA and attended his first convention in 1982. His collection has grown to the point that he is known as "Mr. Moongleam" within the Heisey family of collectors. His constant search for Heisey resulted in his becoming a dealer in Heisey who has set up at the convention for over 10 years, although he still considers himself a collector first and a dealer second. His Heisey Collection has expanded beyond just Moongleam to include New Era, Aqua Caliente, Stanhope and Hartman.

In 1989 Walter presented a seminar on "The Color Moongleam" at the convention. He has served for four years as the President of the Heisey Heritage Society. He served on the convention Identification Panel for the last seven years. He is finishing his first term on the board in which he served on the Education and Technology Committees. This is his second year as Glass Show and Sale Chairman during the convention. He looks forward to another four years of serving the Heisey community. ♦

Russ lives in San Francisco, California. He has been an avid Heisey collector since the mid 70's. His first visit to Newark was during the 1976 HCA convention and he still remembers vividly the outstanding

For the last fifteen years, Russ has also been a member of The Bay Area Glass Society, a glass collectors' club for the San Francisco Bay Area. He has served three terms as President and two terms as Secretary.

Russ and his partner Lee Jones have had a successful antique business for over 20 years and participated in several shows at Adena Hall. Heisey is their main interest. They also have interests in Cambridge, Duncan, Fostoria Shelley, Florence Ceramics and Deswick Beatrix Potter figures.

After teaching elementary school for 29 years, Russ plans to retire in June. He will then devote more time to the antique business in Petaluma.

Russ believes the future of HCA is dependent upon educating a new generation about this quality glassware collectible called Heisey. He feels we do not see enough young faces at antique shows or shops and that we need the young collectors to carry on the fine tradition of Heisey collecting. ♦

Sharon has been an active collector of Heisey glass since 1981 and a lifelong admirer, having grown up with it being used on the holiday tables of both grandmothers. She is the head of the Promotions, Graphics and Duplicating

Department of the Monroe County Library System, headquartered in Rochester, New York. She donated her graphic design and illustration skills to HCA for the convention poster and program for a number of years in the late 80's and early 90's.

Her major Heisey interest is Waverly which has been displayed at the convention twice. Since her collection of Waverly is now complete she concentrates on candy boxes, New Era and other items and patterns from "between the wars". Her

husband of 26 years, also an HCA member, is an avid admirer of Marigold and Dawn.

After serving in leadership roles on a number of boards, including the nationally syndicated Neighborhood Housing Services, Sharon "retired" from community activism in 1992 to spend time restoring and developing the gardens surrounding their 1902 Arts & Crafts-style home. 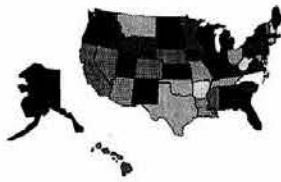

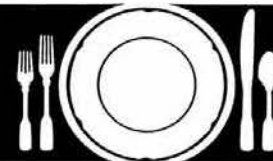
