Linda Bischoff, Incumbent



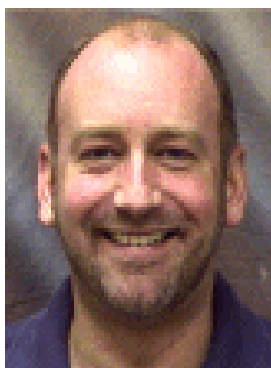
Linda is running for her second term on the Board. Linda currently serves as Secretary.

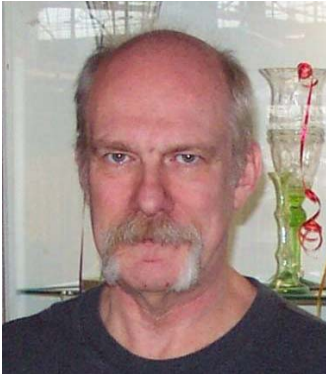

One lady marked patterns on

glass before they were cut; and another lady warmed-in in the factory!

You may never have a chance to hear stories like these again! You'll want to meet these delightful people! Be sure to plan your time so you can visit with these folks! ♦

Identification Panel at Convention

The Identification Panel event during convention will be at 9:30 AM Friday morning. This is always one of the most popular and well-attended events of each convention. 3. The panel is composed mostly of people whose area of expertise is Heisey – but we are willing to take a limited number of general items for identification. Here we are especially interested in items that could be mistaken for Heisey glass.

If you have an item to bring to the panel be there early, bring the item to the table in the front of the room and if you have a particular question write it down and leave it with the item.

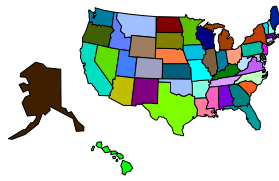

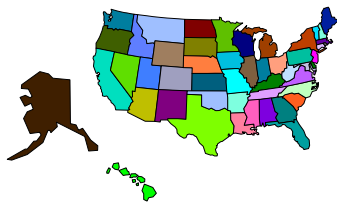
