# #1495 FERN PATTERN

Heisey introduced the Fern pattern in September 1937. There were 25 items offered in the pattern, which are listed in the table with this article. There were no items added later, so 25 is the limit of items that can be found in the Fern pattern. Production of the Fern pattern ended in about 1945, except for the candelabra which was available to about 1954.

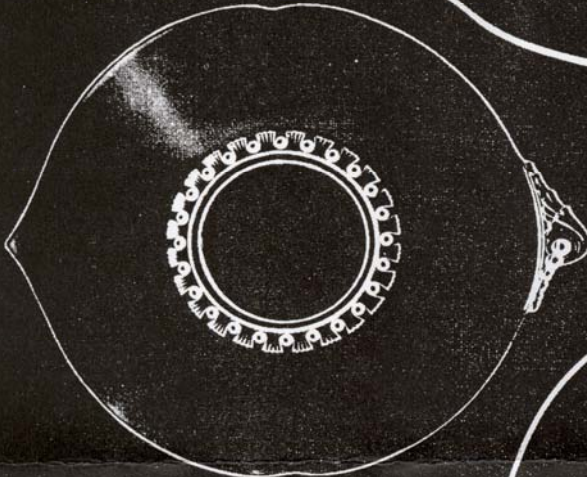
Fern is a simple, plain design. To me, it's a modernistic type design that was a creation of Mr. Van Nessen, an internationally known architect and designer. There are four points of design around the outer edge of each piece. The edge dips-in at two points diagonally opposite each other.

No. 1495 FERN PATTERN

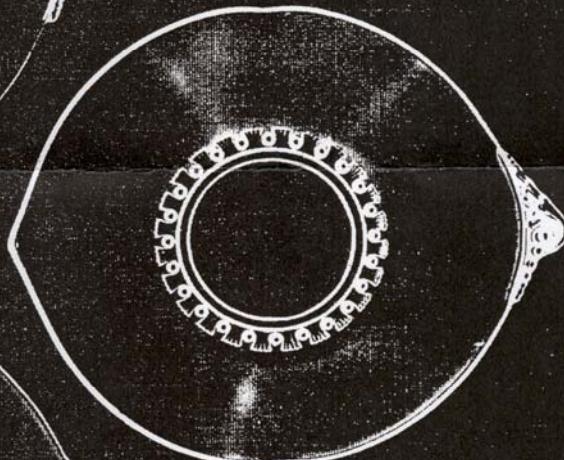

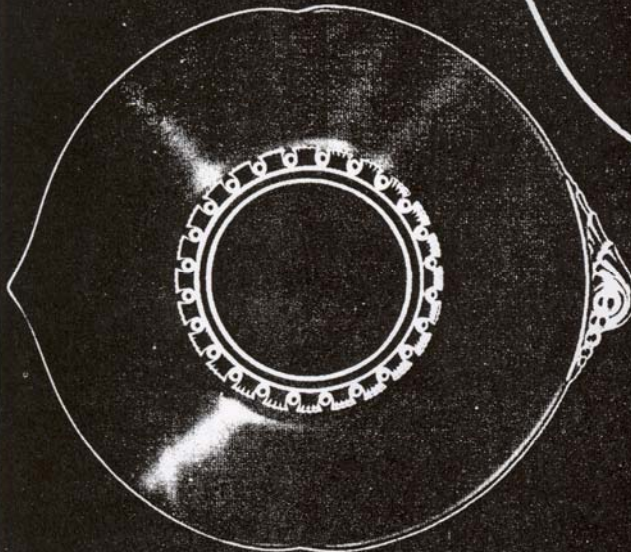
15 in. Cheese & Cracker Plate

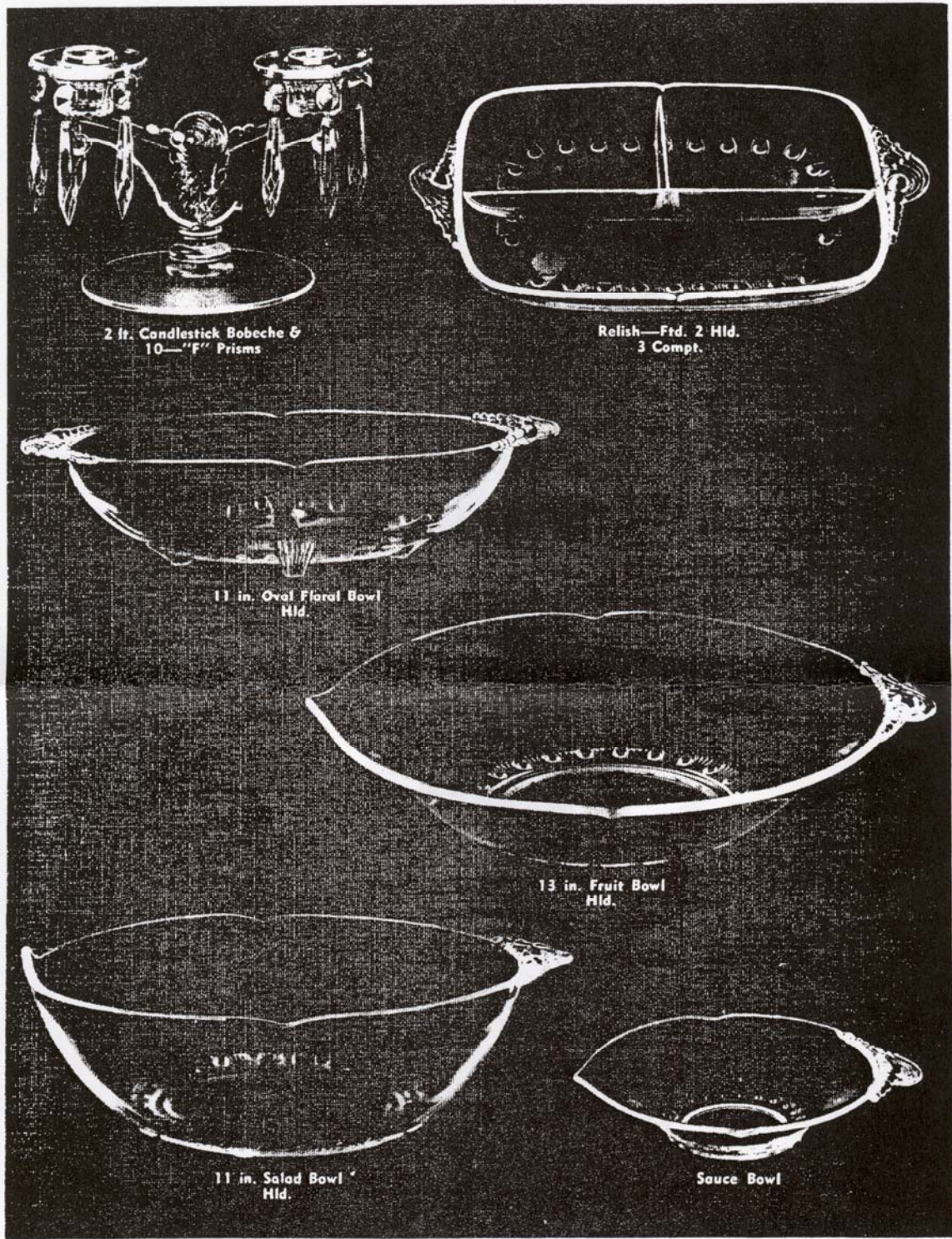

On the edge 90 degrees away from the dip-ins are either two handles or one handle and one dip-out. The so-called handles are not like what we think of as handles. They are like semi-circles of flat glass that are horizontally out from the glass bowl. Press into that horizontal glass handle is the fern motif. The base of the Fern pattern is made up of a series of many small square blocks. Between the blocks is a small design that looks like sheaves of wheat.

Heisey produced their Zircon color from 1937 to 1939. Heisey's Price List #212 dated 6/18/37 offered all 25 items of the Fern pattern in Crystal or in Zircon. For the candelabra, the candlestick was available in Zircon, but the bobèche and prisms were only available in Crystal. There are two pieces known in Dawn color, the torte plate and a bowl.

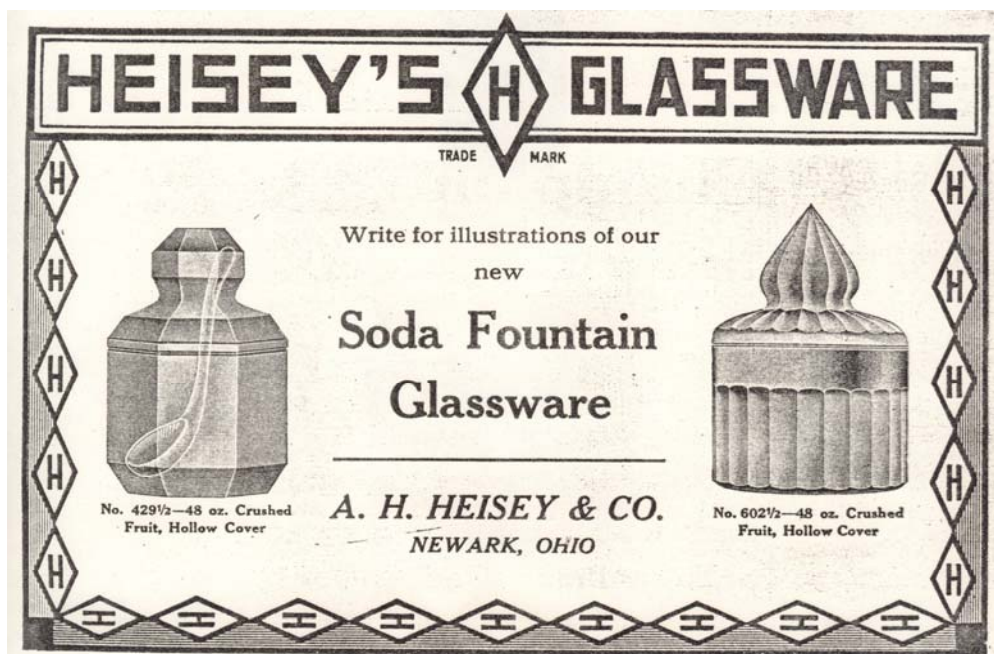
There are several pieces of Fern on display at the Heisey Museum.

1. 11" footed floral bowl, Rose etch, two handles, 4 small square legs, Crystal, signed
2. 6" jelly, one handle, Zircon color, not signed
3. 15 in. diameter plate, one handle, Dawn color, not signed
4. 2 light candlestick in Zircon as well as a 2 light candlestick with 508 Floral etch in crystal (neither has the bobèches), not signed
5. Creamer with 500 Belvedere etch, signed
6. Twin Handled Mayonnaise with 941 Barcelona cutting, not signed
7. 3 part combination relish, Zircon, two handles, not signed
8. 6" mint, matte etched, Crystal, one handle, not signed

The Fern floral bowl with the Rose etch does not fit the Fern time line. The bowl was produced from 1937 to 1945, but the Rose etch didn't start until 1949. What gives? Research indicates the floral bowl was reissued for the Rose etch, but it was listed as part of the #1519 Waverly pattern.

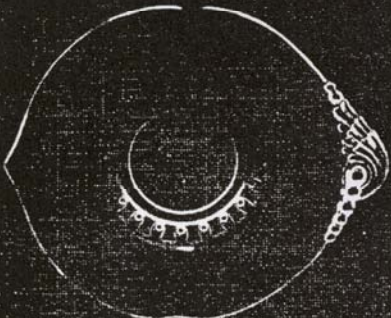

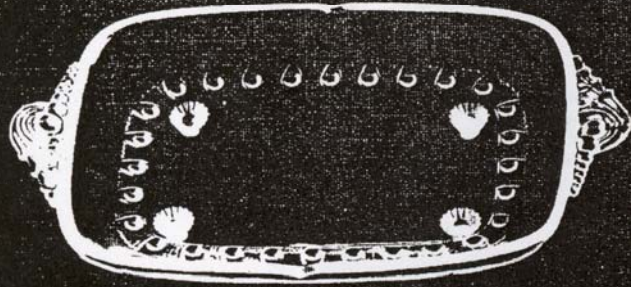

## AN INTERESTING PIECE OF HEISEY GLASSWARE FROM THE MUSEUM COLLECTION

### 8007 Daisy Scroll Plate

This is a pattern about which very little is known. It has never shown up in any of the company catalogs that we have or in any other documentation. Back in 1973, the Heisey Collectors of America named this design Daisy Scroll, and assigned it to pattern number 8007. Many of the other unknowns that were assigned 8000 numbers have now been given their proper factory assigned numbers, but this pattern has never turned up. (Clarence Vogel, an early researcher in Heisey glass, also assigned numbers to unknown patterns. He used numbers starting at 7001 where HCA assigned numbers starting at 8000).

The only pieces of the pattern that have turned up are plates and nappies. A nappy was pictured on page 10 of the August 1975 issue of the Heisey News. The plate the Museum owns measures 11 ½" across from side to side, 12 ½" from point to point. The plate is six sided with nine panels. All design elements in the plate are pressed into the underside of the plate and would have been part of the mold from which the plate was made. The outer edge of the plate has a pressed daisy at each of the six points with a long scroll pattern running between the points. In the paneled portion of the plate there are three evenly spaced symmetric scroll designs connecting the outer edge to the center in of the plate. The center of the plate has three pressed daisies separated by three scroll elements that almost give a plume effect in their design. The bottom of the plate is 4 ¾" wide and nine sided and polished. There is a large diamond H in the center of the plate.

Production of this pattern was probably somewhere in the period from 1901 to 1913. The 380 Scalloped Octagon pattern seems of a similar style and that pattern was produced from 1909 until approximately 1913. You can find this plate currently in the museum in the room behind the dining room of the King House. It is in case R5 C3 on the bottom shelf.

Very few pieces in this pattern have ever turned up. You certainly will be lucky if in your travels you stumble across one of these rare beauties.

The photo at the right is an 11½ 2 8007 Daisy Scroll Plate in the Museum collection. ♥

HCA, however, at its discretion, will consign donated items for auction, add items to the museum collection, and/or sell items in the museum shop.

Each member may consign a maximum of (20) twenty lots to the sale. There is no limit on the number of items in each lot, but HCA retains the right to increase/decrease size/make up of each lot.

Consignors of glassware to this sale will be charged on the following sliding scale of commission per lot: \$5.00-\$49.99=30%; \$50.00-\$199.99=25%; \$200.00-\$399.99=20%; \$400.00-\$749.99=15%; \$750.00 and over = 10%. Settlement for glass sold will be made in full within (10) business days of completed auction, together with a donation slip for commissions charged. All monies received from the sale are held and paid from the HCA Trust Account.

*Glassware for the Benefit Auction will be accepted at any time with a cut-off date for the 2005 Auction being January 15, 2005. Glassware will be catalogued in the order it is received.*

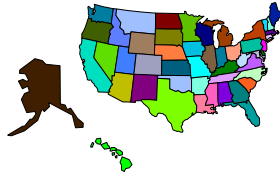

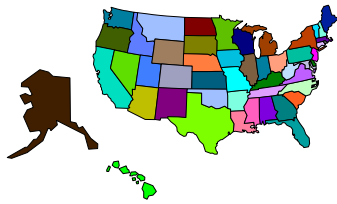

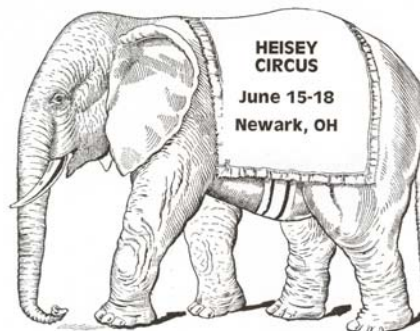
