THE HISTORY OF THE ALF LANDON FRAME - KRALL HEISEY GLASSWARE EXHIBITION CABINET

Alf Landon was the Republican candidate for president in 1936 and the national Republican convention was held in Cleveland, Ohio. Wilson Heisey, then President of A.H. Heisey & Company was Chairman of the Ohio for Landon effort during this time. The Heisey company produced several special items (plates, cups and saucers) with Alf Landon's logo etched on them. At this time, Wilson Heisey enlisted Emil Krall to engrave a mirror frame to hold Alf Landon's picture at the Republican Convention. According to Krall's own account, he traveled to Topeka, Kansas to obtain a likeness of Landon and then engraved a portrait of him for the top oval of the frame. In radio interview transcripts, Krall stated it took four weeks totaling 480 hours to complete the project. The frame was of mirrors engraved with buckeyes and leaves (symbols of Ohio's Buckeye trees) and sunflowers, the state flower of Kansas, Landon's home. Oscar Krall (son of Emil) stated it took him seven hours to assemble the cut pieces onto the frame. It was a large frame (79" x 48") befitting the prominence in which it was displayed at the convention at the Hollenden Hotel (headquarters of Ohio for Landon committee), Cleveland, Ohio. Wilson Heisey intended to present the frame to Alf Landon after he won the presidency. However, after Alf Landon lost the election the frame was returned to Newark, Ohio and placed into storage at the Heisey factory.

According to archive information from the Heisey Company plans were being made for a promotional tour of major department stores (Northeast and Midwest) featuring the cutting and engraving of their master artist Emil Krall. This tour was schedule to begin in January 1937 at the Hudson Company in Detroit, MI. They

(Hudson) had agreed to share the expenses of Mr. Krall's appearance (\$100 weekly) fifty/fifty. As part of these tour plans, Emil Krall had designed in December of 1936 a "shadow box" (cabinet) for the Landon Frame and the center medallion was replaced by Krall with an engraving of a Santa Maria in full sail. The frame was made to fit onto the front of a mirrored cabinet and displayed some of his (Krall) finest Heisey creations. The cabinet was crafted in the wood shop at the factory and the shelving was glass and cut Heisey candlesticks were used as supports for the shelves.

It was during one of these trips when the frame slipped off a hand truck while it was being unloaded for a display and was broken. Subsequently, Emil Krall designed new mirrors with engravings of flowers for the sides of the cabinet (see front cover picture). The engravings on the cabinet were done on glass that was later mirrored (silvered). The cabinet continued to be used for promotional purposes with Emil Krall featuring his special one-of-a-kind works of art.

Most items displayed could be obtained by special order only and the value of his works on display has been reported averaging \$15,000 or more. When the Heisey Exhibition Cabinet featuring the designs of Emil Krall arrived at a retailer, the local media documented the event. Tim Heisey stated at one stop in Chicago several of the items on display were stolen and never recovered.

One of the last appearances locally of the cabinet under direction of the Heisey Company was made in March 1939 when Miss Lucille Adkins in conjunction with the Newark Chamber of Commerce setup a display of the famous "Alfred M. Landon Showcase." The display included many of Emil Krall's one-of-a-kind pieces from the Heisey Company archives. The display received full media coverage and was highlighted in a Newark Advocate story with pictures.

After the A.H. Heisey Company closed the cabinet was sold with the contents of the Heisey factory in 1957 to Percy Moore and he featured it in his antique shop on Route 40 / Kirkersville, Ohio until it was sold to individuals who moved it to Texas. In the early 1970's those owners returned the cabinet to Newark, Ohio and offered it for sale; however, they were unable to reach a satisfactory sales arrangement and the cabinet was returned to their home where it remained in their collection.

Recently, the cabinet changed hands and is now in the possession of the Heisey Collectors of America who are preparing it for exhibition in their Museum. ♦

TREASURER'S REPORT

Also we are now leasing our new fancy-dancy, does everything copier and this expense is now recorded individually. So overall we are doing OK. Always room for improvement, though. That's why you need to save your pennies (gold ones, not copper) for the Moore weekend where you can bid often and high at our Select Auction fund-raiser. 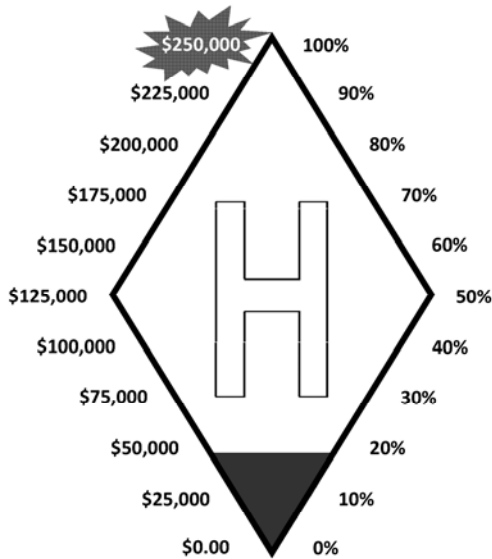

About Gordon and Darlene Cochran

Gordon and Darlene Cochran are from the Washington State area and here is their story about why this National Heisey Glass Museum Challenge Campaign is so important.

Gordon and Darlene made a trip back to Ohio in 1986. Gordon was collecting cars, and they went to Hershey to buy car parts. Darlene talked Gordon into going to the Heisey Museum. It was a Monday and the Museum was closed. They knocked anyway since they were so far away from home. Louise Ream opened the door. The Cochrans asked if they could just take a peak and four hours later they were back on the road. Louise gave them a guided tour through the Museum. This was the

Cochran's introduction to Heisey and was a very favorable one. They were "hooked on Heisey."

They would send in bids to Apple Tree Auction for what they wanted and then they just put in a \$5 dollar bid for everything else. The Cochrans had Christmas every time there was a Heisey auction. They loved getting those boxes in the mail. This was their first learning experience with Heisey.

Then, they started attending the Heisey Convention and it just seemed that they could not get enough Heisey. The Cochrans became dealers around that time and have been going strong ever since.

Gordon was on the HCA Board from 1993 to 1997. He would have liked to run for another term, but being an active Board members takes a lot of time and Gordon was not retired. During his time on the Board, he was in charge of the Convention. Bob Page of Replacements agreed to bring china and silver to match up with Heisey's stemware and patterns. It made a wonderful display. That was one of Gordon's highlights on serving on the Board.

The Cochrans also joined the Northwest Heisey Collectors Club in 1986, and have been HCA voting members since the beginning.

Gordon and Darlene have had such fun collecting and meeting new friends from all over the country. They want to help secure Heisey glass for future generations. The Cochrans also feel sustaining the Heisey Glass Museum through growing the National Heisey Glass Museum Endowment Fund will showcase for years to come the elegance and fine workmanship of a past generation of glass makers.

Remember Heisey was made in the USA. Could there be anything more "Green" than buying Heisey? ♦

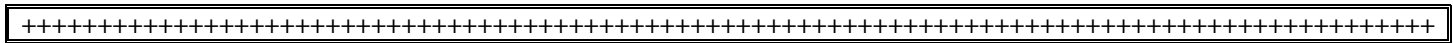

SELECT AUCTION HIGHLIGHTS

Walter Ludwig

I hope you take time to study the Select Auction Catalog that is published in this issue of the Heisey News. There is a great selection of items available this year in a wide range of patterns, colors, and items. There are items in every collector's level of collecting. Some great starter items as well as some real rarities that we have not seen offered for many years.

Some of the items that caught my eye included two unusual pieces of 1540 Lariat: a 12" swung vase (lot 6) and the round egg plate (131). There is a good selection of vases and baskets, stemware, and creams and sugars. Among the many candlesticks being offered is a 109 Petticoat Dolphin candlestick in Sahara (50), I was not even aware that it had been made in that color. Among the "little things" is a 1 tea drip (85) and the elusive 1434 Tom & Jerry mug (94).

There are not a lot of animals in the auction but there are two show stoppers among them: a 1540 Oscar in light Amber (107) and 3 Elephant small in Sultana (108). There is a great selection of deep plate etches including three pieces of Circus etch (lots 145 – 147) and one of Winchester (149). There is a 4225 Cobel cocktail shaker (Rooster head stopper) with 495 Polo Player etch (134) and two pieces of 4054 Coronation with 498 Modern Polo Player etch (152 – 153). Another nice bar set is lots 143 and 144 consisting of a 3397 Gascony tomato juice and 6 juice glasses all in Sahara with 452 Ambassador etch.

Among the standout pieces in color are 300 Peerless low 7 oz goblet (25) and 302 Peerless ice tea (212) both in Flamingo; 1469 Ridgeleigh 12" oval fruit (52) and pair of candlevases (53) both in Zircon; 133 Swan Handled console bowl, Moongleam (67); 4165 Shaw jug in Flamingo (127); and 353 Medium Flat Panel 1 qt. jug in Harvey Amber (128).

There is a great selection of stemware in Alexandrite including cordials in both 3390 Carcassonne (99) and 3416 Barbara Fritchie (100). There are 21 lots of 3390 Carcassonne stemware (lots 152-177) that will be offered in groups by type of stemware and then sold choice to the high bidder.

There is a nice selection of early pattern pieces as well as colonials. A rarity is the 8025 Banded Diamond Flute 5" footed jelly (201).

I hope to see you at the Museum for the auction on October 15. ♦

You set the maximum amount you are willing to pay on each lot. If successful, the remainder will be refunded. Please use good judgment in arriving at your maximum bid figure. Remember, there are minimum limits to raises that the Auctioneer will accept (smaller items \$2.50, larger items \$5, \$10 or as much as \$25). Lots containing multiple items will be as one lot to the successful bidder. Normally, these are not split up; however, there may be some exceptions to this.

Please indicate on your bid the desired condition of the item on which you are bidding. 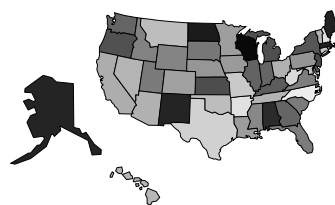

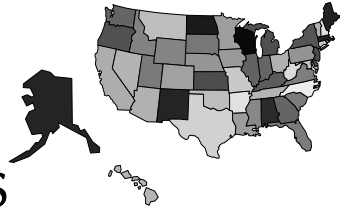

The Sight Unseen Auction netted \$1,358.50 for the challenge, more than double last year. The auction

featured 34 creatively wrapped packages to bid on and some wonderful items appeared including a 417 Double Rib & Panel basket in crystal, a 1010 Decagon handled dish in Flamingo, a 1511 Toujours 2 light candlestick, a 465 Recessed Panel 1 lb. covered candy jar, 1295 Beaded Swag spooners in crystal and Opal, a 1522 Standing Colt and a 2 Goose Wings Half. Show and Tell was limited due to the auction so only a 1020 Phyllis Cream & Sugar in Canary and a 473 Narrow Flute w/Rim combination relish in Moongleam were shown.

Members were reminded of the 50/50 raffle that concludes at the October meeting. The first 50% will be donated to the Cochran Challenge and the second half will be given to the lucky winner, who we hope will also donate this amount to the challenge. You may still buy chances by mail from the treasurer.

Club Historian Darlene Cochran asked us to devise a program aimed at documenting HCA's early history, including 1970-1980's experiences of HCA founders and builders. These experiences go way beyond "how I got started collecting Heisey Glass." The temporary title was "HCA Memoirs on Audio/Video Tape." She suggested adding breakfast or coffee to the convention I.D. Session to increase attendance; to present Loren Yeakley's session on Heisey's 40 years as a session in the auditorium with good sound; interview living Heisey family members; do a history of the Museum, how did it come into being.

The eight members attending Convention marveled at the dedication of the HCA volunteers who staff the Museum and make the Convention such an enjoyable event. We were happy to help with the packet stuffing and program folding. Next month we go to Everett.
