Everything Old Is New Again

It is said that if you hold on to something long enough, it always comes back in style. Heisey collectors would argue that the glass never went out of style — merely out of production. According to home décor experts, if you display a piece of tangerine Heisey this season, you've nailed the hot new home decorating trend. "It's the perfect color to move us out of the dull and dreary winter months and into spring," says HGTV Host Sabrina Soto. Heisey glassware is an easy way to embrace the decorating trend, especially for those who might be gun-shy of using the color in large doses. "It's like what a tie does to a suit, that stand-alone piece that makes such a grand statement," recommends Laura Dailey, vice president of merchandising with Atlanta-based Ballard Designs.

Tangerine Heisey will vary in color from a light orange to almost a true red. The color was difficult to control because the piece had to be reheated in the glory hole after it was finished to bring out the true coloring. Most pieces of Tangerine will be found in the stemware lines. A table setting is hard to put together in Tangerine due to the color variation. Favor vases are very desirable items. Any item in Tangerine will bring a high price.



An HCA member recently brought the above piece to the Museum for authentication. It is an experimental Whimsey Pinch Vase, meaning it was not for mass production and originally made by an employee to test the color when Heisey was developing it. It's unusual to see this strong red shade of Tangerine. The Museum has a similar piece in Tangerine that is more round, as well as a Cobalt piece very similar in shape to this one.

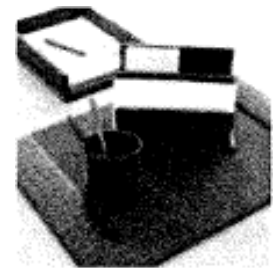

39th Annual Spring All Heisey Benefit Auction Declared A Success

Those who attended the 39th Annual Spring All Heisey Benefit Auction had a great time! Our two-day auction was held again at the GMP Local #244 Union Hall on 350 Hudson Avenue in Newark on Friday and Saturday, April 13 & 14. Our auction was well attended, with over 90 guests and members each day and an additional 19 absentee bidders. We had 1,099 lots of glass available from 45 consignors. We again heard many great comments about the glass we had this year; our consignors sent in nice, clean glass and we only had to reject a few unsuitable pieces during our cat-

aloging sessions. We kept the same schedule this year as last year, as folks seemed to like the earlier start on Friday afternoon. We had the preview on Friday from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m., with the auction starting at 3 p.m.. On Saturday, we opened the doors at 8:30 a.m., held our HCA Membership Meeting chaired by President Sue Kilgore at 9 a.m., and started our auction at 9:30 a.m..

How did we do financially? One never knows what to predict! At press time, we have preliminary numbers only. We grossed \$60,385 and after consignors and expenses are paid,

we estimate we will net around \$14,200. We had a budget estimate of \$16,350 which is conservative when considering last year's net, so we fell a bit under budget. The main difference between this year and last year is that we had \$445 in donated glass revenues this year as compared to last year's \$4,660. As we have said many times: donated glass really helps HCA, so please consider donating glass in the future. Last year, we grossed \$67,340 and netted \$19,652, with our budget being \$10,000.

I want to publicly thank, on behalf of the HCA Board of Directors and Staff, the 43 volunteers who worked with us beginning in January unpacking, identifying, cataloging, and repacking the glass . . . and then working for three straight days until the auction was concluded. You make this event a success and HCA's largest fundraiser. Please see the block to the right that lists the names of those who helped. If you helped and are not listed, I apologize. I must also share with you that every board member (all but one was there) and their friends and

spouses stepped up and worked as volunteers the entire time!

I would like to give special thanks to Joe Harner, president of the Dayton Study Club, and Dick Marsh, Buckeye Club member, who working together did all the little things which need doing to help make the auction successful; to Board member Karen Taylo, who ran the clerk's office and auction software program; to Dan Kilgore, who stepped up and helped me whenever asked, particularly when I under the weather; and lastly, to the Dayton and Buckeye Study Club members, who worked from start to finish in all parts of this auction.

A "THANK YOU" must also go to Auctioneer Craig Connelly and his cohorts. They sold our glass and kept us in stitches! Concessionaire extraordinaire Gerry Dush and his gang again served the world's best pies and other food. GMP Local #244's own Jerry West did everything he could to provide us great facilities and went the "extra mile" to make our auction a success.

Finally, I would like to thank all the consignors who consigned and donated glass to HCA, and all the auction attendees and absentee bidders who purchased that wonderful Heisey Glass. Hope to see all of you at the Convention in June. Happy Heisey Hunting!!

FINANCIAL REPORTS

Our Endowment totals are listed below, and our 1st quarter statement of income and expenses appears on the next page. We are in fairly good shape. We are managing our resources well. We did net over \$17,000 in our Spring Auction which will not show until the April results are in. We have \$60,000 in our accounts available for expenses.

Two expenses not envisioned when we started the year is an upgrade to our museum lighting, and the need for new software and some hardware for our computer operations. The fluorescent lights and ballast we use for the museum lighting and our display cabinets will not be manufactured after July of this year. Our local electric utility, American Electric Power, has advised us to use more efficient and longer-lasting bulbs. They will help with the expense of conversion.

Our computers and software are aging, and some software we rely on daily is no longer supported by the manufacturer. We are getting estimates for a long-range upgrade. Our hope is to have a system that will serve us for at least five years. More will be known later this spring.

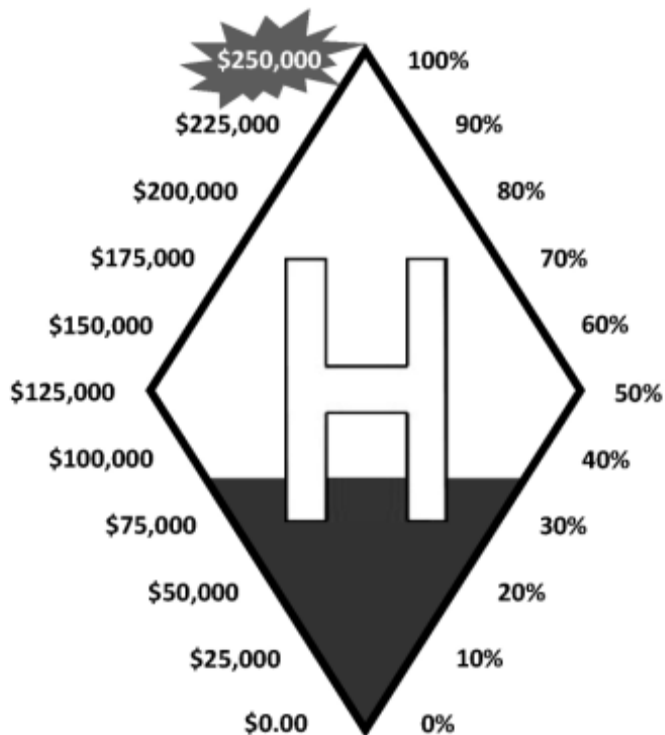

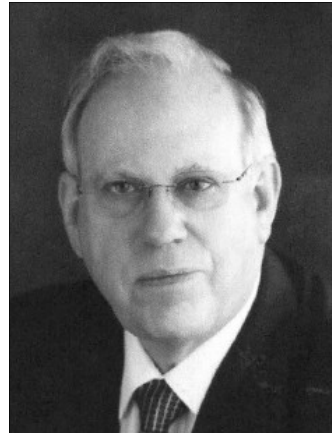

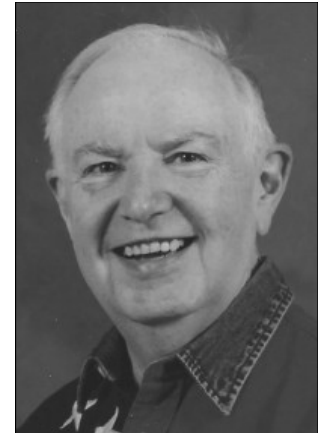

I was a resident of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for over 30 years. I attended Hobart

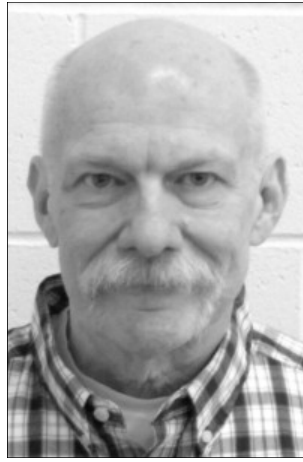

Please note the blank list contains space for 20 lots; each member is allowed to submit **40 lots** for the committee to select from. Remember, this

auction benefits your association. Please consider selecting a special piece of Heisey for a donation to be auctioned off; 100% of the sale price goes to support HCA and the museum. Donations don't count toward your 40 lot limit. We hope that Study Clubs, like last year, will consider donating glass for this auction - a great project for them! If you do not belong to a study club, this is a great opportunity for you to support YOUR museum by donating a piece of Heisey. And you don't have to consign glass to make a donation! To continue our tradition for this event, we are maintaining our low consignment fee of 20%, with a minimum consignment fee of \$5. We want no duplicates, and we would like expensive and not so expensive glass, for both the novice and experienced collector. Please make sure you size each lot so it is worth at least \$25 - and I know it is a guess! As mentioned earlier, we will not select damaged glass.

The Select Committee will be busy after May 21st and will contact you on or about June 1st to let you know which lots of glass from your list have been selected. Hopefully, you will be able to bring your glass to Newark and drop it off at the museum when you come to the Convention on June 13-16.

acquainted with horses and began his lifelong love affair with them. In adulthood, Clarence not only owned horses, he showed them in the most prestigious horse shows in the country. His home on Granville Street housed a trainer and a stable full of show horses. According to his daughter Mary, he originally named his stable *The Rambling Pear Stables*, but then later renamed them *Hi-C Stables* because so many people mispronounced the family name. Although the Clarence Heisey house itself is no longer in the Heisey family, the famous stable has been converted into a beautifully unique home. The property beyond the stable was purchased by the City of Newark in the early 1960s and is now the site of the Newark High School campus.

Mary and brother Tim learned to ride, but Mary's allergies to horses limited her involvement with them. Tim rode the horses in the top-rated shows and won many championships. Marge Evans took care of entering the horses in the various

EDITOR'S NOTE: By press time, the "most exciting two minutes in sports" will be behind us, but as many of you will have watched media coverage of The Kentucky Derby, we thought it an opportune time to share the following, which is excerpted from an article by Susan Pennington as found in the archives of the Museum.

The Heisey family's love of horses and the history of their involvement with horses is truly an interesting story. As well, the influence this passion had in the production of horse-related glass items was tremendous.

E. Wilson Heisey, president of A. H. Heisey & Company from 1922-1942, owned horses but because of his

wife objecting to having them at their home, he stabled them on the glass factory property. According to Clarence Heisey's longtime secretary Margie Evans, Wilson Heisey's horses performed at Newark's Idlewilde Park, an amusement park and race track once located on the site of the prehistoric Indian Mound called the Great Circle Mound, which is now an area park. According to Evans, Clarence's interest for the gentle beasts began when Mrs. Augustus Heisey took the younger children in the family on a trip to Denver, Colorado. It was there that T. Clarence Heisey, the youngest of the children, became

competitions and Tim would fly from prep school to the scheduled shows to perform with the horses.

It is said that Clarence's most famous horse, *Goodness Gracious*, was so named because that is what Tim exclaimed the first time he saw the horse. Between the years 1932 and 1935, *Goodness Gracious* won eight major championships, including International Champion 1935.

It is no surprise then that so many horse figurines, horse-related items, and horse-related etchings were designed and produced during the years that Clarence Heisey was president of A. H. Heisey & Company.

The first horse item offered by the Heisey Company was the horse head bookend. Designed by Ray Cobel, it appeared in 1937 in catalog 212-17 on page 61. It was pictured with other miscellaneous items such as spoons and ladles.

In the early 1940s, Heisey Company Sales Manager Rod Irwin corresponded with famous designer Royal Hickman. The subject of many of their letters was glass animal designs. Both men were interested in coming up with some good horse designs to present to Clarence. They felt horse-related items would be good sellers. The following are samples of correspondence between the two men:

12/5/43

Dear Rod,

I am expressing you in the morning two colts as a pair, to be sold as pair and fell confident they will sell. You remember I had the sketch at Newark with me. They are amusing enough to put themselves over I think.

Am also shipping the Burmese cat, (paperweight as Clarence calls it.)

Cheerio

Dec. 10, 1943

Dear Hick,

Yesterday I received the two plaster models of the colts and the model of the leopard or wild cat or

what have you. In one way I like these colts very much and in another way I don't. I think the one with the head facing front has too much "goiter" for a neck but maybe you made it that way. Clarence has been out of town & has not seen these, so I will give you his reaction when he returns.

The horse being discussed in the letters seems to be the Filly. The Filly design must have remained close to Mr. Hickman's design because the Heisey Filly was produced with the "goiter" neck Rod Irwin described (pictured). The *Burmese Cat* he referred to as a "leopard" and "wild cat" eventually became known as the Tiger Paperweight.

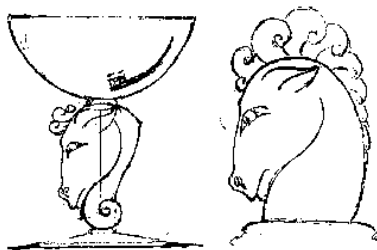


Royal Hickman designed many of Heisey's glass animals, including many of the horses. He also designed animal-related items like cocktails and decanter stoppers. The excerpt below is another example of the beginning of an idea for some new items:

Dear Rod

... Here is a rough and I mean rough sketch of horsehead CT and CT shaker stopper. There are so many horsey people. I think this would go well. What do you think?

The two pieces were eventually produced by the Heisey Company — #5066 Horsehead cocktail and #132 horsehead stopper — but the final

design varied somewhat from the original.

In addition to the actual horses and horse-related items, Heisey produced many items, mostly barware pieces, which were decorated with horse-theme etchings. Carl Cobel, son of Ray Cobel, designed many silhouette etchings including #462 Fox chase, 1933-44; #463 Equestrian, 1933-44; and #467 Tally Ho, 1933-52. Carl may have designed many more of the horse-theme etchings, but it is not always possible to determine exactly who was the designer. The list of other horse-theme etchings includes #1 Sport plate etching, 1928-33; #517 Winchester '73, 1950-52; #498 Modern Polo Player, 1937-44; #481 Lancaster etch, 1937-44; #9038 Tim Heisey on Goodness Gracious; #4222 Horse shoe; and #4224 Steeplechase.

The list of Heisey's glass horses begins with the horsehead bookend: #1 Horsehead Bookend, 1937-55; #1522 Standing Colt, 1940-52; #1527 Kicking Colt, 1941-45; #1529 Balking Colt, 1941-45; #1540 Plug Horse, 1941-46; #2 Clydesdale, 1942-48; Toy/small Horse head, 1944-45; #1 Filly, head forward, 1948-49; #2 Filly, head back, 1948-49; #5 Show Horse, 1948-49; #1 Flying Mare, 1951-52; #8086 Horse head bookend, not production; Rearing Horse bookend, not production. Among these animals, only a few were produced in colors. The three colts and the plug horse were produced in Cobalt. The three colts, the plug horse, the Clydesdale, the Flying Mare and the Horsehead bookend were produced in Amber.

The Plug Horse is probably the most well-known of the Heisey horses. Company records of a July 1941 sales meeting indicate that the salesmen like the cartoon-style horse and wanted to call him *Oscar*. He is also known by collectors as *Sparky*.

The Heisey Company *Price List #27* dated January 1947 lists the following items and prices per dozen: #1 Bookend, \$90; #1 Filly, head forward, \$54; #2 Filly, head backward, \$54; #1 Flying (cantering) Horse, \$240; and #5 Show Horse, \$48.

Heisey's Flying Mare, the most impressive of their glass horses, continues to be a favorite of many collectors.

HCA is truly fortunate that the Heisey family's love for horses carried over into the design and pro-

duction of such a fabulous collection of glass horses and other interesting horse-related items. There must be just as many "horsey people" around today as in years gone by.

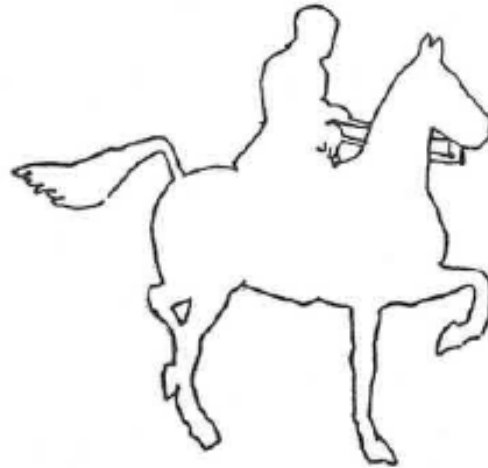

variety of colors. Decanters varied from common to scarce non-production items.

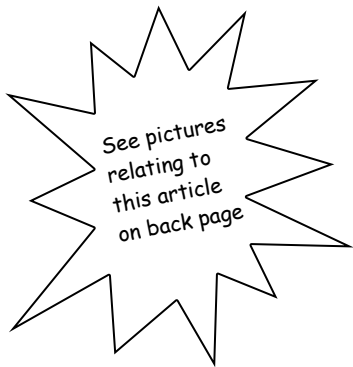
