New Heisey Factory Display

The collection of glass in the National Heisey Glass Museum is fantastic and all of the members deserve credit for that. But the glass, no matter how big a part of our story, is only a portion of the narrative we have to tell. Illustrated here is one of the new displays that were created for Convention 2013. They are designed to showcase some of the many fine factory components that illustrate aspects of Heisey glass production and the people who made Heisey.

Pictures here is an old cart that was pulled from the warehouse which probably originated from the Heisey factory and the long handled tools for carrying the hot glass to the annealing Lehr. The no smoking sign came from the men's restroom in the factory. Photos of glass being made and the crew leaders are hung on the walls and are suspended from the ceiling of the multipurpose room. The original #433 Greek Key punch bowl and base moulds were added to the display to show the size and weight of some of the factory artifacts that have been preserved. It took seven men to move the punch bowl mould to the lower level. The display has been very well received and many really enjoyed seeing some of the items of Heisey's history that are not on permanent display.

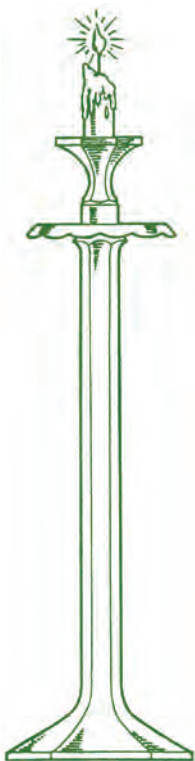

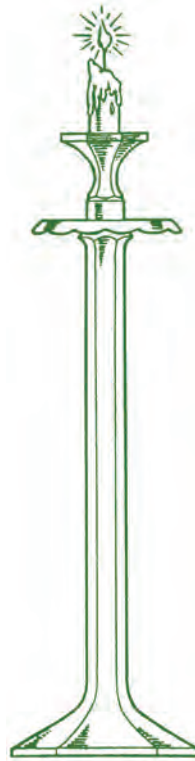

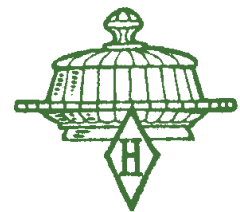
From the Curator

From the Archives...

New Chicago Headquarters for Heisey's Glassware

The beautiful Georgian dining-room in the new Chicago display headquarters of Heisey's glassware, 1561 Merchandise Mart. The attractive setting of this room has won widespread admiration from visitors.



Beauty Reigns in Chicago Displays

EYES of visitors to the new Heisey glassware display rooms in Chicago are greeted by an appealing artistry of arrangement and decoration and a wealth of modern exhibits of beautiful merchandise.

Large Space Occupied

These headquarters, which were completed in recent weeks, are located on the fifteenth floor—No. 1561—of the gigantic Merchandise Mart. They occupy a space 80 feet long and 40 feet wide, a total area of 3200 square feet.

As one approaches the location he sees facing the corridor an attractive window display, through the open center of which

can be glimpsed the dining-room and the gallery beyond.

On entering the new quarters, the visitor finds himself in a spacious reception room, with woodwork done in two-tone ivory and with flooring of colorful rubber tile. The show cabinets here are set into the side walls and have mirror backgrounds. The lighting is enhanced through a system of reflectors.

Dining-room is Georgian

The dining-room, which is furnished in the Georgian period, comes next into view on the left. The table and chairs of walnut harmonize with the style of decoration. The room is in beautiful Georgian green and no architectural feature has been overlooked. An open fire-place heightens its charm and a burgundy carpet

forms a rich setting for the furniture. Illumination is provided by an Empire crystal chandelier.

Connecting with the dining-room is a distinctive feature, a gallery of quite unusual design and arrangement. Seen at first from the corridor, it forms a stunning background to the picture framed in the doorway of the window display (refer to larger illustration on last page), and the charming impression it gives is heightened upon entering it.



Below is given a view of the modern sales and display room in the new Heisey headquarters, Merchandise Mart, Chicago. Tables and handsome wall cabinets carry striking exhibits of fine glassware in the latest shapes and designs. Everything is arranged towards making inspection of the displays as easy and convenient as possible.

THE equipment and arrangement of the sales room in Heisey's Chicago headquarters had one aim in view and that was to make convenience to the buyer the keynote. The exhibits have been so assembled and distributed that passing from one to the other becomes a matter of utmost ease, while inspection and selection can be carried out quickly and with highest satisfaction.

The sales room, in fact, sets a new mark in glassware displays. One is soon impressed by its modern features and the handsomeness of its furnishings. There are twenty-four of these. 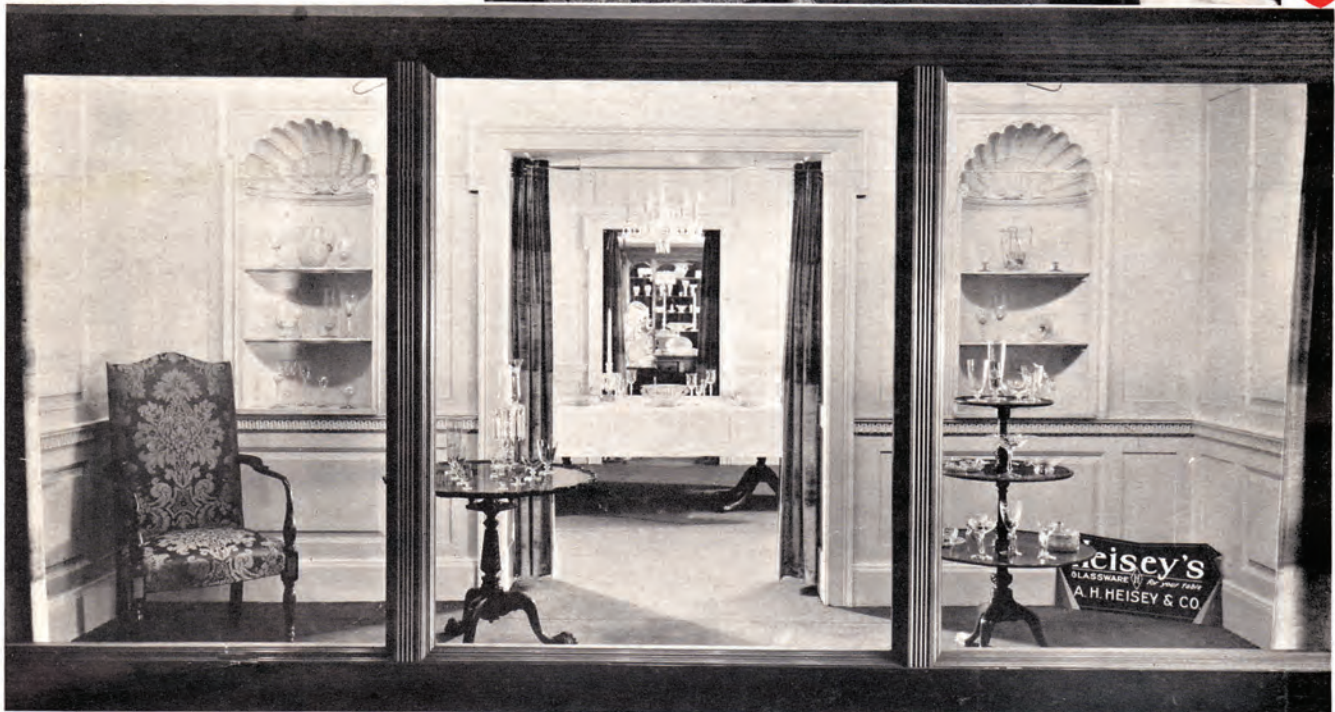
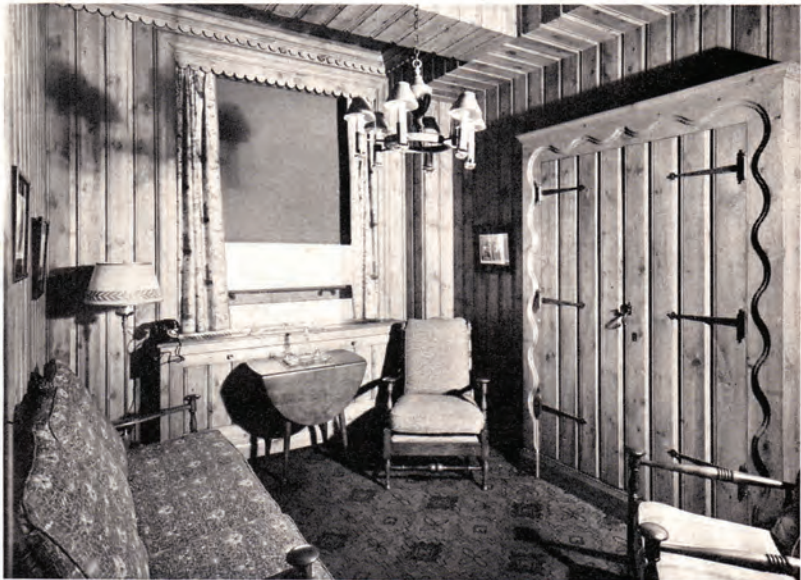




Latch-string Always Out . . .

Rock Crystal | Introduced in 1939 | Discontinued in 1943

In all handwritten records this cutting is listed as George VI, but printed catalogs call it George IV. It seems logical that it was meant to be George VI, in honor of the current English King, but possibly through a printing or typing error, transposition of the numerals occurred. There is a Yugoslavian import which bears a crude similarity to George VI and the stem is also a heavy, crude copy of #5013 Shasta. This looks new and should not confuse the serious collector.
