For those interested we still have two rugs we need to purchase and we are looking into having custom bookcases made to fit the room. We are currently seeking bids and craftsman to complete the detailed custom work. Once the cost per bookcase is determined, these beautiful handcrafted items will be available to be purchased too. Thank you to all who have made donations for this update and relocation of our reference library. With this project I have witnessed the dedication of the membership joining together to make a stunning room. Be sure to come to convention to see the unveiling of our newest improvement to our museum.

I have some exciting news if you are collecting the Heisey glass bead series or are interested in the creation of these beloved jewels. We recently melted and re-caned our NEW colors from the damaged beyond repair Heisey. **Opal:** to be released for sale April 17 (Spring Auction). The Opal beads will be available in two selections: 1. a plain opal bead, 2. the opal bead with painted flowers, mimicking the hand painted flowers often decorated on the original Heisey Opal and Custard pieces. The timing is perfect! The hand painted flowers will be enjoyed for the upcoming spring season. The price is set at \$40.00 for the plain Opal bead and \$50.00 for the painted flower bead. Beads are just another way to give the gift of Heisey. After the Opal Release, the next release of beads will be at the National Convention in June.

Another reason to join us in Newark in June will be to pick-up **The Regal Series of beads.** The plan is to include: Alexandrite, Cobalt and Tangerine in this series, but at this time we do not have any damaged Tangerine deemed worthy to melt for beads (yet).

Alexandrite and Cobalt will be available at the June National Convention for \$75.00 a bead and with the limited amount I am sure we will sell out. These are very hard to find and are breathtaking colors that will look great relieved as a Heisey fashion statement. Page 18 has more information on how these colors handled under the talented work of our bead artist. 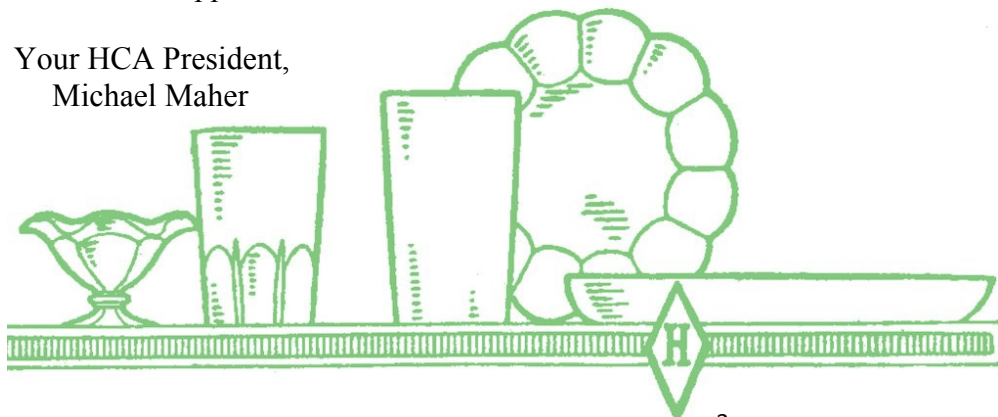

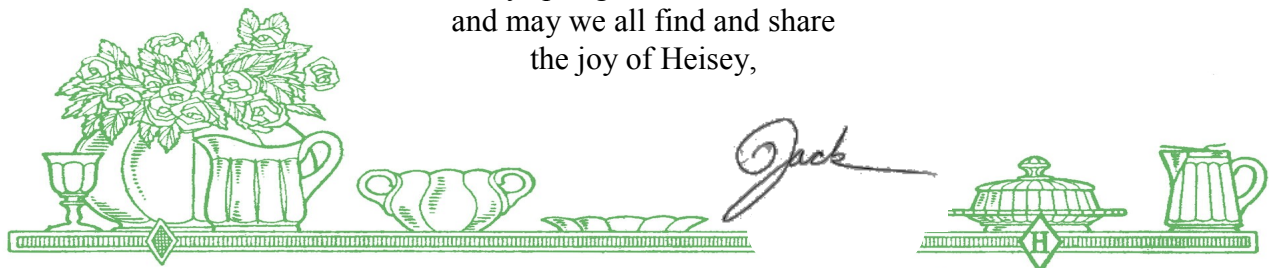
Words From Your Curator – Director

2015 Holdback Silent Auction

The Holdback Silent Auction begins Friday, March 6, 2015, at noon EST and runs through Friday, May 29, 2015, at noon EST. Forms must be received in the HCA Business Office by the closing date and time.

Bids will be accepted from both members and non members. There are no reserves but, just like eBay, there will be a modest minimum first bid. Winning bidders will be notified within 7 days after the auction end date, and the amounts of the winning bids will be published in a future issue of the Heisey News. Items can be picked up beginning May 30 at the Museum after 12:00 noon.

All items are on display in the Museum Gift Shop. Bids will be accepted by mail, drop off, fax (740-345-9638), and e-mail (director@HeiseyMuseum.org). All bids will be sealed and date-stamped with the highest bid winning. In case of a tie bid, the earliest date-stamped bid wins. All bids will be competitively bid. Payment, including shipping and insurance, will not be requested until after the auction. Once a bid has been placed, it cannot be withdrawn.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2015 SPRING AUCTION

We have finished cataloging the items for the 2015 Spring HCA Auction. We are getting better at it – it only took five full days this year. We ended up with 1,457 lots of glass representing the full range of production of the Heisey Glass Company from their beginnings until the doors closed in 1957. There is something for everyone in this auction from the standard production to true rarities that you never are given a chance to buy.

This is the auction to come to if you would like to start a collection, find the ideal wedding gift, or if you are a long time collector needing to add a special piece to your collection. The auction abounds in those old standbys of 1469 Ridgeleigh, 1503 and 5003 Crystolite, 1540 and 5004 Lariat, 1567 and 5067 Plantation, 507 Orchid etch, and 515 Heisey Rose etch. But even among some of the more common pieces are some that you do not see often. Lot 412 is a Crystolite basket while in Ridgeleigh there is a cake plate (Lot #1186) and the elusive two piece roly poly (1189). Many lots of Plantation are featured in lots 135-146 and 289-298 as well as others throughout the auction; special among them are six footed fruits (292) and six mayo underplates (293) that are perfect to use with the fruits.



This is an auction in which candlesticks and candelabrum seem plentiful. There are plenty of pairs and singles to please any collector (they make great gifts, too). There is a pair of 68 Hepplewhite (698) and 109 Petticoat Dolphins in Moongleam (1036). We have singles of 5 Patricain candelabrum in Moongleam (1099), 402 Gothic candlestick in Sahara (1104), 141 Edna (1145), and 1447 Rococo (1148). There is also a great 77 Westminster stand lamp (1137).



We have the full range of colors that Heisey produced represented in this auction. Cobalt is especially well represented with several nice pieces: 1433 Thumbprint and Panel flared vase (374), two 1420 Tulip vases (lots 383 and 889), 1413 straight Cathedral vase (1151), 419 Sussex sherbet with Cobalt bowl (879) and two 3386 Diamond Rose pilsners (1282 and 1283). An interesting piece of Harvey Amber is the 1106 handleless custard (471). There is a Vaseline 350 Pinwheel and Fan 4" nappy (1108).

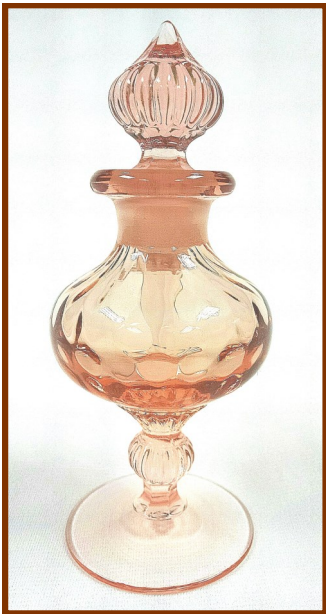
Interesting pieces in early Heisey patterns include the 1225 Plain Band toy child's set (10), many good pieces in 300 Peerless (lots 517-532), covered comports in 337 Touraine (545) and 1225 Plain Band – two sizes (543 and 544), 1205 Fancy Loop pot pourri (1029), 160 Locket on Chain pickle in Emerald (1106), 1201 Fandango sugar shaker (1161), and a 1280 Winged Scroll Emerald 10" tray (1296). In colonial patterns we have all four colors of the 394 Narrow Flute Domino sugar (lots 757-760), 8037 Fluted Diamond 8" footed oval (766), a complete wash set (pitcher and bowl) in 477 Hairpin (1131), a 1776 Kalonyal punch bowl and base (1141), and a 433 Greek Key 10" shallow low footed bowl (464).

You will find plenty of condiment pieces, cruets, lavender jars, perfumes, vases, and animals for the item collector. A nice cologne is the 516 Fairacre in Flamingo (866). Among the animal related items are a 1540 Plug Horse in Amber (1126), a 1601 Sleeping Fox ashtray (1329), and a 1951A Elephant handled mug (1129). Three special vases are a 4222 Horseshoe with 5009 Diana carving (1139), 4191 Olympia 4" (1304), and a 4057 Cecelia with signed Dorothy Thorpe leaf decoration (1015).

If you need a new vessel to contain your drink of choice we have a nice selection of stems and barware to add to your collection. Unusual stems include a lot of six 1408 Panel and Diamond Point goblets (Lot 1), a 7047 Comet Leaf sherbet (1068), and three Dorothy Thorpe 5064 Hydrangea stems: goblet (1072) and two champagnes (882 and 1294). We have several desirable bars: a 2355 Cloverleaf (243), #200 1-ounce (496); and a 4004 Impromptu (1214). In addition there is a 1434 Tom & Jerry mug (67) and a 4027 Christos decanter in Sahara with 447 Empress etch (873).



If it is the "little things" that make your collector juices flow then check out lots 495 and 1381: these are the cutest little restaurant creamers in 1184 Yeoman. Additionally, there is a #1 Tea drip with silver rim (896), a 325 Pillows individual salt (1211), and a set of 10 Oakleaf coasters in all the colors made (1367).



Other unusual lots include a headlight lens unlike any we have in the Museum that still retains an original Heisey sales label that has "Lecalite" embossed on the glass (1264) and a 4165 Shaw handleless pitcher in Flamingo (1387).



Space limitations prevent me from going on, but as you can see there is plenty for offer in the auction. I hope you will be able to join me and all of your Heisey friends for this great event. I look forward to seeing you.

Absentee Bid Instructions

As absentee bidders, we will bid competitively for you at the HCA Spring Benefit Auction, April 17-18, 2015. In case of duplicate bids, the earliest postmark wins. Bids must reflect the listing in the catalog as to lot number, pattern, description, and condition. The minimum absentee bid per lot is \$15.

You set the maximum amount you are willing to pay on each lot. If successful, the remainder will be refunded. Please use good judgment in arriving at your maximum bid figure. Remember, there are minimum limits to raises that the auctioneer will accept (smaller items \$2.50, larger items \$5, \$10 or as much as \$25). Lots containing multiple items will be as one lot to the successful bidder. Normally, these are not split up, however, there may be some exceptions to this.

Please indicate on your bid the desired condition of the item on which you are bidding. We have endeavored to describe all items to the best of our ability and a bid on an item reflects your acceptance of the condition as listed. (As you know, if no flaws are noted, that means the glass is in generally good condition.) If you mark your bid "near mint only," we will use no discretion in your bid. If there is a variance on a lot not called in the catalog (such as unlisted damage or a difference in the number of items in a lot), we will not bid on that lot for you. Please use the form (or a copy) available in the *Heisey News*, or from this catalog, or from our website www.HeiseyMuseum.org to submit your bid. Absentee bids can be submitted by e-mail, fax, or postal service.

PAYMENT Cash, check, cashier's check, or money order payable to HCA Auction, and Visa/MasterCard/DiscoverCard accepted. A 5% buyer's premium will be added. Buyer's premium is deleted for cash, cashier's check, money order, or approved check payments. You may send a separate check for each lot or you may send one check covering the maximum amount of all bids. Absentee Bidders must make their own shipping arrangements. See Shipping section below for further information.

In addition, if you would like to pay by check, **Please** consider leaving the amount blank. Designate in the memo blank of your check an amount not to exceed the total amount of your bids. The Auction Manager or HCA Treasurer will fill in the exact amount of your purchase, thus greatly cutting back on refunds. Surplus bid money will be refunded. Send in a self-addressed, stamped envelope to return your checks. HCA reserves the right to reject any bid.

SHIPPING Buyers must make their own shipping arrangements including payments for shipping directly to the shipper. Glass is available to be picked up by your shipper on Tuesday, April 21, 2015, after 10:00 AM at the National Heisey Glass Museum, 169 W. Church St., Newark, OH 43055. HCA is aware of the following area shippers: Express Pack and Ship: 740-366-1325, Pakmail: 740-522-2564, and UPS Store 3910: 614-939-5195. HCA is not responsible for any services provided by these vendors. HCA will work with these vendors to make sure your glass is available.

BID SUBMISSION Absentee bids must be **received** no later than Tuesday April 14, 2015, at 4:00 p.m. Eastern Standard Time. When using a credit card number, bids must be faxed to (740) 345-9638 using the absentee bidding form. When your Fax is complete, please contact the Museum to ensure it has arrived and is removed from the Museum Fax machine as soon as it arrives. The Absentee Forms with personal checks, et. al., must be mailed to Absentee Bids, National Glass Heisey Museum, 169 W. Church St., Newark, OH 43055. HCA, Inc. must have credit card information or cash, a personal check, money order, or travelers check in its possession prior to executing a bid.

BEHIND THE SCENES ADVENTURES II

Heisey Glass Beads

The adventures of working with glass that hasn't been in liquid state in over 70 years*

In continuation of my article from the January 2015 Heisey News, page 18, I discussed how Heisey glass was performing when re-heated in the furnaces of our Bead Artist, Theresa Sharp. I received much feedback on the article that I saw fit that I report more of the findings from a recent visit I experienced with our Bead Artist. In mid-February Jack Burriss and I were very fortunate to be able to work with Theresa and the Glass Shop manager, Mike Stepanski at the Ohio Glass Museum in Lancaster, Ohio. Mike and Theresa work together to stretch our damaged beyond repair Heisey glass into cane form.

We have been very intrigued by the process, as we never know how the glass will perform once it is placed in the furnaces to re-heat for caning. As you know, each color has its own formula and sometimes our glass has two formulas. One for pressed ware which is very stiff and able to hold the pattern of a mould and another formula for blown ware which is very loose and softer making it more pliable to blown into shape easily.

The first glass we worked with on this day was the donated Opal glass. Similar to my report in the previous article on how Custard reacted, Opal was very difficult to work with as it is a very dense and thick glass that cooled very quickly. Much more effort was added for the production of the Opal bead.



Alexandrite glass on the other hand was very loose and fluid-like. It was very easy to stretch. The piece we were able to stretch was an Empress cream soup with a broken handle. Remember, the items must be placed into what is called the "garage" to slowly bring the glass to about 1000 degrees. The garage allows the glass to warm slowly so when the piece is placed in the glory hole the extreme heat does not fracture the item from the temperature variance. Once the garage was opened to retrieve the pre-heated Alexandrite cream soup we were amazed at what we saw. The piece had completely hazed over. The piece looked as though it had been sand blasted or frosted. In the photos if you receive the newsletter electronically or access them on our facebook page, you will notice it looks like a piece of china or porcelain. This was the first color piece we have witnessed

to have this odd frosting effect. Once the piece was stretched into a cane of glass the frosting minimized and is not nearly as noticeable. My assumption is that once Theresa flame works the canes into beads, and fire polishes them smooth, the frosted appearance will resolve itself and return to the Alexandrite color we all know depending on lighting. We did notice as the artists were reheating the stretched cane that some pieces were flaring off of itself, like a veneer peeling away, once fully fire polished they settled upon the canes, but it was a very odd behavior that neither glass artist had seen before.

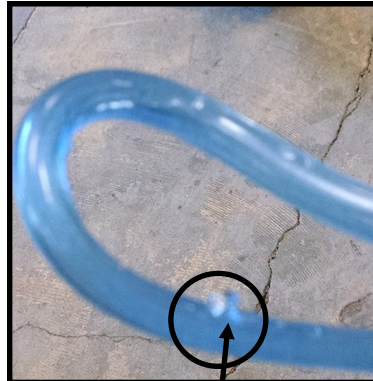
Cobalt glass was a "dream to work with, as most cobalts are" said Theresa, It heated up very quickly and pulled out easily. There was one problem that had the artists puzzled. Areas of clear glass about the size of a dime would glow a different color on the cobalt and was highly noticeable. They knew there was no way that they had gotten any clear glass on the cobalt and were very baffled. The artists cut out the small inclusions of crystal, shook their heads and continued stretching. Later Theresa asked me about this strange occurrence. It took me a moment to analyze, but after remembering the pieces that were stretched from cobalt (a Warwick ind. candle holder and several Spanish stems, of which I cut off the foot) It then occurred to me that there was a small amount of crystal still on the base of the bowl of each Spanish stem. These would be the small

- size dollops they were noticing. There was some detective work, and we solved the mystery together!

It is very exciting to see these damaged pieces of history attached to a glass workers pipe, doused into the glory hole flames and manipulated to the desired shape to be relived as a Heisey glass bead. Through this project we are able to see things we otherwise may have never known about the glass' demeanor and activity in liquid state, much like a Heisey worker would have originally handled the glass. This project has opened an educational window for us and I want to thank those who have supported the project through donating glass and/or purchasing Heisey beads. Please continue to send you glass to the Museum labeled "Bead Project."

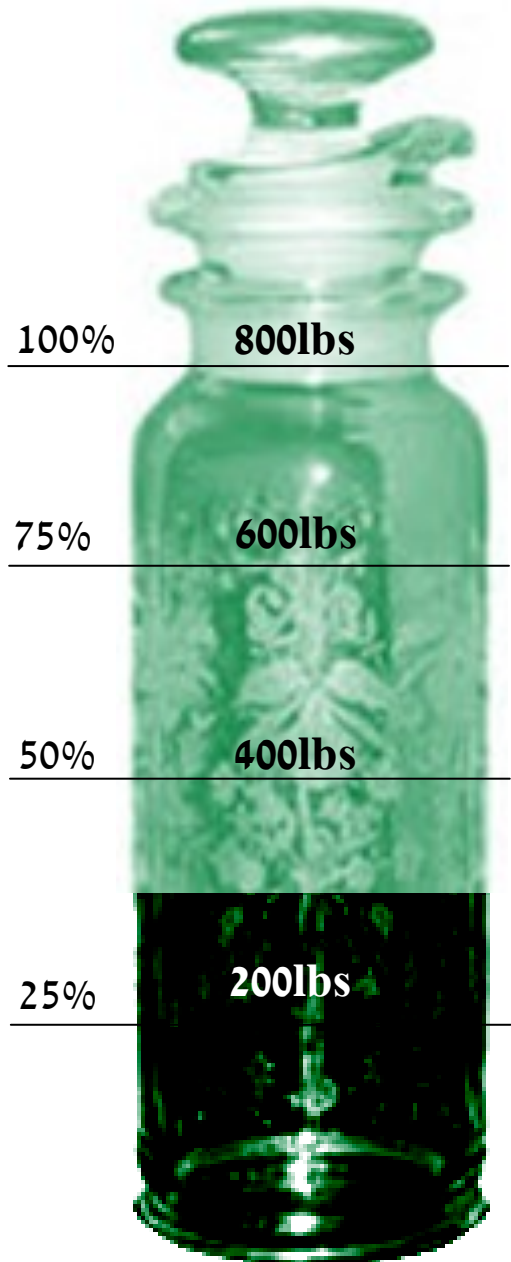


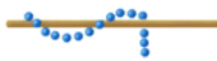
Here is the de-veneering characteristic we noticed in the stretching of Alexandrite.

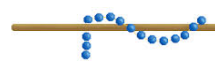

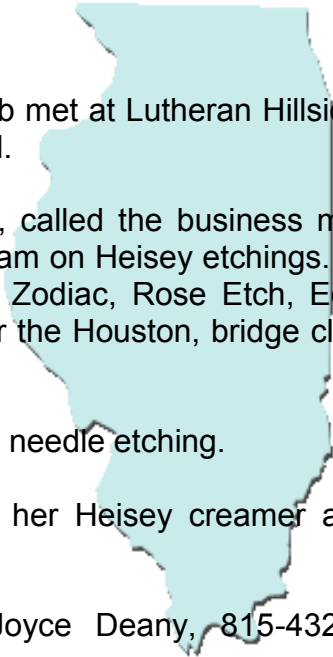
